A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING THE PROCLAMATION OF 29TH NOVEMBER, 1881, APPLYING THE COINAGE ACT, 1870, TO THE COLONY OF FIJI.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas by virtue of a Proclamation of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria dated the 29th day of November, 1881 (hereinafter called "the Proclamation"), the Coinage Act, 1870, was applied to the Colony of Fiji:

And whereas by virtue of the Coinage Act, 1870, it is lawful for Us, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to revoke any Proclamation previously made under that Act:

And whereas by Letters Patent dated the 9th February, 1929, the Governor of the Colony of Fiji (hereinafter called "the Governor") is empowered with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council to make by Ordinance laws for the peace, order, and good government of Fiji:

And whereas it is expedient that the Governor should be empowered to make further provision by Ordinance respecting the currency of Fiji, and that, in the event of such further provision being so made, the Proclamation should be revoked and the Coinage Act, 1870, should cease to apply and to be in force in the Colony of Fiji:

Now, therefore, We, with the advice of Our Privy Council in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that

behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain, as follows:—

1. The Proclamation shall, as from the date of the commencement of any Ordinance by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council making further provision as to the currency of Fiji, be revoked, and accordingly the said Act shall as from that date cease to apply to and to be in force in the Colony of Fiji.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Fiji (Coinage) Proclamation, 1933.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace* this twenty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and in the twenty-fourth year of Our Reign.
