At the Court, at *Buckingham Palace*, the 14th day of *August*, 1934.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 28th day of July, 1934 (G.H.), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty shall from time to time continue or appoint such Officers, Clerks and Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks :

“And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind :

“And whereas by Your Majesty's Orders in Council dated the 17th May, 1920, and the 5th November, 1926, the scale of salary of the Superintendent of the Royal Hospital School at Greenwich was increased to £600 rising by

£25 annually to £800, with residence; and that of the Chief Officer of the Royal Hospital School was increased to £250 rising by £10 annually to £350 per annum with quarters :

“And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council dated 17th May, 1920, the scales of salaries of the Teaching Staff of the Royal Hospital School are to be kept at the same level (after deduction of the value of their residences) as those paid by the London County Council to corresponding ranks of their Teaching Staff :

“And whereas we are of opinion that the salaries and emoluments of the Superintendent, the Chief Officer and the Headmaster of the Royal Hospital School should be revised, and that the removal of the Royal Hospital School to new buildings at Holbrook, Suffolk, should be accompanied by a complete reorganisation of the School routine with a consequent increase in the complement of Salaried Officers :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the revised salaries and emoluments of the Superintendent, Headmaster, and Chief Officer, and to authorise the scales and emoluments of the additional complement as shown on the annexed Schedule, to take effect from the dates shown therein.

WHEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 7th day of March, 1904, it was provided that an Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia entitled The Extradition Act, 1903, should

have effect in the Commonwealth of Australia as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia entitled The Extradition Act, 1933, the provisions of which are fully set forth in the Schedule appended to this Order, the said Commonwealth Extradition Act, 1903, has been amended in certain respects:

And whereas by the said Commonwealth Extradition Act, 1933, it is provided that the said Extradition Act, 1903, as amended by the said Extradition Act, 1933, may be cited as The Extradition Act, 1903-1933:

And whereas it is desirable that the said Commonwealth Extradition Act, 1903-1933, shall have effect in Papua and Norfolk Island as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870, and that the said Commonwealth Extradition Act, 1933, shall have effect in the Commonwealth of Australia as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the Extradition Act, 1870, and in exercise of the powers in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, direct as follows:—

1. The said Commonwealth Extradition Act, 1903-1933, shall have effect in Papua and Norfolk Island without modification or alteration as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870.

2. The said Commonwealth Extradition Act, 1933, shall have effect in the Commonwealth of Australia without modification or alteration as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870.

SCHEDULE.

COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA EXTRADITION ACT, 1933.

Be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Extradition Act 1933*.

(2) The *Extradition Act 1903* (Act No. 12 1903) is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Extradition Act 1903-1933*.

2. The preamble to the Principal Act is amended—

(a) by omitting from the third paragraph the words and figures "and the *Extradition Act 1895*" and inserting in their stead the words and figures "the *Extradition Act 1895*, the *Extradition Act 1906* and the *Extradition Act 1932*"; and

(b) by omitting from that paragraph the words and figures "Extradition Acts 1870 to 1895" and inserting in their stead the words and figures "Extradition Acts 1870 to 1932".

3. After section one of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:—

"1A. In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—

'the Commonwealth' includes the Territories of Papua and Norfolk Island."

4. Sections three and four of the Principal Act are amended by omitting the words and figures "Extradition Acts 1870 to 1895" and inserting in their stead the words and figures "Extradition Acts 1870 to 1932".

5. Section five of the Principal Act is amended—

(a) by omitting the words and figures "Extradition Acts 1870 to 1895" and inserting in their stead the words and figures "Extradition Acts 1870 to 1932"; and

(b) by inserting, after the word "State" (first occurring), the words "or any Magistrate of any Territory of the Commonwealth (not including any Territory governed by the Commonwealth under a Mandate)".

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 and 34 Vict., c. 52) to 1932 (22 and 23 Geo. V, c. 39), it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas under the provisions of Article 18 of the Treaty signed on the 2nd day of May, 1932, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of Iraq for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the Iraq (Extradition) Order in Council, 1933, and are as follows:—

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India,

And His Majesty the King of Iraq,

Desiring to make provision for the reciprocal extradition of criminals,

Have resolved to conclude a Treaty for that purpose, and to that end have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland,

Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Francis Henry Humphrys, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, High Commissioner of His Britannic Majesty in Iraq; His Majesty the King of Iraq,

General Ja'far Pasha al Askari, Order of Al Rafidain, Second Class, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Minister for Foreign Affairs;

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article 3, committed within the jurisdiction of the one party, shall be found within the territory of the other party.

ARTICLE 2.

For the purposes of the present Treaty:—

(i) The territory of His Britannic Majesty shall be deemed to be Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, and all parts of His Britannic Majesty's dominions overseas other than those enumerated in Article 18, together with the territories enumerated in Article 20 and any territories to which it may be extended under Article 21. It is understood that in respect of all territory of His Britannic Majesty as above defined other than Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, the present Treaty shall be applied so far as the laws permit.

(ii) The nationals or natives of any British Protectorate or British-protected State or of any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations is held by His Britannic Majesty shall be deemed to be British subjects.

ARTICLE 3.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:—

1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
4. Rape.
5. Unlawful carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have unlawful carnal knowledge, of a girl under 16 years of age.
6. Indecent assault.
7. Kidnapping or false imprisonment.
8. Child stealing, including abandoning, exposing or unlawfully detaining.
9. Abduction.
10. Procuration.
11. Multiplication of spouses contrary to law.
12. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
13. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
14. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
15. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
16. Arson.
17. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny or embezzlement.

18. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company, or fraudulent conversion.

19. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.

20.—(a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.

(b) Knowingly and without lawful authority making or having in possession any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of coin.

21. Forgery, or uttering what is forged.

22. Crimes against Bankruptcy Law.

23. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling or being upon a railway.

24. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.

25. Piracy and other crimes or offences committed at sea against persons or things which according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition crimes or offences.

26. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a crime or offence against the laws of both High Contracting Parties.

Extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes or offences: provided that such participation be punishable by the laws of both High Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

ARTICLE 4.

Each High Contracting Party reserves the right to refuse or grant the surrender of its own subjects to the other High Contracting Party.

ARTICLE 5.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the territories of the High Contracting Party applied to, for the crime or offence for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed should be under examination or under punishment in the territories of the High Contracting Party applied to for any other crime or offence, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE 6.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime or offence or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the High Contracting Party applying or applied to.

ARTICLE 7.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the crime or offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for a crime or offence of a political character.

ARTICLE 8.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in custody or be brought to trial in the territories of the High Contracting Party to whom the surrender has been made for any other crime or offence, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning, to the territories of the High Contracting Party by whom he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes or offences committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE 9.

Subject to the provisions of Articles 18 and 19, the requisition for extradition shall be made through the diplomatic agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority in the territories of the High Contracting Party requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime or offence had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person, by the competent court in the territories of the High Contracting Party who makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed *in contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE 10.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities in the territories of the High Contracting Party applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE 11.

A criminal fugitive may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any police magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority in the territories of the High Contracting Party applied to on such information or complaint and such evidence, or after such proceedings, as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime or offence had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the territories of such High Contracting Party in which the magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority exercises jurisdiction. He shall, in accordance with this article, be discharged if within the term of two months a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the diplomatic agent of the High Contracting Party claiming his extradition in accordance with the stipulations

of this Treaty. The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this Treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either High Contracting Party which may come into a port of the other.

ARTICLE 12.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the High Contracting Party applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime or offence of which he is accused had been committed in the territory of such High Contracting Party, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the courts of the High Contracting Party who makes the requisition, and that the crime or offence of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the High Contracting Party applied to under this Treaty.

ARTICLE 13.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the High Contracting Party applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in the territories of the other High Contracting Party, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, or copies thereof, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of a conviction, providing the same are authenticated as follows:—

(1) A warrant, or copy thereof, must purport to be signed by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other High Contracting Party, or purport to be certified under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other High Contracting Party to be a true copy thereof, as the case may require.

(2) Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified, under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other High Contracting Party, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.

(3) A certificate of, or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction, must purport to be certified by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other High Contracting Party.

In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate or judicial document must be authenticated, either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of the other High Contracting Party, or by any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the High Contracting Party to whom application for extradition is made.

ARTICLE 14.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed within their respective jurisdictions, his extradition shall be granted to the Power whose claim is earliest in date, unless such claim is waived.

ARTICLE 15.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the High Contracting Party applied to, or the proper tribunal of such High Contracting Party, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE 16.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension, and any articles that may serve as a proof of the crime or offence, shall be given up when the extradition takes place, in so far as this may be permitted by the law of the High Contracting Party granting the extradition.

ARTICLE 17.

Each of the High Contracting Parties shall defray the expenses occasioned by the arrest within its territories, the detention, and the conveyance to its frontier, of the persons whom it may have consented to surrender in pursuance of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE 18.

His Britannic Majesty may accede to the present Treaty on behalf of any of His Dominions hereafter named—that is to say, the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia (including for this purpose Papua and Norfolk Island), the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State, and Newfoundland—and India. Such accession shall be effected by a notice to that effect given by His Britannic Majesty's representative at Baghdad, which shall specify the authority to which the requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in the Dominion concerned, or India, as the case may be, shall be addressed. From the date when such notice comes into effect the territory of the Dominion concerned or of India shall be deemed to be territory of His Britannic Majesty for the purposes of the present Treaty.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of the above-mentioned Dominions or India, on behalf of which His Britannic Majesty has acceded, shall be made by the appropriate diplomatic or consular officer of Iraq.

Either High Contracting Party may terminate this Treaty separately in respect of any of the above-mentioned Dominions or India. Such termination shall be effected by a notice given in accordance with the provisions of Article 22.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this article in respect of one of His Britannic Majesty's Dominions may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, and which is being administered by the Government of the Dominion concerned; such territory shall, if so included, be deemed to be territory of His Britannic Majesty for the purpose of the present Treaty. Any notice given under the third paragraph of this article shall be applicable to such mandated territory.

