The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty The King has jurisdiction in Egypt:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Egypt (Registration Fees Amendment) Order in Council, 1933.

2.—(1) This Order shall come into force on the 1st January, 1934.

(2) No provision of this Order amending or repealing any provision of any previous Order shall affect the past operation of such previous Order or anything done thereunder.

(3) Printed copies of this Order shall forthwith be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in the public offices of all His Majesty's consular posts in Egypt.

(4) Proof shall not be required in any proceeding or matter that the provisions of the preceding paragraph of this article have been complied with, nor shall any failure to comply with the said provisions in any manner affect the operation of this Order.

3. Article 166 of the Egypt Order in Council, 1930, is hereby repealed and the following article shall be substituted therefor:—

166. Every person shall, on every registration of himself, and on every renewal of the registration, pay a fee of five shillings or such other fee as the Secretary of State from time to time appoints. The amount of the fee may be uniform for all persons, or may vary according to the position and circumstances of different classes, if the Secretary of State from time to time so directs, but may not in any case exceed one pound.

HEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty The King has power and jurisdiction in relation to His Majesty's subjects and others within the dominions of His Majesty the Sultan of Morocco:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Morocco (Amendment) Order in Council, 1933.

- (2) This Order shall be construed as one with the "Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1929 Consolidated", and the said Consolidated Orders and this Order may be cited as "The Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1933 Consolidated".
- (3) A copy of the Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1929 Consolidated with the amendments, whether by way of substitution, addition or omission required by this Order, and intituled the "Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1933 Consolidated" shall be prepared and certified by the Secretary of State and copies of the Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1933 Consolidated shall be printed in accordance with the copy so certified, containing the certificate of the Secretary of State as aforesaid printed at the heading thereof, which certificate shall recite the provisions of this and the preceding paragraphs of this Article, and such copies may hereafter, except in regard to matters covered by Article 2 (2) of this Order, be exclusively referred to for all purposes connected with the exercise of jurisdiction by His Majesty in Morocco.

(4) No further copies of the Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1929 Consolidated shall be printed and the copies of the Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1933 Consolidated referred to in the preceding paragraph shall be printed as soon as the existing stock of printed copies of Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1929 Consoli-

dated are exhausted.

2.—(1) This Order shall come into force on

the 1st January, 1934.

(2) No provision of this Order amending or repealing any provision of any previous Order shall affect the past operation of such previous

Order or anything done thereunder.

(3) Printed copies of this Order shall forthwith be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in the public offices of all His Majesty's consular posts in the French and Spanish Zones of Morocco.

(4) Proof shall not be required in any proceeding or matter that the provisions of the preceding paragraph of this Article have been complied with, nor shall any failure to comply with the said provisions in any manner affect the operation of this Order.

the operation of this Order.

3. Article 119 of the Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1929 Consolidated is hereby repealed and the following Article shall be sub-

stituted therefor: --

119. (1) A register of persons subject to this Order shall be kept in the office of every

Consulate in Morocco.

(2) Every person subject to this Order resident in Morocco shall, in the month of January of each year, be registered at the Consulate of the consular district within which he resides, provided that, if some other Consulate is more easy of access, he may, with the assent of the consular officer, be registered there. A person subject to this Order arriving in Morocco must apply for registration within one month after his arrival; provided that a person who fails to apply for or obtain registration within the time limited by this Article may be

registered at any time if he excuses his failure to the satisfaction of the consular officer.

