A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING THE PROCLAMATIONS OF 12TH AUGUST, 1876, THE 17TH MAY, 1920, AND THE 2ND MAY, 1925, FOR THE REGULATION OF THE CURRENCY OF THE COLONY OF MAURITIUS AND ITS DEPENDENCIES.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas by a Proclamation made by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, bearing date the 12th day of August, 1876, provision was made for the regulation of the currency of Our Colony of Mauritius and its Dependencies (hereinafter called "the Colony"):

And whereas by Our Proclamations dated respectively the 17th day of May, 1920, and the 2nd day of May, 1925, further provision was made for the like purpose:

And whereas by Letters Patent dated the 11th day of September, 1913, as amended by

subsequent Letters Patent, the Governor of the Colony is empowered with the advice and consent of the Council of Government to make laws for the peace, order, and good government of the Colony:

And whereas it is expedient that further provision respecting the currency of the Colony should be made by a law or laws enacted by the Governor as aforesaid and that, in the event of such further provision being so made, the said herein-before-mentioned Proclamations of the 12th day of August, 1876, the 17th day of May, 1920, and the 2nd day of May, 1925, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby declare and ordain as follows:—

1. As from the date of the commencement of any law made by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Council of Government making further provision as to the currency of the Colony, the herein-before-mentioned Proclamations of the 12th day of August, 1876, of the 17th day of May, 1920, and of the 2nd day of May, 1925, shall be revoked, and shall as from that date cease to apply to and to be in force in the Colony.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Mauritius (Coinage) Proclamation, 1934.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace* this fourteenth day of *May*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and in the twenty-fifth year of Our Reign.

AUTUMN ASSIZES, 1934.

2. This Order shall not affect the existing powers of altering Commission days.

3. This Order may be cited as the Autumn Circuit (1934) Order, 1934.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that at a Trial of the Pyx begun at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London on the 13th day of March and concluded on the 2nd day of May, 1934, the following Verdict of the Pyx Jury was delivered to the King's Remembrancer, viz.:—

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON
MINT.

VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the thirteenth day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the 1st day of January One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three to the 31st day of December One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, both days inclusive.

We found that there were no gold coins in the said Pyx. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us, and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of silver coins with four additional coins from one of such packets making altogether two crowns, forty-three half-crowns, thirty-three florins, thirty-six shillings, sixty-four sixpences, one fourpence, twenty three-pences, two twopences and one penny. We then weighed each one pound troy weight (at its standard weight) of the coins so taken out and ascertained that the said coins so bulked were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We then took for assay one pound troy (at its standard weight) of the coins so weighed comprising two crowns, six half-crowns, twelve florins, eleven shillings, ten sixpences, one fourpence, one threepence, two twopences and one penny, and we ascertained that the amount of variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920 was, for such pound so taken for assay minus seven thousandths ($-.007$) of one ounce on the whole, and that, therefore, such pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was on the whole within the variation from standard weight so allowed. We then assayed separately the coins in the pound troy so taken for assay, comparing them with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Coinage Act 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said coins was on the whole within the remedy as to fineness prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard fineness so prescribed was minus five ten-thousandths ($-.0005$) on the whole of the coins in such pound, and that, therefore, the said pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was, on the whole, within the variation from fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the coins remaining in the said packets of silver coins and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the remedy as to weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, being one hundred and fifty-seven thousandths of an ounce ($-.157$) below the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts.

STOURBRIDGE FAIR.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF WEST HARTLEPOOL.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

THE WEST HARTLEPOOL (PUBLIC HEALTH)
ORDER, 1934.

BY an Order dated the 3rd day of May, 1934, the Minister of Health has Declared that, on and after the 21st day of May, 1934, the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the County Borough of West Hartlepool, namely:—

Sections 15, 23, 24, 28 and 29, comprised in Part II (streets and buildings);

Sections 43 and 44, comprised in Part III (sanitary provisions);

Sections 64 and 67, comprised in Part IV (infectious diseases); and

Sections 92 and 93, comprised in Part X (miscellaneous).

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject as regards Sections 23 and 92 to the conditions specified in the Order.

The Minister of Health has repealed, as from the dates specified in the Order, the following provisions of the West Hartlepool Extension and Improvement Act, 1870, namely:—

Section 83 (materials in streets sewered and paved);

Section 106 (penalty for not lighting deposits of building materials or excavations) so far as it relates to any street repairable by the inhabitants at large;

Section 122 (height of buildings in street);

Section 194 (urinals attached to public-houses &c.);
