# RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF FARINGDON.

Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907.

Sections 15, 16, 23, 30, 32 and 33, comprised in Part II (Streets and buildings);

Sections 35 to 38 (inclusive) and 43 to 46 (inclusive) comprised in Part III (sanitary provisions); and

Sections 52 to 67 (inclusive) comprised in Part IV (infections diseases):

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject, as regards Sections 23 and 30 Part II and Sections 35 and 38 Part III, to the conditions specified in the Order.
