#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 22nd day of January, 1934 (C.W. 249/34), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Order in Council dated the 12th day of February, 1931, Your Majesty was pleased to sanction special rates of retired pay for Lieutenant Commanders and Lieutenants, Royal Navy, of certain seniorities, with a view to reducing the surplus then existing in the number of Officers of these ranks on the Active List:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that further steps should be taken with the object of reducing the present numbers of Lieutenant Commanders and Lieutenants on the Active List of the Royal Navy to those estimated to be necessary:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals:—

I. That the option of retiring with the special rates of retired pay authorised by Your above-mentioned Order in Council of the 12th day of February, 1931, shall, as from the 27th day of July, 1932, and at our discretion, be extended to Lieutenant Commanders of seniority 1932 and to Lieutenants of seniorities 1924, 1925 and 1926; and the said option shall further, as from the 1st day of January, 1934, and at our discretion, be extended to Lieutenants who have attained at least six years' seniority on the 1st day of January of the year in which they retire: such special rates of retired pay to be subject, in all cases, to the conditions laid down in Your Order in Council of the 12th day of February, 1931.

II. That Lieutenants who are confirmed in that rank on or before the 30th day of June, 1934, and Lieutenant Commanders under the age of 40 shall be given the option of retiring with gratuities as follows; this option to be exercised within a period commencing on the 1st day of January, 1934, and terminating on the 1st day of January, 1935, or on such earlier date as we may consider desirable.

Lieutenant Commanders (under 40 years of age)

A gratuity of £2,500 with an addition of £200 for each complete year's seniority in the rank of Lieutenant Commander.

Lieutenants (confirmed in that rank on or before the 30th June, 1934)

£1,000 for Lieutenants under three years'

£1,200 for Lieutenants who have attained three years' seniority, and £200 for each complete year's seniority in excess of three

The 30th June, 1934, to be taken as the date for reckoning seniority in all cases whether an Officer retires with gratuity before or after that date.

"Officers serving abroad who are allowed to retire under these schemes to be granted full pay up to the date of arrival in England, provided they return by a direct route without delay, but not to be eligible for any extension of full pay in respect of foreign service leave.

"Nothing in this Order shall preclude us from withholding either in whole or in part these special terms from any officer or from retiring any Officer during the currency of these schemes under any other regulations which may be applicable to him.

"Lieutenant Commanders on the Supplementary List and Lieutenant Commanders and Lieutenants promoted from Commissioned Warrant rank or Warrant rank not to be eligible for retirement under these special terms.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 22nd January, 1920, Your Majesty was pleased to sanction inter alia, revised rates of Command Money for Officers in command of Your Majesty's ships and shore establishments and to authorise the payment of Entertaining Allowance to Officers appointed in command:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 9th April, 1932, Your Majesty was pleased to sanction the payment to the Engineer Captain appointed in command of the Mechanical Training Establishment at Chatham of Command Money and Entertaining Allowance at the rates of 7s. and 5s. a day respectively:

"And whereas we consider that the Engineer Captain appointed in command of the Royal Naval Engineering College at Keyham should

be similarly remunerated:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise the payment to this Officer, with effect from the 19th day of September, 1933, of Command Money and Entertaining Allowance at the daily rates of 7s. and 5s. respectively.

" The Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in this proposal."

WHEREAS by the Children and Young Persons Act, 1933, it is, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, specify as respects the metropolitan police court area the places in which juvenile courts are to sit, and assign as a division to each such place such portion of that area as may be specified in the Order:

And whereas an Order in Council (S.R. & O. 1933, No. 764) was made on the 24th day of July, 1933, as to juvenile courts within the metropolitan police court area:

And whereas by Section 105 of the said Act it is provided that an Order in Council made under the Act may be revoked or varied by any subsequent Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to vary the Order of the 24th day of July, 1933, and it is hereby varied accordingly, by the addition of the following Article:

(5) A juvenile court may sit at any time in case of emergency in the room of the chief magistrate of the metropolitan police courts at Bow Street Police Court to hear cases from any portion of the metropolitan police court area.

