## PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1925.

BY an Order dated the 17th July, 1934, the Minister of Health has consented to the adoption by the Urban District Council of Potters Bar of Sections 22 (preventing soil etc. from being washed into streets), 44 (offensive trades), and Sections 51 to 54 inclusive and the unrepealed provisions of Section 55 contained in Part V (watercourses &c.) of the Public Health Act, 1925, and directed that the adoption shall take effect on the 1st day of August, 1934.

The consent of the Minister is given subject, as regards Sections 51, 52, 53 and 54, to the conditions specified in the Order.

## PONTYPOOL GAS.

(Application for Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934.)

THE Pontypool Gas and Water Company (hereinafter called "the Company") whose address is Clarence Street, Pontypool, Mon., are applying to the Board of Trade for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934 for all or some of the following objects:—

1. To authorise the Company to contract with any local authority company body or person whether within or beyond the limits of supply of the Company for the supply of gas in bulk (including coke-oven gas) by or to the Company to or by the other party to the contract.

2. To empower the Company to break up streets and parts of streets in the urban district of Blaenavon in the County of Monmouth and to lay down and place therein mains pipes and other works and to confer powers upon the Company with respect to the streets and parts of streets so broken up and any such mains pipes and other works.

3. To confer upon the Company all or any powers commonly conferred on gas undertakers and not hereinbefore referred to and to enact all such provisions as may be deemed expedient for effecting the purposes of the Order.

4. To incorporate with the intended Order the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Acts 1847 and 1871 and other Acts with modifications and exceptions and to exempt the Company from some of the provisions of those Acts and to amend or repeal any provisions of the Pontypool Gas and Water Acts and Order 1873 to 1921 and of any other Act or Order affecting the Company.

Any local or other public authority company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 1st day of October, 1934. Any such objection must state (a) the specific grounds of objection and (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked
