PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 22nd day of February, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for augmenting the income of the Archdeaconry of Rochester in the Diocese of Rochester:

“Whereas it appears to us to be desirable that the income of the said Archdeaconry of Rochester should be augmented in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“And whereas the grant hereinafter recommended and proposed will not have the effect of raising the annual income provided for such Archdeaconry out of the Common Fund created by the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, beyond the sum of £300 and will not raise the whole income of that Archdeaconry, including the income derived from any ecclesiastical office or preferment annexed thereto, beyond the sum of £1,000 per annum:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Martin, Bishop of Rochester (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that, subject as is hereinafter mentioned, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund by equal quarterly payments on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year to the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Rochester and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a yearly sum of £125, such yearly sum to take effect and be calculated as from the 1st day of January, 1934. Provided always that before any payment in respect of the said yearly sum shall be made by us we shall require to be satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous 12 calendar months complied with the conditions as to

residence which for the time being are required by law.

"And we further recommend and propose that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees or any of these fees or payments shall no longer be receivable by the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry, and all such fees or payments shall accordingly cease to be payable to the said Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of £125 hereinbefore recommended to be paid to the said Archdeacon of Rochester shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry, such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, and Measure, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament, or Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of January, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice of Fen Drayton with the Benefice (being part of the United Benefice of Conington with Knapwell) of Conington, and (2) of the Benefice of Elsworth with the Benefice (being the remaining part of the said United Benefice of Conington with Knapwell) of Knapwell, all of which Benefices

are situate in the County of Cambridge and in the Diocese of Ely:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Leonard, Bishop of Ely, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefices of Fen Drayton and Conington and (2) of the said Benefices of Elsworth and Knapwell duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Ely and therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same and the said Bishop of Ely signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Fen Drayton and Elsworth are now full, the Reverend Edward George Augustine Gardener being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Fen Drayton and the Reverend Lawrence Iggulden being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Elsworth and the said United Benefice of Conington with Knapwell is at present vacant:

"And whereas the Patrons of the said Benefice of Fen Drayton have in view of the intended union of that Benefice with the Benefice of Conington as hereinafter recommended secured to the said Benefice of Fen Drayton (a) certain Tithe Rentcharges commuted at £420 19s. 5d. arising within the Parish of Fen Drayton subject to a charge of £60 per annum payable to the said Patrons and (b) a certain house and premises situate at Fen Drayton and belonging to the said Patrons as a Parsonage or house of residence for the Incumbent of such Benefice:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Leonard, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents of the said Edward George Augustine Gardener and of the said Lawrence Iggulden (testified by their signing this Scheme respectively), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Fen Drayton and the part of the said United Benefice of Conington with Knapwell which consists of the said Benefice of Conington shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Fen Drayton with Conington' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That the said Benefice of Elsworth and the part of the said United Benefice of Conington with Knapwell which consists of the said Benefice of Knapwell shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Elsworth with Knapwell' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Bourne but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the unions shall forthwith take effect and the said Edward George Augustine Gardener if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Fen Drayton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Fen Drayton with Conington and the said Lawrence Iggulden if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Elsworth shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Elsworth with Knapwell.

"4. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Fen Drayton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Fen Drayton with Conington (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Elsworth shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Elsworth with Knapwell and (c) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Conington with Knapwell and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale or such part thereof as to us and to the Bishop of Ely shall seem expedient shall be appropriated towards the cost of repairing and improving the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Fen Drayton and any balance of such net proceeds shall be held and invested by us for the benefit of the United Benefice of Fen Drayton with Conington.

"5. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefices from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say (a) the right of presentation to the United Benefice of Fen Drayton with Conington shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said Benefices of Fen Drayton and Conington with Knapwell alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Conington with Knapwell having the right upon the first presentation to such United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Fen Drayton having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the same United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter, and (b) in every series of five successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Elsworth with Knapwell after the unions the Patron of the said Benefice of Elsworth shall have the first, the third, the fourth and the fifth turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Conington with Knapwell shall have the second turn.

"6. That upon the unions taking effect (a) a part of the endowments and property belonging to the said United Benefices of Conington with Knapwell, namely all glebe land belonging to such United Benefice which is situate within the Parish of Conington and

a sum of £7,122 19s. 2d. Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock at present held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners on behalf of the said United Benefice of Conington with Knapwell shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Fen Drayton with Conington, and (b) all other endowments and property belonging to the said United Benefice of Conington with Knapwell (except the Parsonage House hereinbefore directed to be sold) shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Elsworth with Knapwell.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Ely has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by the Churchwardens of Fen Drayton, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order in Council of the 19th day of April, 1933:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, having taken the said appeal into consideration, reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme be affirmed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council by Order of the 26th day of February, 1934, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be

effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ely.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 22nd day of February, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of so much as is hereinafter mentioned of the ownership of the Advowson or right of Patronage of and presentation to each of these Benefices, namely, the Benefice (being a District) of Saint Chad, Rubery, situate partly in the County of Warwick and partly in the County of Worcester, the Benefice (being a District) of Saint Mark, Stockland Green, situate in the said County of Warwick, and the Benefice (being a District) of Saint Edmund, Tyseley, situate in the said County of Worcester, all of which Benefices are situate in the Diocese of Birmingham, for so much as is hereinafter mentioned of the ownership of the Advowson or right of Patronage of and presentation to each of three other Benefices, namely, the Benefice (being a District) of Saint Faith and Saint Laurence, Harborne, situate in the said County of Warwick, the Benefice (being a District) of Saint Mark, Londonderry, situate partly in the said County of Worcester and partly in the County of Stafford, and the Benefice (being a District) of Saint Hilda, Warley Woods, situate in the said County of Worcester, all of which Benefices are likewise situate in the said Diocese of Birmingham:

“Whereas under the provisions of the 21st Section of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, the right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the six Benefices mentioned above is at present exercised alternately by Your Majesty and by the Bishop of Birmingham for the time being:

“And whereas it has been proposed to us that the Patronage of the said six Benefices

should be assigned and transferred by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said Benefices and of the Patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said Benefices respectively are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham, as the alternate Patron of each of the said three Benefices of Saint Chad, Rubery; Saint Mark, Stockland Green; and Saint Edmund, Tyseley (in testimony of which consent he, the said Bishop, has affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), and with the consent of the Right Honourable James Ramsay MacDonald, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the alternate Patron of each of the said three Benefices of Saint Faith and Saint Laurence, Harborne; Saint Mark, Londonderry; and Saint Hilda, Warley Woods (in testimony of which consent he, the said James Ramsay MacDonald, has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the alternate right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said three Benefices of Saint Chad, Rubery; Saint Mark, Stockland Green; and Saint Edmund, Tyseley, which is now as aforesaid exercised by the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham, shall be transferred from him, the said Bishop, and from his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth belong to and may from time to time be exercised by Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors for ever in such manner that the whole Advowson of each of the last mentioned three Benefices shall hereafter belong to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors for ever, and that in exchange for the same the alternate right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said three Benefices of Saint Faith and Saint Laurence, Harborne; Saint Mark, Londonderry; and Saint Hilda, Warley Woods, which is now exercised as aforesaid by Your Majesty shall be transferred from Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth belong to and may from time to time be exercised by the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham, and his successors, Bishops of Birmingham, for ever, in such manner that the whole Advowson of each of the last mentioned three Benefices shall hereafter belong to the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham, and his successors, Bishops of Birmingham for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of March, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See

of Bristol and known as Bishop's House, Bristol:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, now Bishop of Bristol, has submitted to us the particulars of certain improvements to be made at the said Episcopal Residence and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £153 (being a sum which does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Bristol:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said

Bishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £153 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of seven years or until the said sum of £153 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one fifth part of the said principal sum of £153 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage Deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Clifford Salisbury, now Bishop of Bristol, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £153 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of All Saints, North Beddington, situate within the Parish of Beddington, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Beddington, of the Parish of Mitcham, and of the Parish of Carshalton, both in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Beddington, of the said Parish of Mitcham, and of the said Parish of Carshalton, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of All Saints, North Beddington, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark, with the consent of Dorothy Mary Bridges, of Powers Croft, Saffrons Road, Eastbourne, in the County of Sussex, Widow, as

the Patron of the Rectory of the said Parish of Beddington, with the consent of the Reverend Alard Charles de Bourbel, of Elham Saint Mary, in the County of Kent, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Mitcham, and with the consent of John Cator, of Woodbastwick Hall, in the County of Norfolk, Esquire, as the Patron of the Rectory of the said Parish of Carshalton (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Beddington, of the said Parish of Mitcham, and of the said Parish of Carshalton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of All Saints, North Beddington, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, North Beddington.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, North Beddington, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Beddington, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the east by the Parish of Croydon, in the said County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury, upon the north by the Parish of Mitcham, upon the west by the Parish of Carshalton, upon the south by the New Parish of Wallington, all in the said County of Surrey and in the said Diocese of Southwark, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Wallington from the said Parish of Beddington at the point where such boundary diverges south-eastward from following the middle of London Road, and extending thence first northward and then north westward along the middle of London Road for a distance of 27½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such road across the South London, Peckham, and Sutton Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Mile Road across such line of railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Mile Road for a distance of 60 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Beddington Lane, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Beddington Lane for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to the Croydon Borough Fever Hospital, and extending thence eastward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the gateway at the western entrance to such hospital, and extending thence first northward and then north eastward along the walls or fences forming the western and northern boundaries of the premises attached to the said hospital

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Mitcham which is bounded upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Peter, Saint Helier, in the said County of Surrey and in the said Diocese of Southwark, upon part of the south by the said Parish of Carshalton, upon the remaining part of the south and upon the east by the above described portion of the said Parish of Beddington, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north east and upon the north west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Beddington from the said Parish of Mitcham crosses the middle of the said Croydon and Wimbledon Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence north westward along the middle of such line of railway for a distance of 74 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Willow Lane across such line of railway, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Willow Lane for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern bank of the River Wandle, and extending thence in a straight line due west for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Mitcham from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Saint Helier.

"III. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Carshalton which is bounded upon the east by the above described portion of the said Parish of Beddington, upon the north by the above described portion of the said Parish of Mitcham, upon the north west and upon part of the west by the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Saint Helier, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Saint Helier, from the said Parish of Carshalton diverges westward from following the middle of Greenwrythe Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Greenwrythe Lane for a distance of 16½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Culvers Avenue, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Culvers Avenue for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across the western branch of the River Wandle, and extending thence first southward and then eastward along the middle of such branch of the River Wandle for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the main stream at a short distance north east of Hack Bridge upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Carshalton from the said Parish of Beddington."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part

thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.
