

Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 53, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 30th day of November, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Andrew, Luton, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Luton, in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, and of the New Parish (sometime District) of Biscot, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, and of the said New Parish of Biscot, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Andrew, Luton, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, as well of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, as of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Biscot (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, and of the said New Parish of Biscot, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Andrew, Luton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Luton.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Luton, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Luton, in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans, which is bounded upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Matthew, High Town, Luton, upon the north partly by the New Parish of Stopsley

and partly by the New Parish (sometime District) of Biscot, upon the south-west by the New Parish of All Saints, Luton, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Luton, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, at the centre of the bridge which carries the main line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway across Waldeck Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Waldeck Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Biscot Road and Cromwell Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Cromwell Road for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with New Bedford Road and Cromwell Hill, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Cromwell Hill for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Old Bedford Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, from the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, High Town, Luton.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Biscot which is bounded upon the south by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the north-west, and upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, from the said New Parish of Biscot at or near the junction of New Bedford Road with Montrose Avenue, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of Montrose Avenue for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Denbigh Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Denbigh Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Tudor Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Tudor Road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Leagrave Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Leagrave Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the premises belonging to the London, Midland and Scottish Railway Company and the premises of the Skefko Steel Works, and extending thence south-westward to and along such fence and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 7 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said main line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Biscot, of the said New Parish of All Saints, Luton, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, all meet."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:
