Now, therefore, in pursuance of the above mentioned Act, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and prescribe that Section 14 of the said Act shall apply to the following monuments which appear to His Majesty to be ancient monuments within the meaning of the said Act.

# ADMIRALTY NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 1 of the year 1934.

## CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING BRITISH PORTS.

### PART I.

#### CLOSING OF PORTS.

*Former Notice.*—No. 1 of 1933; hereby cancelled.

(1) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that it may be necessary to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of the British Isles, or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire, a sharp look-out should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (5), Part II, of this Notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.

(2) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three *red* lights vertically disposed by night, or three *red* balls vertically disposed by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (5), Part II, of this Notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must approach the port with the greatest caution and implicitly obey all orders or signals given them by the Examination vessel or signal station.

(3) At some ports or localities at home or abroad, search-lights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing movable search-lights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above, when search-lights are observed to be working.

### PART II.

#### EXAMINATION SERVICE.

(4) In certain circumstances it is also necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter ports or localities at home or abroad.

(5) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the port and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor. If Government vessels, or vessels belonging to the local port authority, are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels with a view to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the port. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.

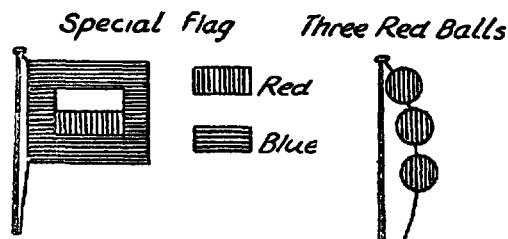
(6) As the institution of the Examination Service will probably be unknown to vessels

desiring to enter the port, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun or sound rocket.

In approaching by night any port in the British Empire, serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient all round lanterns, two *red* and two *white*, are kept available for use.

(7) By day the distinguishing flag of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border).

Also, three red balls vertically disposed if entrance is prohibited.



Usually the Examination Steamers will fly the Blue Ensign, but in certain circumstances they may fly the White Ensign.

By night the steamer will carry:—

(a) Three *red* lights vertically disposed if entrance is prohibited.

(b) Three *white* lights vertically disposed if entrance is permitted.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

(8) Merchant vessels approaching a British Port at which the Examination Service is in force, must hoist their signal letters on arriving within visual signal distance of the port, and are not to wait for the signal "What ship is that?" to be made from the Examination Steamer.

(9) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any port when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions given to them by the Examination Steamer.

Whilst at anchor in the Examination Anchorage, Masters are warned that it is forbidden, except for the purpose of avoiding accident, to do any of the following things, without permission from the Examining Officer:—

To lower any boat.

To communicate with the shore or with other ships.

To move the ship.

To work cables.

To allow any person or thing to leave the ship.

(10) In case of fog, Masters are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the port should be approached with caution.

(11) When the Examination Service is in force merchant vessels when approaching ports are especially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description, either by day or night; the use of them will render a vessel liable to be fired on.

(12) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

## PART III.

## MINE-SWEEPING OPERATIONS.

H.M. Vessels engaged in mine-sweeping operations or exercises are hampered to a considerable extent in their manoeuvring powers.

With a view to indicating the nature of the work on which they are engaged, these vessels will show the signals hereinafter mentioned. For the public safety all other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, should endeavour to keep out of the way of vessels flying these signals and not approach them inside the distances mentioned herein, specially remembering that it is dangerous to pass between the vessels of a pair or group sweeping together.

## 1. SIGNALS SHOWN BY DAY.

## (a) By vessels working singly:

A black ball at the foremast head, and a similar ball at the yard-arm, or where it can best be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous to pass. (If a ball is shown at each yard-arm it is dangerous to pass either side.)

Vessels showing this signal should not be approached nearer than 900 yards.

## (b) By vessels working in pairs or groups:

A black ball at the foremast head, and a similar ball at the yard-arm, or where it can best be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous to pass.

Vessels should not pass within a distance of 400 yards astern of a pair or group of sweepers, or when more than one pair or group are working in company within a distance of 400 yards astern of the rear pair or group. They should on no account attempt to pass between pairs or groups working in company.

## 2. SIGNALS SHOWN BY NIGHT.

As for day, except that all round green lights will be used in a similar manner to and in place of the black balls.

## BRITISH ISLES AND NORTH SEA.

## GENERAL INFORMATION REGARDING MINES.

*Former Notice.*—No. 6 of 1933 [TEMPORARY]; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are informed that floating mines may occasionally be met with. They may be either dummy (British) mines, or mines

originally laid prior to November, 1918, either British or Foreign.

2. British *Dummy mines* are filled with sand, or some similar substance instead of explosive, and have the words "Sand filled" painted in large white letters round the top mouthpiece. The same words are also stamped on the top and bottom annular rings.

3. *Mines laid prior to November 1918.*—All evidence goes to show that these mines are innocuous to any ship that may bump them after this lapse of time. They are also safe for any ordinary handling, such as hoisting inboard and landing on deck, rolling over, etc. No attempt, however, should be made to open one, or remove parts of it, except by a skilled Naval rating.

4. *Recovery of floating mines.*—In order that valuable dummy mines, that may have broken adrift from their moorings, may be returned to the authorities, the Admiralty will pay rewards for the recovery of *floating mines* adrift from their moorings, as follows:—

(a) For the recovery of a *floating mine* found at two miles or less distance from the coast and delivery to the local authority in the United Kingdom: Two pounds.

(b) For the recovery of a *floating mine* found at more than two miles from the coast and delivery to the local authority in the United Kingdom: Five pounds.

(c) For the first report of a mine washed up on shore: Ten shillings.

5. Beyond the awards quoted at (a), (b) and (c) above, no payment is made for loss, material damage, loss of earnings, or other damage incurred in the salvage of a mine.

6. The Admiralty pay no award in respect of *sunken mines* brought up in fishing trawls, nor is compensation payable for damage to trawls.

CAUTION WITH REGARD TO SINGLE SHIPS  
APPROACHING SQUADRONS OR AIRCRAFT CARRIERS.

*Former Notice.*—No. 7 of 1933.

1. The attention of shipowners and mariners is called to the danger to all concerned which is caused by single vessels approaching a squadron of Warships so closely as to involve risk of collision, or attempting to pass ahead of, or through such a squadron.

2. Mariners are warned that it would be in the interests of safety for single vessels to adopt early measures to avoid approaching a squadron under the above conditions so as to involve risk of collision and to keep out of its way.

3. Attention is also drawn to the uncertainty of the movements of Aircraft Carriers which must necessarily turn into the wind when aircraft are taking off or landing.

4. In circumstances where a single vessel has not taken early measures to keep out of the way of a squadron or Aircraft Carrier, the "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea" must be the guide.

*Note.*—This Notice is a repetition of the former Notice quoted above.

So much of the borough of Sutton Coldfield as was transferred thereto from the parishes of Great Barr and Shenstone by the Sutton Coldfield Corporation Act, 1930, and from the parish of Minworth by the Birmingham and Sutton Coldfield Order, 1931;

So much of the urban district of Solihull as lies—

(1) between the existing limits and an imaginary line commencing south-westerly at the east end of the co-terminous boundary of the city and the said district and continuing along the boundary of the parish of Elmdon as constituted immediately before the Warwickshire Review Order, 1932, thence along the centres of the stream rising east of Olton Farm and north of Billsmore Wood and its south tributary to its source thence to and along the south sides of the two parcels between the said tributary and Lode Lane to the fordrough leading to Row-wood Farm thence to and along the centres of the said fordrough and Lode Lane to the centre of Dove House Road thence direct to a point 200 feet south-east of Dove House Road and 200 feet west of Lode Lane thence parallel to Dove House Road thence along the back fences of the houses fronting the east side of Heaton Road thence south-easterly parallel to and 275 feet north-east of Warwick Road for a distance of about 160 yards thence direct to a point on the east boundary of the Great Western Railway (Oxford and Birmingham) about 85 yards south of Wadleys Lane thence along the last-mentioned boundary to a point about 380 yards north of Wadleys Lane thence direct to a point in the centre of Street's Brook 225 feet south of Grange Road thence parallel to Grange Road thence parallel to and 440 feet east of St. Bernard's Road for a distance of about 720 yards thence direct to and along the west side of Brown's Coppice thence westerly parallel to and 165 feet south of Street's Brook Road thence southerly parallel to and 150 feet east of the said co-terminous boundary for a distance of about 360 yards thence direct to and terminating at the point in the said co-terminous boundary on the north-east kerb line of Stratford Road; and

(2) between the parish of Wythall and an imaginary line commencing at the co-terminous boundary of the city and the said district where prior to the construction of the Great Western Railway (Birmingham and North Warwickshire) part of the River Cole entered the parish of Yardley as constituted immediately before the Birmingham (Extension) Order, 1911, and continuing westerly to and thence along the left bank of the River Cole thence south-easterly along the south-west side of the Stratford-on-Avon Canal thence

parallel to and 200 feet north of the portion of The Draw Bridge east of the said canal to a point 200 feet east of Haselucks Green Road thence southerly parallel to Haselucks Green Road thence along the south-west side of the said canal thence along the east boundary of the parish of Solihull as constituted immediately before the Warwickshire Review Order, 1932, to and terminating at the co-terminous boundary of the said district and the parish of Tanworth;

**In the Rural District of Meriden—**

So much of the parish of Castle Bromwich as was transferred thereto from the parish of Minworth by the Birmingham and Sutton Coldfield Order, 1931;

**In the rural district of Stratford-on-Avon—**

So much of the parish of Tanworth as was transferred thereto from the parish of Solihull by the Warwickshire Review Order, 1932;

**In the County of Worcester—**

So much of the urban district of Halesowen as lies between the city and/or the parish of Illey and an imaginary line commencing at the co-terminous boundary of the said parish and the parish of Lapal and continuing parallel to and 200 feet south-west of the unnamed lane leading from Lye Close Lane to Lapal Lane thence parallel to and 200 feet from the said boundary to the north-east side of the said unnamed lane thence parallel to and 200 feet from Lye Close Lane Watery Lane and Highfield Lane to and terminating at the co-terminous boundary of the city and the said district;

