WHEREAS the Right Reverend James, Lord Bishop of Wakefield, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Lord Archbishop of York, in the following terms:—

“I, The Right Reverend James, Bishop of Wakefield, do in pursuance of the Twenty-sixth section of the Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, hereby represent to Your Grace that there is in the County of York and in my Diocese of Wakefield the Vicarage of Whitwood the Parish whereof comprises inter alia the piece of land coloured blue on the plan hereunto annexed and marked with the letter ‘A’ which immediately adjoins the Parish of Whitwood Mere the boundaries of both which Parishes are well known and defined.

“That there is also within the said County and Diocese the Parish of Featherstone which immediately adjoins the Parish of Whitwood and comprises inter alia the land coloured yellow on the said plan.

“That there is also in the said County and Diocese the Parish of Pontefract Saint Giles which comprises inter alia certain detached pieces of land coloured green and green verged with red on the tracing marked ‘B’ annexed to the said plan.

“That there is also in the said County and Diocese the Parish of Pontefract All Saints the boundaries of which are well known and defined which comprises inter alia two pieces of land coloured respectively mauve and pale blue on the said plan.

“That there is also in the said County and Diocese the Parish of Ferry Fryston the boundaries of which are well known and defined which comprises inter alia the land coloured brown on the said plan.

“That there is also in the said County and Diocese the Parish of Carleton the boundaries of which are well known and defined which comprises inter alia the piece of land coloured pink on the said plan, which immediately adjoins the Parish of Pontefract Saint Giles.

“That there is also in the said County and Diocese the Parish of Pontefract Saint Giles the boundaries of which are well known and defined and contains within its area certain extra parochial land known as Pontefract Park and is coloured dark blue and green on the said plan.

“That according to the 1931 Census the population of the said Parish of Whitwood is 1,377 or thereabouts; the population of the said Parish of Whitwood Mere is 4,820 or

thereabouts; the population of the said Parish of Featherstone is 5,623 or thereabouts; the population of the said Parish of Pontefract Saint Giles is 11,992 or thereabouts; the population of the said Parish of Pontefract All Saints is 6,447 or thereabouts; the population of the said Parish of Ferry Fryston is 1,374 or thereabouts; the population of the said Parish of Carleton is 834 or thereabouts, and the population of the Extra Parochial place of Pontefract Park is 452, including in all cases the pieces of land referred to in the said plan. That the population of the said Parish of Whitwood is now estimated to be 2,869 or thereabouts.

“That the population of the areas proposed to be transferred by the Scheme hereinafter referred to is as follows, namely: that part of the Parish of Whitwood coloured blue 1500, that part of the Parish of Featherstone coloured yellow 70, those detached portions of the Parish of Pontefract Saint Giles coloured green and green verged with red 300, that part of the Parish of Pontefract All Saints coloured mauve 60, that part of the Parish of Pontefract All Saints coloured pale blue 316, that part of the Parish of Ferry Fryston coloured brown 30, that part of the Parish of Carleton coloured pink 76, the extra parochial portions coloured dark blue to be transferred to the Parish of Pontefract Saint Giles 148, and that part coloured green proposed to be transferred to the Parish of Pontefract All Saints 252.

“That it appears to me that under the provisions of the said Act of the 1st and 2nd Victoria Chapter 106 and of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same reign Chapter 49 the said area coloured blue on the said plan may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Whitwood to which it now belongs and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Whitwood Mere.

“That the said area coloured yellow on the said plan may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Featherstone to which it now belongs and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Whitwood.

“That the said area coloured mauve on the said plan may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Pontefract All Saints to which it now belongs and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Ferry Fryston.

“That the said extra parochial area coloured dark blue on the said plan may be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Pontefract Saint Giles, and that the extra parochial area and the part of Pontefract St. Giles both coloured green on the said plan may be advantageously annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Pontefract All Saints.

“That the area coloured brown on the said plan may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Ferry Fryston to which it now belongs and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Pontefract All Saints.

“That the said detached portions belonging to the Parish of Pontefract Saint Giles and coloured green on the said tracing marked ‘B’ annexed to the said plan may be advantageously separated from that Parish to