WHEREAS a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Eccles did on the 24th day of July, 1933, agree to petition, and the Council of the said Borough thereupon petitioned, His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, and extended by the Borough Councillors (Alteration of Number) Act, 1925, for an alteration of the number of Councillors and of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 8th day of August, 1933, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 9th day of October, 1933, to alter the number of Councillors of the said Borough of Eccles and to order and direct that henceforth the number of the said Councillors should be twenty-four, and further to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough of Eccles should be henceforth divided and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be eight:

And whereas on the 25th day of October, 1933, the Right Honourable Sir John Gilmour, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, LLB., Barrister at Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the Borough of Eccles:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 4th day of January, 1934:—

"Scheme for determining the Boundaries of the Wards of the Borough of Eccles in the County of Lancaster and for apportioning the Councillors among the said Wards in pursuance of Order in Council of 9th October, 1933.

#### "I.—Boundaries of Wards.

"In the following descriptions 'The Borough boundary' means the boundary of the Borough of Eccles, Lancs, as extended by the Lancashire (Manchester and District) Review Order 1933.

#### "(1) Monton and Park Ward.

"Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the Borough at its intersection with the centre of the track of the Eccles, Tyldesley and Wigan line of the London, Midland & Scottish Railway, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of the said line of railway to a point immediately over the centre of Monton Green, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the centres of Monton Green and Monton Road to a point in Monton Road immediately beneath the centre of the track of the Clifton Branch of the London, Midland & Scottish Railway line, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the track of the said

line of railway to its intersection with the centre of the track of the Eccles, Tyldesley and Wigan branch railway line, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of the Eccles, Tyldesley and Wigan line of railway to its junction with the centre of the track of the Manchester and Liverpool line of the London, Midland & Scottish Railway, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of the said Manchester and Liverpool line to a point immediately beneath the centre of the highway at the junction of Clarendon Road and Church Street, thence north-westward along the centre of Clarendon Road to its junction with Half Edge Lane, thence eastward along the centre of Half Edge Lane to the boundary of the Borough, thence in a northerly and generally westerly direction following boundary of the Borough to the point of commencement aforesaid.

#### " (2) Eccles Ward.

"Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the Borough at its junction with the boundary of Monton and Park Ward, thence in a westerly, south-easterly and westerly direction following the boundary of Monton and Park Ward as hereinbefore defined to the junction of the centre of the track of the Eccles, Tyldesley and Wigan line of railway with the centre of the track of the Manchester and Liverpool line of the London, Midland & Scottish Railway, thence continuing westward along the centre of the track of the said Manchester and Liverpool line to a point on a line continued northward from the centre of Devonshire Road, thence southward following the said line and continuing southward along the centre of Devonshire Road to its junction with Liverpool Road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Liverpool Road and Church Street and continuing eastward along the centre line of the thoroughfare past the Market Place to its junction with Lane End, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Lane End and Salter's Lane and continuing south-eastward by a direct line from the terminus of Salter's Lane to the southern boundary of the Borough in the centre of the Manchester Ship Canal, thence in an easterly and generally northerly direction following the boundary of the Borough to the point of commencement aforesaid.

#### " (3) Irwell Ward.

"Commencing at a point on the boundary of the Borough at its junction with the boundary of Eccles Ward in the Manchester Ship Canal opposite the centre of Salter's Lane, thence north-westward and westward following the boundary of Eccles Ward as hereinbefore defined and continuing westward along the centre of Liverpool Road to its junction with Cannon Street, thence in a southerly and south-easterly direction along the centre of Cannon Street to its junction with Trafford Road, thence in a south-westerly and southeasterly direction along the centre of Trafford Road to its junction with Barton Lane, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Barton Lane to a point immediately under the centre of the Bridgewater Canal, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of the Bridgewater Canal to its intersection with the southern boundary of the Borough in the

Manchester Ship Canal, thence in a north-easterly direction following the southern boundary of the Borough to the point of commencement aforesaid.

#### "(4) Patricroft Ward.

"Commencing at a point on the boundary of Monton and Park Ward under the centre of the northerly bridge carrying the Eccles, Tyldesley and Wigan line of railway over the road at Monton Green, thence westward along the centre of Monton Bridge to a point immediately over the centre of the Bridgewater Canal, thence in a south-easterly and southerly direction along the centre of the said Canal to a point immediately under the centre of Liverpool Road, thence in north-easterly and easterly direction along the centre of Liverpool Road to its junction with the boundary of Eccles Ward, thence northward and eastward following the boundary of Eccles Ward as hereinbefore de-fined to its junction with the boundary of Monton and Park Ward, thence north-westward, north-eastward, north-westward and westward following the boundary of Monton and Park Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

#### " (5) Trafford Ward.

"Commencing at the junction of the western boundary of Irwell Ward with the southern boundary of Patricroft Ward in Liverpool Road, thence in a southerly, south-easterly, south-westerly, south-easterly andwesterly direction following the boundary of Irwell Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the Bridgewater Canal, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the Bridgewater Canal to its junction with the boundary of Patricroft Ward, thence northeastward and eastward following the southern boundary of Patricroft Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement afore-

#### " (6) Barton Ward.

"Commencing at the point on the boundary of the Borough where the Manchester Ship Canal is crossed by the Bridgewater Canal on the western and southern boundaries of Irwell Ward, thence in a north-westerly direction following the western boundaries of Irwell Ward and Trafford Ward, both as hereinbefore defined, to the junction of the boundary of Trafford Ward with the boundary of Patricroft Ward in Liverpool Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Liverpool Road to its intersection with the Borough boundary, thence in a south-easterly and north-easterly direction following the southern boundary of the Borough to the point of commencement aforesaid.

#### " (7) Winton Ward.

"Commencing at a point in the centre of the Bridgewater Canal immediately under the centre of the track of the Manchester and Liverpool line of the London, Midland & Scottish Railway on the western boundary of Patricroft Ward, thence in a southerly direction following the western boundary of Patricroft Ward as hereinbefore defined, to its junction with the boundary of Barton Ward, thence in a south-westerly direction following the boundary of Barton Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence north-westward and northeastward following the Borough boundary to its junction with the Worsley Brook, thence southward by a direct line to the centre of the track of the Manchester and Liverpool line of the London, Midland & Scottish Railway, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of the track of the Manchester and Liverpool line of railway to the point of commencement aforesaid.

#### "(8) Westwood Park Ward.

"Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the Borough at its intersection with the centre of the track of the Eccles, Tyldesley and Wigan line of railway, thence south-eastward following the western boundary of Monton and Park Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the boundary of Patricroft Ward, thence westward, south-east-ward and southward following the western boundary of Patricroft Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the boundary of Winton Ward, thence westward and northward following the northern boundary of Winton Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence northward, north-eastward, south-eastward and north-eastward following the Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

#### "Plan delineating Boundaries.

"The boundaries of the Wards as above defined are delineated on the Plan annexed hereto, which forms part of the Scheme.

"In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out, the textual description shall prevail.

"III.—INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

"1.—(a) The election of the six additional Councillors of the Borough, namely, the three to be elected for Trafford Ward and the three to be elected for Winton Ward, shall be held on Tuesday the 27th day of March, 1934, or such later date as may be fixed by the Secretary

(b) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme, the election shall be held in the same manner as elections to fill ordinary vacancies, provided that the Mayor shall be the Returning Officer at the election, but he may appoint to act as Returning Officer an Alderman or a Councillor who is not registered as a local government elector in respect of a qualification in the Ward.

additional of (c) The Councillors Borough elected in pursuance of this Scheme shall come into office immediately after the election and shall go out of office as follows:—

(i) The Councillor who is elected for the Trafford Ward by the smallest number of votes and the Councillor who is elected for the Winton Ward by the smallest number of votes, on the ordinary day of election of Councillors in 1934.

(ii) The Councillor who is elected for the Trafford Ward by the largest number of votes and the Councillor who is elected for the Winton Ward by the largest number of votes, on the ordinary day of election of Councillors in 1936.

(iii) The other Councillor elected for Trafford Ward and the other Councillor elected for Winton Ward, on the ordinary day of election of Councillors in 1935.

"2. The election of the two additional Aldermen made necessary by the election of the six additional Councillors in pursuance of this Scheme shall take place at the next meeting of the Council after the day of the election of the said six additional Councillors. additional Aldermen shall come into office immediately after the election and shall go out of office, the one who is elected by the smaller number of votes on the ordinary day of elec-tion of Aldermen in the year 1935 and the other on the ordinary day of election of Aldermen in the year 1938.

"3. If for any reason it is doubtful which of the additional Councillors or Aldermen, as the case may be, elected in pursuance of this Scheme, ought to retire in the year specified in this Scheme, the matter shall be determined by lot under the direction of the Mayor or other person presiding at the meeting at the first or second meeting of the Council after the election of such additional Councillors or

"4. On the day of the election of the additional Aldermen as above provided, the exist-ing Aldermen and the additional Aldermen shall be respectively assigned by the Council as Returning Officers until the 9th November, 1934, at elections of Councillors for the several Wards of the Borough.