- (3) Where a person subject to this Order is in possession of a valid British passport, the consular officer shall, on the first registration of any such person, endorse on the passport without further fee than that provided for in sub-Article (6) hereunder a certificate of registration in such form as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State. Where any such person applies for the renewal of the registration and produces his passport, the renewal of the registration shall without further fee than that provided for in sub-Article (6) hereunder be endorsed thereon.
- (4) Every person who has not previously been registered applying to be registered under this Order shall, unless excused by the consular officer, attend personally for that purpose at the Consulate, but any person applying for the renewal of his registration need not attend personally unless directed by the consular officer so to do, provided that the registration of the wife or wives of a man who is registered under this Order may, if living with him, be effected without their personal attendance being required, and provided also that the registration of minors, being his relatives in whatever degree, living with the head of a family who is registered under this Order, may be effected without their personal attendance being required.
- (5) A person registered in any register, established under the provisions of any Order in Council which have been repealed shall be registered under the provisions of this Order, unless the consular officer is satisfied after inquiry that the previous registration was erroneous or that such person is not entitled to registration under the provisions of this Order.
- (6) Every person shall, on every registration of himself, and on every renewal of the registration, pay a fee of five shillings or such other fee as the Secretary of State from time to time appoints. The amount of the fee may be uniform for all persons, or may vary according to the position and circumstances of different classes, if the Secretary of State from time to time so directs, but may not in any case exceed one pound.

(7) Where any person applies to be registered, he shall be entitled without a fee to the assistance of the consular officer in the preparation of any affidavit that may be

required.

(8) The consular officer may require the production of such evidence that an applicant for registration is entitled to the status of a person subject to this Order as he may see fit, but subject to such directions as may be issued by the Secretary of State.

(9) If any person subject to this Order neglects to obtain registration under the provisions of this Order, he shall not be entitled to be recognised or protected as a British subject or a British protected person, as the case may be, in Morocco, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two pounds for each instance of such failure, but he shall, although not registered, be subject to the jurisdiction of His Majesty's Courts in Morocco.

4. Article 124 of the Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1929 Consolidated is hereby repealed and the following article shall be substituted therefor: --

124.—(1) It shall be lawful for the Consul-General and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court from time to time to make Rules and Forms of Procedure as to all civil or criminal matters, subject to the approval

of the Secretary of State.

(2) Until such Rules and Forms have been made, or in relation to matters to which they do not extend, a Court may adopt and use any procedure or forms as were heretofore in use in the Consular Courts in Morocco, or any Regulations or Rules made thereunder and in force immediately before the commencement of this Order, or as are for the time being in use in the Supreme Court of Gibraltar, with any modifications or adaptations which may be necessary.

(3) No proceeding shall be invalidated by any informality, mistake, or omission, so long as, in the opinion of any Court before which any question arises, the essential requisites of law and justice have been com-

plied with.

(4) Provision may, amongst other things, be made by Rules under this Article authorising the Court to grant and enforce searchwarrants, and to enforce awards, and to enforce by distress, or by attachment or commitment, judgments or orders of the Court, or payment of any damages, costs, penalties, fines, or forfeitures, and for the sale of things forfeited, and for garnishee process, and for attachments of property in order to compel appearance or submission to the jurisdiction or process of the Court, and authorising the Court to compel, by fine, distress, or recognisance, or in default of security by commitment, the attendance of witnesses before the Court, or before a Colonial or other Court to which a case is sent for trial, and to take and transmit

depositions of witnesses for use at trials in the United Kingdom or in a British possession, protectorate or mandated territory, and to prescribe forms of indictment or charge in criminal proceedings; and authorising the Court to cause service to be made of writs and other processes of a civil or commercial character on behalf of other tribunals whether situated in Morocco or not, and if outside Morocco whether situated in His Majesty's dominions, protectorates or mandated territories or in any foreign state in amity with His Majesty.

(5) Provision may also be made by Rules made under this Article to prescribe and enforce the fees to be taken in respect of any proceedings under this Order, not exceeding, as regards any matters provided for by the Act of Parliament 6 George IV c. 87, the fees fixed and allowed from time to time by any Order in Council made under that Act, provided that the scales of all fees prescribed under this Article shall have been sanctioned by the Lords Commissioners of

His Majesty's Treasury.

(6) All fees prescribed by or under any Article of this Order shall be paid in local currency at the market rate of exchange for sterling, provided that such rate shall not be such as to require:

(a) in the case of French or Moroccan francs, less than 125 francs to the pound

sterling:

(b) in the case of Spanish pesetas, less than 26 pesetas to the pound sterling; and, if the market rates of exchange for sterling would require less than the amounts of francs or pesetas aforesaid, the rate of exchange for sterling shall be the said rates.

