## A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING THE PROCLAMATION OF 29TH NOVEMBER, 1881, APPLYING THE COINAGE ACT, 1870, TO THE COLONY OF FIJI.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas by virtue of a Proclamation of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria dated the 29th day of November, 1881 (hereinafter called "the Proclamation"), the Coinage Act, 1870, was applied to the Colony of Fiji:

And whereas by virtue of the Coinage Act, 1870, it is lawful for Us, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to revoke any Proclamation previously made under that Act:

And whereas by Letters Patent dated the 9th February, 1929, the Governor of the Colony of Fiji (hereinafter called "the Governor") is empowered with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council to make by Ordinance laws for the peace, order, and good government of Fiji:

And whereas it is expedient that the Governor should be empowered to make further provision by Ordinance respecting the currency of Fiji, and that, in the event of such further provision being so made, the Proclamation should be revoked and the Coinage Act, 1870, should cease to apply and to be in force in the Colony of Fiji:

Now, therefore, We, with the advice of Our Privy Council in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that

behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain, as follows:—

1. The Proclamation shall, as from the date of the commencement of any Ordinance by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council making further provision as to the currency of Fiji, be revoked, and accordingly the said Act shall as from that date cease to apply to and to be in force in the Colony of Fiji.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Fiji (Coinage) Proclamation, 1933.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace* this twenty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and in the twenty-fourth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 7th day of May, 1934 (C.W. 2229/34), in the words following viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is

enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of January, 1923, to approve the payment of Command Money and Entertaining Allowance in certain circumstances at the rates of 10s. and 8s. a day respectively to the Officer holding the combined appointments of Chief of the Staff and Flag Captain to the Commander in Chief, China:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the subsequent separation of the appointments of Chief of the Staff and Flag Captain to the Commander in Chief, China, has in no measure decreased the responsibility and expenses of the Flag Captain for messing and entertaining during the still frequently necessary absences of the Commander in Chief from his Flag Ship on duty:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve the payment of Command Money and Entertaining Allowance to the Officer appointed as Flag Captain to the Commander in Chief, China, at the rates of 10s. and 8s. a day respectively for the whole of every period during which the Commander in Chief may be absent on duty from the Flag Ship for more than nine days, provided that the ship commanded by the Flag Captain is one which apart from her appointment as Flag Ship would carry these rates when in full commission and that this arrangement be subject to the continuance of the necessity for the Commander in Chief's frequent absences on duty."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein,

shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 21st day of *July*, 1932, to sanction the payment of 2s. 6d. a day to Naval and Royal Marine Officers serving as qualified pilots in the Fleet Air Arm who are appointed to undergo the Senior Officers' Tactical Course, provided they are detached for the Course from appointments in which they receive flying pay and are due to return to such appointments on completing the Course:

"And whereas we consider that the allowance of 2s. 6d. a day should be paid to the aforesaid officers provided that if not appointed to undergo the Course they would be receiving flying allowance:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas a Council of Judges of the Supreme Court assembled in pursuance of the said provisions at the House of Lords on Monday, the 30th day of *April*, 1934, recommended that the Long Vacation for the year 1934 should be shortened so that the Michaelmas Sittings of 1934 should commence on Tuesday, the 2nd day of *October*:

And whereas the Lord Chancellor concurs in that recommendation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:-

1. The Michaelmas Sittings of the Court of Appeal and of the High Court of Justice shall

in the year 1934 commence on the 2nd day of October, and the Long Vacation of the several Courts and offices of the Supreme Court shall for all purposes terminate on the 1st day of October in the same year.

2. This Order may be cited as the Long Vacation (1934) Order, 1934.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1925, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1927, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1930, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1930, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1930, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1931, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1932, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1932, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1933, amending the first-mentioned Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the first-mentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to make the following Order, and, in pursuance of section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, to certify that on account of urgency the said Order should come into immediate operation:—

1. The following Article shall be substituted for Article 13 of the principal Order:—

"Parachute descents and dropping of articles.

13. A person shall not, except in a case of emergency, descend by means of a parachute from an aircraft flying within Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and no article, whether attached to a parachute or not, shall be dropped from any such aircraft, unless the descent is made or the article is dropped in accordance with and subject to any conditions or limitations contained in directions or any special permission in writing given by the Secretary of State:

Provided that nothing in this Article shall be taken to prevent the dropping of ballast which is not prohibited by paragraph 35 of Schedule IV to this Order."

2. Paragraph (1) of Article 20 of the principal Order shall be amended by inserting after

sub-paragraph (b) thereof the following sub-paragraph:—

"or

(c) which, being in the neighbourhood of an aerodrome, is liable by reason of its glare to endanger the safety of aircraft arriving at or departing from the aerodrome."

3. In paragraph (2) of Article 21 of the principal Order after the word "aircraft" there shall be inserted the words "or on an aerodrome".

4.—(1) In paragraph (1) of Article 31 of the principal Order after the definition of "Passenger aircraft" and "goods aircraft" the following definitions shall be inserted—

"Public transport aircraft" means aircraft carrying passengers or goods for hire or reward or, in a case where the carriage is effected by an air transport undertaking, whether for hire or reward or not, and the expression "public transport flying machine" shall be construed accordingly;

"Aerial work aircraft" means aircraft, not being public transport aircraft, which are being used for any commercial or industrial purpose or any lucrative purpose, and the expression "aerial work flying machine" shall be construed accordingly;

(2) In paragraph (1) (b) of Article 9A of the principal Order, and in paragraphs 3 and 4 of Schedule V to that Order, for the words "aircraft carrying passengers or goods for hire or reward or being flown for any industrial purpose" there shall be substituted the words "public transport or aerial work aircraft".

(3) In paragraph (3) of Article 9A of the principal Order, for the words "passenger or goods" there shall be substituted the words "public transport or aerial work".

(4) In paragraph 7A of Schedule V to the principal Order, for the words "passenger or goods" in the first and second places where those words occur there shall be substituted the words "public transport or aerial work"; and the words from "In this paragraph" to the end of the paragraph shall be omitted.

(5) In paragraph 13 of Schedule V to the principal Order, the words from "and references" to the end of the paragraph shall be omitted.

5. The following sub-paragraph shall be inserted after sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 9 of Schedule II to the principal Order:—

"(2A) An aircraft, being a flying machine, shall not be used to carry out any trick flying or exhibition flying while carrying passengers for hire or reward, unless the person in charge of the aircraft has satisfied himself before commencing the flight that every passenger carried in an open cockpit (whether carried for hire or reward or not) and the pilot (or pilots, if more than one) is properly secured by the prescribed safety belts."

6. The amendments specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be made in Schedule IV to the principal Order.

7. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 5 of Schedule VI to the principal Order:—

"5. Subject to the provisions of this paragraph, the following fees shall be chargeable

in respect of licences for aerodromes, that is to say—

Provided that where any such licence is granted or renewed for a period which will expire within twelve months from the date on which the grant or renewal becomes operative and an application is made for the renewal of the licence, or for the grant of a further licence to the same person for the same aerodrome, for any subsequent period falling within those twelve months, then—

(a) if the application is for the renewal of the licence without variation or for the grant of a further licence on the same terms as the previous licence, no fee shall be chargeable in respect of the renewal or grant; and

(b) if the application is for the renewal of the licence with variations or for the grant of a further licence on terms different from those of the previous licence, the application shall be treated for the purpose of this paragraph as if it were an application for the variation of a licence."

8. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 7A of Schedule VI to the principal Order:—

"7A. Where an official medical examination is required under paragraph 11 of Schedule V to this Order, the fee chargeable in respect thereof shall be 10s. 6d."

9. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 10 of Schedule VI to the principal Order:—

"10. The fees chargeable in respect of journey log books shall be as follows:—

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10.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1934.

(2) This Order shall come into operation forthwith as a Provisional Order.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### AMENDMENTS OF SCHEDULE IV TO THE PRINCIPAL ORDER.

1. At the end of paragraph 14 the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

"(c) where a flying machine or glider has alighted at night on a water aerodrome having a "control," permission to proceed to the normal arrival point will be given by the same two-letter sign made with a white light

and followed by intermittent signals of the same colour."

2. The following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph 33:—

"34. To facilitate compliance with the foregoing rules of this section, the pilot of a flying machine shall, save in exceptional circumstances, be placed either in the plane of symmetry of the flying machine or on the left hand side of the plane of symmetry."

3. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 36:—

"36. If a flying machine or glider starting from, or about to land at, an aerodrome makes a circuit or partial circuit, the turning—

(a) in the case of a land aerodrome, must be made clear of the landing area and must be left-handed (anti-clockwise) so that during the circuit the landing area shall always be on its left; and

(b) in the case of a water aerodrome, must be left-handed (anti-clockwise)."

