#### WELFARE OF WORKERS IN FACTORIES AND WORKSHOPS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that after consultation with the General Waste Materials Reclamation Trade Board (Great Britain), in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 7 of the Police, Factories, etc. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, of making Orders for securing the welfare of the workers

employed in factories and workshops, he proposes to make an Order to apply to all factories and workshops or parts thereof in which is carried on the sorting or packing of waste paper, cardboard, millboard, rags, or other textile waste material.