Derbyshire and West Riding of Yorkshire.—An Area comprising:—

So much of the Counties of Derby and the West Riding of Yorkshire, the City and County Borough of Sheffield and the Borough of Glossop as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the Railway Station at Glossop; thence in a southerly direction along the road from Glossop, via Hayfield, Hull End and Chapel Milton to Chapel en le Frith;

thence in a south-easterly direction along the road to Bennetston Hall and thence north-easterly along the road to Sparrowpit; thence in an east-south-easterly direction along the road via Peak Forest, Lane Head, Wardlow Mires, Stony Middleton, Calver and Bridge End to Nether End; thence in an easterly direction along the road via Robinhood, Bleak House, Freebirch, Ingmanthorpe and Cutthorpe to Dunston Hall; thence in a general northerly direction along the road via Instone, Dronfield, Little Norton to Norton Woodseats; thence along Woodseats Road till it meets the London Midland and Scottish Railway that runs from Dore and Totley Station to Sheffield; thence in a north-easterly direction along the said railway to a point near to Victoria Station, Sheffield, where the London and North Eastern Railway lines, which run through Sheffield to Penistone, are carried over the said railway; thence in a north-westerly direction along the London and North Eastern Railway as far as Oughtibridge Station; thence in a westerly direction along the road between Grenoside and Oughtibridge to Oughtibridge; thence in a north-westerly direction via Wharncliffe Side, Deepcar, Stocksbridge, Sheephouse Wood, Langsett to Flouch Inn; thence in a westerly direction via Fiddlers Green and Saltersbrook Bridge, to the point where the road crosses the London and North Eastern Railway from Penistone to Glossop near the western end of Woodhead Tunnel and thence along the London and North Eastern Railway via Growden to Glossop and the point of commencement.

Durham, Westmorland, and North Riding of Yorkshire.—An Area comprising:-

So much of the borough of Appleby and the parishes of Forest and Frith, Newbiggin (Durham), Middleton in Teesdale, Milburn, Long Marton, Dufton, Murton, Warcop, Musgrave, Hillbeck, Brough, Stainmore, Lunedale, Holwick, Mickleton, Romaldkirk, Hunderthwaite, Cotherstone, Lartington, Bowes and Boldron as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at a point where the road from Alston to Middleton in Teesdale crosses the boundary between the counties of Cumberland and Durham near Crookburn Bridge; thence along the said road in a general south-easterly direction via Ashgill Head, Dale House and Newbiggin, to Middleton in Teesdale Church; thence in a south-easterly direction along the foad to Middleton in Teesdale railway station; thence in a south-easterly direction along the London and North Eastern Railway via Romaldkirk to the point where the Middleton in Teesdale branch line joins the Darlington and Tebay branch of the London and North Eastern Railway; thence in a general westerly direction along the Darlington and Tebay branch via Lartington and Bowes to the place where the road from North Stainmore to Barras via Palliard crosses the railway near Bleathgill; thence along the road via Palliard, Slapestone House and North Stainmore to Brough; thence in a north-westerly direction along the road to Appleby via Lowgill Cottage; thence in a northerly direction along the road via Brampton Tower, Long Marton Church, Long Marton railway station and Milburn to a point where the road from Milburn to Blencarn crosses the county boundary between Cumberland and Westmorland; and thence in a general easterly direction along the county boundary to the point of commencement.

Cheshire, Lancashire, Derbyshire, and West Riding of Yorkshire.—An Area comprising:—

The borough of Todmorden and so much of the counties of Chester, Lancaster, Derby, and West Riding of Yorkshire, the county boroughs of Rochdale, Oldham, Huddersfield and Halifax and the boroughs of Stalybridge, Glossop, Ashton under Lyne and Mossley (Manchester) as lies within the following boundary, namely:—