So much of the urban district of Oldbury not being within the existing limits as lies to the south-east of—

(1) an imaginary line commencing at the point in the co-terminous boundary of the city and the said district about 63 yards from the west end of the said boundary and continuing direct to a point about 239 yards north and 377 yards east respectively of datum lines drawn east and north from the point of commencement thence tangentially along an arc to a point about 427 yards north and 736 yards east respectively of the said datum lines thence tangentially along an arc to a point about 470 yards north and 795 yards east respectively of the said datum lines thence direct and tangentially to and terminating at the curve in the centre line of Perryhill Crescent about midway along the said crescent; and

(2) the centre line of Norman Road;

**In the rural district of Bromsgrove—**

So much of the parish of Alvechurch as lies—

(1) between the parish of Wythall and an imaginary line commencing at the co-terminous boundary of the said parishes of Alvechurch and Wythall and continuing parallel to and 200 feet from Watery Lane and Brockhill Lane to and terminating at the said boundary; and

(2) between the city and/or the parish of Wythall and an imaginary line commencing at the co-terminous boundary of the said

parishes of Alvechurch and Wythall and continuing parallel to and 200 feet from Brockhill Lane thence parallel to and 200 feet south of Clewshaw Lane to a point 200 feet west of Icknield Street thence parallel to Icknield Street thence parallel to and 200 feet south-west of Redhill Road to the west side of the parcel above Wasthill Tunnel thence along the west side of the said parcel to the north side of the adjoining parcel above Wasthill Tunnel thence along the north sides of the last-mentioned parcel and of the parcel between it and Wasthills Lane thence at right angles to Wasthills Lane thence parallel to and 200 feet west of Wasthills Lane thence parallel to and 200 feet from Redhill Road to a point about 30 yards south-east of Redditch Road thence to and terminating at the nearest point in the co-terminous boundary of the city and the said rural district;

So much of the parish of Beoley as lies between the parish of Wythall and an imaginary line commencing at the co-terminous boundary of the said rural district and the rural district of Stratford-on-Avon and continuing parallel to and 200 feet from Watery Lane to and terminating at the co-terminous boundary of the said parishes;

So much of the parish of Frankley as lies between the city and an imaginary line commencing at the co-terminous boundary of the city and the said rural district south-east of Balaam's Wood and continuing parallel to and 200 feet from Bedlam Lane thence along the centres of the southern portions of New Road and Frogmill Lane thence easterly parallel to and 200 feet from Bedlam Lane to and terminating at the said boundary;

[Dimensions are scaled from the 25-inch Map of Great Britain—second revision];

and to authorise the Corporation to exercise within the areas hereinbefore described all or some of the powers exercisable by them in respect of their gas undertaking within the said existing limits, and to exclude from the limits for the supply of gas of the Smethwick Corporation, the Oldbury Urban District Council, the Halesowen Gas Company, the Lichfield Gas Company, the Redditch Gas Company and the Solihull Gas Company so much of the areas above described as is within the existing limits of those respective authorities and companies.

(2) To exclude from the Corporation's limits for the supply of gas parts of the borough of Smethwick and the urban district of Oldbury.

(3) To empower the Corporation to delegate to the Committee of the Council appointed to deal with gas supply all or any of the powers and duties of the Corporation which may be conferred by the Order.

(4) To repeal, alter or amend, or to re-enact or incorporate in the Order, with or without amendment, some or all of the provisions of the Acts and Orders relating to the supply of gas by the Corporation.

(5) To incorporate with the Order, with or without modification or to render inapplicable to the Corporation or their undertaking all or some of the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, and the Interpretation Act, 1889, and any Acts amending, altering, repealing or re-enacting the same.

(6) To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or interfere with the purposes of the Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 9th day of February, 1934.

Any such objection shall state:—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection must be forwarded to the undermentioned Town Clerk or Parliamentary Agents at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.

Printed copies of the draft Order, together with copies of an Ordnance Map on a scale of one inch to the mile showing the existing gas-works of the Corporation and the boundaries of the proposed area of supply and of the area in which the Corporation are already authorised to supply gas have been deposited for public inspection at the offices of the undermentioned Town Clerk at the Council House, Birmingham, and with the Clerk of the Peace of the City of Birmingham at his offices at Birmingham, the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Warwick at his offices in Warwick, with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Worcester at his offices in Worcester and with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Stafford at his offices in Stafford.

#### THAMES CONSERVANCY.

**NOTICE** is hereby given that the Conservators of the River Thames propose to make the following Bye-laws for the Regulation of the River Thames above the Landward Limit of the Port of London and of the Navigation thereof and for other purposes.