"5. In any Ward in which no existing Alderman is in pursuance of this Scheme assigned for the purpose of acting as Returning Officer at the election of Councillors the Mayor shall be the Returning Officer, but he may appoint to act as Returning Officer another Alderman or a Councillor not being a Councillor for that Ward and not being registered as a local government elector in respect of a qualification in that Ward.

"6. If any vacancy exists at the date of the Order in Council approving this Scheme or thereafter occurs amongst the existing Councillors, an election to fill the vacancy shall be held for the Ward to which the Councillor whose death or retirement causes the vacancy has been apportioned by this Scheme.

"7. If the register of electors is not so framed as to show the local government electors entitled to vote at any election of Councillors of the Borough to be held for any of the Wards constituted by this Scheme, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk of the Borough to make such alteration or re-arrangement of the register as may be necessary for the purpose of such election.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by Section 670 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that when any Lighthouse, Buoy, or Beacon has either before or after passing of that Act been erected or placed on or near the coast of any British Possession by or with the consent of the Legislature of that Possession, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix such dues (in that Act referred to as Colonial Light Dues) to be paid in respect of that Lighthouse, Buoy, or Beacon by the Owner or Master of every Ship which passes the same and derives benefit therefrom as His Majesty may deem reasonable, and may by like Order increase, diminish or repeal such Dues, and those Dues shall from the time mentioned in the Order  $\mathbf{His}$ Majesty's leviable throughout Dominions, and further that Colonial Light Dues shall not be levied in any British Possession unless the Legislature of that Possession has, by address to the Crown or by Act or Ordinance duly passed, signified its opinion that the Dues ought to be levied:

And whereas the Great Basses Lighthouse, the Little Basses Lighthouse, and the Minicoy Lighthouse are Lighthouses which have been duly erected under and pursuant to the said Section:

And whereas by Orders in Council, dated respectively the 22nd day of May, 1883, the 9th day of May, 1892, the 29th day of June, 1896, the 10th day of August, 1903, the 21st day of October, 1912, the 6th day of February, 1917, the 14th day of July, 1922, the 6th day of February, 1925, and the 5th day of November, 1926, the Dues leviable in respect of the said Lighthouses for the Classes of Ships therein respectively mentioned were duly fixed:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 27th day of October, 1930, His Majesty directed that, as from the 1st day of April, 1931, or from the time of the receipt of notice of that Order, if that be later, by the Officers authorised to collect Light Dues, the Dues thenceforth to be levied should be as follows, that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three sixty-fourths of one penny per ton, and in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse one sixty-fourth of one penny per ton, of the burden of every ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said Lights respectively:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the said Dues should be altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers so vested in Him by the above recited provisions, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth by this Order in Council order, and it is hereby ordered, as

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The Colonial Light Dues (Great and Little Basses and Minicoy) Order, 1934".
- 2. As from the 1st day of April, 1934, or from the time of the receipt of this Order, if that be later, by the Officers authorised to collect Light Dues, the Dues thenceforth to be levied shall be as follows, that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three hundredths of one penny per ton, and in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse, one hundredth of one penny per ton of the burden of every ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said Lights respectively.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33-4 V. c. 52), to 1932 (22-3 Geo. V. c. 39), it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 11th day of January, 1932, between His Majesty and the President of the Republic of Poland for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms follow-

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ire-land and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India,

And the President of the Republic of Poland, Desiring to make provision for the reciprocal extradition of criminals,

Have resolved to conclude a Treaty for that purpose, and to that end have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

for Great Britain and Northern Ireland, The Right Honourable Sir William Forbes Erskine, G.C.M.G., M.V.O., His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Republic of Poland;

The President of the Republic of Poland:

- M. August Zaleski, Minister for Foreign Affairs, and
- M. Stefan Sieczkowski, Under-Secretary of State to the Ministry of Justice;

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:-

#### Article 1.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article 3, committed within the jurisdiction of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

#### Article 2.

For the purposes of the present Treaty-

(i) The territory of His Britannic Majesty shall be deemed to be Great Britain and

Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and Isle of Man, and all parts of His Britannic Majesty's dominions overseas other than those enumerated in Article 19, together with the territories enumerated in Article 21 and any territories to which it may be extended under Article 22. It is understood that in respect of all territory of His Britannic Majesty as above defined other than Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and Isle of Man, the present Treaty shall be applied so far as the laws permit.

(ii) The nationals or natives of any British Protectorate or British-protected State or of any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations is held by His Britannic Majesty shall be deemed to

be British subjects.

(iii) Danzig citizens in Poland shall be assimilated to Polish citizens, and in the event of the Treaty being applied to the territory of the Free City of Danzig under Article 18, Polish citizens in the said territory shall be assimilated to citizens of the Free City.

#### Article 3.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences when they are punishable in accordance with the laws of both the High Contracting Parties (that is to say, in Poland, in accordance with the laws of at least one of the Provinces of Poland):—

- Murder (including assassination, parricide, murder of relations, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
- 2. Manslaughter.
- Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
- 4. Rape.
- 5. Unlawful carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have unlawful carnal knowledge, of a girl under 16 years of age.
- 6. Indecent assault.
- 7. Kidnapping or false imprisonment.
- 8. Child stealing, including abandoning, exposing or unlawfully detaining.
- 9. Abduction.
- 10. Procuration; that is to say, the offences enumerated in Articles 1 and 2 of the International Convention for the Suppression of the White Slave Traffic concluded at Paris on the 4th May, 1910.
- 11. Bigamy.
- 12. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
- Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
- 14. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
- 15. Arson.
- 16. Burglary or housebreaking.
- 17. Robbery with violence or menaces.
- 18. Larceny or embezzlement.
- 19. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company, or fraudulent conversion.
- 20. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.

- (a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.
  - (b) Knowingly and without lawful authority making or having in possession any instrument, tool or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting or alteration of coin.
- 22. Forgery or counterfeiting or altering, or uttering what is forged or counterfeited or altered; comprehending all crimes designated in the Polish laws as counterfeiting or falsification of paper money, bank notes or other securities, forgery or falsification of other public or private documents, likewise the uttering or bringing into circulation, or wilfully using such counterfeited, forged or falsified papers.
- 23. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
- 24. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling upon a railway or being upon a railway.
- 25. Piracy.
- 26. Wrongfully sinking or destroying a vessel at sea or attempting to do so.
- 27. Assault on a person on board a ship on the high seas with intent to inflict death or do grievous bodily harm.
- Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas, against the authority of the master.
- Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a crime or offence against the laws of both States.

Extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes or offences, before, during or after the crime is committed: provided that such participation is punishable by the laws of both the High Contracting Parties (that is to say, in Poland, in accordance with the laws of at least one of the Provinces).

#### Article 4.

Each Party reserves the right to refuse or grant the surrender of its own subjects or citizens to the other Party.

#### Article 5.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the State applied to, for the crime or offence for which his extradition is demanded: provided that the discharge of the accused on the ground that the crime or offence was committed abroad shall constitute no hindrance to his subsequent extradition.

If the person claimed should be under examination or under punishment in the State applied to for any other crime or offence, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

#### Article 6.

Extradition shall not be granted if the accused has by lapse of time, in accordance with the laws of that part of the territories of the High Contracting Parties in which he is found, acquired exemption from prosecution or punishment with respect to the crime or offence for which his surrender is claimed.

#### Article 7.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the crime or offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for a crime or offence of a political character.

#### Article 8.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in custody or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime or offence, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered (whether he has made use of this opportunity or not) or else until having returned there he reappears in the country to which he has been previously surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes or offences committed after the extradition.

#### Article 9.

Subject to the provisions of Articles 19 and 20, the requisition for extradition shall be presented by the diplomatic agent of the High Contracting Party requiring the extradition to the Secretary of State or Minister for Foreign Affairs of the High Contracting Party applied

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime or offence had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in contumaciam is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

#### Article 10.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

#### Article 11.

In urgent cases a criminal fugitive may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any police magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority in either State, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings, as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime or offence had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the dominions of the two Contracting Parties in which the magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority exercises jurisdiction. shall, in accordance with this Article, be discharged if within the term of thirty days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the diplomatic agent of the other State in accordance with the stipulations of this Treaty.

#### Article 12.

Extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, (a) either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime or offence had been committed in the territory of the same State, or (b) to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime or offence of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to.

No criminal shall be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his committal to prison to await the warrant for his surrender.

#### Article 13.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, or copies thereof, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:-

1. A warrant, or copy thereof, must purport to be signed by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State, or purport to be certified under the hand of a judge, magistrate or officer of the other State to be a true copy thereof, as the case may require.

