WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 11th day of April, 1934 (N. 5797), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council of the 11th October, 1921, and the 1st February, 1926, to sanction scales of pay for the Seedie ratings of Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the title of 'Seedie' at present applied to these ratings is unsuitable, they being for the most part recruited from Somaliland:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the title of 'Somali' being substituted for the present title of 'Seedie'."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 and 34 Vict. c. 52) to 1906 (6 Edw. VII c. 15) it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in

the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 31st March, 1873, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the King of Denmark for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, in the case of which Treaty the Extradition Act, 1870, was applied by Order in Council of the 26th day of June, 1873:

And whereas there was signed on the 4th day of May, 1910, between His Majesty and other Powers and States enumerated therein one of whom was His Majesty the King of Denmark, a Convention for the suppression of the white slave traffic, which contains Articles in the terms following:—

*" Article 1.*

" Doit être puni quiconque, pour satisfaire les passions d'autrui, a embauché, entraîné ou détourné, même avec son consentement, une femme ou fille mineure, en vue de la débauche, alors même que les divers actes qui sont les éléments constitutifs de l'infraction auraient été accomplis dans des pays différents.

*" Article 2.*

" Doit être aussi puni quiconque, pour satisfaire les passions d'autrui, a, par fraude ou à l'aide de violences, menaces, abus d'autorité, ou toute autre moyen de contrainte, embauché, entraîné ou détourné une femme ou fille majeure en vue de la débauche, alors même que les divers actes qui sont les éléments constitutifs de l'infraction auraient été accomplis dans des pays différents.

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*" Article 5.*

" Les infractions prévues par les articles 1 et 2 seront, à partir du jour de l'entrée en vigueur de la présente Convention, réputées être inscrites de plein droit au nombre des infractions donnant lieu à extradition d'après les Conventions déjà existantes entre les Parties contractantes.

" Dans les cas où la stipulation qui précède ne pourrait recevoir effet sans modifier la législation existante, les Parties contractantes s'engagent à prendre ou à proposer à leurs législatures respectives les mesures nécessaires.

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*" Article 11.*

" Si un Etat contractant désire la mise en vigueur de la présente Convention dans une ou plusieurs de ses colonies, possessions ou circonscriptions consulaires judiciaires, il notifiera son intention à cet effet par un acte qui sera déposé dans les archives du Gouvernement de la République française. Celui-ci en enverra, par la voie diplomatique, copie certifiée conforme à chacun des Etats contractants et les avisera en même temps de la date du dépôt.

" Six mois après la date du dépôt de l'acte de notification, la Convention entrera en

vigueur dans les colonies, possessions ou circonscriptions consulaires judiciaires visées dans l'acte de notification."

And whereas His Majesty has ratified the said Convention or acceded thereto in respect of, and the said Convention thereby extends to the following parts of His Majesty's dominions:—

And whereas His Majesty has been advised by His Ministers in the Commonwealth of Australia, New Zealand and the Union of South Africa to take the necessary steps to cause the said recited Acts to be applied in the case of Denmark in respect of the aforementioned Dominions in accordance with the said Treaty as supplemented by the said Convention:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him, by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Acts shall apply in respect of the above mentioned parts of His Majesty's dominions in the case of Denmark in accordance with the said Treaty as supplemented by the said Convention.

This Order shall come into operation on the 28th day of May, 1934, and may be cited as the Extradition (Denmark) (White Slave Traffic) Order in Council, 1934.

Provided that where His Majesty the King of Denmark has not notified his intention that the said Convention shall come into force in any of his Colonies, Possessions or Consular Judicial Districts by a declaration to that

effect deposited in the archives of the Government of the French Republic, the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended in respect of any such Colonies, Possessions or Consular Judicial Districts until such declaration shall have been so deposited and no longer.

**WHEREAS** by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, (which is a Section in Part XI of that Act), it is enacted amongst other things that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities on account of the services of lighthouses, buoys and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of those establishments, and that an increase of any establishment or part of an establishment so fixed shall not be made without the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by Section 738 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is provided that where His Majesty has power under that Act or any Act thereafter to be passed amending the same to make an Order in Council His Majesty may from time to time make that Order in Council, and by Order in Council revoke, alter or add to any Order so made:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is amongst other things provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund:

And whereas by Order in Council made on the 14th day of December, 1922 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), His Majesty fixed the clerical and engineering establishments which might be maintained by the Corporation of Trinity House of Deptford Strond (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") being one of the General Lighthouse Authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the amount of the salaries to be paid to the officers of the said establishments:

And whereas by the Orders in Council specified in the First Schedule to this Order certain alterations in and additions to the Principal Order were made in so far as the said Order relates to the engineering establishment of the Corporation:

And whereas it is expedient that the engineering establishment of the Corporation should be altered and increased in the manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Board of Trade have consented to such increase:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as The Trinity House (Increase of Establishment) Order, 1934.

2. The Second Schedule hereto shall be substituted for Part II of the Second Schedule to the Principal Order as amended by any subsequent Order in Council and the engineering establishment of the Corporation shall, as from the 1st day of October, 1933, consist of the posts enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto at the salaries of which the minimum annual increment and maximum are respectively set out in the said Schedule.

Provided that the salary of the post of the Clerical Officer shall increase by the annual increments for Clerical Officers set out in Part I of the said Second Schedule to the Principal Order.

3. The Orders in Council specified in the First Schedule to this Order which amend the Principal Order are hereby revoked.

4. Notwithstanding anything in this Order the salary of Mr. A. E. Wyatt at present holding the post of Super Clerical Officer (Chief Engineering Clerk) shall be £450 per annum, rising by annual increments of £20 to a maximum of £600 per annum.

5. Notwithstanding anything in Part I of the Second Schedule to the Principal Order, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council, as from the 1st day of October, 1932, the clerical establishment of the Corporation shall be increased by the inclusion of:—

(a) Mr. R. C. Daws and Mr. W. E. Trickett as "S" Class Clerks, Grade III, on a salary scale commencing at 51s. 3d. a week inclusive and rising by annual increments of 2s. 6d. a week to a maximum of 68s. 9d. a week inclusive, subject to variation in accordance with fluctuations in the cost of living figure; and

(b) Miss F. M. Fenn as a Writing Assistant with a salary scale of 18s. a week, rising by annual increments of 2s. a week to a maximum of 36s. a week.

6. The salaries payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

**W**HEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the territories mentioned in the Schedule to this Order:

And whereas certain persons who are regarded as belonging to those territories are afforded His Majesty's protection, and are known as British protected persons:

And whereas it is expedient to define in relation to those territories the persons who are so regarded as belonging thereto:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression "the territory" means any territory mentioned in the Schedule to this Order.

2. The following persons shall be regarded as belonging to the territory:—

(a) any person born (whether before or after the entry into force of this Order) within the territory who is not, at the time of his birth, a British subject, and who does not, at the time of his birth, possess under the law of some other State the nationality of such State;

(b) any person born (whether before or after the entry into force of this Order) out of the territory who is not, at the time of his birth, a British subject and does not possess under the law of some other State the nationality of such State and whose father was, at the time of that person's birth, a person who under this Order is regarded as belonging to the territory and was himself born within the territory;

Provided that any person born after the death of his father (whether before or after the entry into force of this Order) shall be regarded as belonging to the territory if he would, if born before his father's death, have been so regarded.

3. The wife of a person who under this Order is regarded as belonging to the territory shall be regarded as belonging to the territory if she has, with the permission of the Government, become resident with her husband in the territory, and is not a British subject and does not possess the nationality of any other State.

4. A person who under this Order is regarded as belonging to the territory and who

(a) becomes a British subject; or

(b) not being a married woman, minor, lunatic, or idiot, by some voluntary and formal act, acquires the nationality of a State in which he is resident; or

(c) being the wife or minor child of a person who ceases to be regarded as belonging to the territory under paragraph (b) of this Article, acquires the nationality of some other State; or

(d) being the wife of a national of some other State, acquires the nationality of her husband, shall thereupon cease to be regarded as belonging to the territory.

