THE COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE BRISTOL DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, it is provided that any Scheme may be amended with the approval of the Board of Trade in manner provided by the Scheme;

And whereas in pursuance of powers conferred upon them by subsection (4) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Board of Trade have made the Bristol District (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1934, which provides that the Bristol District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may be amended so as to provide for certain matters specified in the Schedule to the said Order in substitution for certain matters mentioned in the said Section 3;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 19 of the said Scheme (*inter alia*) that any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme shall be operative from such date as may be prescribed by the Board of Trade;

And whereas in pursuance of the said Clause 19 the amendments of the said Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme;

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act hereby approve the amendments of the Bristol

District (Coal Mines) Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto and prescribe the 1st day of January, 1935, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force:

Provided that where under the said Scheme as amended the Executive Board are empowered to make any determination or to obtain any information which is necessary or expedient for bringing the said Scheme as amended into operation on the said 1st day of January, and any owner is required to furnish such information to the Executive Board, the provisions of the said Scheme as amended in relation to the matters aforesaid shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1934.

SCHEDULE.

THE BRISTOL DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme"), shall be amended as follows:—

1. Clause 2 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) at the end of the definition of "Coal mine" there were added the words "and includes undertaking";

(ii) the definition of "District Allocation" were deleted; and

(iii) at the end of the Clause there were inserted the following paragraphs, that is to say:—

"Allocation" means any allocation made to the District for any period under the provisions of the Central Scheme;

"Export Supply" means loading at the customary shipping places of the District as cargo into ships for conveyance therein to destinations outside the United Kingdom, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands, or as fuel for use on ships proceeding to such destinations or as fuel for use on fishing vessels or supply to works situated at ports to be used for the preparation of patent fuel for export;

"Inland Supply" means supply otherwise than as export supply including supply to other parts of an undertaking of which the coal mine forms part, but excluding supply for use in working the coal mines and supply free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed;

"The customary shipping places of the District" means Bristol (including Avonmouth and Sharpness), Newport, Cardiff and any other port declared from time to time by the Executive Board to be a customary shipping place.

2. Clause 20 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "except for the purposes of Clauses 21 to 29 (inclusive) of the Scheme" were inserted after the word "classification".

3. Clause 21 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs therein;

(ii) the words "or undertaking" and "or undertakings" were deleted wherever those words occur therein; and

(iii) the words "determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied" were inserted after the words "classes of coal" where those words first occur therein.

4. Clause 22 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the word "output" were inserted after the word "annual".

5. Clause 23 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs therein; and

(ii) the words "or undertaking" were deleted wherever those words occur therein.

6. Clause 24 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.

7. The following Clause shall be inserted after Clause 24 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"24A.—(1) Before the 31st day of December, 1934, and subsequently not later than the end of December in each year the Board shall determine for every coal mine the annual standard tonnage for that coal mine in respect of:—

(i) coal for export supply, and

(ii) coal for inland supply.

The Board may, if they think fit, further distribute the annual standard tonnages so determined for any such mine among the various classes of coal determined according to the nature of the coal, or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied, produced therefrom:

Provided that such distribution of the standard tonnages among classes of coal shall have effect for all coal mines producing those classes of coal or any of them.

The first standard tonnages thus determined shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1935, and subsequently such standard tonnages shall come into force on the 1st day of January in each year.

(2) In the determination of standard tonnages in respect of coal or any class of coal for export supply and for inland supply the Board shall have regard to all matters relevant to such determination and to the proportions in which coal supplied from the coal mine has been disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively:—

(i) in the case of the first determination during the 4 years ended 31st December, 1933; and

(ii) in the case of subsequent annual determinations during the 12 months ended on the 31st December immediately preceding the determination.

(3) For the purpose of assisting the Board in the determination of supply standard tonnages every owner shall furnish to the Board upon notice given to him by the

Board a statement in writing giving any information which the Board may require for that purpose and every owner may submit to the Board together with a statement so required a claim in writing accompanied by any evidence required to substantiate the same in respect of any matters relative to the determination of standard tonnages for his coal mine for export supply or for inland supply."

8. Clause 25 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the word "any" were substituted for the word "the" where that word first occurs therein, and the words "in the case of any determination of output standard tonnage and, in the case of any determination of supply standard tonnages, to any matters relevant thereto and to the proportions in which coal supplied from the coal mine has been disposed of for export supply and inland supply respectively during some recent period" were inserted at the end thereof.

9. Clause 26 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the word "so" were deleted.

10. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 27 and 28 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"27. The Board may at any time review whether or not at the request of an owner any standard tonnage and determine such revised standard tonnage as may seem to the Board fair and proper having regard in the determination of any standard tonnage in respect of output to the special circumstances of the coal mine and in determining any standard tonnage in respect of coal for export supply or inland supply to any matters relevant to such determination and to the proportions in which coal supplied from the coal mine has been disposed of for export supply and inland supply respectively during some recent period.

28. Where after the commencement of the Scheme an owner purchases or otherwise acquires any coal mine, the standard tonnages of the coal mine so acquired, added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner, shall constitute the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking, and on any subsequent determination of standard tonnages, such combined undertaking shall be treated in the same way as if the standard tonnages so constituted were the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking under the last previous determination of standard tonnages for the District:

Provided that where an owner purchases or otherwise acquires part only of an undertaking in respect of which standard tonnages have been determined under the Scheme, the proportion of those standard tonnages to be added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner shall be determined by the Board and that amount shall be deducted from the standard tonnages of the undertaking of which the part has been so acquired."

11. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 30, 31, 32, 33 and 34 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"30.—(1) The Board shall from time to time determine the proportions (hereinafter in the Scheme referred to as "Quotas") of

the standard tonnages of each coal mine that may be produced therefrom or which may be supplied by the owner thereof as the case may be.

(2) If standard tonnages have been determined in respect of any class of coal the Board may if they think fit determine a separate quota for such class.

(3) All quotas shall be so calculated that during no period in respect of which allocations have been fixed by the Central Council shall any of such allocations be exceeded.

(4) Quotas shall be determined for such period as the Board may decide within the period of the allocation to which such quotas relate and shall be notified by the Board to all the owners not less than 14 days before the commencement of the period to which they relate.

(5) The quotas and the periods for which they are fixed shall be determined by the Board having regard amongst other matters to the prospective demand for the coal to which those quotas relate.

(6) Any quota determined shall be the same proportion of the corresponding standard tonnage for all coal mines.

(7) The Board may at any time after the determination of quotas increase any quota, so, however, that the tonnage of coal permitted to be raised or supplied as the case may be under any allocation made to the District shall not be exceeded. Any such increase shall be notified to all the owners affected thereby in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.

31. Every owner shall forward to the Board within 7 days after the end of each period for which quotas are determined a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe giving in respect of such period full particulars of the output of his coal mine, the tonnage of coal disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively and the output or supply as the case may be of any class of coal for which a separate quota has been determined. The Board may require such other particulars as in their opinion may be necessary for ascertaining whether any quota for the coal mine has been exceeded.

32. No owner shall be entitled in the event of the output of or the supply of coal or any class of coal from his coal mine falling short of the tonnage permitted under the relevant quota in the period for which such quota has been determined to carry forward the amount of such shortage or any portion thereof as any addition to the tonnage permitted under any quota during any succeeding period.

33. Arrangements may be made by any two owners whereby the output or export supply or inland supply of coal or any class of coal from the coal mine of one owner may exceed the quota in respect thereof in any period where the other owner has agreed, whether for valuable consideration or not, to limit the corresponding output of or supply from his coal mine to a tonnage which is less than the quota in respect thereof by a tonnage not less than the tonnage by which

such first mentioned quota is exceeded. If the output of or supply from any coal mine exceeds any limit so agreed, for the purposes of Clauses 55 and 56 hereof the corresponding quota shall be deemed to be exceeded by the amount of the excess over such limit.

34. Notice in writing of any arrangement made under the last preceding Clause must be given to the Secretary by the parties concerned within 24 hours of the making of any such arrangement."

