WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of June, 1934, (C.W. 3926/34), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas we consider that Lieutenants and Lieutenant-Commanders who have not undergone the Staff Course but are qualified

Fleet Air Arm Pilots or Observers, and are appointed for operational duties on the staff of a Flag Officer with aircraft under his command, should receive some additional remuneration:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise payment of an allowance of two shillings and sixpence a day to these Officers subject to the following conditions:—

(i) This allowance not to be paid concurrently with Navigating allowance, Specialist allowance, Physical Training allowance, or the allowance payable to non-specialist Officers performing specialist duties laid down in Schedule VI of the Fifth Schedule to Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd January, 1920.

(ii) This allowance not to be paid for any day on which an Officer carries out a practice flight in respect of which he receives six shillings under the provisions of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 7th May, 1928.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 64 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932 (23-3 G. 5, c. 9) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted amongst other things that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the Provisions of Part II of the Act shall extend to any Colony:

And whereas by paragraph (a) of sub-section (3) of Section 64 of the Act it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that any provision of Part II of the Act which is expressed to apply only to British ships registered in the United Kingdom shall apply to British ships registered in any country or part of His Majesty's dominions to which the provisions of Part II of the Act can be extended by virtue of the foregoing provisions of the said Section:

And whereas by virtue of an Order in Council dated the tenth day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty-two, made in pursuance of Section 67 of the Act, Part II of the Act came into operation in the United Kingdom on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-three:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section 64, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to direct and it is hereby directed as follows:—

1. The provisions of Part II of the Act set out in the First Schedule hereto which are expressed to apply only to British ships registered in the United Kingdom shall apply to British ships registered in the Territories set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping Load Line Convention (Colonial) No. 2 Order, 1934.

And whereas it is expedient that the first-mentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to make the following Order, and, in pursuance of section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, to certify that on account of urgency the said Order should come into immediate operation:—

1. The following Article shall be inserted immediately after Article 9A of the principal Order:—

"9B. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Order, it shall not be lawful—

(a) for a person under the age of seventeen years to have sole control of an aircraft in motion; or

(b) for any person to cause or permit a person apparently under the age of seventeen years to have sole control of an aircraft in motion;

Provided that, in any prosecution for a contravention of paragraph (b) of this Article, it shall be a defence to prove that the person apparently under the age of seventeen years was at the time of the alleged contravention actually of or over that age."

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1934.

(2) This Order shall come into operation forthwith as a provisional Order.

**W**HEREAS by Section 214 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60), it is provided that a local authority, whose district includes a seaport, may, with the approval of the Board of Trade, make byelaws relating to seamen's lodging houses in their district, and that those byelaws shall be binding upon all persons keeping houses in which seamen are lodged, and upon the owners thereof and persons employed therein and

further, that such byelaws shall, amongst other things, provide for the licensing, inspection, and sanitary conditions of seamen's lodging houses, for the publication of the fact of a house being licensed, for the due execution of the byelaws, for preventing the obstruction of persons engaged in securing that execution, for the preventing of persons not duly licensed holding themselves out as keeping or purporting to keep licensed houses, and for the exclusion from licensed houses of persons of improper character, and shall impose sufficient fines, not exceeding fifty pounds, for the breach of any byelaw; and further, that whenever His Majesty in Council orders that in any district or any part thereof, none but persons duly licensed in pursuance of byelaws under the said Section shall keep seamen's lodging houses or let lodgings to seamen from a date therein named, a person acting in contravention of that order shall for each offence be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds:

And whereas the Urban District Council of Barry (hereinafter called "the Council") is the local authority in the Urban District of Barry and a local authority within the meaning of the said Section:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 28th day of May, 1894, (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1894, No. 159) Her late Majesty was pleased to order that none but persons duly licensed in pursuance of the Byelaws and Regulations scheduled to such Order should keep seamen's lodging houses or let lodgings to seamen in the district of the Barry and Cadoxton Local Board including the sea port town of Barry or in any part thereof:

And whereas the Council have, with the approval of the Board of Trade, made further Byelaws to come into force on the 1st day of July, 1934, from which date the Byelaws and Regulations scheduled to the said Order in Council dated the 28th day of May, 1894, have been revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The said Order in Council dated the 28th day of May, 1894, shall be and the same is hereby revoked.

