TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 28th September, 1934, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 1st October, 1934, to Saturday, the 6th October, 1934, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even

multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

ALTERATION OF LOCAL BOUNDARIES CONSEQUENT UPON ALTERATION OF WATERCOURSES.

Whereas the Lee Conservancy Catchment Board have carried out alterations in certain portions of the channels of the Old River Stort and Canons Brook (hereinafter referred to as "the watercourses") which form part of the boundary lines between the counties of Essex and Hertford, the rural districts of Epping and Ware and the parishes of Great Parndon, Netteswell, Roydon, Eastwick and Gilston;

And whereas the said Board have, in accordance with the provisions now incorporated in sub-section (1) of Section 145 of the Local Government Act, 1933, notified the Minister of Health of the above-mentioned alterations, and the Minister is satisfied that a new boundary line may conveniently be adopted;

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (1) of Section 145 of the Local Government Act, 1933, hereby declares that the watercourses shown coloured red on the two maps deposited at the Offices of the Ministry of Health, Whitehall, S.W.1 (which maps are sealed with the seal of the Minister and respectively marked "Map No. 1" and "Map No. 2" and each of which maps is also marked "Map referred to in the Notice published in September, 1934 in the 'London Gazette' under sub-section (1) of Section 145 of the Local Government Act, 1933, relating to the alteration of watercourses in the counties of Essex and Hertford") shall, as from the date of this Notice, be substituted for the watercourses respectively shown coloured blue on the said maps as part of the boundary lines between the said counties, districts and parishes.

And notice is hereby given that, consequent upon the foregoing Declaration whereby the limits of areas of local government of which the watercourses respectively shown coloured blue on the deposited maps formed part of the boundaries are deemed to have been varied in accordance with the Declaration, the areas respectively described in columns 1 and 2 of the following table are, by virtue of the operation of sub-section (1) of Section 145 of the Local Government Act, 1933, now situate in the counties, rural districts and parishes respectively named in columns 5, 6 and 7 of that table opposite the description of the areas-

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1934 (No. 10).