12. Clause 54 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.

13. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 55 and 56 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"55.—(1) Any owner who, during any period for which a quota is determined, raises or allows to be raised an output of coal or any class of coal or supplies or allows to be supplied a tonnage of coal or any class of coal for export supply or for inland supply in excess of the corresponding quota (after allowing for any arrangement under Clause 33 of the Scheme whereby a quota may be exceeded) shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty in respect of each ton or part of a ton of such excess of the same amount per ton as is prescribed for the time being under rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme for exceeding the corresponding allocation:

Provided that

(i) until the coming into force of such rules the penalty shall be 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) per ton;

(ii) where in any period for which quotas have been determined a quota for output of coal or any class of coal has been exceeded and any quota for export supply or inland supply of coal or that class of coal has also been exceeded, one penalty only shall be payable in respect of such excesses calculated upon the amount of the excess over the quota for output or the excess over the quota or the sum of any excesses over quotas for supply, whichever shall be the greater.

(2) The Board shall before the coming into force of any rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme notify each owner of the amount per ton which will be payable in consequence thereof for exceeding any quota.

56. Where output of coal or any class of coal or inland supply or export supply of coal or any class of coal is in excess of the corresponding quota for any period the corresponding quota for the coal mine of the owner concerned may during such succeeding period as the Board may determine be reduced at the discretion of the Board by the amount of the excess but without prejudice to any penalty incurred under Clause 55 hereof by reason of the excess."

14. Clause 57 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.

15. Clause 61 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "in respect of output of coal" were inserted after the word "tonnage".

And whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (4) of Section 2 of the said Act, the Board of Trade have made the Central (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1934, which provides that the Central (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may be amended so as to provide for certain matters specified in the schedule to the said Order in substitution for the matters mentioned in paragraphs (b), (c) and (j) of subsection (2) of the said Section 2, and for certain matters so specified in addition to the matters mentioned in subsections (2) and (3) of the said Section 2;

And whereas the amendments of the said scheme set out in the schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Central Council for approval:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act, hereby approve the amendments of the Central (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930 set out in the schedule hereto and approve the 1st day of January, 1935, as the date on which the said amendments shall come into force:

Provided that where the Central Council are thereby empowered to make any allocation or any rules, or to obtain any estimates or information which are necessary or expedient for bringing the said scheme as amended into operation on the said 1st day of January, the provisions in relation to the matters aforesaid shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1934.

SCHEDULE.

THE CENTRAL (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended as follows:—

1. Clause VI.—(1) of the Scheme shall have effect as if there were inserted after the word "under" the words "the Act or".

2. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses X. and XI. of the Scheme, that is to say:—

Allocations.

"X.—(1) The Council shall from time to time allocate to each district

(a) a maximum output for the district; and

(b) maximum tonnages in coal raised at all the coal mines in the district for

(i) export supply, that is to say, loading at the customary shipping places of the district as defined in the district scheme

as cargo into ships for conveyance therein to destinations outside the United Kingdom, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands, or as fuel for use on ships proceeding to such destinations, or as fuel for use on fishing vessels or supply to works situated at ports to be used for the preparation of patent fuel for export; and

(ii) inland supply, that is to say, supply otherwise than as specified in sub-paragraph (i) hereof, including supply to other parts of an undertaking of which the coal mine forms part, but excluding supply for use in working the coal mines and supply free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed.

(2) The Council may further from time to time on the application of the Executive Board for any district make to that district the allocations specified under subclause (1) of this Clause in relation to a class of coal determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied.

(3) In determining the allocations to be made to any district the Council shall have regard to all relevant circumstances affecting the several districts not excluding the relative position of such districts prior to the war:

Provided that—

(a) in the change over from the determination of allocation of output alone to the determination of allocations of output and of tonnages for export supply and inland supply regard shall be had to the existing distribution of the trade in coal among the districts;

(b) special regard shall be had to a claim on behalf of any district that allocations shall be so made as to enable any stocks of coal which are on the ground at coal mines in that district at the first day of October, 1934, to be disposed of as and when the demand arises for coal of that size or description;

(c) in determining allocations of tonnages for inland supply the Council shall observe the general principle that the inland market is the common property of all districts; so, however, that the Council shall take into account among any other considerations a claim on behalf of any district to the right to supply coal in a particular market or markets on the ground that such district would have been the source of supply if no schemes for allocation were in force.

(4) The Council shall determine allocations for such periods as it thinks fit and any such period is hereinafter referred to as a period of allocation.

(5) Before the commencement of each period of allocation the Council shall require the Executive Board for each district to submit an estimate in respect of each allocation to be made under subclauses (1) or (2) of this Clause of the output or tonnage of coal which should be allocated to that district.

The Central Council shall send notice of such requirement as soon as in its opinion it is possible for the Executive Boards to make such estimates for the period of allocation.

(6) The Council may also require from any Executive Board from time to time such further information as it may decide to be necessary to assist it in arriving at its determination.

(7) Each Executive Board shall forward to the Council the estimates referred to in subclause (5) of this Clause within such time as may be determined by the Council and specified in the notice mentioned in that subclause, and the Council shall cause the estimates of each Executive Board to be forwarded to each of the other Executive Boards as soon as practicable after the receipt thereof.

(8) The Council shall meet at such reasonable interval after the notices mentioned in subclause (5) of this Clause have been sent as the Council may determine, and in any event not less than three weeks before the beginning of a period of allocation, to consider the allocations for that period.

(9) All allocations made by the Council or awarded at arbitration as the case may be shall be communicated by the Council to all the Executive Boards as soon as practicable and in the case of allocations made by the Council under the provisions of subclause (1) of this Clause not less than two weeks before the commencement of the period of allocation to which they relate.

(10) In any period of allocation any Executive Board may at any time apply to the Council to have any allocation made to its district increased for the remainder of such period on the ground that such increase is necessary by reason of the demand for coal or coal for export supply or coal for inland supply, or any class of coal in respect of which an allocation has been made by the Council being in excess of that for which provision is made in the allocations already made to the district by the Council in respect of the period in question. The Council shall meet within seven days of the receipt of any such application to consider the same and if satisfied that the increase applied for is necessary wholly or in part to meet such increased demand as aforesaid shall grant the same wholly or in part as the case may be and if not so satisfied shall refuse the same and unless the representative or representatives of any Executive Board exercise the right conferred by Clause IX. (3) of appealing to arbitration against the decision of the Council, shall at once communicate such decision to all of the Executive Boards. In the event of an appeal to arbitration under Clause IX. (3) the matter shall forthwith be referred to arbitration accordingly. The Council shall use its best endeavours to secure that the decision of the Council or of the arbitrators as the case may be shall be communicated to all the Executive Boards as soon as practicable after the receipt of the application, but delay in the making or communication of the decision of the Council or the arbitrators as the case may be shall not entitle the applicant district to exceed any allocation already made to it in accordance with the provisions of this Clause.

X.A.—(1) No Executive Board shall have the right to transfer to any other district any part of any allocation made to it under the Scheme.

(2) If in any period of allocation any district fail to produce or to supply, as the case may be, the whole tonnage of coal allocated to it

in respect of that period such deficiency in production or supply shall not entitle it to exceed any allocation in any subsequent period and the allocations to it in such subsequent periods shall continue to be fixed in the manner provided by Clause X.

XI.—(1) The Executive Board of each district shall regulate the output and supply of coal by that district so that no allocation made to it is exceeded, but if in any period of allocation any such allocation is exceeded the Executive Board for that district shall pay to the Trustees within fourteen days after demand therefor by the Council the penalty in respect of such excess payable under Rules made under the provisions of this Clause:

Provided that until the coming into force of Rules made by the Council under this Clause the penalty payable in respect of an excess over any allocation shall be at the rate of two shillings and sixpence per ton of such excess, so, however, that where during the same period of allocation a penalty has been incurred in respect of an excess over an allocation of output of coal or any class of coal and also in respect of an allocation of inland supply or of export supply or of allocation of both such supplies of coal or any class of coal, the tonnage of coal upon which the penalty shall be payable shall be the quantity by which the allocation of output of coal is exceeded or the sum of the quantities by which the other allocations have been exceeded, whichever is the greater.

(2) The Trustees shall pay all such penalties received by them into the Central Fund.

(3) The Council shall from time to time make Rules prescribing the sum payable per ton of coal by which any allocation is exceeded and different sums may be prescribed in respect of different allocations, but such sums shall in no case be less than two shillings and sixpence.

(4) The Rules shall prescribe whether, and to what extent if any, the amount of any penalty payable in respect of an excess over any allocation of output or of inland supply or of export supply of coal or of any class of coal shall be remitted where during the same period of allocation a penalty has been incurred in respect of any excess over any other allocation.

(5) Rules made by the Council under this Clause shall come into force after the expiry of such period not being less than two months as may be specified therein and in no case earlier than the beginning of the next following period of allocation."

3. Clause XIII. (1) of the Scheme shall have effect as if there were inserted after the word "Act," the words "other than such functions as are specified in Clause XIII. A. hereof."

4. The following Clause shall be inserted after Clause XIII. of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"XIII.A.—(1) The Council shall inquire into any complaint made to it by any Executive Board as to any act or omission of any other Executive Board or of any person having functions under any district scheme in relation to the operation of the provisions of that district scheme with regard to the determination and enforcement of the minimum prices for coal produced in that district.

(2) The Council shall give notice of any such inquiry to all other Executive Boards and the Council shall take into consideration any representations made by any Executive Board.

(3) After any such inquiry the Council may give directions in regard to the matter complained of to any Executive Board which in the opinion of the Council is affected thereby and, subject to any reference to arbitration, such directions shall be binding upon the Executive Boards to which they are given.

(4) If at any time any Executive Board represents to the Council that owing to a change in circumstances any direction given by the Council under subclause (3) of this Clause should be varied, the Council shall give notice of such representation to all the other Executive Boards and shall consider any representations made by any such other Executive Board with respect thereto, and after inquiry the Council may give new directions in the matter, whether or not a decision of an arbitrator or arbitrators is in force in relation thereto.

(5) If any Executive Board for a district to which any directions have been given by the Council in accordance with subclause (3) of this Clause, or any persons having functions under the scheme for that district fail to comply with such directions or if that Board or such persons fail to enforce any provision of that scheme with respect to the enforcement of the minimum prices for coal produced in that district and the Council find upon representations made to it by any other Executive Board that such other Board is aggrieved or dissatisfied by the failure to enforce any such provision the first-named Executive Board shall pay to the Trustees a penalty of two shillings and sixpence per ton of the tonnage of coal which, in the opinion of the Council, has been supplied in contravention of such directions, or in respect of which the provisions of the district scheme relating to the enforcement of minimum prices have not been enforced. Such penalty shall be paid to the Trustees within fourteen days after demand therefor by the Council, and the Trustees shall pay all such penalties received by them into the Central Fund.

(6) If any Executive Board represents to the Council that it is aggrieved or dissatisfied

(a) by any direction given by the Council under subclause (3) of this Clause; or

(b) by the failure of the Council to give any directions under subclause (3) of this Clause; or

(c) by any new directions given under subclause (4) of this Clause; or

(d) by the failure of the Council to give any new directions under subclause (4) of this Clause; or

(e) by any finding of the Council under subclause (5) of this Clause

and desires to refer any one of these matters to arbitration, the same shall forthwith be referred to arbitration accordingly."

5. The following Rule shall be substituted for Rule 10 of the Schedule to the Scheme, that is to say:—

"10. In the case of disputes under Clause X. the arbitrators shall hear and

determine the question and deliver their decision to the Secretary within five days from the day of the meeting of the Council at which the reference of the matter to arbitration has been demanded, so however that in the case of disputes under Clause X.(10) such period shall be three days:

Provided that Sunday shall not be counted as a day in either case and that the arbitrators shall have power in any proper case to extend the time so limited."

THE COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE CANNOCK CHASE DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, it is provided that any Scheme may be amended with the approval of the Board of Trade in manner provided by the Scheme;

And whereas in pursuance of powers conferred upon them by subsection (4) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Board of Trade have made the Cannock Chase District (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1934, which provides that the Cannock Chase District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may be amended so as to provide for certain matters specified in the Schedule to the said Order in substitution for certain matters mentioned in the said Section 3;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 33 of the said Scheme (*inter alia*) that any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme shall be operative from such date as may be prescribed by the Board of Trade;

And whereas in pursuance of the said Clause 33 the amendments of the said Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act hereby approve the amendments of the Cannock Chase District (Coal Mines) Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto and prescribe the 1st day of January, 1935, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force:

Provided that where under the said Scheme as amended the Executive Board are empowered to make any determination or to obtain any information which is necessary or expedient for bringing the said Scheme as amended into operation on the said 1st day of January, and any owner is required to furnish such information to the Executive Board, the provisions of the said Scheme as amended in relation to the matters aforesaid shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1934.

SCHEDULE.

THE CANNOCK CHASE DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme"), shall be amended as follows:—

1. Clause 2 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) in the definition of "Coal mine" there were added after the words "any mine" the word "undertaking";

(ii) the definition of "District Allocation" were deleted; and

(iii) the following definitions were inserted at the end of the Clause:—

"Allocation" means any allocation made to the District for any period under the provisions of the Central Scheme;

"Export Supply" means loading at the customary shipping places of the District as cargo into ships for conveyance therein to destinations outside the United Kingdom, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands, or as fuel for use on ships proceeding to such destinations or as fuel on fishing vessels or supply to works situated at ports to be used for the preparation of patent fuel for export;

"Inland Supply" means supply otherwise than as specified in the last preceding definition hereof including supply to other parts of an undertaking of which the coal mine forms part, but excluding supply for use in working the coal mines and supply free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed;

"The customary shipping places of the District" means Garston, Hull and Immingham, and any other port declared from time to time by the Executive Board to be a customary shipping place.

2. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 13 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"13. The Board shall appoint a Secretary and such Inspectors or other Officers as the Board may deem necessary to enable effect to be given to the functions of the Board, and they shall fix the terms and duration of each appointment."

3. Clause 29 of the Scheme shall have effect as if in the first paragraph thereof the words "in respect of output of coal" were inserted after the words "standard tonnage" and the words "or mines" were deleted.

4. Clause 35 of the Scheme shall have effect as if after the word "classification" there were inserted the words "except for the purposes of Clauses 38 to 45 inclusive of the Scheme".

5. Clauses 38 and 39 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted wherever those words occur, and as if the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs.

6. Clause 40 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs;

(ii) the words "or undertaking" and "or undertakings" were deleted wherever those words occur; and

(iii) before the word "produced" there were inserted the words "determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied".

7. Clause 41 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the words "or undertaking" were deleted wherever those words occur in paragraph (1);

(ii) the word "output" were inserted before "standard" wherever that word occurs in paragraphs (1) and (2); and

(iii) paragraph (3) thereof were deleted.

8. The following Clauses shall be inserted after Clause 41 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"41A.—(1) Before the first day of December, 1934, and subsequently in the month of December in each year thereafter the Board shall determine for every coal mine the annual standard tonnage for that coal mine in respect of

- (a) coal for export supply, and
- (b) coal for inland supply.

The Board may, if they think fit, further distribute the standard tonnages so determined for any such mine among the various classes of coal determined according to the nature of the coal, or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied, produced therefrom:

Provided that such distribution of the standard tonnages among classes of coal shall have effect for all coal mines producing those classes of coal or any of them.

The first standard tonnages thus determined shall come into force on the first day of January, 1935, and subsequently such standard tonnages shall come into force on the first day of January in each year.

(2) In the determination of standard tonnages in respect of coal or any class of coal for export supply and for inland supply the Board shall have regard to all matters relevant to such determination and to the proportions in which coal supplied from the coal mine has been disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively—

(a) in the case of the first determination during the period from the first day of January, 1934, to the thirty-first day of March, 1934, and

(b) in the case of subsequent determinations during the twelve months ended on the thirtieth day of September immediately preceding the determination.

(3) For the purpose of assisting the Board in the determination of standard tonnages in respect of supply every owner shall furnish to the Board upon notice given to him by the Board a statement in writing giving any information which the Board may require for that purpose, and every owner may submit to the Board together with a statement so required a claim in writing accompanied by any evidence required to substantiate the same in respect of any matters relative to the determination

of standard tonnages for his coal mine for export supply or for inland supply.

41B. After the determination of the annual output and supply standard tonnages of each coal mine, every owner shall declare, by notice in writing to the Secretary, the monthly proportions in which he requires the Board to allocate such standard tonnages over the twelve months of each year ending on the 31st day of December, or over such other period as the Board may prescribe, and if the Board shall be satisfied that such declared allocations are not prejudicial to the interests of other owners, they shall fix the allocated monthly tonnages as the monthly output and monthly supply standard tonnages of the coal mine concerned. After the Board shall have fixed such monthly output and supply standard tonnages, the same shall not be altered by the owner concerned during the year in question except with the written consent of the Board and in such manner as may be so sanctioned:

Provided that in fixing monthly output standard tonnages the Board shall have regard to the special circumstances of the coal mine, and in determining the monthly supply standard tonnages the Board shall have regard to any matters relevant to such determination and to the proportions in which coal supplied from the coal mine has been disposed of for export supply and inland supply respectively during some recent period."

9. Clause 42 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "annual standard tonnages" were substituted for the words "standard tonnage for the year", and as if the word "tonnages" were substituted for the word "tonnage" where that word occurs the second time.

10. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 44 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"44. The Board may at any time review, whether or not at the request of an owner, any standard tonnage and determine such revised standard tonnage as may seem to the Board fair and proper having regard in the determination of any standard tonnage in respect of output to the special circumstances of the coal mine and in determining any standard tonnage in respect of coal for export supply or inland supply to any matters relevant to such determination and to the proportions in which coal supplied from the coal mine has been disposed of for export supply and inland supply respectively during some recent period."

11. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 45 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"45. Where after the commencement of the Scheme an owner purchases or otherwise acquires any coal mine, the standard tonnages of the coal mine so acquired added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner shall constitute the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking, and on any subsequent determination of standard tonnages, such combined undertaking shall be treated in the same way as if the standard tonnages so constituted were the standard tonnages of the combined

undertaking under the last previous determination of standard tonnages for the District:

Provided that where an owner purchases or acquires part only of an undertaking in respect of which standard tonnages have been determined under the Scheme the proportion of those standard tonnages to be added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner shall be determined by the Board, and that amount shall be deducted from the standard tonnages of the undertaking of which part has been so acquired."

12. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 46, 47, 48, 49 and 50 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"Determination of Quotas.

46.—(1) The Board shall from time to time determine the proportions (hereinafter in the Scheme referred to as 'the quotas') of the standard tonnages of each coal mine that may be produced therefrom or which may be supplied by the owner thereof, as the case may be.

(2) If standard tonnages have been determined in respect of any class of coal the Board may, if they think fit, determine a separate quota for such class.

(3) All quotas shall be so calculated that during no period in respect of which allocations have been fixed by the Central Council shall any of such allocations be exceeded.

(4) Quotas shall be determined for such period as the Board may decide within the period of the allocation to which such quotas relate, and shall be notified by the Board to all the owners not later than seven days before the commencement of the period to which they relate.

(5) The quotas and the periods for which they are fixed shall be determined by the Board having regard, among other matters, to the prospective demand for the coal to which those quotas relate.

(6) Any quota determined shall be the same proportion of the corresponding standard tonnage for all coal mines.

(7) The Board may at any time after the determination of quotas increase any quota so, however, that the tonnage of coal permitted to be raised or supplied, as the case may be, under any allocation made to the District shall not be exceeded. Any such increase shall be notified to all the owners affected thereby in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay, and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.

47. Every owner shall forward to the Board within seven days after the end of each period for which quotas are determined a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe, giving in respect of such period full particulars of the output of his coal mine, the tonnage of coal disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively, and the output or supply, as the case may be, of any class of coal for which a separate quota has been determined. The Board may require such other particulars as, in their opinion, may be

necessary for ascertaining whether any quota for the coal mine has been exceeded.

48. No owner shall be entitled in the event of the output of, or the supply of coal or any class of coal from his coal mine falling short of the tonnage permitted under the relevant quota in the period for which such quota has been determined, to carry forward the amount of such shortage or any portion thereof as any addition to the tonnage permitted under any quota during any succeeding period:

Provided that if the quotas are fixed for a period of one month only an owner shall be entitled, in the event of the output of or supply of coal from his coal mine in any month falling short of the tonnage permitted under the relevant quota for that month, to carry forward the amount of the shortage (being the difference between the tonnage permitted by such quota allowing for any arrangement under Clause 49 of the Scheme whereby a quota may be exceeded and the actual output of or tonnage of coal supplied from the coal mine during the month) as an addition to the tonnage permissible under the corresponding quota during the next succeeding month. No shortages shall be carried forward at the end of the period of the allocation to which such quota relates.

49. Arrangements may be made by any two owners whereby the output or export supply or inland supply of coal or any class of coal from the coal mine of one owner may exceed the quota in respect thereof in any period where the other owner has agreed, whether for valuable consideration or not, to limit the corresponding output of or supply from his coal mine to a tonnage which is less than the quota in respect thereof by a tonnage not less than the tonnage by which such first mentioned quota is exceeded. If the output of or supply from any coal mine exceeds any limit so agreed for the purposes of Clauses 76 and 77 of the Scheme the corresponding quota shall be deemed to be exceeded by the amount of the excess over such limit.

50. Notice in writing of any arrangement made under the last preceding Clause must be given to the Secretary by the parties concerned within one day of the making of such arrangement."

13. Clause 56 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) in sub-paragraph (iii) of paragraph (1) before the word "discount" there were inserted the word "gift," and after the word "otherwise" there were added the word "or";

(ii) there were added after sub-paragraph (iii) of paragraph (1) the following sub-paragraph, that is to say:—

"(iv) permit or suffer any agent or subsidiary company of the owner to make, allow or give, or to agree to make, allow or give, any such gift, discount, commission, rebate, extended credit or allowance as aforesaid."; and

(iii) there were added at the end of the Clause the following paragraph, that is to say:—

"(3) In this Clause the expression 'subsidiary company' means in relation to

any owner (being a company), a subsidiary company within the meaning of Section 127 of the Companies Act, 1929, whose objects consist of, include, or involve, trading in coal produced from the coal mine of that owner."

14. Clause 71 of the Scheme shall have effect as if after the word "accounts" there were inserted the words "balance sheets".

15. Clause 72 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.

16. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 76 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"76.—(1) Any owner who, during any period for which a quota is determined, raises or allows to be raised an output of coal or any class of coal or supplies or allows to be supplied a tonnage of coal or any class of coal for export supply or for inland supply in excess of the corresponding quota (after allowing for any shortage carried forward under Clause 48 of the Scheme and any arrangement under Clause 49 of the Scheme whereby a quota may be exceeded) shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty in respect of each ton or part of a ton of such excess of the same amount per ton as is prescribed for the time being under rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme for exceeding the corresponding allocation:

Provided that

(i) until the coming into force of such rules the penalty shall be 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) per ton;

(ii) where in any period for which quotas have been determined a quota for output of coal or any class of coal has been exceeded and any quota for export supply or inland supply of coal or that class of coal has also been exceeded, one penalty only shall be payable in respect of such excesses calculated upon the amount of the excess over the quota for output or the excess over the quota or the sum of any excesses over quotas for supply, whichever shall be the greater.

