At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 14th day of *August*, 1934.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of July, 1934, (N. 3489/34), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council of the 19th May, 1931, to sanction the amalgamation, as regards future entrants, of the Officers' Cook and Ship's Cook branches of the Royal Navy which formerly had separate systems of entry, training and advancement, by the creation of a new Naval Cook Branch:

"And whereas by Orders in Council of the 28th March, 1903, 11th October, 1923 and 25th June, 1924, we are authorised to pay allow-

ances to certain specified ratings for instructional duties and for charge of bakeries and cookery schools:

"And whereas we consider that with the change in the organization of the Cook branch the payment of these allowances should no longer be restricted to the ratings previously specified:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise the payment of the allowances in question to Cook ratings of the Ship's Cook, Officers' Cook, or new Naval Cook Branches provided they are of the grade for which the allowances were originally provided; and also to approve payment of the allowance of 6d. a day authorised by the Order in Council of the 28th March, 1903, to Cook ratings employed in instructing new entries in the new Naval Cook Branch.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by subsection (1) of Section 238 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, (57 & 58 V. c. 60) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act) it is provided that where it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are or will be given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in that country, His Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that Section shall apply in the case of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions and qualifications contained in the Order:

And whereas by certain Orders in Council made under Section 1 of the Foreign Deserters Act, 1852, (15 & 16 V. c. 26) the dates whereof are specified in the first column of Part I of the First Schedule hereto provisions were made as more particularly appear in the said Orders for the apprehension of seamen who desert from merchant ships belonging to the foreign countries set out in the second column of Part I of the said First Schedule or to subjects of the Rulers of or to citizens of such foreign countries:

And whereas by virtue of the provisions of Section 745 of the principal Act the said Orders in Council are still in force as if they had been made under that Act:

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 26th September, 1901, it was ordered and declared that Section 238 of the principal

Act should apply in the case of the Republic of Honduras:

And whereas it is expedient that the Orders in Council specified in the said First Schedule should be revoked:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are given by the Governments of the foreign countries specified in the Second Schedule hereto for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in those countries:!

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the principal Act and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and doth hereby order and declare, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as "The Deserters from Foreign Ships Order, 1934".

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, (52-3 V. c. 63) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The Orders in Council specified in the First Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

3. Section 238 of the principal Act shall apply in the case of each of the foreign countries specified in the Second Schedule hereto with regard to any seaman or apprentice who deserts from a merchant ship belonging to a subject of any such foreign country when within the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or any Colony within the meaning of Section 11 of the Statute of Westminster, 1931.

(a) for a person under the age of seventeen years to have sole control of an aircraft in motion; or

(b) for any person to cause or permit a person apparently under the age of seventeen years to have sole control of an aircraft in motion;

Provided that, in any prosecution for a contravention of paragraph (b) of this Article, it shall be a defence to prove that the person apparently under the age of seventeen years was at the time of the alleged contravention actually of or over that age."

And whereas it is expedient that the first-mentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to make the following Order, and, in pursuance of section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, to certify that on account of urgency the said Order should come into immediate operation:—

1. The following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph (1) of Article 9:—

"(1A). A flying machine registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland and carrying passengers for hire or reward on a regular line or service of public air transport shall not, unless it is designed to manoeuvre on the water, be flown over the sea or any inland waters in such circumstances that, in the event of the stoppage of its engine or one of its engines, it would be unable to reach land."

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1934.

(2) This Order shall come into operation forthwith as a provisional Order.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of

the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts", duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of June, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Saint Mary, Southampton, in the County of Southampton, and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Southampton, has been improved by means of a sale of glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice, which sale was carried out under the authority of the said Acts, by the Reverend Reginald Bradley Jolly, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Winchester, the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice, with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

"And whereas the proceeds of the said sale have been paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and in respect of a portion of such proceeds there is in our hands a capital sum of £3,300 and there is also standing in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, a sum of £20,000 Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, which said capital sum and sum of Stock are now held by us in trust to pay the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said sale payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the Acts mentioned:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said sale exceeds the annual sum of £750, and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of £600:

"And whereas the said Reginald Bradley Jolly, the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Southampton, is consenting to this Scheme and has signified his assent thereto by signing and sealing this Scheme:

Now, therefore we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the interest or dividends arising in respect of the said capital sum of £3,300 and of the said sum of £20,000 Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock shall cease to be applied by us for the benefit of the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Southampton, and shall be appropriated by us

for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the Notice of the foregoing Scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patron of the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Southampton, and the said Patron has not made any objection to the said Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 12th day of July, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the District Parish of Trinity, Carlisle, in the County of Cumberland and in the Diocese of Carlisle:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said District Parish of Trinity, Carlisle, is a Cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said District Parish of Trinity, Carlisle, which is mentioned

and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and is delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 21st day of July, 1932, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, the Benefice of Saint Mary, Carlisle, and the Benefice of Saint Mary Without (Saint Paul), Carlisle, both in the said County and Diocese, were united into one Benefice: and it was by the same Order provided amongst other things that a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice should be appropriated as follows, that is to say, the whole of the annual stipend of £180 formerly payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Carlisle, together with a sum of £666 13s. 4d. London County £3 per centum per annum Stock formerly held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Carlisle, should be severed or diverted from that Benefice and should be applied for the endowment of a new District to be constituted within or near the City of Carlisle and to be selected for this purpose by the Bishop of Carlisle, and until such new District should have been constituted the income arising from the endowment so to be severed or diverted as aforesaid should be accumulated by us towards the endowment of the same proposed new District:

"And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected by the Bishop of Carlisle as the District for which an endowment shall be secured as provided by the above mentioned Order in Council:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £100 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £100 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such

District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Carlisle as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said District Parish of Trinity, Carlisle, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of 'The District of Saint Barnabas, Carlisle.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Barnabas, Carlisle, being:—

"All that part of the District Parish of Trinity, Carlisle, in the County of Cumberland and in the Diocese of Carlisle, which is bounded upon the north partly by the Parish of Stanwix, partly by the Parish of Grinsdale and partly by the Parish of Kirkandrews upon Eden, upon the west by the Parish of Orton, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Orton from the said District Parish of Trinity, Carlisle, crosses the middle of the road leading from Orton to Carlisle, and extending thence first north-eastward then eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Alban, Becontree, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Barking, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the west by the District of Saint John, Becontree, upon the north by the New Parish of Saint Elizabeth, Becontree, upon the east by the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Martin, Dagenham, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the south by the middle of the River Thames.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Dagenham, which is bounded upon the west by the above described portion of the said Parish of Barking, upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Elizabeth, Becontree, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries the main line of the Southend Section of the London Midland and Scottish Railway across Gores Brook, where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Dagenham, of the said New Parish of Saint Elizabeth, Becontree, and of the Parish of Dagenham, in the said County and Diocese, all meet; and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Gores Brook for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries Dagenham Avenue across the said brook, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Dagenham Avenue for a distance of 35½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Dagenham, from the said Parish of Barking."

Richard Neill, of Christ Church Vicarage, Maids Causeway, Cambridge, as trustees of the Martyr's Memorial Trust:

"And whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Leybourne is vested in Sir David Henry Hawley, Baronet:

"And whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Aylesford is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary, at Rochester:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Martin, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ and The Blessed Virgin Mary at Rochester (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consents also of the said Henry Barker Greene, Charles Anthony King Harman, Thomas Lancaster, and Robert Richard Neill, David Henry Hawley, Donald Leslie Band, Frederick William Linton Bogle, Arthur William Lawson, Frederick Fremlin Key, Harry William Thorne, and Frederick John Everett (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme:

(a) All those three detached parts of the Parish of the said Benefice of Ryarsh which lie within the area of the Civil Parish of Addington, (all which detached parts are more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and are thereon coloured pink) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Addington;

(c) A portion of the detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Leybourne which lies to the south-west of the Parish of the said Benefice of Offham, that is to say, the portion lying to the east of Leybourne Lodge and comprising part of Great Leybourne Wood (all which portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured yellow) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Offham; and

(d) A portion of the detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Aylesford which lies to the south-east of the Parish of the said Benefice of Offham, that is to say the northern portion of each detached part comprising part of Blaze Wood (all which portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured green) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Offham.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

month a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Paul, Chester, situate in the Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Chester, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Chester':

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Chester, and the said New Parish of All Saints, Hoole, shall be altered so that (first) All those portions of the Parish of Plemstall, in the said County and Diocese, and of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Chester, which are described in the first Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parish and New Parish respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of All Saints, Hoole, and (secondly) All those portions of the said Parish of Plemstall and of the said New Parish of All Saints, Hoole, which are described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such Parish and New Parish respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Chester.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to

the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinafore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of All Saints, Hoole, in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester, comprising:—