ARTICLE 19.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any territory of His Britannic Majesty other than Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man, or the Dominions or India mentioned in Article 18, shall be made to the Governor, or chief authority, of such territory by the appropriate diplomatic or consular officer of Iraq.

Such requisition shall be dealt with by the competent authorities of such territory: provided, nevertheless, that if an order for the committal of the fugitive criminal to prison to await surrender shall be made, the said Governor or chief authority may, instead of issuing a warrant for the surrender of such fugitive, refer the matter to His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom.

ARTICLE 20.

This Treaty shall apply in the same manner as if they were Possessions of His Britannic Majesty to the following British Protectorates, that is to say, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Gambia Protectorate, Kenya Protectorate, Nigeria Protectorate, Northern Rhodesia, Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, Nyasaland, Sierra Leone Protectorate, Solomon Islands Protectorate, Somaliland Protectorate, Swaziland, Uganda Protectorate and Zanzibar, and to the following territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, that is to say, Cameroons under British Mandate, Togoland under British Mandate, the Tanganyika Territory, Palestine, and Transjordan.

ARTICLE 21.

If after the signature of the present Treaty it is considered advisable to extend its provisions to any British Protectorates other than those mentioned in the preceding article or to any British-protected State, or to any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, other than those mandated territories mentioned in Articles 18 and 20, the stipulations of Articles 18 and 19 shall be deemed to apply to such Protectorates or States or mandated territories from the date and in the manner prescribed in the notes to be exchanged for the purpose of effecting such extension.

ARTICLE 22.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

In the absence of an express provision to that effect, a notice given under the first paragraph of this article shall not affect the operation of the Treaty as between Iraq and any territory in respect of which notice of accession has been given under Article 18.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratification shall be exchanged at Baghdad as soon as possible.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate in English and Arabic, of which, in the case of divergence, the English text shall prevail, at Baghdad, this second day of May, 1932, corresponding with the twenty-sixth day of Dhulhijjah, 1350, Hijrah.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 31st day of August, 1934, the said Acts shall apply in respect of the aforementioned Dominions in the case of Iraq under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 2nd May, 1932.

This Order may be cited as the Iraq (Extradition: Commonwealth of Australia and New Zealand) Order in Council, 1934.

And whereas under the provisions of Article 18 of the Treaty signed on the 2nd day of May, 1932, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of Iraq for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the Iraq (Extradition) Order in Council, 1933, and are as follows:—

[For Text of Treaty see the Iraq (Extradition: Commonwealth of Australia and New Zealand) Order in Council, 1934, printed above.]

His Majesty has acceded to the said Treaty in respect of Newfoundland.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 31st day of August, 1934, the said Acts shall apply in respect of Newfoundland in the case of Iraq under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 2nd May, 1932.

This Order may be cited as the Iraq (Extradition: Newfoundland) Order in Council, 1934.

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of Sweden the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Sweden or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 9th July, 1885 (S.R. & O. Rev. 1904, IX., Patents, &c., p. 6.), Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased to declare that certain provisions of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, should apply to Sweden and Norway, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order in so far as it applies to Sweden, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Sweden confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Sweden or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932, shall be applicable to Sweden.

3. The Order in Council dated the 9th July, 1885, in so far as it relates to Sweden is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Sweden) Order, 1934.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Pluralities Act I have drawn up the following Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithe rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which Scheme together with the consents thereto of myself as Patron of the Benefices of Boxley, St. Faith Maidstone, and St. Paul Maidstone and of the present Incumbents of the same Benefices respectively I do certify by this my Report to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect.

"That the inhabitants of the aforesaid areas or portions so to be separated shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of St. Faith Maidstone as they might have had in

the Parish Churches of Boxley and St. Paul Maidstone respectively.

"That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said areas or portions so to be separated from the Parishes of Boxley and St. Paul Maidstone shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of St. Faith Maidstone.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or any or either of them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said Benefices or any or either of them.

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER UNDER THE NATIONAL SAVINGS COMMITTEE.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions under these regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held only on the occurrence of a vacancy.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 21, and must not have attained the age of 35 on the 1st April of the year in which the competition is held.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject. Provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject, but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible, provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Until further notice preference will be given to candidates who served in His Majesty's Forces during the War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

5. The National Savings Committee will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of a vacancy, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

6. Applications shall be addressed in the first instance to the Secretary of the National Savings Committee. The authorities of that Department will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

7. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education and possess such knowledge as to fit them for the post. University training and a knowledge of economic subjects are desirable. The Civil Service Commissioners may submit all or any of the candidates to a qualifying examination to test their education or any part of it.

8. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. A female candidate must be unmarried or a widow, and will be required to resign her appointment on marriage.

9. Candidates who are recommended by the authorities of the Department and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection

Board, who will recommend for appointment the candidate who appears to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decision.

10. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.
