DEVONSHIRE JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT, 1930: SECTION 3.

78,319.

(27th February, 1934.)

Whereas by the Devonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee Order 1931 (in this order referred to as "the order of 1931") the Minister of Health made provision until the 31st day of March, 1934, for the combination of the administrative county of Devon and the county boroughs of Exeter and Plymouth for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casual poor persons by a joint committee named the Devonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee;

And whereas it is expedient that such provision as aforesaid should be continued:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 3 of the Poor Law Act 1930 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Devonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee (Continuance) Order 1934.

(2) The order of 1931 and this order shall be construed together and may be cited as the Devonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee Orders 1931 and 1934.

2. The order of 1931 shall continue in force until the 30th day of September, 1934, unless sooner revoked or otherwise amended.

3. The members of the joint committee who would pursuant to the order of 1931 have gone out of office on the 31st day of March, 1934, shall continue in office and be deemed to have been elected for a period ending on the 30th day of September, 1934.

MIDDLESEX AND NORTHERN HOME COUNTIES JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT, 1930: SECTION 3.

(2nd March, 1934)

Whereas the councils of the counties of Essex, Hertfordshire and Middlesex and of the county boroughs of East Ham, West Ham and Southend-on-Sea consider that it is expedient that the areas of the councils should be combined for such of the purposes connected with the administration of their functions under the Poor Law Act, 1930, as are hereinafter specified, and have made application to the Minister of Health for the purpose:

Now therefore the Minister, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by subsection (1) of section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf makes the following order:—

SHORT TITLE.

1. This Order may be cited as the Middlesex and Northern Home Counties Joint Vagrancy
