

to that effect has been placed upon the carriage, no person other than a person for whose conveyance the carriage is reserved shall enter or attempt to enter such carriage.

Persons Suffering from Disease not to Travel on Carriages.

32. No person affected with any infectious or contagious disease, or who from any other cause is, in the opinion of the conductor, unfit to be a passenger, shall board, enter or travel on a carriage, or attempt so to do and any such person if found in or upon any carriage shall leave the carriage immediately on being requested to do so by the conductor.

Power to remove persons committing Offence.

33. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any carriage, shelter, or premises of the Corporation, any breach of these Byelaws shall in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the carriage, shelter, or premises, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to demand the return of the amount of his fare so paid.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Byelaws.

34. Every conductor and driver shall to the best of his ability enforce these Byelaws, and prevent the breach thereof.

Penalty.

35. Any person infringing any of the foregoing Byelaws shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Forty Shillings for each offence, and in case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not exceeding Ten Shillings, in addition to the first-mentioned penalty, for every day during which the offence continues.

36. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage, shelter, or premises in use, a printed copy of these Byelaws.

37. These Byelaws shall come into force on the first day of March, 1934.

1933.

Worsley (Little Hulton No. 2) Planning Scheme.

NOTICE is hereby given that (1) on the eighth day of December, 1933, the Minister of Health notified his approval of the resolution of the Council of the Urban District of Worsley dated the fourteenth day of August, 1933, deciding to prepare the above planning scheme with reference to an area situate wholly within the Urban District of Worsley; (2) the said Council having delegated powers in connection with the adoption and

preparation of the scheme to the Manchester and District Regional Planning Committee the Map defining the area to which the resolution applies has been deposited at the Regional Planning Office, Town Hall, Manchester, and will be open for inspection each week-day by all persons interested without charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. except on Saturdays when the hours will be 9 a.m. and 12 noon; (3) any person who is, or claims to be, an owner of any property in the area and any association representing owners of property within the said Urban District and any local association representing business or industry may by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the Manchester and District Regional Planning Committee, whose office is situate at the Town Hall, Manchester, to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the scheme; (4) under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933,* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the Council of the said Urban District are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map. (5) The Manchester and District Regional Planning Committee intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a Draft Scheme and any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the Draft Scheme should be sent in writing to the Honorary Clerk to the Committee.
