FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1934 (No. 7).

SUBJECT.

Declaration of Flintshire Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

Declares the following to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area, for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.
