Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the Benefice of York, Saint Martin, Micklegate, with Saint Gregory, in the said Diocese of York.

"6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the united Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of York, Saint John, Micklegate, having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of York, Holy Trinity, Micklegate, having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"7. That upon the union taking effect a portion of the endowment or property of the said Benefice of York, Saint John, Micklegate, shall be severed or diverted from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say, a sum of £1,366 13s. 4d. Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock (being part of a larger sum of such Stock at present held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of York, Saint John, Micklegate) shall be transferred and annexed to the Benefice of York, Saint Mary Bishophill Junior, in the said Diocese of York.

"8. That (a) if within a period of three years immediately following the day of the date upon which the said union shall take effect the Archbishop of York shall certify in writing to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that arrangements have been made which will render practicable the appropriation of the Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, for one or more of the purposes contemplated by Section 24 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, then the said Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, together with the site thereof and any other ground belonging thereto (not being a graveyard or burial ground) shall be appropriated accordingly, subject to such conditions, regulations and provisions as the Archbishop of York shall by Deed made pursuant to the said 24th Section, declare and appoint, but (b) if no such certificate shall be given by the Archbishop of York within the aforesaid period of three years then so soon as conveniently may be thereafter the Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and in that case the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of York under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be held and accumulated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as a fund for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection of a new Church for a District to be selected by the Archbishop of York as the District for which such Church shall be built; and any ultimate residue after the provision of a site for and the erection of such Church shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of York.

"9. That upon any provision for the appropriation or sale as aforesaid of the said Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, becoming effective (a) the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Archbishop of York may direct be transferred to the Church of Holy Trinity, Micklegate, York, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of York and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, or such of them as the Archbishop of York shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Archbishop of York for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of York which the Archbishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, as aforesaid, and (b) the register books of baptisms, marriages, and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, shall be transferred to the Church of the United Benefice.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the appropriation or sale and disposal of the Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the appropriation or sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the appropriation or sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time
