Greeting!

Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to enquire into and report upon the whole question of tithe rentcharge in England and Wales and its incidence, with special reference to stabilised value, statutory remission, powers of recovery, and method and terms of redemption:

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorised and appointed, and do by these Presents authorise and appoint you the said Sir John Fischer Williams (Chairman); Fiennes Stanley Wykeham, Baron Cornwallis; Sir Edward Robert Peacock; Sir Leonard James Coates and Sir John Edward Lloyd to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said enquiry:

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; to call for information in writing; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to enquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever:

And We do by these Presents authorise and empower you, or any of you, to visit and inspect personally such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid:

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral the twenty-seventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, in the Twenty-fifth Year of Our Reign.

To make further provision in regard to the gas undertaking of the Corporation and the supply of gas by them particularly in relation to the following matters:—the supply of gas where consumer has separate supply of gas, electricity, steam or other form of energy; the use of anti-fluctuators with engines, etc., and of apparatus preventing the admission of compressed air or of gas not supplied by the Corporation into any service pipe or main; the immediate repair of fittings in case of danger; fittings let for hire not to be subject to distress, etc.; the inspection and testing of meters; charges for special meter readings; the mode of cutting off supplies; the expenses of recon-necting discontinued supply; the prevention of the improper use of gas; the cutting off of supplies where charges due for apparatus let by the Corporation on hire or hire-purchase have not been paid; the recovery summarily of charges in respect of fittings, apparatus, etc., and the inclusion of several sums in one summons.
- 3. To empower the Corporation to provide dwellinghouses for employees and offices, showrooms and other buildings for the purposes of their gas undertaking.

4. To enable the Corporation to exercise all such powers as may be necessary or convenient for giving effect to the purposes of the Order, and to confer upon them all such other powers as are usually conferred upon local authorities

in connection with the supply of gas.
5. SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising:-

The Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

Kent and East Sussex .- An Area comprising :-

The administrative counties of Kent and East Sussex (including all boroughs geographically situated therein).

And also comprising: -

The city of Rochester.

The city and county borough of Canterbury; and the county boroughs of Brighton, Eastbourne and Hastings.

Inverness.—An Area comprising:—

The Islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray; and except the parish of North Uist and all the islands therein, together with the island of Berneray in the parish of Harris and all the grazing islands attached thereto), in the county of Inverness.

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AND DOUBLE DIPPING AREA.

The following Area is a "Movement Area" and a "Double Dipping Area" for the purposes of Parts II and III of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

North Wales .- An Area comprising :-

The administrative counties of Caernarvon, Denbigh, Flint (except the petty sessional division of Overton), Merioneth and Montgomery.

And also comprising:-

The parishes of Brompton and Rhiston, and Chirbury, in the administrative county of Salop.

The movement of sheep out of the following areas is regulated by the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934. Areas Nos. 3 and 5 are also "Double Dipping Areas" for the purposes of Part III of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

Area No. 1.

So much of the counties of Westmorland and Lancashire and of the North and West Ridings of Yorkshire and of the borough of Lancaster as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the Kirkby Stephen station of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway; thence in a general southerly direction along the said railway via Hawes Junction, Dent Station, Ribblehead Station, Horton Station, Stainforth, Settle, Long Preston, Swinden, Newsholme and Gisburn to the point near Downham Bridge where the railway is carried over Ings Beck;

thence in a westerly direction along Ings Beck to the River Ribble; thence in a south-westerly direction along the River Ribble to the point where it is joined by the River Hodder; thence in a north-westerly direction along the River Hodder to the point where the road from White-well via Stakes and Dusty Clough to Chipping is carried over the said river; thence in a general westerly direction along the road via Dusty Clough, Chipping, Cold Coates, Lower Core, Brock Mill, Jack Anderton Bridge, Tootle Hall, Butt Hill, Dandy Birks and Sandholme Mill to Garstang and Catterall Station; thence in a northerly direction along the London, Midland and Scottish Railway via Scorton Station and Galgate to Lancaster; thence continuing along the railway in a north-easterly direction via Halton, Caton, Hornby and Wennington to the point near Lower Bentham where the railway is carried over the road from Oxenforth Green to Lower Bentham; thence in a northerly direction along the road via Lower Bentham, Wards End, Four Lane Ends, Sunderland House, Burton in Lonsdale, and Anems to the point where the road crosses the Ingleton Branch of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway; thence continuing in a northerly direction along the railway via Kirkby Lonsdale Station, Barbon, Middleton Station to Tebay Station; thence in an easterly direction along the London and North Eastern Railway via Gaisgill and Newbiggin to the point where it crosses the London, Midland and Scottish Railway from Appleby to Hawes Junction; thence in a south-easterly direction along the London, Midland and Scottish Railway to the point of commencement.

Area No. 2.

So much of the county of Westmorland and of the North and West Ridings of Yorkshire

and of the borough of Richmond as lies within the following boundary, namely:-

Commencing at the point where the London and North Eastern Railway from Barnard Castle to Lartington crosses the River Tees; thence in a general west-south-westerly direction along the railway via Lartington, Bowes and Barras Station to the Kirkby Stephen Station of the London and North Eastern Railway; thence in a south-westerly direction along the road to the Kirkby Stephen Station of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway; thence in a southerly direction along the London, Midland and Scottish Railway to its junction with the London and North Eastern Railway at Hawes Junction; thence in an easterly direction along the London and North Eastern Railway via Hawes, Askrigg, Redmire and Leyburn to the point where the road from Fingall to Hunton is crossed by the railway; thence in a northerly direction along the road via Hunton, Craggs Lane Farm, Scotton, Scotton Hall, Wood House, Richmond, Gilling Grange, Gilling and Moor End Plantation to the point where the road meets the Watling Street; thence in a north-westerly direction along the Watling Street via Ravensworth Lodge and Newsham Grange to Rokeby Park; thence in a north-westerly direction along the River Tees to the point of commencement.

Area No. 3.

So much of the counties of Derby and the West Riding of Yorkshire and of the city and county borough of Sheffield and of the boroughs of Chesterfield and Glossop as lies within

the following boundary, namely:
