“ And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £1,200 (being a sum which does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Norwich:

“ Now therefore with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £1,200 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of twenty-five years or until the said sum of £1,200 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof,

shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one twentieth part of the said principal sum of £1,200 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage Deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Bertram, now Bishop of Norwich, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £1,200 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 23rd day of August, 1883, and published in the London Gazette on the 28th day of the same month portions of the parish of Preston and of the New Parish of (Christ Church) Fulwood, both in the said County of Lancaster and at that time in the Diocese of Manchester but now in the said Diocese of Blackburn, were constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and such District was named 'The District of Ribbleton':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 14th day of April, 1884, and published in the London Gazette on the 25th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Matthew, Preston, situate in the New Parish of Saint Mary, Preston, in the said County of Lancaster and at that time in the said Diocese of Manchester, but now in the said Diocese of Blackburn, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Matthew, Preston':

"And whereas the said District of Ribbleton and the said District Chapelry of Saint Matthew, Preston, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Ribbleton and of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Preston, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of

Ribbleton and of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Preston, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Ribbleton which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Preston.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Ribbleton, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Matthew, Preston, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Ribbleton which is bounded upon the west and upon part of the south by the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Preston, upon the remaining part of the south and upon part of the east by the Parochial Chapelry of Walton-le-Dale, in the Parish of Blackburn, in the said County and Diocese, upon the remaining part of the east by the Parochial Chapelry of Samlesbury, in the said Parish of Blackburn, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parochial Chapelry of Samlesbury from the said New Parish of Ribbleton at the centre of Brockholes Bridge which carries the roadway connecting Preston New Road with New Hall Lane across the River Ribble, and extending thence westward along the middle of New Hall Lane for a distance of 63 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Blackpool Road, and extending thence in a straight line due north for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the wall forming the western boundary of the Preston Corporation Cemetery, and extending thence north-westward along such wall for a distance of 19½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of Miller Road, and extending thence first north-westward and then south-westward along the middle of Miller Road for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Blackpool Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Blackpool road for a distance of 9½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Ribbleton from the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Preston."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Eliza Mary Petteward, John Cherry and William Septimus Middlemist (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and by way of confirmation of the hereinbefore recited devise by the Will of the said Charles Petteward, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Onehouse with Harleston shall be transferred to the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Bawsey, the Benefice of Gaywood, and the Benefice of Mintlyn, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Bawsey, Gaywood and Mintlyn, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and also recommended the transfer to the Parish of the Benefice of Ashwicken with Leziate in the said County of Norfolk and in the said Diocese of Norwich of a portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Bawsey, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Norwich embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices of Bawsey, Gaywood and Mintlyn are now full, the Reverend Arthur John Groom being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bawsey, and the Venerable Harry Sydney Radcliffe being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of Gaywood and Mintlyn:

"And whereas the said Arthur John Groom is at present also the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ashwicken with Leziate:

"And whereas there is no Church now standing within either of the Parishes of the said Benefices of Bawsey and Mintlyn:

"And whereas the Patronage of all of the three said Benefices of Bawsey, Gaywood and Mintlyn at present belongs to one and the same Patron:

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY:

We, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors of the City of Manchester, in Council assembled, humbly offer to Your Majesty and to Her Majesty The Queen a warm and cordial welcome to the City.

We recall with pleasure the visit which Your Majesties paid to the City in 1921 in connection with the opening of the extension of the Manchester Royal Exchange, and we desire to express on behalf of the Citizens the deep pleasure and satisfaction which they experience to-day in again being honoured by the presence of Your Majesties among them.

The visit of Your Majesties for the opening of the new Central Library and for laying the foundation stone of the extension of the Town Hall is a notable event in the history of the City, and it is a source of great pride and satisfaction that Your Majesties will be associated so closely with these important buildings which will be in daily use by so many of Your Majesty's subjects.

Manchester has been referred to on more than one occasion as "the cradle of the public library movement", for it was here that the first public lending and reference library was established under the powers conferred by the Public Libraries Act of 1850.

During the 82 years that have elapsed Manchester has steadily extended her library service to meet the growing needs of a rapidly increasing population for mental recreation, education, industry and commerce.

To-day the Libraries Committee of this City administer no fewer than 25 district libraries, in addition to the building which to-day Your Majesty is to declare open.

Public libraries are indispensable to the life of the nation. They provide healthy mental recreation for every class of society, and make available for the common benefit of all, the vast store of human knowledge as recorded in the printed book.

We are deeply grateful to Your Majesties for the great encouragement given to the important work of library administration by your presence here to-day.

We rejoice to have again the opportunity of expressing the deep loyalty of the Citizens of Manchester and the love and affection which they bear to Your Majesties and we earnestly pray that Almighty God may long spare Your Majesties to an Empire, diverse in its peoples, but united in gratitude for the benefits conferred upon them by Your Majesty's illustrious reign.

To which address His Majesty was pleased to return the following Gracious Answer:—

I am happy, My Lord Mayor, to receive your loyal and dutiful Address, which is a source of much gratification to the Queen and myself.

You have referred to the visit which we paid to your City thirteen years ago. On that occasion the growth of your commerce had necessitated an extension of the Royal Exchange. To-day the needs of your civic administration call for an extension of the Town Hall, and the development of the work of your Libraries' Committee has created the need for a new central library. All these activities in the field of local government, of commerce and of education are closely connected: each fosters and sustains the other and contributes to the well-being of your City.

At no time were the demands upon the civic spirit of the local communities of our country greater than they are to-day: and in no department of our national life is the spirit of public service more clearly manifested than in the sphere of local government.

The record of Manchester is a proud one, and I am confident that this tradition will be your constant inspiration.

You have reminded me that the movement for the provision of public libraries began in Manchester over eighty years ago, and I am very glad to hear of the ever increasing use made of the facilities which you provide for the instruction and recreation of your citizens.

In the splendid building which I am about to open, the largest Library in this country provided by a local authority, the Corporation have ensured for the inhabitants of the City magnificent opportunities for further education and for the pleasant use of leisure.

The Queen and I are glad to be associated with these striking developments in the life of your great City, and we thank you from our hearts for the warmth of the welcome accorded to us by the people of Manchester on this memorable occasion.