**BYE-LAWS FOR THE REGULATION OF THE RIVER THAMES ABOVE THE LANDWARD LIMIT OF THE PORT OF LONDON AND OF THE NAVIGATION THEREOF AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, MADE BY THE CONSERVATORS OF THE RIVER THAMES IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS AND AUTHORITY VESTED IN THEM BY THE THAMES CONSERVANCY ACT, 1932, AND OF EVERY OTHER POWER OR AUTHORITY THEM THEREUNTO ENABLING.**

##### PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the "Thames Conservancy (Navigation and

General) Bye-laws, 1934," and shall come into operation the day after the same are confirmed by the Minister of Transport.

2. The Thames Bye-laws, 1898, so far as the same relate to the Thames as hereinafter defined are hereby repealed.

3. These Bye-laws shall be applicable to:—

(a) so much of the Rivers Thames and Isis as is between the east side of the Town Bridge at Cricklade in the county of Wilts and an imaginary straight line drawn from high-water mark on the bank of the River Thames at the boundary line between the Parishes of Teddington and Twickenham in the county of Middlesex to high-water mark on the Surrey bank of the river immediately opposite the last hereinbefore mentioned point; and

(b) so much of the River Kennet as is between the River Thames and an imaginary straight line drawn from a point on the north bank of the River Kennet seventy yards eastward of the east side of the High Bridge at Reading in the County of Berks to a point on the south bank of the River Kennet, immediately opposite the last hereinbefore mentioned point;

and all locks, cuts and works within the said portions of rivers: Provided that no dock, lock, canal or cut existing at the 17th day of August, 1894, and constructed under the authority of Parliament and belonging to any body corporate established under such authority and no bridge over the River Thames or the River Kennet belonging to or vested in any county council municipal authority railway company or any company body or person other than the Conservators shall be deemed to form part of the Thames.

4. In these Bye-laws the following words and expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction, namely:—

"The Thames" or "the river" means and includes those parts of the Rivers Thames and Isis and Kennet respectively to which these Bye-laws are made applicable;

"The Act of 1932" means the Thames Conservancy Act, 1932;

"Mechanically propelled vessel" means any vessel propelled by steam electricity or other mechanical power and includes a petrol motor launch as hereinafter defined;

"Petrol motor launch" means any vessel propelled by an internal combustion engine using motor spirit consisting of any inflammable hydrocarbon either alone or in admixture with any other liquid which is capable of providing the necessary motive power not being used solely as a tug or for the carriage of goods and not being certified by the Board of Trade as a passenger steamer to carry two hundred or more passengers;

"Lighter" includes any barge or other like craft for carrying goods. A sailing barge shall be deemed to be a lighter when her mast and gear are lowered on deck;

"Dredger" includes any vessel equipped with machinery for the purpose of dredging and whether self-propelled or not;

"Vessel" includes any ship lighter keel barge launch house-boat pleasure or other boat randan wherry skiff dinghy shallop punt canoe yacht raft float of timber or craft whatsoever however navigated.

"Whistle" means an efficient steam whistle or siren sounded by steam (or by some substitute for steam) or an efficient electric horn (of a pattern approved by the Conservators) capable of sounding a short blast and a prolonged blast as hereinafter defined;

"Short blast" means a blast of about one second's duration;

"Prolonged blast" means a blast of from four to six seconds' duration;

"Under way" means not at anchor moored berthed or aground;

"Visible" means visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere at a distance of at least one mile;

"By day" means between sunrise and sunset;

"By night" means between sunset and sunrise;

Except as hereinbefore otherwise provided words and expressions to which a special meaning is assigned by the Act of 1932 have respectively the same meaning in these Bye-laws as they have in the said Act.

## PART II.—NAVIGATION.

### (a) LIGHTS AND OTHER VISUAL SIGNALS FOR MECHANICALLY PROPELLED VESSELS (INCLUDING PETROL MOTOR LAUNCHES) AND OTHER VESSELS.

5. The master of every vessel shall comply with the provisions of these Bye-laws as to visual signals in all weathers as to lights by night and as to other visual signals by day, and during such times no other lights or other visual signals which may be mistaken for or impair the visibility of the lights or other visual signals prescribed by these Bye-laws shall be exhibited.

6. (a) A mechanically propelled vessel (other than a launch registered under the Act of 1932) when under way by night shall exhibit:—

(i) On or before the foremast or (if there be no foremast) on the funnel or on a staff at the bow and in either case at a height above the hull of not less than four feet a visible bright white light so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of twenty points of the compass and so fixed as to throw the light ten points on each side of the vessel, viz.:—from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on either side;

(ii) On the starboard (or right) side a visible green light so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of ten points of the compass and so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the starboard (or right) side.

(iii) On the port (or left) side a visible red light so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of ten points of the compass and so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the port (or left) side.

(b) A mechanically propelled vessel when towing another vessel or when attached to

another vessel for the purpose of towing or manoeuvring the same shall exhibit in addition to the lights hereinbefore prescribed a second white light in the like position (as nearly as may be) and of the like character and construction as either the white light mentioned in paragraph (a) of this Bye-law or (in the case of a launch registered under the Act of 1932) the white light mentioned in section 9. of the Act of 1932.

7. Every mechanically propelled vessel shall by night exhibit a white light on the approach of an overtaking vessel in sufficient time to prevent collision.