2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified, under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.

3. A certificate of, or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State.

In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated, either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of the other State, or by any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the State to which the application for extradition is made.

#### Article 14.

If the extradition of an individual is claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty and his extradition is also claimed by one or more other States, the State applied to shall in its absolute discretion determine to which State the extradition shall be granted.

#### Article 15.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

#### Article 16.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension, and any articles that may serve as a proof of the crime or offence shall be given up when the extradition takes place, in so far as this may be permitted by the law of the State granting the extradition.

#### Article 17.

Each of the High Contracting Parties shall defray the expenses occasioned by the arrest within its territories, the detention, and the conveyance to its frontier, of the persons whom it may have consented to surrender in pursuance of the present Treaty.

#### Article 18.

The Government of the Republic of Poland, in virtue of Article 104 of the Treaty of Peace, signed at Versailles on the 28th June, 1919, and of Articles 2 and 6 of the Convention concluded between Poland and Danzig on the 9th November, 1920, reserves the right of subsequently declaring that the provisions of the present Treaty are applicable also to the territory of the Free City of Danzig.

#### Article 19.

His Britannic Majesty may accede to the present Treaty on behalf of any of His Dominions hereafter named—that is to say, the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia (including for this purpose Papua and Norfolk Island), the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State, and Newfoundland—and India. Such accession shall be effected by a notice to that effect given by His Britannic Majesty's representative at Warsaw, which shall specify the authority to which the requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in the Dominion concerned, or India, as the case may be, shall be addressed. From the date when such notice comes into effect, which date shall be specified in the notice, the territory of the Dominion concerned or of India shall be deemed to be territory of His Britannic Majesty for the purposes of the present Treaty.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of the above-mentioned Dominions or India, on behalf of which His Britannic Majesty has acceded, shall be made by the appropriate consular officer of the Republic of Poland.

Either High Contracting Party may terminate this Treaty separately in respect of any of the above-mentioned Dominions or India. Such termination shall be effected by a notice given in accordance with the provisions of Article 23.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of one of His Britannic Majesty's Dominions may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, and which is being administered by the Government of the Dominion concerned; such territory shall, if so included, be deemed to be territory of His Britannic Majesty for the purpose of the present Treaty. Any notice given under the third paragraph of this Article shall be applicable to such mandated territory.

#### Article 20.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any territory of His Britannic Majesty other than Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, or Isle of Man, or the Dominions or India mentioned in Article 19, shall be made to the Governor, or chief authority, of such territory by the appropriate consular officer of the Republic of Poland.

Such requisition shall be dealt with by the competent authorities of such territory: provided, nevertheless, that if an order for the committal of the fugitive criminal to prison to await surrender shall be made, the said Governor or chief authority may, instead of issuing a warrant for the surrender of such fugitive, refer the matter to His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom.

#### Article 21.

This Treaty shall apply in the same manner as if they were Possessions of His Britannic Majesty to the following British Protectorates, that is to say, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Gambia Protectorate, Kenya Protectorate, Nigeria Protectorate, Northern Rhodesia, Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, Nyasaland, Sierra Leone Protectorate, Solomon Islands Protectorate, Somaliland Protectorate, Swaziland, Uganda Protectorate and Zanzibar, and to the following territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, that is to say, Cameroons under British mandate, Togoland under British mandate, and the Tanganyika Territory.

#### Article 22.

If after the signature of the present Treaty it is considered advisable to extend its provisions to any British Protectorates other than those mentioned in the preceding Article or to any British-protected State, or to any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, other than those mandated territories mentioned in Articles 19 and 21, the stipulations of Articles 19 and 20 shall be deemed to apply to such Protectorates or States or mandated territories from the date and in the manner prescribed in the notes to be exchanged for the purpose of effecting such extension.

#### Article 23.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

In the absence of an express provision to that effect, a notice given under the first paragraph of this Article shall not affect the operation of the Treaty as between the Republic of Poland and any territory in respect of which notice of accession has been given under Article 19.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Warsaw as soon as possible.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate in English and Polish at Warsaw this 11th day of January, in the year 1932.

And whereas His Majesty has ratified the said Treaty in respect of, and the said Treaty thereby extends to, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (including for that purpose the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man) and all British Colonies:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 12th day of March, 1934, the said Acts shall apply in respect of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, and all British Colonies in the case of Poland under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 11th January, 1932.

This Order may be cited as the "Poland (Extradition) Order in Council, 1934".

