“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Section VI, Schedule V, to Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction the payment of certain rates of Entertaining Allowance to officers of the rank of Captain and Commander in Your Majesty's Fleet, the rates for Captains being dependent upon the rate of Command Money payable:

“And whereas we are of opinion that the rate of Entertaining Allowance payable to a Captain should not necessarily be dependent upon the rate of Command Money payable:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us to pay Entertaining Allowance to Captains holding the prescribed appointments at the rate of 8s.,

5s. or 2s. 6d. a day at our discretion in conjunction with the payment of Command Money at the rate of 10s. a day.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment, as from the 1st January, 1934, of an allowance of one shilling a day to Warrant Telegraphists and Officers promoted therefrom while in charge of W/T Stations abroad.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 118, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of July, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of 'The Public Schools Act, 1868' have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for assigning certain lands and hereditaments for the support of Westminster School:

"Whereas under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act a capital sum of £15,000 was paid by us in the month of October 1868 to the Governing Body of the said School for the support of the School and an annual sum of £3,500 has also been paid by us for the same purpose to the said Governing Body since the passing of the said Act:

"And whereas the said Governing Body have signified to us their willingness to accept for the future support of the said School in pursuance of the above-mentioned Act in substitution for the said annual sum of £3,500 heretofore paid by us as aforesaid and in full satisfaction of all claims and demands which the said Governing Body have or may have under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act upon or in respect of the estates now vested in us, the lands tenements and hereditaments particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written which are now vested in us in fee simple subject to the several leases granted by us and referred to in the said Schedule and the same are in our opinion convenient to be held by the said Governing Body for the support of the said School and are calculated to produce an annual income of not less than £3,500 after deducting all expenses of management:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Governing Body of the said School testified by their having hereunto affixed their

Common Seal, we humbly recommend and propose that upon the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any Conveyance, Assurance or Act in the Law other than such duly published Order, the lands, tenements and hereditaments particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written, with their appurtenances and all our right, title, estate and interest therein, subject to and with the benefit of the leases referred to and set out in the said Schedule, shall be assigned and transferred to the said Govern-

ing Body for the support of the said School and shall become and be absolutely vested in the said Governing Body and the said Governing Body shall become and be absolutely entitled to the rents, profits and proceeds of such lands tenements and hereditaments as from the 29th day of September, 1933.

"And we further recommend and propose that the annual money payment heretofore payable by us under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act shall as from the said 29th day of September, 1933, cease and determine.

(a) to suspend entirely during the continuance of the Order the obligations of the Corporation to discharge compensation water from any of their said reservoirs between the hours of twelve midnight on every Friday and 6 p.m. on the following Sunday.

(b) To determine that the quantity of compensation water which the Corporation are or may be required to discharge from the above mentioned reservoirs or any of them during such times as are not within the periods referred to in paragraph (a) hereof shall be reduced as follows, viz. :—

By 25 per cent. on such days when the total contents of the reservoirs exceed sixty days supply.

By 35 per cent. on such days when the total contents of the reservoirs exceed fifty days supply and are less than sixty days supply.

By 50 per cent. on such days when the total contents of the reservoirs exceed forty days supply and are less than fifty days supply.

By 65 per cent. on such days when the total contents of the reservoirs exceed thirty days supply and are less than forty days supply.

By 75 per cent. on such days when the total contents of the reservoirs are below thirty days supply.

(c) To determine that 11,934,000 gallons shall for the purpose of the calculations referred to in paragraph (b) be deemed to be one day's supply.

(d) That if and when it is found impossible to send the reduced quantity of compensation water from Warley Moor Reservoir the Corporation shall open the discharge valve of such reservoir so as to insure that as much water as can be discharged from the reservoir for compensation water shall be so discharged.

2. Authority to the Corporation to prohibit from and after the making of the said Order consumers in the area within which the Corporation are authorised to supply water from using for any of the following purposes water supplied by the Corporation to such consumers, namely:—

(i) for watering gardens, allotments, cricket fields, football fields, racing tracks of any description, bowling greens, tennis courts and lawns or any recreation ground of whatsoever nature; and

(ii) for automatic flushing cisterns and for the swilling of footpaths and watering of streets and by means of hosepipes or other similar apparatus;

or to impose such limitations as may be considered necessary on the use of water for any of such purposes.

3. The making of such alterations or amendments of the Halifax Improvement Act 1853 the Halifax Corporation Waterworks and Improvement Act 1868 the Halifax Corporation Waterworks Act 1888 the Halifax Corporation Acts 1898 1902 1922 and 1924 or of any other local Act or of any Act confirming a provisional Order made in pursuance of the Public Health Acts and in force in the County Borough of Halifax or in the area within which the Corporation are authorised to supply water or relating to the water undertaking of the Corporation as may be necessary or desirable and to make such supplemental incidental and consequential provisions as appear to the Minister of Health to be expedient.
