## SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

*Ross and Cromarty*.—An Area comprising:—

The Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

*Inverness*.—An Area comprising:—

The Islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray; and except the parish of North Uist and all the islands therein, together with the island of Berneray in the parish of Harris and all the grazing islands attached thereto*), in the county of Inverness.

The movement of sheep out of the following areas is regulated by the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934, as amended by the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934 (No. 3). Areas Nos. 1, 2 and 4 are also "Double Dipping Areas" for the purposes of Part III of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

*Area No. 1.*

So much of the counties of Westmorland and Lancashire and of the West Riding of Yorkshire as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point where the London, Midland and Scottish Railway Line from Kirkby Stephen to Hawes Junction passes over the main Garsdale Road north-east of Garsdale Head, thence in a generally southerly direction along the said railway via Hawes Junction, Dent Station, Ribbleshead Station, Horton Station, Stainforth and Settle to the point where it joins the Branch line from Clapham Station; thence in a north-westerly direction along the latter railway via Giggleswick Station to Clapham Station; thence in a westerly direction along the railway via High Bentham Station to the point near Lower Bentham where the railway is carried over the road from Oxenforth Green to Lower Bentham; thence in a northerly direction along the road via Lower Bentham, Wards End, Four Lane Ends, Sunderland House, Burton-in-Lonsdale and Anems to the point where the road crosses the Ingleton Branch of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway; thence continuing in a northerly direction along the railway via Kirkby Lonsdale Station, Barbon and Middleton Station to Sedbergh Station; thence in a generally easterly direction along the road via Sedbergh to the point where the road forks at Thorns Hall; thence along the road crossing the River Rawthey to Hall Bank; thence following the River Clough through Garsdale and Garsdale Head to the point of commencement.

*Area No. 2.*

So much of the county of Westmorland and of the North and West Ridings of Yorkshire and of the borough of Richmond as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point where the London and North Eastern Railway from Barnard Castle to Lartington crosses the River Tees; thence in a general west-south-westerly direction along the railway via Lartington, Bowes and Barras Station to the Kirkby Stephen Station of the London and North Eastern Railway; thence in a south-westerly direction along

the road to the Kirkby Stephen Station of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway; thence in a southerly direction along the London, Midland and Scottish Railway to its junction with the London and North Eastern Railway at Hawes Junction; thence in an easterly direction along the London and North Eastern Railway via Hawes, Askrigg, Redmire and Leyburn to the point where the road from Fingall to Hunton is crossed by the railway; thence in a northerly direction along the road via Hunton, Craggs Lane Farm, Scotton, Scotton Hall, Wood House, Richmond, Gilling Grange, Gilling and Moor End Plantation to the point where the road meets the Watling Street; thence in a north-westerly direction along the Watling Street via Ravensworth Lodge and Newsham Grange to Rokeby Park; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary of Rokeby Park to the River Tees and thence in a north-westerly direction along the River Tees to the point of commencement.

*Area No. 3.*

So much of the counties of Derby and the West Riding of Yorkshire and of the city and county borough of Sheffield and of the boroughs of Chesterfield and Glossop as lies within the following boundary, namely:—
