WHEREAS by Section 214 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60), it is provided that a local authority, whose district includes a seaport, may, with the approval of the Board of Trade, make byelaws relating to seamen's lodging houses in their district, and that those byelaws shall be binding upon all persons keeping houses in which seamen are lodged, and upon the owners thereof and persons employed therein; and further, that such byelaws shall, amongst other things, provide for the licensing, inspection, and sanitary conditions of seamen's lodging houses, for the publication of the fact of a house being licensed, for the due execution of the byelaws, for preventing the obstruction of persons engaged in securing that execution, for the preventing of persons not duly licensed holding themselves out as keeping or purporting to keep licensed houses, and for the exclusion from licensed houses of persons of improper character, and shall impose sufficient fines, not exceeding fifty pounds, for the breach of any byelaw; and further, that whenever His Majesty in Council orders that in any district or any part thereof, none but persons duly licensed in pursuance of byelaws under the said Section shall keep seamen's lodging houses or let lodgings to seamen from a date therein named, a person acting in contravention of that order shall for each offence be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds:

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Falmouth (hereinafter called "the Borough Council") is the local authority in the Borough of Falmouth and a local authority within the

meaning of the said Section:

And whereas the Borough Council have, with the approval of the Board of Trade, made Byelaws to come into force on the 1st day of January, 1934:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. None but persons duly licensed in pursuance of the said Byelaws which come into force on the 1st day of January, 1934, shall keep seamen's lodging houses or let lodgings to seamen in the district of the Borough Council, including the seaport of Falmouth or in any part thereof.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Falmouth Seamen's Lodging-houses

Keepers) Order, 1933.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Willesden, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Francis of Assisi, situate at Gladstone Park as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Francis, Gladstone Park.'

"And with the like consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Francis of Assisi, situate at Gladstone Park as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical sioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 9th day of November, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Radford, partly out of the Parish of Bilborough, partly out of the Parish of Wollaton, partly out of the Parish of Basford, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Cinder Hill, all in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Radford, the said Parish of Bilborough, the said Parish of Wollaton, the said Parish of Basford, and the said New Parish of Christ Church, Cinder Hill, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Radford, of the

said Parish of Bilborough, of the said Parish of Wollaton, of the said Parish of Basford, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Cinder Hill, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas John Dane Player, of Alexandra Park, in the City of Nottingham, Esquire, has contributed and paid a capital sum of £5,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said

proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £5,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said John Dane Player, as the contributor of the said capital sum of £5,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church has nominated to us the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Southwell, himself, the said John Dane Player, John Ashley Player, of Whatton Manor in the said County of Nottingham, Esquire, the Reverend Claude Wilfrid Good, Clerk in Holy Orders and Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Radford, and the Reverend John Waring, Clerk in Holy Orders and Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Nottingham, as the persons to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Radford, of the said Parish of Bilborough, of the said Parish of Wollaton, of the said Parish of Basford, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Cinder Hill, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan

hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Margaret, Aspley.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, John Dane Player, John Ashley Player, Claude Wilfrid Good, and John Waring to be held by them as trustees in fee simple upon the trusts declared by a certain Indenture already prepared and intended to be executed by the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, John Dane Player, John Ashley Player, Claude Wilfrid Good and John Waring.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Margaret, Aspley, comprising:-

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Radford, of the Parish of Bilborough, of the Parish of Wollaton, of the Parish of Basford, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Cinder Hill, all in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell, which, taken together, are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Nuthall Road and Melbourne Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Melbourne Road for a distance of 9½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hillcot Drive, and extending thence westward along the middle of Hillcot Drive for a distance of 26½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Minver Crescent, and extending thence first south westward, then westward and then north westward along the middle of Minver Crescent (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Cinder Hill, from the said Parish of Bilborough) for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sherbourne Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Sherbourne Road for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Broxtowe Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Broxtowe Lane for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Aspley Lane and extending thence eastward along the middle of Aspley Lane for a distance of 23½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to

the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 131 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Bilborough published in the year 1915 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 132 upon the said maps, and extending thence first southward to such fence and then first southward, then south westward and then again southward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 131 and the close numbered 137 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 132 for a distance in all of 19 chains or thereabouts to the south eastern corner of the said close numbered 137 and extending thence first southward to and then generally south eastward along the middle of the stream which runs through Robin's Wood (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bilborough from the said Parish of Radford and crossing the northern boundary of the said Parish of Wollaton) for a distance of 62 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries the roadway leading into Radford Bridge Road across such stream, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 17g chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wollaton from the said Parish of Radford, and extending thence southward along such boundary for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the Radford and Trowell Branch Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence first eastward and then south eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 43 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Nottingham and Mansfield Line of the same railway, and extending thence northward along the last mentioned line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Radford from the said Parish of Basford) for a distance of 70 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of Albert Avenue, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of Albert Avenue for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Nuthall Road, and extending thence first northward and then north westward along the middle of Nuthall Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said Parish of Basford from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Cinder Hill) for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Melbourne Road, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Hanwell is a Cure wherein or in part whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Hanwell which is mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and is delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 13th day of June, 1930, and published in the London Gazette on the 17th day of the same month, the Benefice of Saint Thomas, Portman Square, and the Benefice of Saint Peter, Vere Street, both in the said County and Diocese, were united into one Benefice; and it was by the same Order provided amongst other things (1) that an ecclesiastical District or Districts should be selected by the Bishop of London as the District or Districts for which a Church or Churches should be built out of the proceeds of the sale of the site and materials of the Church of Saint Thomas, Portman Square, (2) that when a Church for one of such Districts had been built it should be dedicated to Saint