(2) The Board shall before the coming into force of any rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme notify each owner of the amount per ton which will be payable in consequence thereof for exceeding any quota."

17. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 77 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"77. Where output of coal or any class of coal or inland supply or export supply of coal or any class of coal is in excess of the corresponding quota for any period, the corresponding quota for the coal mine of the coal owner concerned may during such succeeding period as the Board may determine be reduced at the discretion of the Board by the amount of the excess but without prejudice to any penalty that may have been incurred by reason of the excess."

18. Clause 78 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "of 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence)" were substituted for the words "not exceeding 3s. (three shillings)".

19. Clause 79 of the Scheme shall have effect as if in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (1) the

word "output" were inserted before the word "standard".

20. Clause 84 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "annual output" were inserted after the word "prevailing".

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act hereby approve the amendments of the North Staffordshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto and prescribe the 1st day of January, 1935, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force:

Provided that where under the said Scheme as amended the Executive Board are empowered to make any determination or to obtain any information which is necessary or expedient for bringing the said Scheme as amended into operation on the said 1st day of January, and any owner is required to furnish such information to the Executive Board, the provisions of the said Scheme as amended in relation to the matters aforesaid shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1934.

"Export Supply" means loading at the customary shipping places of the District as cargo into ships for conveyance therein to destinations outside the United Kingdom, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands, or as fuel for use on ships proceeding to such destinations, or as fuel for use on fishing vessels, or supply to works situated at ports to be used for the preparation of patent fuel for export;

"Inland Supply" means supply otherwise than as export supply, including supply to other parts of an undertaking of which the coal mine forms part, but excluding supply for use in working the coal mines and supply free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed;

"The customary shipping places of the District" means:—The Mersey Ports, Manchester Ship Canal, Ellesmere Port, Widnes, Fleetwood, Preston, and any other port declared from time to time by the Executive Board to be a customary shipping place.

2. Clause 29 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the word "output" were inserted after the word "annual"; and

(ii) the words "or mines" were deleted wherever they occur.

3. Clause 35 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "except for the purposes of Clauses 38 to 45 inclusive of the Scheme" were inserted after the word "classification".

4. Clause 37 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or mines" were deleted.

5. Clauses 38 and 39 of the Scheme shall be deleted.

6. Clause 40 of the Scheme shall be re-numbered 38 and shall have effect as if:—

(i) the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs;

(ii) the words "or undertaking" and "or undertakings" were deleted wherever those words occur;

(iii) before the word "produced" there were inserted the words "determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied"; and

(iv) at the end of the Clause there were added the sentence "In any such distribution as aforesaid regard shall be had to the special circumstances of the coal mine and in the case of the first determination to the proportion which the output of the coal mine bore to the output of the District during some recent period."

7. Clause 41 of the Scheme shall be re-numbered 39, paragraph (3) thereof shall be deleted, and the remaining paragraphs (1) and (2) shall have effect as if the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs.

8. The following new Clauses shall be inserted immediately preceding Clause 42 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"40.—(1) Before the thirty-first day of December, 1934, and subsequently not later than the end of December in each year the Board shall determine for every coal mine an annual standard tonnage in respect of

- (a) coal for export supply, and
- (b) coal for inland supply,

and may, if they think fit, further distribute such standard tonnages fixed for any such mine among the various classes of coal determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied produced therefrom:

Provided that such distribution of the standard tonnages among classes of coal shall have effect for all coal mines producing those classes of coal or any of them.

(2) The first annual standard tonnages for export supply and inland supply shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1935, and in subsequent years such standard tonnages shall come into force on the 1st day of January of each year.

(3) In the determination of annual standard tonnages in respect of coal or any class of coal for export supply and inland supply the Board shall have regard to any matters relevant to such determination and, in the case of the first determination, to the proportion which the tonnage of coal or of that class of coal supplied from the coal mine in question for export supply or inland supply as the case may be bore to the total tonnage of coal or of that class of coal supplied from all the coal mines in the District for export supply or for inland supply during the twelve months ended the 30th day of June, 1934.

40A. After the determination of the annual output and supply standard tonnages of his coal mine each owner shall declare, by notice in writing to the Secretary, the monthly proportions in which he requires the Board to allocate such annual standard tonnages for the twelve months of each year ending on the 31st day of December, or over such other period as the Board may prescribe. If the Board shall be satisfied that such declared allocations are not prejudicial to the interests of other owners they shall determine the monthly standard tonnages so

declared as the monthly standard tonnages in respect of output or supply, as the case may be, of the coal mine concerned, but if they are not so satisfied they shall themselves determine the monthly standard tonnages at such amounts as seem to them fair and equitable to all owners:

Provided that in the determination of monthly standard tonnages as aforesaid regard shall be had, in so far as output standard tonnages are concerned, to the special circumstances of the coal mine, and in so far as all other standard tonnages are concerned to any matters relevant to such determination.

41. For the purpose of assisting the Board in the determination of standard tonnages every owner shall furnish to the Board upon notice given to him by the Board any information which the Board may require for that purpose and any owner may submit to the Board any written representations (accompanied by evidence to substantiate the same) relating in the case of any determination of standard tonnage in respect of output to the special circumstances of his coal mine and in the case of any determination of standard tonnage for inland supply or for export supply to any matters relevant thereto which the owner may desire to have taken into consideration in any such determination."

9. Clause 42 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the word "all" were substituted for the word "the" where that word first occurs; and

(ii) the word "tonnages" were substituted for the word "tonnage" wherever that word occurs.

10. Clause 43 of the Scheme shall have effect as if for the words "without delay" there were substituted the words "within 28 days of such notice of objection".

11. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 44 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"44. Subject to the provisions of Clause 45 of the Scheme the Board may at any time review (whether or not at the request of an owner) all or any of the standard tonnages and determine such revised standard tonnages or standard tonnage as to the Board shall seem fair and proper having regard to the matters to which they are hereinbefore directed to have regard in the determination of such standard tonnages."

12. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 45 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"45. Where after the commencement of the Scheme an owner purchases or otherwise acquires any coal mine, the standard tonnages of the coal mine so acquired, added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner, shall constitute the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking, and on any subsequent determination of standard tonnages such combined undertaking shall be treated in the same way as if the standard tonnages so constituted were the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking under the last previous determination of standard tonnages concerned for the District:

Provided that where an owner purchases or otherwise acquires part only of an undertaking in respect of which standard tonnages have been determined under the Scheme, the proportions of the standard tonnages to be added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner shall be determined by the Board and the amounts so determined shall be deducted from the standard tonnages of the undertaking of which part has been so acquired."

13. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 46, 47, 48, 49 and 50 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

Determination of Quotas.

"46.—(1) The Board shall from time to time determine the proportions (hereinafter referred to as 'the quotas') of the standard tonnages of each coal mine that may be produced therefrom or supplied by the owner thereof, as the case may be, during the period to which the quota relates. The quotas and the periods for which they are fixed shall be determined by the Board having regard among other matters to the prospective demand for the coal to which these quotas relate.

(2) If separate standard tonnages have been determined for any class of coal, the Board may, if they think fit, determine a separate quota for such class.

(3) Each quota shall be determined for such period as the Board may decide within the period of the allocation to which such quota relates, and shall be notified by the Board to all the owners not less than 7 days before the commencement of the period to which that quota relates.

(4) All quotas shall be so calculated that during any period for which the appropriate allocation has been fixed that allocation shall not be exceeded.

(5) Any quota determined by the Board shall be the same proportion of the standard tonnage to which it relates for every coal mine.

(6) The Board may at any time during the period for which any quota has been determined increase such quota, so however that the tonnage of coal permitted to be raised or supplied, as the case may be, under any allocation made to the District shall not be exceeded. Any such increase shall be notified to all the owners affected thereby in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.

47. Every owner shall forward to the Board within 7 days after the end of each period for which a quota has been determined a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe, giving in respect of such period full particulars of the output of his coal mine, the tonnage of coal disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively, including the output or supply of any class of coal for which a separate quota has been fixed, together with such other particulars as the Board may require for ascertaining whether any quota has been exceeded.