2. None but persons duly licensed in pursuance of the said Byelaws which come into force on the 1st day of July, 1934, or of Byelaws for the time being in force in substitution for or in modification or variation of or in addition to such Byelaws, shall keep seamen's lodging houses or let lodgings to seamen in the district of the Council, including the seaport of Barry or in any part thereof.

3. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Barry Seamen's Lodging-houses Bye-laws) Order, 1934.

**W**HEREAS by Section 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (hereinafter referred to as "the said

Section"), it is, amongst other things, enacted as follows:—

"5.—(1) On and after the commencement of this Act, the general lighthouse authorities shall levy light dues with respect to the voyages made by ships or by way of periodical payment, and not with respect to the lights which a ship passes or from which it derives benefit, and the dues so levied shall take the place of the dues now levied by those authorities.

"(2) The scale and rules set out in the Second Schedule to this Act shall have effect for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of this Act, but Her Majesty may by Order in Council, alter, either generally or with respect to particular classes of cases, the scale or rules and the exemptions therefrom":

And whereas from time to time divers Orders in Council have been made in pursuance of the said Section:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Scale and Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act should be further altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1934, and shall have effect from the date of its publication in the *London Gazette*.

2. Each of the dues authorised to be levied in accordance with the Scale set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall be subject to an increase of twelve and a half per cent. for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of the said recited Act.

3. The payments referred to in the proviso to Rule (1) and in the proviso to Rule (7) of the Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall also be subject to an increase of twelve and a half per cent.

**W**HEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by section six of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917 (7 & 8 Geo. 5. c. 51), and section three of the Auxiliary Air Force and Air Force Reserve Act, 1924 (14 & 15 Geo. 5. c. 15), His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Force Reserve Order, 1924 (S.R. & O. 1924, No. 1213), whereby certain provisions of the Reserve Forces Act, 1882 (45 & 46 Vict. c. 48), including section eleven thereof, and certain provisions of the Territorial and Reserve Forces Act, 1907 (7 Edw. 7. c. 9), as set out with modifications in the Schedules to the said Order, were applied as so modified to the air force reserve and to the officers and men of that reserve:

And whereas by section one of the Air Force Reserve (Pilots and Observers) Act, 1934 (24 Geo. 5. c. 5), it is provided that the power of His Majesty under the first recited Act to apply by Order in Council to the air force reserve, or to the officers and men thereof, any of the enactments relating to the army reserve, or to the officers and men thereof, shall be extended so as to include power so to apply any of those enactments with such modifications as may be necessary to provide that, notwithstanding anything in subsection (1) of the said section eleven of the Reserve Forces Act, 1882, the period or periods for which men of the air force reserve who are serving therein as qualified pilots or qualified observers, or are under instruction with a view to qualifying for service as such, may be called out for training, shall be such period or periods as may be prescribed by orders or regulations made under the Reserve Forces Act, 1882, as so applied as aforesaid, not exceeding in any one year—

(i) in the case of a man who is serving as a qualified pilot or as a qualified observer, twenty-four days; and

(ii) in the case of a man who is undergoing instruction with a view to his qualifying for service as a pilot or as an observer, six months:

And whereas it is by the said section provided that nothing therein shall affect any man who was in the air force reserve at the date of the passing of the said Act, or any man who was in the regular air force at that date and has subsequently been transferred to the air force reserve, unless in either case he agrees in writing to accept the obligations imposed by the said section in lieu of the obligations originally undertaken by him:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order of nineteen hundred and twenty-four should be amended in so far as it applies section eleven of the Reserve Forces Act, 1882, to the air force reserve and to the men thereof:

And whereas the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. Section eleven of the Reserve Forces Act, 1882, as set out with modifications in the Schedule to this Order, shall apply to the air force reserve and to the men of that reserve in the form in which it is there set out in lieu of in the form in which it is set out in the first Schedule to the Air Force Reserve Order, 1924, and that Schedule shall be deemed to be amended accordingly.

2. This Order may be cited as the Air Force Reserve (Pilots and Observers) Order, 1934.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### SECTION 11 OF THE RESERVE FORCES ACT, 1882, AS MODIFIED.

