## A PROCLAMATION,

For Dissolving this present Parliament, and Declaring the Speedy Calling another.

WILLIAM R.

**W** Hereas We have thought fit for divers Important and Weighty Considerations, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to Dissolve this present Parliament, which now stands Prorogued to Tuesday the Second Day of August next; We do for that End Publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby Dissolve the said present Parliament accordingly. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgeses of the said Parliament are Discharged from their Meeting upon Tuesday the said Second Day of August. And to the Intent Our Good Subjects may Perceive the Confidence We have in their Affections, and how desirous We are to Meet Our People, and have their Advice in Parliament, We do hereby make known to Our said Subjects, that We do intend to give Directions to Our Chancellor for the Issuing out of Writs in due Form of Law, for the Calling a New Parliament, which shall Begin and be Holden at Westminster on Wednesday the Twenty fourth Day of August next.

Given at Our Court at Kensington the Seventh Day of July 1698. In the Tenth Year of Our Reign.

Malaga, June 10. N. S. Orders are given for the sending of several Troops quartered in these parts, to reinforce the Garrisons of Ceuta and Oran. Last Sunday failed hence the *Reward*, Capt. Bennet Commander, bound to London from Smyrna; The *Laurel*, John Fisher Commander, from Scanderoon; The *Neptune*, Capt. Robinson, and the *Flying-Eagle*, Capt. Read, from Leghorne; and the *Muscovy-Merchant*, Daniel Parsons Commander, and the *Mary*, Francis Woodward Master, both laden here.

Cadix, June 15. On the 4th Instant the *Poole Man of War*, Capt. Cranby Commander, put in here, having sustained damage in her Masts by bad Weather; The same day came in the *Betsy*, Capt. Lamborn Commander, who failed again the 7th to Cruise on the Coast of Sallee, and will be followed by the *Poole* as soon as she is refitted. The 3th two Spanish Men of War failed out of this Port, to meet the two Ships of the *New-Spain* Fleet which are not yet come in. The 14th arrived here the *Hope*, Capt. Warner Commander, from England.

Madrid, June 25. The King of Spain continues in very good Health. The Venetian Ambassador, Signior Mocenigo, made his Publick Entry here on the 18th Instant. The Moors are still before Ceuta, and we hear from Barcelona, that the Duke of Naera with the Capitana or Admiral Galley of Spain, and another Galley under his Command, would shortly fall in with Soldiers and Provisions for that Garrison. They write from Alicante, that they have Advice from Algiers, that about 12 or 14 of their Men of War were cut a Cruising, and that the War between that Government and the King of Morocco continues still. These Letters add, That on the 6th Instant 3 French Frigats of between 60 and 70 Guns each, sailed along that Coast, being bound from Toulon to Cadix. We have an account from Carthagena, that 18 French Gallies and 4 light Frigats were sent off that place sailing to the Westward. Our Advices from St. Sebastian of the 19th Instant say, that the day before two French Gallies of 52 Oais each, came before that Port, the Commander of which sent off an Officer, to know if they might come in and Anchor, saying, they had Orders not to enter into any Port of Spain without first having Leave of the Governor; which was granted.

Madrid, June 29. The King of Spain was taken the 25th at night with raising Fire, which lasted some time.