48. No owner shall be entitled, in the event of the output of or the supply of coal or any class of coal from his mine falling short in any period of the tonnage permitted under the relevant quota for that period, to carry forward the amount of the shortage or any part thereof as an addition to the tonnage permitted under any quota during any succeeding period:

Provided that, if any quota is fixed for a period of one month only, an owner shall be entitled in the event of the output of or supply from his coal mine falling short of the tonnage permitted under that quota for that month, to carry forward the amount of the shortage (being the difference between the tonnage permitted by that quota for that month, allowing for any arrangement made under Clause 49 of the Scheme, and the actual output of or tonnage of coal supplied from the coal mine as the case may be during the month) as an addition to the tonnage permissible under the corresponding quota during the next succeeding month. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Clause, all shortages shall be cancelled at the end of the period for which the appropriate allocation has been made.

49. Arrangements may be made by any two owners whereby the output or export supply or inland supply of coal or any class of coal from the coal mine of one of them may exceed the quota in respect thereof during any period by an amount equal to the amount by which the other owner shall agree, whether for valuable consideration or otherwise, to reduce the corresponding output or supply from his coal mine during the same period below what would otherwise be permissible for such coal mine under the relevant quota. If the owner who has agreed to reduce the output of or supply from his coal mine under such an arrangement exceeds the limit to which it should have been so reduced during the period in question, he shall be deemed for the purposes of Clauses 77 and 78 of the Scheme to have exceeded the permitted output or supply by the excess over such agreed limit.

50. Notice in writing of any arrangement made under the last preceding Clause must be given to the Secretary by the owners concerned within 24 hours of the making of the arrangement."

14. Clause 73 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.

15. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 77 and 78 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"77.—(1) Any owner who, during any period for which a quota is determined, raises or allows to be raised an output of coal or any class of coal or supplies or allows to be supplied a tonnage of coal or any class of coal for export supply or for inland supply in excess of the corresponding quota (after allowing for any shortage carried forward under Clause 48 of the Scheme and any arrangement under Clause 49 of the Scheme whereby a quota may be exceeded) shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty in respect of each ton or part of a ton of such excess of such amount per ton as the Board shall

determine but not exceeding the amount per ton as is prescribed for the time being under rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme for exceeding the corresponding allocation:

Provided that

(i) until the coming into force of such rules the penalty shall not exceed 3s. per ton;

(ii) where in any period for which quotas have been determined a quota for output of coal or any class of coal has been exceeded and any quota for export supply or inland supply of coal or that class of coal has also been exceeded, one penalty only shall be payable in respect of such excesses calculated upon the amount of the excess over the quota for output or the excess over the quota or the sum of any excesses over quotas for supply, whichever shall be the greater.

(2) The Board shall before the coming into force of any rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme notify each owner of the amount per ton which will be payable in consequence thereof for exceeding any quota.

78. Where output of coal or any class of coal or export supply or inland supply of coal or any class of coal for any period is in excess of the relevant quota for the same period, the corresponding quota for the coal mine of the owner concerned may during such succeeding period as the Board may determine be reduced at the discretion of the Board by the amount of the excess or any part thereof but without prejudice to any penalty that may have been incurred by reason of the excess."

16. Clause 79 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.

17. Clause 80 of the Scheme shall have effect as if in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (1) the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard".

18. Clause 85 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "annual output" were inserted after the word "prevailing".

19. Clause 87 of the Scheme shall have effect as if at the end thereof there were added the following words:—

"Provided also that a request for reference of the matter for decision of an arbitrator or arbitrators shall be made by the Complainant within 28 days (unless the arbitrator or arbitrators shall, for good cause shown, extend such period) of the act or omission in respect of which such reference is desired."

THE COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE SOMERSET DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, it is provided that any Scheme may be amended with the

approval of the Board of Trade in manner provided by the Scheme;

And whereas in pursuance of powers conferred upon them by subsection (4) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Board of Trade have made the Somerset District (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1934, which provides that the Somerset District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may be amended so as to provide for certain matters specified in the Schedule to the said Order in substitution for certain matters mentioned in the said Section 3;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 20 of the said Scheme (*inter alia*) that any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme shall be operative from such date as may be prescribed by the Board of Trade;

And whereas in pursuance of the said Clause 20 the amendments of the said Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act hereby approve the amendments of the Somerset District (Coal Mines) Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto and prescribe the 1st day of January, 1935, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force:

Provided that where under the said Scheme as amended the Executive Board are empowered to make any determination or to obtain any information which is necessary or expedient for bringing the said Scheme as amended into operation on the said 1st day of January, and any owner is required to furnish such information to the Executive Board, the provisions of the said Scheme as amended in relation to the matters aforesaid shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1934.

SCHEDULE.

THE SOMERSET DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended as follows:—

1. Clause 2 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) at the end of the definition of "Coal Mine" there were added the words "and includes undertaking";

(ii) the definition of "District Allocation" were deleted; and

(iii) at the end of the Clause there were inserted the following paragraphs, that is to say:—

"Allocation" means any allocation made to the District for any period under the provisions of the Central Scheme;

"Export Supply" means loading at the customary shipping places of the District as cargo into ships for conveyance therein

to destinations outside the United Kingdom, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands, or as fuel for use on ships proceeding to such destinations or as fuel for use on fishing vessels or supplied to works situated at ports to be used for the preparation of patent fuel for export;

"Inland Supply" means supply otherwise than as export supply including supply to other parts of an undertaking of which the coal mine forms part, but excluding supply for use in working the coal mines and supply free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed;

"The customary shipping places of the District" means Bristol, Newport and Cardiff and any other port declared from time to time by the Executive Board to be a customary shipping place.

2. Clause 5 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.

3. Clause 14 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "in respect of output of coal" were inserted after the word "tonnage" and as if the words "or mines" were deleted.

4. Clause 21 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "except for the purposes of Clauses 24 to 32 (inclusive) of the Scheme" were inserted after the word "classification".

5. Clause 23 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or mines" were deleted.

6. Clause 24 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) The word "output" were inserted before "standard" wherever that word occurs therein;

(ii) The words "or undertaking" and "or undertakings" were deleted wherever those words occur therein; and

(iii) The words "determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry, or other category of consumer supplied" were inserted after the words "classes of coal" where those words first occur therein.

7. Clause 25 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard".

8. Clause 26 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs therein; and

(ii) the words "or undertaking" were deleted wherever they occur therein.

9. Clause 27 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted and as if the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard".

10. Clause 28 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs therein.

11. The following Clause shall be inserted after Clause 28 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"28A.—(1) Before the first day of December, 1934, and subsequently in the month of December in each year thereafter the Board shall determine for every coal mine the annual standard tonnage for that coal mine in respect of:—

- (i) coal for export supply, and
- (ii) coal for inland supply.

The Board may, if they think fit, further distribute the annual standard tonnages so determined for any such mine among the various classes of coal determined according to the nature of the coal, or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied, produced therefrom:

Provided that such distribution of the standard tonnages among classes of coal shall have effect for all coal mines producing those classes of coal or any of them.

The first standard tonnages thus determined shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1935, and subsequently such standard tonnages shall come into force on the 1st day of January in each year.

(2) In the determination of standard tonnages in respect of coal or any class of coal for export supply and for inland supply the Board shall have regard to all matters relevant to such determination and to the proportions in which coal supplied from the coal mine has been disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively:—

(i) In the case of the first determination during the 12 months ended 31st December, 1933;

(ii) In the case of subsequent determinations during the 12 months ended on the 31st December last preceding.

(3) For the purpose of assisting the Board in the determination of supply standard tonnages every Owner shall furnish to the Board upon notice given to him by the Board a statement in writing giving any information which the Board may require for that purpose and every Owner may submit to the Board together with a statement so required a claim in writing accompanied by any evidence required to substantiate the same in respect of any matters relative to the determination of standard tonnages for his coal mine for export supply or for inland supply."

12. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 30 and 31 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"30. The Board may at any time review (whether or not at the request of an Owner) any standard tonnage and determine such revised standard tonnage as may seem to the Board fair and proper having regard in the determination of any standard tonnage in respect of output to the special circumstances of the coal mine and in determining any standard tonnage in respect of coal for export supply or inland supply to any matters relevant to such determination and to the proportions in which coal supplied from the coal mine has been disposed of for export supply and inland supply respectively during some recent period.

31. Where, after the commencement of the Scheme an Owner purchases or otherwise acquires any coal mine, the standard tonnages of the coal mine so acquired, added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such Owner, shall constitute the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking, and on any subsequent determination of standard tonnages, such combined undertaking shall be treated in the same way as if the standard tonnages so constituted were the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking under the last previous determination of standard tonnages for the District:

Provided that where an Owner purchases or otherwise acquires part only of an undertaking in respect of which standard tonnages have been determined under the Scheme, the proportion of those standard tonnages to be added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such Owner shall be determined by the Board and that amount shall be deducted from the standard tonnages of the undertaking of which the part has been so acquired."

13. Clause 32 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the word "so" were deleted.

14. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 33, 34, 35, 36 and 37 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

Determination of Quotas.

"33.—(1) The Board shall from time to time determine the proportions (hereinafter in the Scheme referred to as "Quotas") of the standard tonnages of each coal mine that may be produced therefrom or which may be supplied by the Owner thereof as the case may be.

(2) If standard tonnages have been determined in respect of any class of coal the Board may if they think fit determine a separate quota for such class.

(3) All quotas shall be so calculated that during no period in respect of which allocations have been fixed by the Central Council shall any of such allocations be exceeded.

(4) Quotas shall be determined for such period as the Board may decide within the period of the allocations to which such quotas relate and shall be notified by the Board to all the Owners not less than 7 days before the commencement of the period to which they relate.

(5) The quotas and the periods for which they are fixed shall be determined by the Board having regard amongst other matters to the prospective demand for the coal to which those quotas relate.

(6) Any quota determined shall be the same proportion of the corresponding standard tonnage for all coal mines.

(7) The Board may at any time after the determination of quotas increase any quota, so, however, that the tonnage of coal permitted to be raised or supplied as the case may be under any allocation made to the District shall not be exceeded. Any such increase shall be notified to all the Owners affected thereby in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.

34. Every Owner shall forward to the Board within 7 days after the end of each period for which quotas are determined a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe giving in respect of such period full particulars of the output of his coal mine, the tonnage of coal disposed of for export supply and for inland supply, respectively, and the output or supply as the case may be of any class of coal for which a separate quota has been determined. The Board may require such other particulars as in their opinion may be necessary for ascertaining whether any quota for the coal mine has been exceeded.

35. No Owner shall be entitled in the event of the output of or the supply of coal or any class of coal from his coal mine falling short of the tonnage permitted under the relevant quota in the period for which such quota has been determined to carry forward the amount of such shortage or any portion thereof as any addition to the tonnage permitted under any quota during any succeeding period.

36. Arrangements may be made by any two Owners whereby the output or export supply or inland supply of coal or any class of coal from the coal mine of one Owner may exceed the quota in respect thereof in any period where the other Owner has agreed, whether for valuable consideration or not, to limit the corresponding output of or supply from his coal mine to a tonnage which is less than the quota in respect thereof by a tonnage not less than the tonnage by which such first mentioned quota is exceeded. If the output of or supply from any coal mine exceeds any limit so agreed, for the purposes of Clauses 63 and 64 hereof the corresponding quota shall be deemed to be exceeded by the amount of the excess over such limit.

37. Notice in writing of any arrangement made under the last preceding Clause must be given to the Secretary by the parties concerned within 24 hours of the making of any such arrangement."

15. Clause 59 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.

16. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 63 and 64 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

Penalties.

"63.—(1) Any Owner who, during any period for which a quota is determined, raises or allows to be raised an output of coal or any class of coal or supplies or allows to be supplied a tonnage of coal or any class of coal for export supply or for inland supply in excess of the corresponding quota (after allowing for any arrangement under Clause 36 of the Scheme whereby a quota may be exceeded) shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty in respect of each ton or part of a ton of such excess of the same amount per ton as is prescribed for the time being under rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme for exceeding the corresponding allocation:

Provided that

(i) until the coming into force of such rules the penalty shall be 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) per ton;

(ii) where in any period for which quotas have been determined a quota for output of coal or any class of coal has been exceeded and any quota for export supply or inland supply of coal or that class of coal has also been exceeded, one penalty only shall be payable in respect of such excesses calculated upon the amount of the excess over the quota for output or the excess over the quota or the sum of any excesses over quotas for supply, whichever shall be the greater.

(2) The Board shall before the coming into force of any rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme notify each Owner of the amount per ton which will be payable in consequence thereof for exceeding any quota.

64. Where output of coal or any class of coal or inland supply or export supply of coal or any class of coal is in excess of the corresponding quota for any period the corresponding quota for the coal mine of the Owner concerned may during such succeeding period as the Board may determine be reduced at the discretion of the Board by the amount of the excess but without prejudice to any penalty incurred under Clause 63 hereof by reason of the excess."

17. Clause 65 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.

18. Clause 66 of the Scheme shall have effect as if in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (1) thereof the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard".

19. Clause 71 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the word "output" were inserted after the word "annual".

THE COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE CUMBERLAND DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, it is provided that any Scheme may be amended with the approval of the Board of Trade in manner provided by the Scheme;

And whereas in pursuance of powers conferred upon them by subsection (4) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Board of Trade have made the Cumberland District (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1934, which provides that the Cumberland District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may be amended so as to provide for certain matters specified in the Schedule to the said Order in substitution for certain matters mentioned in the said Section 3;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 18 of the said Scheme (*inter alia*) that any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme shall be operative from such date as may be prescribed by the Board of Trade;

And whereas in pursuance of the said Clause 18 the amendments of the said Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted

to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act hereby approve the amendments of the Cumberland District (Coal Mines) Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto and prescribe the 1st day of January, 1935, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force:

Provided that where under the said Scheme as amended the Executive Board are empowered to make any determination or to obtain any information which is necessary or expedient for bringing the said Scheme as amended into operation on the said 1st day of January, and any owner is required to furnish such information to the Executive Board, the provisions of the said Scheme as amended in relation to the matters aforesaid shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1934.

SCHEDULE.

THE CUMBERLAND DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme"), shall be amended as follows:—

1. Clause 2 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) at the end of the definition of "Coal Mine" there were added the words "and includes undertaking";

(ii) the definition "District Allocation" were deleted;

(iii) for the definition of "Undertaking" there were substituted the following definition, that is to say:—

"Undertaking" means any undertaking comprising two or more coal mines belonging to the same owner; and

(iv) there were inserted at the end of the Clause the following paragraphs, that is to say:—

"Allocation" means any allocation made to the District for any period under the provisions of the Central Scheme;

"Export Supply" means loading at the customary shipping places of the District as cargo into ships for conveyance therein to destinations outside the United Kingdom, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands, or as fuel for use on ships proceeding to such destinations, or as fuel for use on fishing vessels or supply to works situated at ports to be used for the preparation of patent fuel for export;

"Inland Supply" means supply otherwise than as export supply, including supply to other parts of an undertaking of which the coal mine forms part, but excluding supply for use in working the

coal mines and supply free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed;

"The customary shipping places of the District" means Silloth, Maryport, Workington, Whitehaven, Barrow-in-Furness and any other port declared from time to time by the Executive Board to be a customary shipping place.

2. Clause 5 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted wherever they occur therein.

3. Clause 10 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the word "five" were substituted for the word "six", and the word "output" were inserted after the word "aggregate".

4. Clause 14 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or mines" were deleted wherever these words occur, and as if in paragraph (5) the word "output" were inserted after the word "annual".