11.—(1) All or any of the men belonging to the air force reserve may be called out for annual training at such time or times, and at such place or places within Great Britain and

Northern Ireland, and for such period or periods as may be prescribed, so, however, that the period or periods so prescribed shall not in any one year exceed:—

(i) in the case of a man who is serving as a qualified pilot or as a qualified observer, twenty-four days;

(ii) in the case of a man who is undergoing instruction with a view to his qualifying for service as a pilot or as an observer, six months; and

(iii) in the case of any other man, twelve days or twenty drills or instructional parades:

Provided that nothing in paragraph (i) or in paragraph (ii) of this subsection shall apply to or affect any man who was in the air force reserve on the twenty-eighth day of March, nineteen hundred and thirty-four or who was in the regular air force on that date and has subsequently been transferred to the air force reserve, unless in either case he has agreed in writing to accept the obligations imposed by the paragraph in question in lieu of his obligations under paragraph (iii) of this subsection.

In this subsection "qualified" means qualified in accordance with orders or regulations made under this Act.

(2) Every man so called out may during his annual training be attached to and trained with a body of the regular air force or of the auxiliary air force.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of a share or portion of the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Barnabas, Leeds, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon:



"Whereas by an Indenture made the 28th day of February, 1934, between Denis Marshall of Brackensgill, Sedbergh, in the County of York, Schoolmaster, of the one part and the Reverend William Thompson Elliott, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Ripon, the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the Parish of Leeds, in the said County and Diocese of the other part, after reciting that the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Barnabas, Leeds, was vested alternately in the Lord Bishop of Ripon and in the said Denis Marshall, it was witnessed that the said Denis Marshall did thereby convey unto the said William Thompson Elliott the share so vested in him of the said Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, Leeds, that is to say the next and every alternate right of presentation thereafter, to hold the same unto and to the use of the said William Thompson Elliott, Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Leeds, and to his successors in the same incumbency:

"And whereas the said conveyance was made with the intention of vesting the said share of the patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Barnabas, Leeds, in the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Leeds, and the parties thereto are desirous that anything which by way of further assurance or otherwise may be required effectually to carry out that intention may be done and have applied to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that a Scheme under the Acts hereinbefore mentioned may be prepared for the said purpose and submitted to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas they, the said Denis Marshall and William Thompson Elliott, are consenting to this Scheme and in token of such consent have executed the same as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Arthur, now Bishop of Ripon, is consenting to the transfer of patronage which is hereinafter recommended and proposed, and in token of such his consent, which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary, he the said Edward Arthur, Bishop of Ripon, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of patronage which is hereinafter recommended and proposed, will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of patronage so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the United Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, with Saint Barnabas, Leeds:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Denis Marshall and the said William Thompson Elliott (in testimony whereof they have each signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Edward Arthur, Bishop of Ripon (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical

Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the share of the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, Leeds, hitherto vested in the said Denis Marshall as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said William Thompson Elliott and to his successors Vicars or Incumbents of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Leeds, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William Thompson Elliott and by his successors Vicars or Incumbents of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Leeds for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Augustine, Bexhill, situate within the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, and

of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mark, Bexhill, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, and of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Augustine, Bexhill, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, as well of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, as of the Rectory of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, and of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on

the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Augustine, Bexhill, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Bexhill.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Bexhill, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, which is bounded upon the north-east partly by the Parish of Bexhill and partly by the New Parish of Saint Stephen, Bexhill, upon the north-west and upon the west by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mark, Bexhill, all in the said County and Diocese, upon the south by the sea, and upon the remaining side that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at a point at the low water mark of ordinary tides due south of the junction of Park Road with the road called West Parade, and extending thence northward in a straight line for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the junction of such roads and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of West Parade for a distance of  $9\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Egerton Road and Sackville Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Sackville Road for a distance of  $11\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Western Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Western Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall forming the eastern boundary of the playground of the Saint Barnabas Girls and Infants School, and extending thence northward to and along the said wall for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the Brighton and Hastings Branch Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence in a straight line due north (thereby crossing the said line of railway) for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Buckhurst Place, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Buckhurst Place for a distance of  $2\frac{1}{4}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with London Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of London Road for a distance of  $2\frac{1}{4}$  chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, from the said Parish of Bexhill.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, which is bounded upon the south by the sea, upon the east by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, diverges south-eastward from following the middle of Collington Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Collington Lane for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Collington

Avenue and Pages Lane, and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of Pages Lane (thereby crossing the said Brighton and Hastings Branch Line of the Southern Railway) for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cooden Drive and Pages Avenue, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Pages Avenue for a distance of  $10\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called South Cliff, and extending thence in a straight line due south to the sea.