5. This Order may be cited as the British Protected Persons Order, 1934.

**W**HEREAS, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by section six of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917 (7 & 8 Geo. 5. c. 51), and section three of the Auxiliary Air Force and Air Force Reserve Act, 1924 (14 & 15 Geo. 5. c. 15), His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Force Reserve Order, 1924 (S.R. & O. 1924, No. 1213), whereby certain provisions of the Reserve Forces Act, 1882 (45 & 46 Vict. c. 48), including section eleven thereof, and certain provisions of the Territorial and Reserve Forces Act, 1907 (7 Edw. 7. c. 9), as set out with modifications in the Schedules to the said Order, were applied as so modified to the air force reserve and to the officers and men of that reserve:

And whereas, by section one of the Air Force Reserve (Pilots and Observers) Act, 1934 (24 Geo. 5. c. 5), it is provided that the power of His Majesty under the first recited Act to apply by Order in Council to the air force reserve, or to the officers and men thereof, any of the enactments relating to the army reserve, or to the officers and men thereof, shall be extended so as to include power so to apply any of those enactments with such modifications as may be necessary to provide that, notwithstanding anything in subsection (1) of the said section eleven of the Reserve Forces Act, 1882, the period or periods for which men of the air force reserve who are serving therein as qualified pilots or qualified observers, or are under instruction with a view to qualifying for service as such, may be called out for training, shall be such period or periods as may be prescribed by orders or regulations made under the Reserve Forces Act, 1882, as so applied as aforesaid, not exceeding in any one year—

(i) in the case of a man who is serving as a qualified pilot or as a qualified observer, twenty-four days; and

(ii) in the case of a man who is undergoing instruction with a view to his qualifying for service as a pilot or as an observer, six months:

And whereas it is by the said section provided that nothing therein shall affect any man who was in the air force reserve at the date of the passing of the said Act, or any man who was in the regular air force at that date and has subsequently been transferred to the air force reserve, unless in either case he agrees in writing to accept the obligations imposed by the said section in lieu of the obligations originally undertaken by him:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order of nineteen hundred and twenty-four should be amended in so far as it applies section eleven of the Reserve Forces Act, 1882, to the air force reserve and to the men thereof, and it is expedient on the ground of urgency that this Order should come into immediate operation as a provisional Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Section eleven of the Reserve Forces Act, 1882, as set out with modifications in the

Schedule to this Order, shall apply to the air force reserve and to the men of that reserve in the form in which it is there set out in lieu of in the form in which it is set out in the first Schedule to the Air Force Reserve Order, 1924, and that Schedule shall be deemed to be amended accordingly.

2. This Order shall come into operation forthwith as a provisional Order.

3. This Order may be cited as the Air Force Reserve (Pilots and Observers) Order, 1934.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### SECTION 11 OF THE RESERVE FORCES ACT, 1882, AS MODIFIED.

11.—(1) All or any of the men belonging to the air force reserve may be called out for annual training at such time or times, and at such place or places within Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and for such period or periods as may be prescribed, so, however, that the period or periods so prescribed shall not in any one year exceed:—

(i) in the case of a man who is serving as a qualified pilot or as a qualified observer, twenty-four days;

(ii) in the case of a man who is undergoing instruction with a view to his qualifying for service as a pilot or as an observer, six months; and

(iii) in the case of any other man, twelve days or twenty drills or instructional parades:

Provided that nothing in paragraph (i) or in paragraph (ii) of this subsection shall apply to or affect any man who was in the air force reserve on the twenty-eighth day of March nineteen hundred and thirty-four, or who was in the regular air force on that date and has subsequently been transferred to the air force reserve, unless in either case he has agreed in writing to accept the obligations imposed by the paragraph in question in lieu of his obligations under paragraph (iii) of this subsection.

In this subsection "qualified" means qualified in accordance with orders or regulations made under this Act.

(2) Every man so called out may during his annual training be attached to and trained with a body of the regular air force or of the auxiliary air force.

**W**HEREAS by Section 37 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932, it is enacted that His Majesty, if satisfied that the Government of any country has ratified the Safety Convention, may, by Order in Council, make a declaration to that effect:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Government of the Irish Free State has ratified the Safety Convention:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the aforesaid Section and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare and doth hereby declare that the Government of the Irish Free State has ratified the Safety Convention.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Wythenshawe Parishes (Transfer) Measure, 1933, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 22nd day of March, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Wythenshawe Parishes (Transfer) Measure, 1933, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme in respect of certain matters in connection with the transfer to the Diocese of Manchester of the Parishes of Northenden and Baguley and of a part of the Parish of Timperley:

"Whereas by virtue of the said Measure the Parishes of Northenden and Baguley and a part of the Parish of Timperley were as from the 28th day of June, 1933, transferred from the Diocese of Chester to the Diocese of Manchester and included in the Archdeaconry of Manchester and in the Rural Deanery of Heaton:

"And whereas it is provided by the third Section of the said Measure that at any time within twelve months after the 28th day of June, 1933, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, may lay before Your Majesty in Council for confirmation a Scheme for all or any of the matters hereinafter mentioned and generally for making such provisions and arrangements as may be necessary for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Measure:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose as follows, namely:—

"1. The Chester Diocesan Board of Finance is hereby authorised and directed to transfer or convey to the Board of Finance of the Diocese of Manchester (a) all that sum of stock at present held by the said Chester Diocesan Board of Finance on behalf of the said Parish of Northenden and (b) all those plots of land together with any buildings thereon and any other property which from time to time have been conveyed to and are now held by the said Chester Diocesan Board of Finance on behalf of the said Parishes of Northenden and Baguley, including that portion of land situate near Wythenshawe Road in the said Parish of Northenden which was conveyed to them by deed dated the 12th day of April, 1932, and on receiving from the Board of Finance of the Diocese of Manchester for the last mentioned piece of land the sum of £400, the said sum of stock and all such lands

buildings and other property to be held by the said Board of Finance of the Diocese of Manchester upon the trusts and for the purposes upon and for which the same are now held by the said Chester Diocesan Board of Finance.

"2. The Bishop's Secretary, Registrar, Apparitor General, Sealer or Record-keeper of the Diocese or Bishopric of Manchester and the Registrar and any other officer of the Archdeaconry of Manchester shall respectively on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year, so long as the present Bishop's Secretary, Registrar, Apparitor General, Sealer or Record-keeper of the Diocese or Bishopric of Chester or the Registrar or other officer of the Archdeaconry of Macclesfield who was appointed to his office before the 28th day of June, 1933, continue to hold such office, pay to such Bishop's Secretary, Registrar, Apparitor General, Sealer or Record-keeper of the Diocese or Bishopric of Chester or such Registrar or other officer of the Archdeaconry of Macclesfield half of the net fees received by such accounting officer during the six months preceding the said first day of January or first day of July (as the case may be) for work done by such accounting officer in the exercise of his office (or by any other officer who may by usage or otherwise perform the duties of such office) in or in relation to the said Parishes of Northenden and Baguley and the said part of the Parish of Timperley, such fees to be calculated upon the scale of fees which shall be in force within the Diocese of Manchester or the Archdeaconry of Manchester (as the case may be) and in computing such net fees there shall be deducted from the gross fees so received as aforesaid the out of pocket expenses incurred in relation to the matters in respect of which the fees have been received, such out of pocket expenses being deemed to be one half of the gross fees."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said Dioceses of Manchester and Chester.

the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"And whereas by a certain Deed bearing date on or about the 22nd day of March, 1934, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856' or some or one of them between the Reverend Henry Edwards Collins, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Rotherfield, of the first part, the Most Honourable Henry Gilbert Ralph Nevill, Marquis of Abergavenny, the Patron of the said Rectory of Rotherfield, of the second part, the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, the Ordinary of the said Rectory of Rotherfield, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part (which Deed is intended to be registered in the books of the Charity Commissioners), the said Henry Edwards Collins did, with the consent of the said Henry Gilbert Ralph Nevill, Marquis of Abergavenny, as such Patron as aforesaid, and of the said George, Bishop of Chichester, as such Ordinary as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the Minister or Incumbent of the District or New Parish hereinafter recommended to be constituted, and to his successors, one perpetual clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £200 to be payable quarterly on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in every year free from and clear of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any), and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all that the said Rectory of the Parish of Rotherfield and the tithes or tithe commutation rent charges, glebe lands and hereditaments, and all other the endowments and emoluments for the time being to the said Rectory belonging, the first of such quarterly payments in respect of the said clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £200 to be made on such of the said quarterly days of payment as shall happen

next after the date of the licence of the first Minister or Incumbent of the said intended District or New Parish and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of the said licence to the said quarterly day of payment:

"And whereas the said yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £200 has been granted by the said Henry Edwards Collins as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Henry Edwards Collins has nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chichester as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Mardale and Bampton are now full, the Reverend Frederick Henry John Barham being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Mardale and the Reverend Wilfrid Howard Cormack being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bampton:

"And whereas the share of the Patronage of the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect which upon a fair and just apportionment would be assignable in respect of the interest of the Patron of the said Benefice of Mardale would in our opinion be negligible:

" And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111 :

" And whereas the said sums of £4,263 16s. 3d. Local Loans £3 per centum Stock and £2,402 17s. 1d. Local Loans £3 per centum Stock have been so assigned as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth :

" And whereas the said Henry James Kitcat has nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of London as the Person to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned :

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Hillingdon, of the said Parish of Ickenham, and of the said Parish of Cowley which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named ' The New Parish of All Saints, Hillingdon. '

" And we further recommend and propose that the said Church of All Saints, Hillingdon, shall as from the day last mentioned be and for that purpose we hereby specify the same Church as the Parish Church of the said New Parish of All Saints, Hillingdon.

" And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said Diocese of London, and his successors for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The New Parish of All Saints, Hillingdon, comprising :—

" I. All that portion of the Parish of Hillingdon, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon the south east by the Parish of Hayes, upon the east and upon part of the north by the Parish of Ickenham, upon the remaining part of the north by the Parish of Harefield, upon part of the west by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Hillingdon, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the west and upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Hillingdon, from the said Parish of Hillingdon, at the centre of the bridge across the River Pinn which connects Ickenham Road with Sweetcroft Lane and extending thence eastward along the middle of Sweetcroft Lane for a distance of 12 yards or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Honey Hill, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Honey Hill for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Vine Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Vine Lane for a distance of 29 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Court Drive, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Court Drive for a distance of 39½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Long Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of Long Lane for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sutton Court Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Sutton Court Road for a distance of 29½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Grosvenor Crescent and extending thence eastward in a straight line for a distance of 7 yards or thereabouts to a point in the fence forming the western boundary of the close known as Home Covert and numbered 1 upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence first southward and then eastward along the fences forming the western and southern boundaries of the said close for a distance of 19½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence meets the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 2 upon the said map or plan, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the last mentioned fence for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of the roadway leading from Polehill Farm into Polehill Road, and extending thence in a straight line due south across the said roadway for a distance of 8 yards or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hillingdon from the said Parish of Hayes.

" II. And also all those detached portions of the said Parish of Ickenham and of the Parish of Cowley in the said County and



Diocese which are entirely surrounded by the above described portion of the said Parish of Hillingdon."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District or New Parish recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Southwell was duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas Appeal was made to His Majesty in Council by the Parochial Church Council of Hayton and such Appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 25th May, 1933:

And whereas the said Scheme has been revised by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in pursuance of the Order in Council dated the 26th February, 1934, approving the Report made by the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council in the matter of the said Appeal:

And whereas the said Scheme so revised is in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Hayton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Clareborough, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Southwell, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Hayton and Clareborough duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Southwell and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Southwell signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Southwell embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Clareborough is now full the Reverend Edward Hester being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Hayton is at present vacant:—

"And whereas it was one of the terms of the said Report to the said Bishop of Southwell that after the union of the said Benefices of Clareborough and Hayton as hereinafter recommended and proposed the patronage of the United Benefice of Clareborough with Hayton should belong to the Patrons of the said two Benefices in alternate shares:

"And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Clareborough now belongs to certain Trustees (commonly known as and hereinafter referred to as the Simeon Trustees), namely, the Reverend Francis Edward Murphy, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Wells, the Reverend Charles Edward Wilson, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark, the Reverend Arthur James Tait, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Peterborough, the Reverend Christopher Maude Chavasse, Clerk in Holy Orders and Master of Saint Peter's Hall, Oxford, and the Very Reverend William Edward Reginald Morrow, Clerk in Holy Orders and Provost of the Cathedral Church of Chelmsford:

"And whereas the said Simeon Trustees are consenting to this Scheme to the intent that an exchange shall be made of such alternate share in the patronage of the United Benefice of Clareborough with Hayton as was recommended as aforesaid to be assigned to the said

Simeon Trustees for the patronage of the Benefice of Retford, Saint Saviour, in the said Diocese of Southwell, now belonging to the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, in right of his See:

"And whereas such proposed exchange of patronage appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be desirable for, the purpose of more conveniently carrying into execution the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, in regard to the union of Benefices hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell; as Diocesan and also as Patron of the said Benefice of Retford, Saint Saviour (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents (so far as concerns the exchange of patronage hereinafter recommended and proposed) of the said Simeon Trustees, that is to say, the said Francis Edward Murphy, Charles Edward Wilson, Arthur James Tait, Christopher Maude Chavasse and William Edward Reginald Morrow as Patrons of the said Benefice of Clareborough (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

That upon the said union taking effect the patronage of the said Benefice of Retford, Saint Saviour, which is now vested in the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, in right of his See, shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme and duly published in the London Gazette be transferred from the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever, and shall become and be absolutely vested in the said Simeon Trustees, and that

in exchange for such patronage so transferred, the alternate share in the patronage of the United Benefice recommended and proposed as aforesaid to be assigned to the said Simeon Trustees shall in like manner and by the same authority be transferred from the said Simeon Trustees and shall become and be absolutely vested in the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors, to the intent that the right of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be exercised as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Southwell and by the Patron of the said Benefice of Hayton alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Hayton having the right upon the first presentation or nomination to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Bishop of Southwell having the right upon the second presentation or nomination to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said

Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of All Saints, Shooter's Hill, Plumstead, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford, in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 20th day of August, 1915, and published in the London Gazette on the 24th day of the same month a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Mark, Basford, situate in the Parish of Wolstanton, in the said County and Diocese, and such Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Basford':

"And whereas the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Basford, has, under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford, shall be altered so that (first) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed

and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dis-severed from such New Parish and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Wolstanton, and (secondly) all that portion of the said Parish of Wolstanton which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green, shall be dis-severed from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

*"The First Schedule.*

"The territory to be dis-severed from the New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford, in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield, and to be restored to the Parish of Wolstanton, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford, which is bounded upon the north by the said Parish of Wolstanton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east and upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wolstanton from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford, at the junction of Basford Road, Bleak Street, and Woolliscroft Avenue, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Woolliscroft Avenue for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with May Avenue, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of May Avenue for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford, from the said Parish of Wolstanton.

*"The Second Schedule.*

"The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford, being:—

"All that portion of the said Parish of Wolstanton which is bounded upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford, from the said Parish of Wolstanton crosses the middle of May Avenue, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of May Avenue for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Brampton Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Brampton Road for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wolstanton from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Basford."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Cures

affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

#### COMMERCIAL RELATIONS WITH FRANCE.

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

*Inverness.*—An Area comprising:—

The Islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray; and except the parish of North Uist and all the islands therein, together with the island of Berneray in the parish of Harris and all the grazing islands attached thereto*), in the county of Inverness.

*Ross and Cromarty.*—An Area comprising:—

The Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

*Stirlingshire and Dunbarton and Perthshire.*—An Area comprising:—

*In the county of Stirling.*

The parish of Buchanan.

That part of the parish of Drymen that lies to the west of the public road which passes Balfunning House and which runs from the bridge over the Kelty Water at Wester Third to Drymen bridge over the River Endrick.

*In the county of Dunbarton.*

The premises known respectively as Ardleish Farm and Doune Farm in the parish of Arrochar.

*In the county of Perth.*

That part of the parish of Aberfoyle (including the premises in the occupation of the Glasgow Corporation known as Stronachlachar Farm and the premises known as Frenich Farm) which lies to the south and west of a line drawn from the point where the eastern boundary of Stronachlachar Farm joins Loch Katrine along the eastern boundary of the said Stronachlachar Farm; thence along the eastern boundary of Frenich Farm; thence along the western shore of Loch Chon; thence along the River Chon; thence along the southern shore of Loch Ard; thence along the River Forth to the point where it crosses the parish boundary near Gartmore Station.

That part of the parish of Port of Menteith that lies to the west of the road that runs from Gartmore Station to the Bridge over the Kelty Water at Wester Third.

The movement of sheep out of the following areas is regulated by the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934:—

*Area No. 1.*

So much of the counties of Westmorland and Lancashire and of the North and West Ridings of Yorkshire and of the borough of Lancaster as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the Kirkby Stephen station of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway; thence in a general southerly direction along the said railway via Hawes Junction, Dent Station,

Ribblehead Station, Horton Station, Stainforth, Settle, Long Preston, Swinden, Newsholme and Gisburn to the point near Downham Bridge where the railway is carried over Ings Beck; thence in a westerly direction along Ings Beck to the River Ribble; thence in a south-westerly direction along the River Ribble to the point where it is joined by the River Hodder; thence in a north-westerly direction along the River Hodder to the point where the road from White-well via Stakes and Dusty Clough to Chipping is carried over the said river; thence in a general westerly direction along the road via Dusty Clough, Chipping, Cold Coates, Lower Core, Brock Mill, Jack Anderton Bridge, Tootle Hall, Butt Hill, Dandy Birks and Sandholme Mill to Garstang and Catterall Station; thence in northerly direction along the London, Midland and Scottish Railway via Scorton Station and Galgate to Lancaster; thence continuing along the railway in a north-easterly direction via Halton, Caton, Hornby and Wennington to the point near Lower Bentham where the railway is carried over the road from Oxenforth Green to Lower Bentham; thence in a northerly direction along the road via Lower Bentham, Wards End, Four Lane Ends, Sunderland House, Burton in Lonsdale, and Anems to the point where the road crosses the Ingleton Branch of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway; thence continuing in a northerly direction along the railway via Kirkby Lonsdale Station, Barbon, Middleton Station to Tebay Station; thence in an easterly direction along the London and North Eastern Railway via Gaisgill and Newbiggin to the point where it crosses the London, Midland and Scottish Railway from Appleby to Hawes Junction; thence in a south-easterly direction along the London, Midland and Scottish Railway to the point of commencement.

*Area No. 2.*

So much of the county of Westmorland and of the North and West Ridings of Yorkshire and of the borough of Richmond as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point where the London and North Eastern Railway from Barnard Castle to Lartington crosses the River Tees; thence in a general west-south-westerly direction along the railway via Lartington, Bowes and Barras Station to the Kirkby Stephen Station of the London and North Eastern Railway; thence in a south-westerly direction along the road to the Kirkby Stephen Station of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway; thence in a southerly direction along the London, Midland and Scottish Railway to its junction with the London and North Eastern Railway at Hawes Junction; thence in an easterly direction along the London and North Eastern Railway via Hawes, Askrigg, Redmire and Leyburn to the point where the road from Fingall to Hunton is crossed by the railway; thence in a northerly direction along the road via Hunton, Craggs Lane Farm, Scotton, Scotton Hall, Wood House, Richmond, Gilling Grange, Gilling and Moor End Plantation to the point where the road meets the Watling Street; thence in a north-westerly direction along the Watling Street via Ravensworth Lodge and Newsham Grange to Rokeby Park; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary of Rokeby Park to the River Tees and thence in a north-westerly direction along the River Tees to the point of commencement.

*Area No. 3.*

So much of the counties of Derby and the West Riding of Yorkshire and of the city and county borough of Sheffield and of the boroughs of Chesterfield and Glossop as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the Railway Station at Glossop; thence in a southerly direction along the road from Glossop, via Hayfield, Hull End and Chapel Milton to Chapel-en-le-Frith; thence in a south-easterly direction along the road to Bennetston Hall and thence north-easterly along the road to Sparrowpit; thence in an east-south-easterly direction along the road via Peak Forest, Lane Head, Wardlow Mires, Stony Middleton, Calver and Bridge End to Nether End; thence in an easterly direction along the road via Robin Hood, Bleak House, Freebitch, Ingmanthorpe and Cutthorpe to Dunston Hall; thence in a general northerly direction along the road via Unstone, Dronfield, Little Norton to Norton Woodseats; thence along Woodseats Road till it meets the London, Midland and Scottish Railway that runs from Dore and Totley Station to Sheffield; thence in a north-easterly direction along the said railway to a point near to Victoria Station, Sheffield, where the London and North Eastern Railway lines, which run through Sheffield to Penistone, are carried over the said railway; thence in a north-westerly direction along the London and North Eastern Railway as far as Oughtibridge Station; thence in a westerly direction along the road between Grenoside and Oughtibridge to Oughtibridge; thence in a north-westerly direction via Wharncliffe Side, Deepcar, Stocksbridge, Sheephouse Wood and Langsett to Flouch Inn; thence in a westerly direction via Fiddlers Green and Saltersbrook Bridge, to the point where the road crosses the London and North Eastern Railway from Penistone to Glossop near the western end of Woodhead Tunnel and thence along the London and North Eastern Railway via Crowden to Glossop and the point of commencement.