8. The master of a mechanically propelled vessel shall not by night commence to tow any lighter unless a white light is exhibited on the stern or after part of such lighter. Provided that if more than one such lighter is being towed astern of a mechanically propelled vessel in line either singly or abreast the white light above referred to shall be exhibited on the stern or after part of the sternmost or last of such line and shall not be exhibited on more than one of such lighters.

9. Every vessel aground in the fairway or mid-channel or employed to mark the position of a wreck or of any other obstruction shall exhibit where the same may best be seen by day a green flag and by night two visible bright white lights from globular lanterns not less than eight inches in diameter placed horizontally not less than six or more than twelve feet apart.

10.—(a) Every steam dredger at anchor or moored in the Thames for the purpose of dredging shall by night exhibit three visible bright white lights from globular lanterns not less than eight inches in diameter placed in a triangular form with the apex uppermost at right angles to the keel and not less than six feet apart on the highest part of the framework athwartships.

(b) Every steam dredger shall exhibit by day a white flag on her free or clear side and a red flag on the side where chains or other obstructions exist.

### (b) SOUND SIGNALS FOR MECHANICALLY PROPELLED VESSELS (INCLUDING PETROL MOTOR LAUNCHES).

11.—(a) All sound signals prescribed by these Bye-laws shall be given on the whistle and shall not be used on any occasion or for any purpose except those therein mentioned or those from time to time authorised by the Conservators and no other signal by whistle shall be given or used.

(b) Every mechanically-propelled vessel shall be provided with an efficient whistle so placed that the sound may not be intercepted by any obstruction.

12. When vessels are in sight of one another a mechanically propelled vessel under way and taking any of the courses hereinafter mentioned shall indicate that course by the following signals on her whistle, namely:—

One short blast to mean "I am directing my course to starboard" (i.e., to the right).

Two short blasts to mean "I am directing my course to port" (i.e., to the left).

Three short blasts to mean "My engines are going astern."



13. When a mechanically propelled vessel under way (which includes a tug with a tow) is about to turn round she shall signify the same by four short blasts on the whistle in rapid succession followed after a short interval if turning with her head to starboard (or right) by one short blast, and if with her head to port (or left) by two short blasts; and whilst turning shall repeat such signal to any approaching vessel which latter vessel shall take action to avoid collision.

14. When a mechanically propelled vessel under way is for any reason not under command or is unable to manoeuvre as required by these Bye-laws she shall signify the same to any approaching vessel by four short blasts on the whistle in rapid succession and thereupon such approaching vessel shall take action to avoid collision.

15. When a mechanically propelled vessel under way takes the ground she shall immediately signify the same to any approaching vessel by five or more short blasts on the whistle in rapid succession and shall repeat such signals at short intervals until she shall have exhibited the lights or day marks prescribed by Bye-law 9 hereof.

16. In fog, mist, falling snow, heavy rain-storms or other exceptional causes affecting visibility, whether by day or by night, the sound signals described in this Bye-law shall be used as follows:—

(a) A mechanically propelled vessel having way upon her shall sound at intervals of not more than two minutes one prolonged blast;

(b) A mechanically propelled vessel under way but stopped and having no way upon her shall sound at intervals of not more than two minutes two prolonged blasts with an interval of about one second between them;

(c) A mechanically propelled vessel when towing shall sound at intervals of not more than two minutes three blasts in succession, namely:—

One prolonged blast followed by two short blasts. A vessel towed may give this signal and she shall not give any other;

(d) A mechanically propelled vessel under way and about to turn round and whilst turning shall sound at intervals of not more than two minutes four short blasts in rapid succession followed if turning with her head to starboard (or right) by one short blast and if with her head to port (or left) by two short blasts;

(e) A mechanically propelled vessel under way which for any reason is not under command or which is unable to manoeuvre as required by these Bye-laws shall sound at intervals of not more than two minutes four short blasts in rapid succession.

(c) STEERING, SAILING AND SPEED.

17. The master of every vessel shall keep or cause to be kept a proper look-out and shall observe any precaution which may be required by the ordinary practice of seamen or watermen or by the special circumstances of the case particularly in times of flood or other dangerous conditions of navigation.

18. The master of every vessel in obeying these Bye-laws shall have due regard to all dangers of navigation and collision and to any

special circumstances which may render a departure from the Bye-laws necessary in order to avoid danger.

19. When a mechanically propelled vessel and a sailing vessel are proceeding in such directions as to involve risk of collision the mechanically propelled vessel shall keep out of the way of the sailing vessel.

20.—(a) Every mechanically propelled vessel proceeding up or down the river shall, when it is safe and practicable, be navigated in the fairway or mid-channel and shall keep to that side of the fairway or mid-channel which lies on the starboard (or right) side of such vessel.

(b) When two mechanically propelled vessels proceeding in opposite directions, the one up and the other down the river, are approaching each other so as to involve risk of collision they shall pass port (or left) side to port (or left) side unless the special circumstances of the case make departure from this Bye-law necessary.