5. Clause 20 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "except for the purposes of Clauses 23 to 30, inclusive, of the Scheme" were inserted after the word "classification" where that word occurs the second time.

6. Clause 22 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or mines" were deleted.

7. Clause 23 of the Scheme shall have effect as if after the word "determining" there were inserted the word "output".

8. Clause 24 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard".

9. Clause 25 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word appears;

(ii) the words "or undertaking" and "or undertakings" were deleted wherever those words occur; and

(iii) the words "determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry, or other category of consumer supplied" were inserted before the word "produced".

10. Clause 26 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs therein; and

(ii) the words "or undertaking" were deleted wherever they occur therein.

11. The following Clauses shall be inserted after Clause 26 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"26A.—(1) Before the first day of December 1934 and subsequently in the month of December in each year thereafter the Board shall determine for every coal mine the annual standard tonnage for that coal mine in respect of:—

- (a) coal for export supply, and
- (b) coal for inland supply.

(2) The Board may, if they think fit, further distribute the standard tonnages so determined for any such mine among the

various classes of coal determined according to the nature of the coal, or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied, produced therefrom:

Provided that such distribution of the standard tonnages among classes of coal shall have effect for all coal mines producing those classes of coal or any of them.

(3) The first standard tonnages thus determined shall come into force on the first day of January, 1935, and subsequently such standard tonnages shall come into force on the first day of January in each year thereafter.

26B. In the determination of standard tonnages in respect of coal or any class of coal for export supply and for inland supply the Board shall have regard to all matters relevant to such determination and, in the case of the first determination, to the proportion which the tonnage of coal or that class of coal supplied from the coal mine for export supply or for inland supply, as the case may be, bore to the total tonnage of coal or that class of coal supplied from all the coal mines in the District for export supply or for inland supply during the year ended 31st December, 1933.

26C. For the purpose of assisting the Board in the determination of supply standard tonnages every owner shall furnish to the Board upon notice given to him by the Board a statement in writing giving any information which the Board may require for that purpose and every owner may submit to the Board together with the statement so required a claim in writing accompanied by any evidence required to substantiate the same in respect of any matters relative to the determination of standard tonnages for his coal mine for export supply or for inland supply."

12. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34 and 35, of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"29. The Board may at any time review whether or not at the request of an owner any standard tonnage and determine such revised standard tonnage as may seem to the Board fair and proper having regard in the determination of any standard tonnage in respect of output to the special circumstances of the coal mine and in determining any standard tonnage in respect of coal for export supply or inland supply to any matters relevant to such determination.

30. Where after the commencement of the Scheme an owner purchases or otherwise acquires any coal mine the standard tonnages of the coal mine so acquired, added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner, shall constitute the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking and on any subsequent determination of standard tonnages such combined undertaking shall be treated in the same way as if the standard tonnages so constituted were the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking under the last previous determination of standard tonnages for the District:

Provided that where an owner purchases or otherwise acquires part only of an undertaking in respect of which standard tonnages

have been determined under the Scheme, the proportion of those standard tonnages to be added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner shall be determined by the Board and that amount shall be deducted from the standard tonnages of the undertaking of which part has been so acquired.

Determination of Quotas.

31.—(1) The Board shall from time to time determine the proportions (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as 'the quotas') of the standard tonnages of each coal mine that may be produced therefrom or which may be supplied by the owner thereof, as the case may be.

(2) If standard tonnages have been determined in respect of any class of coal the Board may, if they think fit, determine a separate quota for such class.

(3) All quotas shall be so calculated that during no period in respect of which allocations have been fixed by the Central Council shall any of such allocations be exceeded.

(4) Quotas shall be determined for such period as the Board may decide within the period of the allocation to which such quotas relate, and shall be notified by the Board to all the owners not less than seven days before the commencement of the period to which they relate.

(5) The quotas and the periods for which they are fixed shall be determined by the Board having regard, among other matters, to the prospective demand for the coal to which those quotas relate.

(6) Any quota determined shall be the same proportion of the corresponding standard tonnage for all coal mines.

(7) The Board may at any time after the determination of quotas increase any quota so, however, that the tonnage of coal permitted to be raised or supplied, as the case may be, under any allocation made to the District shall not be exceeded. Any such increase shall be notified to all the owners affected thereby in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay, and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.

32. Every owner shall forward to the Board within seven days after the end of each period for which quotas are determined a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe, giving in respect of such period full particulars of the output of his coal mine, the tonnage of coal disposed of for export supply and for inland supply, respectively, and the output or supply, as the case may be, of any class of coal for which a separate quota has been determined. The Board may require such other particulars as, in their opinion, may be necessary for ascertaining whether any quota for the coal mine has been exceeded.

33. No owner shall be entitled in the event of the output of or the supply of coal or any class of coal from his coal mine falling short of the tonnage permitted under the relevant quota in the period for which such quota has been determined, to carry forward the amount of such shortage or any portion

thereof as any addition to the tonnage permitted under any quota during any succeeding period:

Provided that if the quotas are fixed for a period of one month only an owner shall be entitled, in the event of the output of or supply of coal from his coal mine in any month falling short of the tonnage permitted under the relevant quota for that month, to carry forward the amount of the shortage (being the difference between the tonnage permitted by such quota allowing for any arrangement under Clause 34 of the Scheme, whereby a quota may be exceeded, and the actual output of or tonnage of coal supplied from the coal mine during the month) as an addition to the tonnage permissible under the corresponding quota during the next succeeding month. No shortages shall be carried forward at the end of the period of the allocation to which such quota relates.

34. Arrangements may be made by any two owners whereby the output or export supply or inland supply of coal or any class of coal from the coal mine of one owner may exceed the quota in respect thereof in any period where the other owner has agreed, whether for valuable consideration or not, to limit the corresponding output of or supply from his coal mine to a tonnage which is less than the quota in respect thereof by a tonnage not less than the tonnage by which such first-mentioned quota is exceeded. If the output of or supply from any coal mine exceeds any limit so agreed, for the purposes of Clauses 62 and 63 of the Scheme the corresponding quota shall be deemed to be exceeded by the amount of the excess over such limit.

35. Notice in writing of any arrangement made under the last preceding Clause must be given to the Secretary by the parties concerned within two days of the making of such arrangement."

13. Clause 56 of the Scheme shall have effect as if in paragraph (a) thereof the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard".

14. Clause 58 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.

15. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 62 and 63 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"62.—(1) Any owner who, during any period for which a quota is determined, raises or allows to be raised an output of coal or any class of coal or supplies or allows to be supplied a tonnage of coal or any class of coal for export supply or for inland supply in excess of the corresponding quota (after allowing for any shortage carried forward under Clause 33 of the Scheme and any arrangement under Clause 34 of the Scheme whereby a quota may be exceeded) shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty in respect of each ton or part of a ton of such excess of the same amount per ton as is prescribed for the time being under rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme for exceeding the corresponding allocation:

Provided that

(i) until the coming into force of such rules the penalty shall be 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) per ton;

(ii) where in any period for which quotas have been determined a quota for output of coal or any class of coal has been exceeded and any quota for export supply or inland supply of coal or that class of coal has also been exceeded, one penalty only shall be payable in respect of such excesses calculated upon the amount of the excess over the quota for output or the excess over the quota or the sum of any excesses over quotas for supply, whichever shall be the greater.

(2) The Board shall before the coming into force of any rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme notify each owner of the amount per ton which will be payable in consequence thereof for exceeding any quota.

63. Where output of coal or any class of coal or inland supply or export supply of coal or any class of coal is in excess of the corresponding quota for any period, the corresponding quota for the coal mine of the owner concerned may during such succeeding period as the Board may determine be reduced, at the discretion of the Board, by the amount of the excess but without prejudice to any penalty that may have been incurred by reason of the excess."

16. Clause 64 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.

17. Clause 65 of the Scheme shall have effect as if in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) thereof the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard".

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A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.

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