Thomas, and that the Patronage thereof should be vested in the Patron of the Benefice of Saint Thomas, Portman Square, and (3) that out of the proceeds of such sale a sum sufficient to provide an income of £300 per annum should be appropriated and held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and the income arising therefrom should, after the cessation of a pension of £300 per annum payable under the terms of the same Order in Council to the Reverend Henry Gardner Hills, Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Portman Square, be held and applied by us for the endowment of such Church and District:

"And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected by the Bishop of London as one of the Districts for which a Church shall be built and an endowment secured as provided by the above mentioned Order in Council:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a temporary grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors, such temporary grant to continue payable until the date upon which the above-mentioned sum of £300 per annum becomes available towards the endowment of the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said temporary grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Portman Square, was, at the date of the said Order in Council of the 13th day of June, 1930, vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Hanwell which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of 'The District of Saint Thomas, Hanwell.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, as provided by the said Order in Council of the 13th day of June,

"The District of Saint Thomas, Hanwell, being:-

"All that isolated part of the Parish of Hanwell, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the south by the Parish of New Brentford, upon the west partly by the Parish of Isleworth and partly by the Parish of Norwood, upon the north partly by the New Parish of Saint Mark, Hanwell, partly by the New Parish of Saint Mellitus, Hanwell, and partly by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint James, Ealing, and upon the east partly by the last named Cure, partly by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Ealing, and partly by the Parish of Ealing, all in the said County and Diocese."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Hanwell, out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Richard Dixon (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Crowfield and Gosbeck duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Southwell, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefices of Nottingham, Saint Peter; Nottingham, Saint James; Nottingham, Saint John the Baptist; and the Benefice of Notting-ham, Saint Nicholas, in the said County of Nottingham and in the said Diocese of Southwell, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Southwell, and therein recommended the union of the said Benefices of Nottingham, Saint Peter; Nottingham, Saint James; Nottingham, Saint Nicholas; and a part of the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint John the Baptist and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Southwell signified in writing his approval of the said Report subject to the omission from the union so recommended of the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint Nicholas:

James; and a part of the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint John the Baptist, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Southwell embodies certain modifications thereof including the omission as: aforesaid of the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint Nicholas:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint James, is a Benefice without cure of souls the Church whereof is situate within the part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint John the Baptist, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed to beunited to the said Benefices of Nottingham, Saint Peter and Nottingham, Saint James:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Nottingham, Saint James, and Nottingham, Saint John the Baptist, are now full, the Reverend Herbert Victor Turner being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Nottingham,

Saint Peter, is at present vacant:

"And whereas the Patronage of each of the said Benefices of Nottingham, Saint Peter; Nottingham, Saint James; and Nottingham, Saint John the Baptist; now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Herbert Victor Turner (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:-

"1. That the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint Peter, and the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint James, and all that part of the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint John the Baptist, which lies to the west of the middle of Wilford Street, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and Parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Nottingham, Saint Peter with Saint James.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Nottingham, Saint Peter, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Nottingham, Saint Peter, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Herbert Victor Turner if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint James, and Nottingham, Saint John the Baptist, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but shall thereupon cease to be Incumbent of the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint John the Baptist.

"(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Southwell under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say (1) in payment thereout of the compensation or compensations mentioned in Clause 5 of this Scheme or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations as in the same Clause is provided (2) as to such a sum as shall be determined by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Bishop of Southwell, for and towards the augmentation of the United Benefice and (3) the residue of such net proceeds shall be held and accumulated by us as a fund for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection of a new Church for a District to be selected by the Bishop of Southwell as the District for which such Church shall be built; and any ultimate residue after the provision of a site for and the erection of such Church shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Southwell.

"(c) That the font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Nottingham, Saint James, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Nottingham, Saint Peter, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the Diocese of Southwell and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Nottingham, Saint James, or such of them

as the Bishop of Southwell shall select, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any articles not so transferred shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Southwell for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Southwell which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Nottingham, Saint James as aforesaid.

"(d) That upon the Bishop certifying in writing as aforesaid that the said Church of Nottingham, Saint James, is no longer required for the purposes of Divine Service the Register Books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said Church of Nottingham, Saint James, shall be transferred to the Church of Nottingham, Saint Peter, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the said Church of Nottingham, Saint James, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"7. That upon the union taking effect the endowments of the United Benefice (apart from any augmentation under the provisions of the last preceding clause of this Scheme) shall consist of the whole of the endowments of the said Benefices of Nottingham, Saint Peter, and Nottingham, Saint James, and a part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint John the Baptist, namely all the endowments of the last named Benefice, except an annual sum of £250 being part of a larger annual sum now payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of that Benefice, and the endowment of the said Benefice of Nottingham, Saint John the Baptist, shall consist of the annual sum of £250 so excepted.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Nottingham, Saint James, shall not take effect until the consents and approval, which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church, shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Nottingham, Saint James, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said

Report:

'And whereas both of the said Benefices of Great Wenham and Holton Saint Mary are now full the Reverend Walter Edwards being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Wenham and the Reverend Charles James Howard being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Holton Saint Mary:

That the Inhabitants of the said District or portion of land shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Whitmore to which it is proposed that the said District or portion of land shall be annexed and in common with the Parishioners of that Parish and shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of the said Parish of Keele, except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in the said Parish Church of Keele, and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

SANCTION BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT.

Now therefore the Minister of Transport in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred
