“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Tadcaster is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Newton Kyme Estate Limited, whose registered Office is situate at Tadcaster, in the said County of York :

“ And whereas the said Newton Kyme Estate Limited have agreed that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Tadcaster now

vested in them as aforesaid shall be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of York for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, now Archbishop of York, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said William, Archbishop of York, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £150 will after the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Newton Kyme Estate Limited (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Tadcaster, now vested in them, the said Newton Kyme Estate Limited, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said William, Archbishop of York, and his successors in the same Archbishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William, Archbishop of York, and by his successors in the same Archbishopric for ever.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Letton with Willersley and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Staunton on Wye, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Hereford and in the Diocese of Hereford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Letton with Willersley and Staunton on Wye duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Letton with Willersley and Staunton on Wye are now full, the Reverend Hyacinth Osman Grimes being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Letton with Willersley and the Reverend George Owen Lewis being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Staunton on Wye:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Letton with Willersley and the said Benefice of Staunton on Wye shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under

the style of 'The United Benefice of Letton with Willersley and Staunton' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall, with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Letton with Willersley shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Staunton on Wye and the site and appurtenances thereof and the ground heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, and the first turn of presentation or nomination shall belong to the Patron or Patrons of that one of the said two Benefices the Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into

and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Battisford, Little Finborough and Ringshall, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Little Finborough and the Parishes of the Benefices of Combs and Great Finborough, both in the said County of Suffolk and in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Battisford and Little Finborough are now full, being held in plurality by the Reverend John Francis Vincent-Fernie under the authority of a Dispensation, and the said Benefice of Ringshall is at present vacant:

"And whereas the share of the Patronage of the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect which on a fair and just apportionment would be assignable in respect of the interest of the Patron of the said Benefice of Little Finborough would in our opinion be negligible:

"And whereas there is a pension charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Ringshall in favour of the Reverend John Kinnersly Taylor, a former Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said John Francis Vincent-Fernie (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Battisford, the said Benefice of Little Finborough and the said Benefice of Ringshall shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ringshall with Battisford and Little Finborough' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Bosmere, but the Parishes of the said Benefice shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said John Francis Vincent-Fernie if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Battisford and Little Finborough shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ringshall shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the

United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate or occasional clerical or lay assistance and the endowments of the United Benefice other than glebe shall be charged with a sum of £80 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or for occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid and the said charge of £80 per annum shall be payable and shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of a Curate or the expenses of occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid.

That with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and as such Bishop the Patron of the said Benefices of Combs and Great Finborough (testified as aforesaid), and with the consent of the Reverend Canon James Hutton Bannerman, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Combs (testified by his signing this Scheme), and with the consent of the Reverend Charles Fisher, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Finborough (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect (a) all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Little Finborough which lies to the east of the footpath which leads from Jack's Lane and along the eastern side of America Wood to the road leading from Moat Farm to America Farm (all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and is thereon coloured yellow) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Combs; (b) all that detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Little Finborough which lies to the west of Cagman's Bridge (all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured green) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Great Finborough; and (c) all that south western part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Combs including Moat Farm (all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured pink) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Little Finborough.

"6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons of the said Benefices of Battisford and Ringshall shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of such two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Ringshall having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Battisford having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"7. That upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of any pension out of the income of the United Benefice payable to the

said John Kinnersly Taylor whichever shall the later happen a part of the endowment and property of the United Benefice shall be excepted out of the union and shall be transferred and annexed to the said Benefice of Great Finborough and a further part to the Benefice of Farnham, in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, that is to say, (a) there shall be transferred and annexed to the said Benefice of Great Finborough the two capital sums of £400 each at present held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty for the benefit of the said Benefice of Little Finborough, together with a capital sum of £540 being part of a capital sum of £700 at present held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the said Benefice of Little Finborough, and (b) there shall be transferred and annexed to the said Benefice of Farnham a capital sum of £160 being the remainder of the said capital sum of £700 at present held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the said Benefice of Little Finborough as aforesaid together with the tithe redemption annuity amounting to £26 2s 6d. payable to the said Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty for the benefit of the said Benefice of Battisford and the two further tithe redemption annuities amounting together to £25 5s. 10d. payable to the said Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty for the benefit of the said Benefice of Ringshall and the amounts now in the sinking funds held by the said Governors in respect of the same tithe redemption annuities.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Little Thurrock, situate within the Parish of Little Thurrock, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Little Thurrock and of the Parish of Grays Thurrock, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Little Thurrock and of the said Parish of Grays Thurrock should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Little Thurrock, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, as well of the Rectory of the said Parish of Little Thurrock as of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Grays Thurrock (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly

represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Little Thurrock and of the said Parish of Grays Thurrock which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Little Thurrock, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Little Thurrock.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Little Thurrock, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Little Thurrock, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the west by the Parish of Grays Thurrock, upon the north west, upon the north and upon the north east by the Parish of Orsett, upon the east by the Parish of Chadwell, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Chadwell from the said Parish of Little Thurrock turns eastward along the northern side of Chadwell Road, and extending thence first southward to and then westward along the middle of Chadwell Road for a distance of 58 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Little Thurrock from the said Parish of Grays Thurrock.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Grays Thurrock which is bounded upon the east by the above described portion of the said Parish of Little Thurrock and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Little Thurrock from the said Parish of Grays Thurrock at or near the point where the northern side of Chadwell Road meets the eastern side of Southend Road, and extending thence south westward in a straight line for a distance of 11 yards or thereabouts to the junction of these roads with College Avenue, and extending thence westward along the middle of College Avenue for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Brandleigh Avenue, and extending thence northward along the middle of Brandleigh Avenue for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lodge Lane, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Lodge Lane for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Windsor Avenue, and extending thence first north eastward and then northward along the middle of Windsor Avenue for a distance of 29½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stifford Long Lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Stifford Long Lane for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Grays Thurrock from the said Parish of Little Thurrock."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 9th day of November, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting (1) the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Gloucester, Saint Luke, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Gloucester, Christ Church, and (2) certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, and the Parishes of the Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Luke the Less (Saint Stephen); Gloucester, Saint Paul; and Hempsted; all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon (1) the union of the said two Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Luke, and Gloucester, Christ Church, and (2) an alteration of the boundaries of the said Parishes of Gloucester, Saint Luke; Gloucester, Saint Luke the Less (Saint Stephen); Gloucester, Saint Paul; and Hempsted; duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Gloucester and therein recommended the said union and alteration of boundaries and the terms for effecting the same and the said Bishop of Gloucester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alteration of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Gloucester, Christ Church, is at present vacant, but all the other said Benefices are now full, the Reverend Frederick William Baldwin

being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke; the Reverend Edward Cowles Prichard being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke the Less (Saint Stephen); the Reverend Harold King Page being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Paul; and the Reverend Canon the Honourable Charles Augustus Sinclair being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hempsted:

"And whereas the Patronage of all of the said Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Luke; Gloucester, Christ Church; Gloucester, Saint Luke the Less (Saint Stephen); Gloucester, Saint Paul; and Hempsted; now belongs to one and the same Patron, namely the Bishop of Gloucester for the time being:

"And whereas the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, are the Trustees and have the management or control of certain Schools situate in New Street, Gloucester, and lying within the area hereinafter recommended and proposed to be transferred and annexed to the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Paul:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, as Diocesan and also as the Patron of the several Benefices affected by this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents of the said Edward Cowles Prichard, Harold King Page, and Charles Augustus Sinclair (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, and the said Benefice of Gloucester, Christ Church, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Gloucester, Christ Church' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice), and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Gloucester, Christ Church, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Gloucester, Christ Church, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Luke, and Gloucester, Christ Church, shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Luke, and Gloucester, Christ Church, shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said

union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Luke, and Gloucester, Christ Church, be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Gloucester, Saint Luke, shall be transferred to the Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Gloucester, Saint Luke, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Gloucester, Christ Church, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"6.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Gloucester, Saint Luke, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the deduction of such a sum as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as follows, that is to say (1) in payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations, and (2) the balance of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Gloucester under the said Measure.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Gloucester, Saint Luke, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Gloucester, Christ Church, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice, or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Gloucester and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Gloucester, Saint Luke, or such of them as the Bishop of Gloucester shall select, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any articles not so transferred shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Gloucester for use in any other Church or Chapel, Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Gloucester which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be paid into the said Expenses Fund.

(d) That in the event of the services of the Organist or any of the Church Servants of the said Church of Gloucester, Saint Luke, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect, such Organist or Church Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of office and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Gloucester equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us, if we shall see fit so to do, in all or any of these cases, to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

"7. That upon the union taking effect (a) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke the Less (Saint Stephen) all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, which is bounded upon the east by the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Paul, upon the south by the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke the Less (Saint Stephen), upon the west by the middle of the Gloucester and Berkeley Canal, upon the north by the middle of Baker Street, and upon the north east partly by the middle of Southgate Street and partly by the middle of Stroud Road all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and is thereon coloured green; (b) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Paul, all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, which is bounded to the south and east by the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Paul, and which is bounded upon the north by the middle of the High Orchard Branch Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway and upon the south west partly by the middle of Southgate Street and partly by the middle of Stroud Road all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured blue; (c) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Hempsted all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice

of Gloucester, Saint Luke, which lies to the south and west of an imaginary line commencing at the centre of the bridge which carries the Docks Branch Line of the Great Western Railway across the River Severn and extending thence south eastward along the middle of such Branch Line of Railway to the centre of the bridge which carries the said Branch Line across Hempsted Lane and extending thence generally eastward along the middle of Hempsted Lane, Severn Road and Llanthony Road to the centre of the bridge which carries Llanthony Road across the Gloucester and Berkeley Canal and extending thence south westward along the middle of the Gloucester and Berkeley Canal to the boundary of the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured red; and (d) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke the Less (Saint Stephen), all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Paul, which lies to the south of the middle of Linden Road all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured brown.

"8. That upon the union taking effect (a) a part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, namely an annual payment of £80 being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, shall be transferred and annexed to the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke the Less (Saint Stephen); (b) a further part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, namely a further annual payment of £150 being part of the said larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, shall be appropriated and applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for and towards the Stipend of a Second Curate for the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke the Less (Saint Stephen); (c) a further part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, namely a further annual payment of £40 being part of the said larger payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, shall be transferred and annexed to the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Paul, and (d) all other the endowments of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Luke, shall belong to the United Benefice.

"9. That upon the union taking effect the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the said Parish of Gloucester, Saint Paul, shall be substituted for and stand in the place of the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the said Parish of Gloucester, Saint Luke, for the purposes of trusteeship, management and control of the said Schools situate in New Street, Gloucester.

"Provided always that this Scheme shall not take effect until the consents and approval

which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church, shall be obtained to the sale hereby proposed of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Luke and of any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Gloucester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 18th day of January, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Luke, Preston, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of Ribbleton, both in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Preston, and the said New Parish of Ribbleton are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Preston, and of the said New Parish of Ribbleton which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District or New Parish in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is within the limits of the said proposed separate District or New Parish a consecrated Church in use for the purposes of Divine Worship and such Church is named 'The Church of Saint Oswald, Preston':

"And whereas the trustees of the Will of the late Mrs. Eliza Mary Eccles have contributed a sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock and have transferred the same into our name to be held by us as and for a permanent endowment for the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the District or New Parish hereinafter recommended to be constituted:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed separate District or New Parish, so soon as a Minister or Incumbent shall have been duly licensed thereto in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock has been so contributed and transferred to us

as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said trustees of the will of the late Eliza Mary Eccles have nominated to us the Reverend Lawrence Douglas Winstanley Spencer of Saint James' Vicarage, Preston, in the said County of Lancaster, Clerk in Holy Orders, for his life, and after his death the Bishop for the time being of the Diocese in which the said Church of Saint Oswald, Preston, shall be situate as the persons to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Preston, and of the said New Parish of Ribbleson which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The New Parish of Saint Oswald, Preston.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the said Church of Saint Oswald, Preston, shall as from the day last mentioned be and for that purpose we hereby specify the same Church as the Parish Church of the said New Parish of Saint Oswald, Preston.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Lawrence Douglas Winstanley Spencer for his life, and that after his death the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish shall be vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, and his successors, Bishops of the Diocese in which such proposed District or New Parish shall be situate.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The New Parish of Saint Oswald, Preston, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint

Luke, Preston, and of the New Parish (sometime District) of Ribbleson, both in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn which, taken together, are bounded upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Jude, Preston, upon the north by the New Parish of Fulwood, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east, upon the south and upon the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Fulwood from the said New Parish of Ribbleson at the junction of Watling Street Road with Cromwell Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Cromwell Road for a distance of $36\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such road across the Preston and Longridge Branch Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the northern end of Belmont Avenue, and extending thence south eastward to and along the middle of Belmont Avenue for a distance of $17\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ribbleson Avenue, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Ribbleson Avenue for a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Blackpool Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Blackpool Road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Ribbleson from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Preston) for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such road across the said Preston and Longridge Branch Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across Skeffington Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Skeffington Road for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the Preston North End Football Ground and extending thence westward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Deepdale Road and continuing thence westward in the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 12 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Deepdale Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Preston, from the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Preston."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District or New Parish recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part

thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Blackburn.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 9th day of November, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Slaidburn with a part of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Dale Head, Saint James, and (2) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Tosside, Saint Bartholomew, and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Alfred, Bishop of Bradford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the rearrangement of the said three Benefices of Slaidburn, Dale Head, Saint James, and Tosside, Saint Bartholomew, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bradford and therein recommended the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Slaidburn with a part of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, and (2) of the said Benefice of Tosside, Saint Bartholomew, with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, and the terms for effecting such unions, and the said Bishop of Bradford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas all the said three Benefices of Slaidburn, Dale Head, Saint James, and Tosside, Saint Bartholomew, are now full, the Reverend William Charles Jordan being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Slaidburn, the Reverend Cyril Slater being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, and the Reverend Harry Isherwood being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tosside, Saint Bartholomew:

"And whereas the Patronage of each of the said Benefices of Slaidburn and Dale Head,

Saint James, at present belongs to one and the same Patron:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, was constituted out of the Parish of the said Benefice of Slaidburn by Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, dated the 14th day of January, 1871, and published in the London Gazette on the 17th day of the same month:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Alfred, Bishop of Bradford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said William Charles Jordan and Harry Isherwood (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Slaidburn and the western part (containing the Parish Church) of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James (all which part is more particularly described in the Schedule hereto annexed), shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Slaidburn' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Slaidburn).

"2. That the said Benefice of Tosside, Saint Bartholomew, and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Tosside' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Tosside).

"3. That the Church of the Parish of Slaidburn shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Slaidburn and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Slaidburn shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"4. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, shall be vacant, then the said unions shall forthwith take effect but if upon that day the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, shall be full then the said unions shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James.

"5. That upon the unions taking effect the register books of baptisms marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint James, Dale Head, shall be transferred to the church of the United Benefice of Slaidburn but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint James, Dale Head, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Slaidburn to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"6. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Slaidburn shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Slaidburn (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Tosside, Saint Bartholomew, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of

Tosside and (c) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"7. That upon the unions taking effect a part of the endowments and property of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, namely an annual payment of £46 being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Tosside and the remainder of the said annual payment made by us and all other the endowments and property (other than the Parsonage House referred to in Clause 6 of this Scheme) of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Slaiburn.

"8. That upon the unions taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Slaiburn for obtaining the services of a Curate or occasional clerical assistance and the endowments of the United Benefice of Slaiburn shall be charged with a sum of £200 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or for occasional clerical assistance as aforesaid which said fund of £200 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Slaiburn but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid except that if and whenever it is not possible to obtain the services of a suitable Curate or suitable clerical assistance such sum of £200 per annum shall be available to meet the expenses of providing for the services of lay assistance previously authorised by the Bishop of the Diocese, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £200 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Slaiburn to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as Trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of a Curate or the expense of occasional clerical assistance or lay assistance so authorised as aforesaid.

"9. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Slaiburn shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Slaiburn and (b) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Tosside shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Tosside, Saint Bartholomew.

"10. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the unions have taken effect the Church of Saint James, Dale Head, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or

times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the deduction of such sum as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall constitute and form part of the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Bradford.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint James, Dale Head, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop may direct be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Slaiburn or to the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Tosside, Saint Bartholomew, or to some other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the said Diocese of Bradford and the bells and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint James, Dale Head, or such of them as the Bishop of Bradford shall select, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Slaiburn or to the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Tosside and any articles not so transferred shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Bradford for use in any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Bradford which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in that case the proceeds shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Bradford.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the said Church of Saint James, Dale Head, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint James, Dale Head, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

"The western part of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, proposed to be united to the said Benefice of Slaiburn being:—

"All that part of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, lying to the west of an imaginary line commencing at the point where the northern boundary of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, crosses the middle of the road leading from Clapham Common through Crutchenber Fell Gate and over Coat Rakes Bridge to School Lane, and extending thence generally southward along the middle of the said road to its junction with School Lane and extending thence south westward

along the middle of School Lane to its junction (opposite the said Church of Saint James, Dale Head) with the new road leading into Hole House Lane, and extending thence first south eastward and then southward along the middle of such new road to its junction with Hole House Lane, and extending thence first southward and then generally south eastward along the middle of Hole House Lane to its junction with Dugdale Lane and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Dugdale Lane to the southern boundary of the said Benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, all which part is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bradford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bradford.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of the Holy Trinity, Idle, partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint James, Bolton, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Windhill, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Idle, the said New Parish of Saint James, Bolton, and the said New Parish of Christ Church, Windhill, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Idle, of the said New Parish of Saint James, Bolton, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Windhill, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Alfred, Bishop of Bradford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Idle, of the said New Parish of Saint James, Bolton, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Windhill, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Cuthbert, Wrose'.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Cuthbert, Wrose, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of the Holy Trinity, Idle, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint James, Bolton, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Windhill, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford, which, taken together, are bounded upon the east by the New Parish of Saint John, Idle, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the west, and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Idle, from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Idle, at the junction of Highfield Road with All Alone Road, and extending thence first north westward, then south westward, then again north westward and then westward along the middle of All Alone Road for a distance of 41 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Westfield Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of Westfield Lane (thereby following the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Idle, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Windhill) for a distance of 20½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading past Catstones Quarries to Low Ash, and extending thence first westward and then south westward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 33½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading through Low Ash, and extending thence south westward along the middle of such road for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the fence forming the boundary which divides the close numbered 541 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Shipley published in the year 1922 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 495 upon the same maps, and extending thence first north

westward to such fence and then first north westward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 541 and the closes numbered 540B, 496, 501, 502 and 505 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 495 and the closes numbered 497, 500, and 499 upon the same maps for a distance of 31 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 505 from the said close numbered 499 reaches the western side of the road leading to Gaisby Lane, and extending thence first eastward to and then southward along the middle of such road for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Gaisby Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Gaisby Lane for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence forming the boundary between the close numbered 446 upon the above mentioned maps and the close numbered 447 upon the same maps, and extending thence first eastward to such fence and then eastward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 446 and the closes numbered 450 and 452 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 447 and the close numbered 449 upon the same maps for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to the south eastern corner of the said close numbered 449, and extending thence north eastward in a straight line across the said close numbered 452 for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to the western end of the fence which divides the close numbered 410 upon the said maps from the close numbered 458 upon the same maps, and extending thence eastward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of the roadway leading from Oak Bank Farm into Wrose Road, and extending thence first eastward to and then northward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence which divides the close numbered 461 upon the said maps from the close numbered 463 upon the same maps and extending thence first eastward to such fence and then first eastward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 461 and the closes numbered 408, 407, 406 and 398 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 463 and the closes numbered 464, 465 and 405 upon the same maps for a distance of 31 chains or thereabouts to the south western corner of the said close numbered 405, and extending thence southward in a straight line (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Windhill, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Bolton) for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to the junction of Bolton-hall Road with the roadway leading through Bolton Wood Quarries to Livingstone Road, and extending thence southward in a straight line across Bolton Wood Quarries for a distance of 32 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Wood Lane with the roadway and footpath leading to Chestnut Grove and Stanley Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Wood Lane for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to Bolton Lodge and Wood Lane House, and extending thence first eastward and then north eastward along the middle of the last mentioned roadway for a

distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the fence which divides the close numbered 2629 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Bradford published in the year 1922 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the said map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 2662 upon the said maps, and extending thence first south eastward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 2629 and the closes numbered 2630, 2632, 2637, 2638, 2636, 2640, 2641, 2642, 2644 and 2650 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 2662 and the closes numbered 2661, 2666, 2639, 2639A, 2643 and 2651 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 48 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 2650 from the said close numbered 2651 meets the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 503 Idle Road, and extending thence first north westward along such wall or fence and then eastward along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the same house and premises for a distance in all of 1½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the western side of Idle Road, and extending thence eastward in a straight line for a distance of 13 yards or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Bolton, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Idle."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bradford.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Christ Church, Cinder Hill, in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 15th day of August, 1929, and published in the London Gazette on the 30th day of the same month, part of the Parish of Basford, in the said County and Diocese, was assigned as a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church called Christ Church, Cinder Hill, situate in the said Parish of Basford, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Cinder Hill':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Christ Church, Cinder Hill, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Cinder Hill, should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT ARCHITECTS, GRADE II, IN H.M. OFFICE OF WORKS.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 23 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part, but must not have attained 30 years of age on that date.

Candidates who have served or are serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force may deduct from their actual age for this purpose any time during which they have so served, but not exceeding five years.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject. Provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject, but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate

is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. Candidates must be prepared to serve at home or abroad as may be directed.

5. H.M. Office of Works will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancies which they desire to fill, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

6. Applications shall be addressed in the first instance to the Secretary, H.M. Office of Works, and shall be made on a form to be obtained from the Establishment Officer of that Department. The form must be stamped by the applicant with a "Civil Service" stamp or stamps of the value of 10s.; this fee is payable in respect of the application and will not be returned in any circumstances.

7. Candidates should have had at least six years' experience in the study and practice of architecture in an architect's office, provided that whole-time study in an architectural school may be allowed to count towards this period up to a maximum of three years.

8. Applications will be scrutinised by the Office of Works in association with the Civil Service Commissioners, and the candidates who appear to be best qualified in both general and special attainments will be submitted to an examination in Architectural Design, and of those who qualify and obtain the highest marks a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them most suitable. The decision of the Selection Board will be final. The Board will be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the Office of Works who will be represented thereon.

9. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the

Commissioners of H.M. Works. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

10. In addition to the fee of ten shillings payable on application (Clause 6), each candidate admitted to the examination (Clause 8) will be required to pay a fee of £2. A selected candidate will be required to pay a fee of £8, towards which the fees paid on application and on examination will count, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.
