The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Corpus Christi College, in the University of Oxford, on the 5th day of December, 1933, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

AMENDING STATUTE OF THE COLLEGE CLAUSE II 8 (TO TAKE THE PLACE OF CLAUSE II 8 (A) AND (B) OF THE EXISTING STATUTE).

A President retiring either under the provisions of Clause 4, or owing to ill-health before he reaches the age of seventy, shall be entitled to such pension as the College may, at the time of his retirement, or (if he has not before his election become a member of the Federated Superannuation Scheme for Universities) at the time of his election or any subsequent time, determine to be suitable:

Provided always that

(i) On retirement under the provisions of Clause 4 a President shall not receive from the College a pension which together with any pension received by him under the Federated Superannuation Scheme for Universities, exceeds £700 per annum.

(ii) On retirement owing to ill-health

(ii) On retirement owing to ill-health before reaching the age of seventy a President shall not receive from the College a pension which together with any pension received by him under the Federated Superannuation Scheme for Universities, exceeds £600 per annum.