"III. And also all that other contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, which is bounded upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Bexhill, upon the south-east and upon the south by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, at a point in the middle of Collington Lane opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as Wethersfield, Collington Lane, and extending thence northward to and along such wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as "Green Leaves," Little Common Road, for a distance in all of  $5\frac{1}{4}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the southern side of Little Common Road, and extending thence northward in a straight line for a distance of 6 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Little Common Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, from the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Bexhill."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 19th day of April, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of

Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Cantley and the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Limpenhoe with Southwood, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Cantley and Limpenhoe with Southwood duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Norwich embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Cantley and Limpenhoe with Southwood are now full, the Reverend James William Jacobs being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Cantley and the Reverend Edwin John Gargery being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Limpenhoe with Southwood:

"And whereas there is no Church left standing within the limits of the Parish of Southwood, being one of the Parishes of the said United Benefice of Limpenhoe with Southwood:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Cantley and the said Benefice of Limpenhoe with Southwood shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Cantley with Limpenhoe and Southwood' and that the Parishes of Limpenhoe and Southwood shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided, but the Parish of the said Benefice of Cantley shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said

two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice:

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Limpenhoe with Southwood shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Cantley and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Cantley having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Limpenhoe with Southwood having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to

such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Luke, Bromley Common, partly out of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of the Holy Trinity, Bromley, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint George, Bickley, all in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Bromley Common, the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Bromley, and the said New Parish of Saint George, Bickley, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Bromley Common, of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Bromley, and of the said New Parish of Saint George, Bickley, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Martin, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Bromley Common, of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Bromley, and of the said New Parish of Saint George, Bickley, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Augustine, Bromley Common'.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Augustine, Bromley Common, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint

"That there is also within the said County and Diocese the Parish of Featherstone which comprises *inter alia* the piece of land coloured pink on the plan marked 'B' hereunto annexed and there is also in the said County and Diocese the Parish of Normanton the boundaries of which are well known and defined and which immediately adjoins the said Parish of Featherstone.

"That there is also in the said County and Diocese and in my Patronage the Parish of Penistone which comprises *inter alia* the piece of land coloured pink on the plan marked 'C' hereunto annexed which immediately adjoins the Parish of Thurgoland which is also in the said County and Diocese the boundaries of which are also well known and defined.

"That the population of the said Parish of Hoylandswaine is 759 or thereabouts, the population of the said Parish of Penistone is 6,000 or thereabouts, the population of the said Parish of Normanton is 15,700 or thereabouts and the population of the Parish of Thurgoland is 1,623 or thereabouts and the population of the said Parish of Featherstone 8,200 or thereabouts including in all cases the pieces of land referred to in the said plans.

"That the population of the areas proposed to be transferred by the Scheme hereinafter referred to is as follows, namely, that part of the Parish of Hoylandswaine coloured pink on the said plan marked 'A', 159, that part of the Parish of Featherstone coloured pink on the said plan marked 'B', 500, that part of the Parish of Penistone coloured pink on the said plan marked 'C', 200.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the said Act of the 1st and 2nd Victoria, Chapter 106, and of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same reign, Chapter 49, the said area coloured pink on the plan marked 'A' and belonging to the Parish of Hoylandswaine may be advantageously separated from that Parish and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Penistone.

"That the said area coloured pink on the said plan marked 'B' may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Featherstone



and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Normanton.

"That the said area coloured pink on the said plan marked 'C' and now belonging to the Parish of Penistone may be advantageously separated from that Parish and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Thurgoland.

"That I, the said Bishop of Wakefield, am the Patron of the said Parish of Penistone and the Reverend Edward Barrington Carleton is the present Vicar thereof.

"That John Montague Spencer Stanhope of Cannon Hall Barnsley is the Patron of the Benefice of Hoylandswaine and the Reverend Herbert Lionel Pratt is the present Vicar thereof.

"That the Master, Fellows and Scholars of Trinity College Cambridge are the Patrons of the said Benefice of Normanton and the Reverend Harold William Orgill is the present Vicar thereof.

"That the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Oxford are the Patrons of the said Benefice of Featherstone and the Reverend James Gray is the present Vicar thereof.

"That all fees and payments for Burials Baptisms Churchings and Marriages performed by the Incumbents of the Parishes to which the above portions are intended to be annexed as aforesaid and all other ecclesiastical dues and emoluments arising in respect to the said separate and annexed portions and usually paid and payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice shall henceforth be received by the Incumbent of the Parish to which the same are intended to be annexed.