21. Every mechanically propelled vessel navigating against the stream shall (if necessary in order to avoid risk of collision) ease her speed or stop on approaching or when rounding a point or sharp bend so as to allow any vessel navigating with the stream to pass clear of her.

22. Every mechanically propelled vessel navigating against the stream shall (if necessary) on approaching a bridge ease her speed or stop in order to avoid risk of collision with another vessel or another vessel and her tow navigating with the stream approaching or passing under the same bridge.

23. Every mechanically propelled vessel which is directed by these Bye-laws to keep out of the way of another vessel shall on approaching her, if necessary, slacken her speed or stop or reverse.

24. When two sailing vessels are approaching one another so as to involve risk of collision one of them shall keep out of the way of the other, namely:—

(a) A vessel which is running free shall keep out of the way of a vessel which is close-hauled.

(b) A vessel which is close-hauled on the port tack (i.e. tacking to the right) shall keep out of the way of a vessel which is close-hauled on the starboard tack (i.e. tacking to the left).

(c) When both are running free with the wind on different sides the vessel which has the wind on the port (or left) side shall keep out of the way of the other.

(d) When both are running free with the wind on the same side the vessel which is to windward shall keep out of the way of the vessel which is to leeward.

(e) A vessel which has the wind aft shall keep out of the way of the other vessel.

25. Subject to the provisions of Bye-law 19 hereof (Mechanically propelled vessel to keep out of the way of sailing vessel) every vessel crossing from one side of the river towards the other side shall do so at a proper time having regard to vessels navigating up and down the river, and shall be navigated so as not to cause obstruction, injury, or damage to any other vessel.

26. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Bye-laws every vessel overtaking any



other vessel shall keep out of the way of such vessel.

27. Where by any of these Bye-laws one of the two vessels is to keep out of the way the other shall, when it is safe and practicable, keep her course and speed.

28. Every vessel which is directed by these Bye-laws to keep out of the way of another vessel shall, if the circumstances of the case admit, avoid crossing ahead of the other.

29. Every vessel shall in fog, mist, falling snow, or heavy rainstorms, whether by day or night, be navigated with careful regard to the existing circumstances and conditions.

(d) MISCELLANEOUS.

30.—(a) All vessels under way shall be navigated singly and separately except vessels towed alongside or astern of mechanically propelled vessels.

(b) A mechanically propelled vessel may tow another vessel secured alongside of her but shall not at any time tow more than one vessel in such manner.

(c) Vessels towed below Long Ditton Ferry may be placed in a single line but shall not be placed more than two abreast (except vessels not exceeding fourteen feet nine inches in width which may be placed three abreast when not in a lock) and not more than six of any such vessels shall be towed together at the same time.

(d) Vessels towed above Long Ditton Ferry shall be placed in a single line and not more than four such vessels shall be towed together at the same time.

Provided that nothing in this Bye-law contained shall prejudice or affect any Bye-laws of the Conservators for the time being in force relating to the towing of vessels carrying petroleum or petroleum spirit as defined by the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act 1928.

*Number of persons to navigate lighters.*

31.—(a) A lighter when under way shall have at least one competent man constantly on board for the navigation and management thereof, and a lighter exceeding fifty tons but of not more than one hundred and fifty tons burden shall when under way have one man in addition constantly on board, and a lighter exceeding one hundred and fifty tons burden shall when under way have two men in addition constantly on board to assist in the navigation and the management of the same.

Provided that where a lighter is in tow of a mechanically propelled vessel or is being moved between any vessels or places a distance not exceeding two hundred yards one competent man on such lighter shall be sufficient.

(b) In this Bye-law the word "burden" means burden tonnage as ascertained in accordance with the Rules specified in the Schedule hereto.

(c) Where any offence against this Bye-law is committed, the owner or the hirer (if any) of the lighter and (when the lighter is in tow of a mechanically propelled vessel) the master of such vessel shall be liable to be proceeded against. Provided that such owner (or hirer as the case may be) and such master be not both punished in respect of the same offence.

32.—(a) No vessel shall be towed from the bank otherwise than from a mast of sufficient height to protect the banks, gates, and works

from injury by the tow-rope except in places where the strength of the stream renders it necessary that the line should be brought down to the vessel and made fast.

(b) When two vessels each being towed from the bank but proceeding in opposite directions approach each other the vessel proceeding downstream shall pass outside the other vessel.

33. No vessel shall enter any lock unless there be sufficient water to float and carry such vessel through such lock and through the channel or cut leading to and from the same and no vessel shall stop in any lock longer than is necessary for the filling or emptying of the lock and for the passage of the vessel through the same.

34. No vessel shall enter any lock with sail hoisted nor shall during the time she continues to be in a lock hoist any sail.

35. When any lighter or mechanically propelled vessel enters a lock a rope or chain shall be immediately put out from the bow and stern of such vessel and made fast on shore in order to prevent the vessels from running foul of the gates or works or other vessels in the lock.

36. On the occasion of any boat-race regatta public procession or launch of a vessel or on any other occasion when large crowds assemble on the river no vessel shall pass thereon so as to obstruct impede or interfere with such boat-race procession or launch or to endanger the safety of persons assembling on the river or to prevent or interfere with the maintenance of order thereon.

37. Every vessel when navigating or lying in the river shall carry her anchor in such a position as not to cause injury or damage to any other vessel.

38.—(a) No vessel shall (except with the consent of the Conservators) be anchored moored berthed or otherwise stopped in such a position as to impede the clear and free passage of any other vessel or otherwise to obstruct the navigation of the river or the use of the towing-path thereof;

(b) When any vessel is anchored moored or stopped in front of the towing path the mast towing-mast or funnel (if any) as the case may be shall be lowered so as to permit the towing lines of any vessel to pass without obstruction and the vessel shall be securely made fast head and stern and shall be laid as close to and along the bank of such towing-path as conveniently may be.

39.—(a) For the prevention of annoyance to any occupier of a riparian residence the Conservators from time to time as occasion requires may by resolution mark off or define any part or parts of the Thames in which no houseboat or launch shall loiter or delay and the Conservators may alter vary and rescind any such resolution:

(b) No houseboat or launch shall loiter or delay in any part of the Thames for the time being marked off or defined by the Conservators as aforesaid Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply to the loitering or delay of any houseboat or launch in any such part or parts of the river marked off or defined as aforesaid during any regatta boat-race procession or other special occasion for such length of time as may be sanctioned by the Conservators.

40. No mechanically propelled vessel attached to any moorings mooring-buoy mooring-post dolphin jetty wharf or landing-place shall work her engines so that injury or damage may be caused to such moorings mooring-buoy mooring-post dolphin jetty wharf or landing-place or any vessel or thing whatsoever.

### PART III.—GENERAL.

41. The master of every vessel which has slipped parted from or lost any anchor cable or propeller shall forthwith give notice thereof and of the position of such anchor cable or propeller to the Conservators.

This Bye-law shall not apply to vessels belonging to the Conservators employed in raising a wreck or to any wreck in charge of the Conservators.

42.—(a) The master of every vessel which through accident or other similar cause has sunk or is stranded in the river shall forthwith give to the Lock-keeper at the nearest lock on the Thames notice thereof and of the position of such vessel.

(b) No rye-peck or punt pole shall be left fixed in the Thames.

43. No master of any vessel shall load or discharge any cargo ballast fuel refuse or rubbish any part of which is liable in the course of such loading or discharging to fall into the river without taking such precautions by affixing canvas or tarpaulins or other suitable material or thing as shall effectually prevent any such cargo ballast fuel refuse or rubbish from falling into the river.

44. No advertisement or advertising notice shall be exhibited upon or by means of any vessel or otherwise on or over the Thames except advertisements or notices by the owner of any vessel on such vessel for the purposes of or in reference to his trade or business as an owner builder or repairer of vessels. The expression "owner" in this Bye-law means the person whose name appears in the certificate of registration of such vessel.

45. No person shall ride drive place or leave any motor car or motor cycle cart carriage wagon cycle or any other vehicle of any description or any horse over or upon any towpath of the Thames (not being a towpath over which there is a public right of way for vehicles). Provided that:—

(a) this Bye-law shall not apply to any person riding or driving a horse used for the purpose of towing a vessel or to any person riding a horse when engaged in coaching a person or persons practising rowing for races;

(b) nothing in this Bye-law contained shall take away or diminish any existing right of any riparian owner in any towpath who in the exercise of any such right causes no obstruction or damage to such towpath so as to interfere with the use therefore for towing;

(c) this Bye-law shall not apply to any person riding a cycle (other than a motor-cycle) who causes no obstruction or damage to the towpath so as to interfere with the use thereof for towing. Provided that this exception shall not confer or be deemed to confer upon any person any right to ride a cycle over or upon any towpath of the Thames where such right does not exist;

(d) this Bye-law shall not apply to any towpath which passes over any public walk or pleasure ground in the Boroughs of Reading and Henley-on-Thames respectively and under the control of the Councils of the said Boroughs respectively.

46. No person shall while using or while in upon or about the Thames or the banks or the towing-paths thereof or any land of the Conservators do any of the acts hereinafter specified (that is to say):—

(1) Commit any offence against decency or be intoxicated or otherwise behave in a disorderly manner;

(2) Beg for or gather alms;

(3) Dress or undress except behind an efficient shelter or screen;

(4) Bathe without wearing proper rowing costume or University bathing costume. Provided that this provision shall not apply to a person bathing before the hour of eight in the morning and wearing bathing drawers;

(5) Bathe at any place where bathing is for the time being prohibited by the Conservators;

(6) Make use of obscene scandalous or abusive language to any officer of the Conservators whilst employed in the due execution of his duties or to the annoyance of any person using the Thames or the banks or the towpaths thereof or any of the locks works or other property of the Conservators;

(7) Throw at or wilfully cause to fall upon or strike any vessel on the Thames or any person using the Thames or the banks or towpaths thereof or any land of the Conservators any stone or other thing or do any other act which may cause danger to any person or property or occasion a nuisance obstruction or annoyance to any person or which may otherwise injuriously affect the safety or amenity of the Thames;

(8) Light maintain throw down place or leave any fire or any combustible flaming smouldering or burning substance matter or thing in any place where the same may cause danger or damage to property of any kind or annoyance to any person;

(9) Move injure or deface any notice or notice board the property of or in charge of the Conservators or set up by them or with their consent;

(10) Take destroy search for or disturb the nest or egg of any bird or kill injure take catch or trap or attempt to kill injure take catch or trap any animal or bird or the young of any animal or bird. Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to prevent any person employed by the Conservators or acting with their consent from killing vermin or affect any right of fowling hunting or sporting existing on the 16th day of June, 1932;

(11) Destroy or injure any flowering or other plant or any shrub vegetation tree wood or underwood;

(12) Deposit or leave any bottle tin container broken glass or crockery waste paper or other like article or thing.

47. No person shall without the previous express request or consent of the ferry-man first obtained take away or use any ferry-

boat belonging to the Conservators or any pole or tackle belonging to such ferry.

48. No person shall without the previous express request or consent of the lock-keeper first obtained use interfere or meddle with the gear at any lock or weir or with any sluice belonging to the Conservators.

49.—(a) The owner and the master of every vessel on the River above Teddington Lock shall take every precaution for the prevention of sewage or any other offensive or injurious matter whether solid or fluid being allowed to flow or pass into the River from such vessel and (subject as hereinafter mentioned) where any such vessel is fitted with sanitary arrangements or appliances such arrangements or appliances shall be so designed constructed and at all times maintained as to prevent any such flow or passage as aforesaid.

(b) The owner or the master of every vessel entering the Thames above Teddington Lock and then already fitted with sanitary arrangements or appliances so designed or constructed as to permit of the flow or passage into the River of sewage or other matter aforesaid shall without delay give notice to the Lock-keeper at the lock on the Thames nearest to the point of such entry specifying the nature of the arrangements aforesaid and shall upon being requested by such Lock-keeper or other officer of the Conservators so to do afford to such officer facilities for the taking by him of such steps by way of sealing or otherwise as may be reasonably necessary for preventing the flow or passage into the River of sewage or other matter aforesaid from the vessel and so long as the vessel remains on the River above Teddington Lock no interference or alteration shall be made with the sealing or other steps so taken as aforesaid except with the approval of the Conservators.

The expressions "sanitary arrangements" and "sanitary appliances" in this Bye-law include any device or apparatus for the reception of sewage or of any household refuse or of rubbish of any kind whether solid or fluid.

50. The master of every vessel shall obey and conform to the directions of every officer of the Conservators relating to the navigation mooring or unmooring of such vessel.

51. The owner or occupier of a mill intending to draw down the water at the mill for the repair of such mill or of any flood-gates or other works belonging thereto or for the purpose of cleansing the mill stream shall (except in case of sudden emergency) give to the Conservators not less than seven days' previous notice in writing of his intention so to do.

52. No person while on board a vessel shall enter or be in any lock wearing less than full rowing costume or full University bathing costume.

53. Any person acting in contravention of any of these Bye-laws shall for every such act be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty not exceeding the like amount which said penalties shall be recoverable enforced and applied according to the provisions of the Act of 1932.

#### SCHEDULE.

Rules for ascertaining Tonnage of Craft for the purposes of the Bye-law of which the

marginal note is "Number of Persons to navigate lighters."

#### 1. Measure—

(a) Length of craft over all.

(b) Width of craft over all amidships deducting 2 inches each side for outwales or rubbing pieces; and

(c) Depth of craft amidships from under-side of deck or gunwale plank to upper side of ceiling.

2. Multiply together length width and depth of craft as so ascertained and the product by the factor 0.8 (decimal 8) and divide the result by 100.

3. The result so obtained to be deemed to be the tonnage of the craft by measurement; and

4. The tonnage by measurement of the craft multiplied by five-thirds to be deemed the weight-carrying capacity or burden tonnage of the craft.

And notice is hereby further given that the said Conservators of the River Thames will during the period of six weeks from the date of this Notice afford to all persons the opportunity of making in writing or otherwise objections to or representations respecting such proposed Bye-laws and will thereafter proceed to take all such objections and representations into consideration.

#### THE MIDDLESEX COUNTY COUNCIL.

##### ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

**W**HEREAS in pursuance of Section 46 (1) of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, the Middlesex County Council have made application to the Minister of Transport for an Order to be made by him, the effect of which is:—

To prohibit, subject to such exceptions or conditions as to occasional user or otherwise, as may be specified in the Order, the driving of heavy and light locomotives, motor tractors, heavy motor cars (as defined, respectively, by Section 2 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930), and motor cars with a seating capacity exceeding seven persons, exclusive of the driver, on Cedars Road and Vicarage Road in the Urban District of Hampton Wick.

Provided that nothing in the Order shall prevent the driving upon the said roads of—

(i) any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said roads;

(ii) any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement

or reconstruction of the said roads, or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said roads, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports.
