ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY OF EAST SUFFOLK.

CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

Order for the alteration of Coroners' Districts.

Whereas on the 24th May, 1933, a vacancy occurred in the office of Franchise Coroner for the Liberty of St. Etheldreda in the administrative county of East Suffolk:

And whereas by the operation of Section 4 (1) of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, any area in which the Franchise Coroner had jurisdiction thereupon for all purposes relating to coroners became merged in the said county:

And whereas by Section 4 (2) of the said Act it is provided that where any area in which a Franchise Coroner had jurisdiction is merged in a county which is divided into coroners' districts, any consequential alteration of the division of the county into coroners' districts shall be effected in manner provided by the Act:

And whereas the administrative county of East Suffolk, exclusive of the Liberty of the Duke of Norfolk, is now divided into two coroners' districts known as the Lowestoft and Stowmarket districts:

And whereas the council of the said county has pursuant to Section 12 of the said Act and to the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order providing for the alteration of the existing division of the said county into coroners' districts:

Now therefore I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by Section 12 of the said Act, do hereby order that the administrative county of East Suffolk, exclusive of the Liberty of the Duke of Norfolk which Liberty consists of the Parishes named in the Second Schedule hereto, shall be divided into three coroners' districts to be known as the Northern, Southern and Eastern districts comprising the parishes named in the First Schedule hereto.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of February, 1934.
