

5. Candidates must have obtained a School Certificate, preferably with a credit in Mathematics.

6. Those candidates who from their application forms appear to the Civil Service Commissioners to be best fitted for the post will be submitted to an examination in Drawing to test their skill in plan drawing and lettering and will also be admitted to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for appointment such candidates as they consider most suitable, having regard to the number of vacancies to be filled, from among those who qualify in the examination in Drawing. The Selection Board will be nominated by the Civil Service Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department who will be represented on the Selection Board. The decision of the Selection Board will be final.

Candidates admitted to the examination in Drawing will be required to pay a fee of 8s.

7. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's previous work.

8. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed on probation for a period of not less than three months, subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible for appointment in respect of age, nationality, health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

9. The Chief Land Registrar will require to be satisfied from periodical reports or by examination by the Head of the Mapping Branch that persons appointed as Probationers possess the necessary qualifications for appointment to the grade of Mapping Assistant. A Probationer who proves to be unsatisfactory or shows no promise of acquiring the necessary qualifications during the three months probationary period will not be retained in the Service. All appointments are subject to the general conditions of service applicable to Crown servants.

10. Subject to satisfactory reports and on reaching the age of 19 Probationers will be appointed to the grade of Mapping Assistant (unestablished); and on attaining the age of 20, Mapping Assistants (unestablished) will be eligible for consideration for appointment to the established staff, subject to the occurrence of vacancies. Appointment to the established staff is conditional on the issue of a certificate of qualification by the Civil Service Commissioners; in the event of the Commissioners declining to issue a certificate of qualification, the candidate will not be retained in the Service.

11. A fee of 8s., being the balance of the prescribed fee of 16s., is payable to the Civil Service Commissioners before the certificate of qualification can be issued.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice of a competition to be held under the foregoing Regulations.

It is anticipated that at least 12 vacancies will be filled on the result of this competition,

provided a sufficient number of candidates should be found to be duly qualified.

No person will be considered from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 14th June, 1934, an application, in the candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport in exercise of the power conferred upon him by the Road Traffic Act, 1930, has made the Motor Vehicles (Authorisation of Special Types) Order (No. 2) 1934.

The Order authorises subject to certain provisos the use on roads of land locomotives as defined in Regulation 3 of the Motor Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations, 1931, specially designed and constructed as rotary ploughs, notwithstanding that such vehicles do not comply with the requirements of Regulations 20 and 21 of those Regulations.