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, situate within the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, and of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint John, Welling, in the said County and

Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, and of the said New Parish of Saint John, Welling, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Martin, Bishop of Rochester, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint John, Welling, and with the of Sir Ian Zachary Malcolm, consent K.C.M.G., of Number 57, Onslow Square, London, as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, and of the said New Parish of Saint John, Welling, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey.'

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, and of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint John, Welling, both in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, which, taken together, are bounded upon the west partly by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, and partly by the New Parish of All Saints, New Eltham, both in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the east, and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, New Eltham, from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, crosses the middle of the Dartford Loop Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 46 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Willersley Avenue across such line of railway, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Willersley

Avenue for a distance of 642 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called The Oval, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the north western roadway of The Oval for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wellington Avenue, and extending thence northward along the middle of Wellington Avenue for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Blackfen Road and West Wood Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Welling, and extending thence northward along the middle of West Wood Lane for a distance of 8½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bexley Heath Bye-pass Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Bexley Heath Bye-pass Road, for a distance of 63 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Welling, from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer

of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Fetcham, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Fetcham is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Sir Arthur Wilfred Graham-Moon of Number 1, Royal Exchange Avenue, in the City of London, Baronet:

"And whereas the said Arthur Wilfred Graham-Moon is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Fetcham, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Guildford for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend John, now Bishop of Guildford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said John, Bishop of Guildford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Fetcham which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Fetcham:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Wilfred Graham-Moon (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said John, Bishop of Guildford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Fetcham, now vested in him, the said Arthur Wilfred Graham-Moon as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said John, Bishop of Guildford, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John, Bishop of Guildford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Guildford.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the Award of the Medal of the Civil Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire to the undermentioned:—

#### For Gallantry.

For an heroic and self-sacrificing action in averting a catastrophe after an explosion in the Main Theatre at the Middlesex Hospital.

On a morning in January the Dispensary porter was changing the reducing valve on a large oxygen cylinder in the anæsthetic room of the Main Ground Floor Theatre when an explosion occurred. The explosion took place as soon as he had turned the oxygen on and was probably due to a piece of grit violently impinging upon the reducing valve and causing a spark.

Following the explosion the issuing oxygen caught fire and a stream of sparks and flames shot through the open door of the anæsthetic room across the Theatre for a distance of about 15 feet. Onlookers described the burning cylinder as being most alarming, and there was a general fear that it would explode at any moment. The Theatre was immediately vacated.

Sister Thomas stopped behind until all were clear and then removed the ether from the anæsthetic room and shut the doors with the idea of minimising the effect of the explosion which she expected. After a moment's reflection, however, she decided that it was her duty to try to avert the wrecking of the 'Theatre, re-entered the anæsthetic room, ran up to the cylinder and turned it off by the tap below the valve.

The intensity of the burning was evidenced by the fact that the steel neck, or collar, of the reducing valve was partly burned away.

Sister Thomas showed great bravery and coolness as she and all present believed that the cylinder might blow up at any moment.

No. 349, Shawish (Sergeant) Taha Idris, Blue Nile Province Police, Sudan.

Shawish (Sergeant) Taha Idris showed conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in September last in arresting an armed policeman. A native Non-Commissioned Officer in charge of a police guard temporarily lost his self-control, and after

loading his rifle with nine rounds of ball ammunition "ran amuck." The guard, not being able to deal with the situation themselves, sent word to the Shawish who immediately came to their assistance. He was unable to approach without being seen. The Non-Commissioned Officer aimed at Taha Idris at a few paces distance and pulled the trigger, but for some reason the cartridge did not explode, and Taha Idris eventually ran in and disarmed his opponent.

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT BY COM-PETITIVE SELECTION OF DISTRICT LIVE STOCK Officers (Male) under the Ministry of AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

#### N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

- 1. Application for appointment shall be made in the first instance to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Ministry. When a vacancy occurs the Ministry will cause notice to be given by advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.
- 2. A candidate must have attained the age of 25 and must not have attained the age of 45 on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications; provided that in reckoning age for this purpose a candidate who served in the Army, Navy or Air Force between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918, may deduct from his actual age any period of service between the 4th August, 1914, and the 31st December, 1919.
- 3. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:-
  - (a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August,

1914, and 11th November, 1918.
(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

4. Until further notice preference will be given to candidates who served in His Majesty's Forces during the War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

5. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for

appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.
