1901 TO 1929.**

In pursuance of Section 118 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, the Right Honourable Sir John Gilmour, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been pleased to appoint William Douglas Short, Esq., to be an Inspector of Factories and Workshops.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of male young persons of 16 years of age and over in attending mixer and brick press and in wheeling bricks from press to drying sheds and kilns at the works of Amalgamated Anthracite Collieries Limited, Pontamman, Ammanford, subject to compliance with The Clay Works Welfare Order, 1932, and to the condition that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks.
