## KINGSTON UPON HULL (SUTTON ROAD) BRIDGE SCHEME.

### PUBLIC WORKS FACILITIES ACT, 1930.

NOTICE is hereby given that application has been made by the Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the city and county of Kingston upon Hull to the Minister of Transport for a scheme under section 1 of the Public Works Facilities Act 1930 under the above name or short title, the title of which is "Scheme under the Public Works Facilities Act 1930 empowering the Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City and County of Kingston upon Hull to construct an opening bridge over the River Hull and a tunnel under the said river, to borrow money and for other purposes".

In accordance with the Standing Orders of Parliament a notice containing a concise summary of the purposes of the Scheme has been or will be published in the Hull Daily Mail on the 23rd December, 1933, and the 1st January, 1934.

A plan and section of the proposed works including a plan of the lands which are proposed to be acquired under the authority of the Scheme together with a book of reference to the plan were on or before the 23rd day of December 1933 deposited for public inspection with the undersigned town clerk at his office.

Copies of the Scheme, plan, section, book of reference and estimate of the cost may be inspected, and copies may be made or purchased (at the price of three shillings for each copy as regards the scheme) at the Town Clerk's Office, Guildhall, Hull, and copies of the Scheme may be purchased at the offices of the undersigned parliamentary agents at all reasonable times.

Any objections respecting the Scheme or to any proposals of the Scheme may be made in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Transport, 6, Whitehall Gardens, S.W.1, on or before the 17th day of January, 1934, and copies of such objections must at the same time be sent to the undersigned town clerk or parliamentary agents.