4. In paragraphs 37 and 38, after the words "6,000 feet" there shall be inserted the words "in the case of a land aerodrome, or 2,000 feet in the case of a water aerodrome."

5. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 40:—

"40.—(1) By day at every aerodrome the direction of the wind at the landing area shall be clearly indicated by a landing T, wind sleeve, smoke producing wind indicator or other recognised method.

(2) Where a landing T is used, it shall be placed so that the shaft of the T lies along the direction of the wind and the cross arm lies across the windward end of the shaft.

(3) If there is no wind, the landing T, if used, shall be fixed in the direction in which landings are to be made.

(4) The fact that there is no wind and that the landing T is fixed as aforesaid may be indicated by a red square panel having in its centre a yellow square panel the sides of which are parallel to those of the red panel, each side measuring at least three feet.

(5) If the bad state of the landing area at any land aerodrome requires precautions to be observed in landing, that fact may be indicated by a red square panel partly covered by yellow triangular panels so as to show a red isosceles triangle no side of which measures less than ten feet.

(6) If an aerodrome is temporarily closed to aircraft owing to special circumstances, that fact may be indicated by a red square panel with the diagonals thereof covered by yellow rectangular panels arranged in the form of an X.

(7) Where a red panel is used for the purpose of this paragraph—

(a) it shall be placed horizontally and as near as practicable to the landing T or wind sleeve; and

(b) each side of the panel shall measure at least ten feet."

6. In paragraph 45 before the word "aerodromes" wherever that word occurs there shall be inserted the word "land".

7. After paragraph 45 the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

“45A. At every water aerodrome the following requirements shall be complied with:—

(1) A flying machine or glider which has landed shall give way to a flying machine or glider landing or about to take off:

(2) Every flying machine and glider when landing or taking off shall do so in conformity with the provisions of paragraph 41 of this Schedule, leaving clear on its left any flying machine or glider which has already landed and leaving as much space as possible on its right for another flying machine or glider to land or take off:

(3) A flying machine or glider which has landed shall, before proceeding towards the normal arrival point, slow down to a speed at which it can easily be manœuvred on the water:

Provided that if the aerodrome has a “control”, a flying machine or glider which has landed at night shall come to rest and await the signal referred to in paragraph 14 (c) of this Schedule before proceeding towards the normal arrival point:

(4) In proceeding towards the normal arrival point, a flying machine or glider shall turn to the left and approach that point without crossing the landing area.”

8. After paragraph 46 the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

“46A. At every water aerodrome while night landings thereat are expected the following requirements shall be complied with:—

(1) The aerodrome shall be defined and lighted in the manner most appropriate to local conditions:

(2) If possible the direction of the wind at the landing area shall be clearly indicated by one of the recognised methods.”

9. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 48:—

“48. Suitable signals by day and lights by night shall be placed on all obstacles on an aerodrome which are dangerous to flying by reason of their not being readily visible, and, so far as possible, on all such obstacles within 1,000 yards of an aerodrome.”

10. In paragraph 50 the words “this Schedule” shall be substituted for the words “the above rules”.

11. In paragraph 51 the words “this Schedule” shall be substituted for the words “the above provisions”.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the aforesaid Section, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare and doth hereby declare that the Government of the Irish Free State has ratified the Load Line Convention.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 3rd day of May, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Barking, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

“Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Barking is a Cure wherein or in part whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Barking which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

“And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication

in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Barking which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint John, Becontree.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"All that part of the Parish of Barking, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the south by the middle of the River Thames and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east, upon the north, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of the River Thames due south of the southern end of the western boundary of the London County Council Becontree Estate, and extending thence northward to and along such estate boundary for a distance of 1 mile and 6 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of Ripple Road, and extending thence first northward to and then westward along the middle of Ripple Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Gale Street, and extending thence northward along the middle of Gale Street, for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Gale Street across the Southend Branch Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 55 chains or thereabouts to the western boundary of the said London County Council Becontree Estate, and extending thence first southward and then south westward along such estate boundary for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of Ripple Road, and extending thence first southward to and then eastward along the middle of Ripple Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Barking Bye Pass Road, and extending thence in a straight line due south for a distance of 1 mile and 50 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Thames."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Barking out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 1st June, 1934, at 1 o'clock for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th June, 1934, to Saturday, the 9th June, 1934, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or
