The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, on the 21st day of February, 1934, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

ORIEL COLLEGE OXFORD.

A STATUTE to amend a Statute made by the University of Oxford Commissioners acting in pursuance of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5, c. 33), and approved by The King in Council on the 30th day of April, 1926, in relation to Oriel College in the University of Oxford, duly made at a Special General Meeting of the Provost and Fellows of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose, held on the twenty-first day of February, 1934, and passed at such meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted to His Majesty in Council.

Whereas by Statute IV, 1, as made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and approved by The King in Council on the 30th day of April, 1926, in relation to Oriel College in the University of Oxford it was enacted as follows:—

" 1. The number of Open Scholarships in the College the emoluments of which are paid out of the corporate revenues shall not exceed thirty-five, exclusive of Scholarships held for a fifth year, and no more than £4000 shall be paid out in emoluments to Scholars holding such Scholarships in any one year, inclusive of £30 in the case of each Scholar occupying rooms in College free of rent, rates and taxes.

Provided that the Provost and Fellows may from time to time increase by Statute the number of the Scholarships in the College and the total sum which may be paid in emoluments to the Scholars."

And whereas by Statute IV, 3 (5), it was enacted as follows:—

" (5) There shall be a Scholarship and Exhibition Fund into which shall be paid annually a sum of not less than £1500 from the corporate revenues of the College and also the annual net income of the Ludwell, the Robinson, the Ireland and the Jackman
