## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Bishops
Resignation Act, 1869, a representation
has been made to His Majesty by the Most
Reverend and Right Honourable Cosmo
Gordon, by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop
of Canterbury, Primate of All England and
Metropolitan, at the instance of the Right
Reverend John, by Divine Permission Lord
Bishop of Guildford, and as such a Bishop of
a Diocese within and of the Province of
Canterbury, that the said Bishop is desirous
of resigning his Bishopric (such resignation to
take formal effect upon the 6th day of October,
1934), by reason that he is incapacitated by
permanent physical infirmity from the due
performance of his duties as Bishop:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied of such incapacity and that the said Bishop has canonically resigned:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared that the said Bishopric of Guildford shall become vacant on the 6th day of October, 1934, and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Guildford.
