FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1901 to 1929.

In pursuance of Section 118 of the Factory
and Workshop Act, 1901, the Right Honourable

of Women, Young Persons and Children Act,
1920, he has made an Order authorising the
employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18

and young persons of 16 years of age and over
in worsted twisting, warping and winding at
the Ashfield Mills of Messrs. John Priestman
& Company Limited, Thornton Road, Brad-
ford, subject to the conditions that a worker
shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in
consecutive weeks; that suitable accommodation
for clothing put off during working hours,
adequate arrangements for taking meals at the
works and washing facilities shall be pro-
vided; and that additional daily thermometer
readings shall be taken and recorded if atmos-
pheric humidity is artificially produced.

employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18
years of age and over in winding yarn on

Spinning Company Limited, Barn Street,
Stockport, subject to the conditions that a
worker shall not be employed in the afternoon
shift in consecutive weeks, and that suitable
accommodation for clothing put off during
working hours, messroom accommodation and
