CENSUS OF HORSES, 12TH MAY, 1934.

(GREAT BRITAIN.)

ORDER BY THE ARMY COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 114 OF THE ARMY ACT.

1. All owners of horses are required under the above-mentioned Section to fill up (in duplicate) the Form prescribed by the Army Council in their Regulations regarding the Census of Horses, 1934, giving the required particulars in respect of all horses (as defined in such Regulations) owned by them on 12th May, 1934.

2. If the owner is notified that the Return will be called for he must complete the Return and hand it to the constable, or other representative of the Chief Officer of Police, who calls for it.

If the owner is not so notified he must complete the Return and forward it within three days of receipt, to the Police Station named on the back of the form.

(Forms may be folded and posted without covering envelope, and postage need not be prepaid.)

REGULATIONS REGARDING THE CENSUS OF HORSES, 1934, MADE BY THE ARMY COUNCIL ON 5TH APRIL, 1934.

- 1. Any person who, on the twelfth day of May, 1934, is the owner of any horse within Great Britain shall, on or before the twenty-second day of May, 1934, make a Return to the Army Council in the form set out in the schedule hereto, giving the information specified in such form with regard to every such horse owned by him on the twelfth day of May whether in his possession on that day or not.
- 2. Horses loaned out, or sent for sale but not yet sold, or supplied under contract, must be accounted for by the actual owner or his representative, and not by the person in whose charge they are.
- 3. A separate return shall be furnished in respect of horses owned in each borough, urban district or county. In cases where horses under one ownership are not all stabled or kept in the same places, the owner may, however, include in one Return all the horses owned by him and stabled or kept in separate localities of the same borough or urban district or (if stabled or kept elsewhere than in a borough or urban district) in separate localities of the same county. In this Regulation as applying to Scotland, the expressions "borough" and "urban district" shall mean a burgh.
 - 4. For the purpose of these Regulations:-
 - "Horse" shall include foal, yearling, mare, gelding, colt, filly and pony.
- 5. Failure to comply with the above requirements is a summary offence under Section 114 of the Army Act.
