The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, on the 7th December, 1933, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of the College of Saint Mary Magdalen, commonly called Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, duly made under the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, at a Meeting of the Governing Body specially summoned for the purpose on the seventh day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and passed at that Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty The King in Council.

### PRELIMINARY.

This Statute is supplemental to the existing Statutes of the College, that is to say the Statutes made for the College by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and approved by His Majesty The King in Council on the 26th day of July, 1926.

### DEMYSHIPS, SCHOLARSHIPS AND EXHIBITIONS.

Statute IX. 4.—This clause (IX. 4) is hereby repealed and in its stead the following is hereby enacted:

"There shall be maintained within the College Junior Demyships, and the sum which may be annually paid out of the Corporate Revenues of the College for their maintenance shall be £100 in respect of each Junior Demyship held within the College. The number of such Junior Demyships shall, subject to the provisions of Clauses 10, 11, 22 and 23 of this Statute, be not less than thirty-two. Provided that the President and Fellows may increase the number of such Junior Demyships to not more than forty for such time as they think fit, thus increasing the total sum payable annually in respect of Junior Demyships to not more than £4,000.

If, under the terms of Clauses 10 and 11 of this Statute, the number of Junior Demyships exceed forty, the sum which may be so paid shall likewise exceed £4,000 by £100 in respect of each Junior Demyship so held in excess of the number of forty. Any emoluments which a Junior Demy may receive shall commence and be payable from the date of his coming into residence."

Statute IX. 13—In this clause (IX. 13) the figure £4,000 shall be substituted in place of the figure £3,200 wherever it occurs.
