PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Children and Young Persons Act, 1933, it is, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, specify as respects the metropolitan police court area the places (which, notwithstanding anything in the Metropolitan Police Courts Acts, 1839 and 1840 (2-3 V. c. 71 and 3-4 V. c. 84), may be places other than police courts) in which juvenile courts are to sit, and assign as a division to each such place such portion of that area as may be specified in the Order: and direct the manner in which for the purposes of the constitution of a juvenile court in that area two justices of the peace for the County of London shall be selected from the panel of such justices nominated from time to time by the Secretary of State:

And whereas such an Order in Council may contain such supplemental, incidental and consequential provisions as appear to His Majesty in Council to be necessary for the purposes of the Order and such Orders in Council may by section 105 of the said Act be revoked or varied by a subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas Orders in Council were made on the twenty-fourth day of July, 1933 (S.R. and O., 1933, No. 764), and the twenty-sixth day of February, 1934 (S.R. & O., 1934, No. 202): Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accertingly, that—

- (1) juvenile courts for the metropolitan police court area shall sit in the places mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order; and the division assigned to each such place shall be that portion of that area which is specified in the second column of the Schedule.
- (2) the juvenile courts shall be held on the days and at the hours specified in the third column of the Schedule or on such other days and at such other hours as may from time to time be approved by a Secretary of State: provided
 - (i) that a juvenile court which would in pursuance of the foregoing provision be held on a day when the metropolitan police courts are closed may be held on the preceding day;
 - (ii) that any of the juvenile courts may hold additional sittings at any time as may be necessary for the purposes of the courts; and
 - (iii) that a juvenile court may sit at any time in case of emergency in a magistrate's room at Bow Street Police Court for the purpose of hearing cases arising in any part of the metropolitan police court area;
- (3) the justices who are to sit at the several sittings of the juvenile courts shall be chosen by the panel and by such metropolitan police magistrates as are nominated

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by the Secretary of State to act as chairmen of juvenile courts within the metropolitan police court area.

(4) The said Orders in Council made on the twenty-fourth day of July, 1933, and on

the twenty-sixth day of February, 1934, are hereby revoked.

(5) This Order shall come into force on the 5th November, 1934.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 & 34 Vict. c. 52) to 1932 (22 & 23 Geo. V. c. 39), it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any sub-sequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof

subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas under the provisions of Article 19 of the Treaty signed on the 11th day of January, 1932, between His Majesty and the President of the Republic of Poland for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the Poland (Extradition) Order in Council, 1934, His Majesty has acceded to the said Treaty in respect of India:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 22nd day of October, 1934, the said Acts shall apply in respect of India in the case of Poland under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 11th January, 1932.

This Order may be cited as the "Poland

(Extradition: India) Order in Council, 1934".

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of July, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, a part of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, and a part of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows; (2) of the remaining part of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, and the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin; and (3) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, and further for effecting certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said Benefices of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George; Exeter, Saint Mary Major; Exeter, Saint Mary Arches; Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows; Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin, and the Parish of the Benefice of Exeter, All Hallows on the Wall, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the rearrangement of the said Benefices of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock; Exeter, Saint Mary Major; Exeter, Saint John with Saint George; Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin; and Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, duly made their Reports to the said Bishop of Exeter and the said Bishop of the said Reports:

"And whereas, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners have prepared this Scheme for effecting the unions and alterations of boundaries recommended in the said Reports in accordance with the terms of such Reports but with the assent of the said Bishop of Exeter embodying certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Exeter, St. Mary Arches, is at present vacant but all of the other said Benefices are at present full, the Reverend Charles William Bate being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, the Reverend Henry Frank Nesbitt being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Paucras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, the Reverend Prebendary Edgar Hay Hay being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin, the Reverend John Alfred Goundry being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, and the Reverend Harry Ward being

the present Incumbent under the authority of a dispensation for plurality of the said Benefices of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, and Exeter, All Hallows on the Wall:

"And whereas the whole patronage of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, and the alternate patronage of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, are now vested in one and the same person:

"And whereas the whole patronage of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, the whole patronage of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, the whole patronage of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Paneras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, and the alternate patronage of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, are now vested in one and the same body of patrons:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Edgar Hay Hay, John Alfred Goundry and Harry Ward (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), and with the consent also of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter at Exeter, as Patrons of the said Benefice of Exeter, All Hallows on the Wall (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That (a) the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, (b) a part of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, namely, all that part of such Benefice which lies to the north-west of the middle of Fore Street and the middle of High Street and (c) a part of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, namely, all that part of such Benefice which lies to the south-west of an imaginary line running north-westward from the middle of High Street along the middle of Goldsmith Street to its junction with Paul Street and extending thence north-westward in precisely the same direction to the northern boundary of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches with Saint Kerrian and Saint Pancras'.

"2. That the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin, and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with All Hallows (Goldsmith Street) Saint Martin Saint Paul and Saint Stephen'.

"3. That the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish

for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major with Saint George Saint John and Saint Petrock'.

"4. That the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme shall take effect upon the next vacation of that one of the said two Benefices of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, and Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, which shall the later be vacated after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, and that pending such union taking effect (a) if the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, shall be vacant at the said date or shall be vacated after that date but before the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, shall have fallen vacant then upon the said date or upon such vacation of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, as the case may be, the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, and the part of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme, shall be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches with Saint Pancras', and (b) if the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, shall be vacant at the said date or shall be vacated after that date but before the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows shall have fallen vacant, then upon the said date or as the case may be upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, and the part of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme shall be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches with Saint Kerrian'.

"5. That if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows shall be vacant the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme shall forthwith take effect but if upon that day the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows shall be full then the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows.

"6. That the union referred to in Clause 3 of this Scheme shall take effect upon the next vacation of that one of the said two Benefices of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, and Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, which shall the later be vacated after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, and that pending such union taking effect (a) if the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, shall be vacant at the said date or shall be vacated after that

date but before the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock shall have fallen vacant then upon such date or as the case may be upon such vacation of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, and the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, shall be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major with Saint George and Saint John', and (b) if the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, shall be vacant at the said date or shall be vacated after that date but before the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George shall have fallen vacant, then upon such date or as the case may be upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, and the part of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, referred to in Clause 3 of this Scheme shall be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major with Saint Petrock '.

"7. That if within the period of twelve calendar months immediately following the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Charles William Bate shall with the consent of the Bishop of Exeter retire from the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, in order to accelerate the union of part of such Benefice with the said Benefice of Exeter Saint Mary Arches, as hereinbefore provided or the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme, then he shall be entitled to receive out of the annual income of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches with Saint Kerrian, or of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches with Saint Kerrian and Saint Pancras, as the case may be and by way of compensation an annual sum equal to the difference between the sum of £250 and the amount of the pension to which he would thereupon become entitled under the ordinary law relating to clerical pensions such annual sum to be in addition to any charge on the revenues of the United Benefice included in such pension and to be payable to the said Charles William Bate during the remainder of his life subject, however, to the same conditions as to payment, suspension, reduction and forfeiture, as a pension assigned to a retiring Incumbent under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts, 1871 and 1887, as amended by the Clergy Pensions (Older Incumbents) Measure, 1930, and the provisions of such Acts and Measure as to recovery in case of non-payment and as to such conditions as aforesaid shall apply to the said annual sum and to the said Charles William Bate as if the said annual sum were a pension awarded under the said Acts and Measure and the said Charles William Bate had resigned the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, under such Acts and Measure.

"8. That if at the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the

said Henry Frank Nesbitt shall still be the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows. and within the period of twelve calendar months immediately following that date he shall with the consent of the Bishop of Exeter retire from such Benefice in order to accelerate the union of part of such Benefice with the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin, as hereinbefore provided then he shall be entitled to receive out of the annual income of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with All Hallows (Goldsmith Street) Saint Martin Saint Paul and Saint Stephen, and by way of compensation an annual sum equal to the difference between the sum of £250 and the amount of the pension to which he would thereupon become entitled under the ordinary law relating to clerical pensions such annual sum to be in addition to any charge on the revenues of the United Benefice included in such pension and to be payable to the said Henry Frank Nesbitt during the remainder of his life, subject, however, to the same conditions as to payment, suspension, reduction and forfeiture, as a pension assigned to a retiring Incumbent under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts, 1871 and 1887, as amended by the Clergy Pensions (Older Incumbents) Measure, 1930, and the provisions of such Acts and Measure as to recovery in case of nonpayment and as to such conditions as aforesaid shall apply to the said annual sum and to the said Henry Frank Nesbitt as if the said annual sum were a pension awarded under the said Acts and Measure and the said Henry Frank Nesbitt had resigned the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows under such Acts and Measure.

"9. That if at the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, the said Harry Ward shall still be the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, and Exeter, All Hallows on the Wall, and within the period of twelve calendar months immediately following that date he shall with the consent of the Bishop of Exeter retire from the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, in order to accelerate the union of such Benefice with the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major and with part of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, as contemplated by Clause 3 of this Scheme, or with the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major only as contemplated by Clause 6 (a) of this Scheme, but shall continue to hold the said Benefice of Exeter, All Hallows on the Wall, he shall by way of compensation be entitled, so long as he continues to hold the said Benefice of Exeter, All Hallows on the Wall, to receive out of the annual income of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major Saint George Saint John and Saint Petrock or as the case may be out of the annual income of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, Saint George and Saint John, an annual sum of £223 15s., which annual sum shall accrue from day to day and be payable (subject to any necessary apportionments) by equal quarterly instalments on the 31st day of March, the 30th day of June, the 30th day of September and the 31st day of December in each year, and for the recovery of the said annual sum of £223 15s., the said Harry Ward shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply.

"10. Upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme (a) all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, which lies to the north-west of the middle of Fore Street shall be transferred and annexed and for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Exeter, All Hallows on the Wall; and (b) all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, which lies to the southeast of the middle of Fore Street shall forthwith be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, or to the Parish of any United Benefice of which the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, shall under the provisions of this Scheme then form part; (c) if upon the day aforesaid the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, shall be vacant then all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin, which lies to the north-west of the middle of High Street and to the south-east of Waterbeer Street shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the United Benefice of which the Parish of Exeter, Saint Pancras, shall under the provisions of this Scheme then form part, but if upon that day the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, shall not be vacant, then such transfer and annexation shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras

with Saint Paul and All Hallows. "11. That upon the taking effect as hereinbefore recommended and proposed of any union (a) including the said Benefice and Parish of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, the Church of Saint Mary Arches shall become and be the Parish Church of the United Benefice and Parish and the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish; (b) including the said Benefice and Parish of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin, the Church of Saint Lawrence shall become and be the Parish Church of the United Benefice and Parish and the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish and (c) including the said Benefice and Parish of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, the Church of Saint Mary Major shall become and be the Parish Church of the United Benefice and Parish and the Table of Fees for the Parish of Exeter, Saint Mary Major shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"12. That upon any of the unions hereinbefore provided for taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at any Parish Church other than the Parish Church which will thereupon in accordance with Clause 11 of this Scheme become the Parish Church of the United Benefice and Parish shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially and in the case of any union including the said Benefice and Parish of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin, upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Paul and the register books of marriages (after they have been officially closed as hereinbefore provided) shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice and Parish.

"13. That upon the taking effect as hereinbefore recommended and proposed of any union (a) including the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin, the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice; (b) including the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice; and (c) including the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, and a part of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, the Parsonage House Fund at present held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, shall be held by us for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"14. That (a) the endowments of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches with Saint Pancras (if such United Benefice shall come into being pursuant to the provisions of Clause 4 (a) of this Scheme) shall consist of the whole of the present endowments of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, (b) the endowments of the United Benefice of Saint Mary Arches with Kerrian, or of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches with Saint Kerrian and Saint Pancras, as the case may be shall consist of the whole of the present endowments of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock, and a part of the present endowments of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, that is to say, all the endowments of the last named Benefice except a capital sum of £1,800 being part of a larger capital sum held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of such Benefice and the said capital sum of £1,800 shall, subject as hereinafter mentioned, be excluded from the union and shall be appropriated by the said Governors for the benefit of the Incumbent either of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major and Saint Petrock, or as the case may be of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, Saint George Saint John and Saint Petrock, provided that for the period, if any, during which the revenues of either of the United Benefices first referred to in this part of this Clause may be charged with the payment to the said Charles

William Bate of any pension and an annual sum by way of compensation as provided in Clause 7 of this Scheme, if the total annual charge amounts to or exceeds £54 no part of the endowments of the United Benefice shall be excluded from the union, and if the total annual charge be less than £54 the part of the endowments of the United Benefice be excluded from the union and appropriated as aforesaid shall be reduced to a capital sum the income from which calculated at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum shall be equal to the difference between the total annual charge and the sum of £54, (c) the endowments of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with All Hallows (Goldsmith Street) Saint Martin Saint Paul and Saint Stephen, shall consist of the whole of the present endowments of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin and a part of the present endowments of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Pancras with Saint Paul and All Hallows, that is to say, all the endowments of the last named Benefice except a capital sum of £2,678 6s. 8d., being part of a larger capital sum held by the said Governors on behalf of such Benefice and the said capital sum of £2,678 6s. 8d., shall be excluded from the union and shall be held and the income in respect thereof accumulated by the said Governors for and towards the endowment of the proposed new District mentioned in Clause 16 (b) of this Scheme provided that for the period, if any, during which the revenues of either of the United Benefices referrred to in this part of this Clause may be charged with the payment to the said Henry Frank Nesbitt of any pension and an annual sum by way of compensation as provided in Clause 8 of this Scheme if the total annual charge amounts to or exceeds £80 7s. 0d., no part of the endow-ments of the United Benefice shall be excluded from the union, and if the total annual charge be less than £80 7s. 0d., the part of the endowments of the United Benefice to be excluded from the union and held as aforesaid shall be reduced to a capital sum the income from which calculated at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum shall be equal to the difference between the total annual charge and the sum of £80 7s. 0d., (d) the endowments of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, Saint George, Saint John and Saint Petrock shall consist of the whole of the present endowments of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, together with the capital sum of £1,800 referred to in part (b) of this Clause and a part of the present endowments of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, that is to say, all the endowments of the last named Benefice excepting a capital sum of £1,600 bearing interest at £5 per cent. per annum held by the said Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of such Benefice and excepting also the Parsonage House Fund at present held by the said Governors for the benefit of the same Benefice and the said capital sum of £1,600 and the said Parsonage House Fund shall be excluded from the union and shall be held and the income in respect thereof accumulated by the said Governors for and towards the endowment of the proposed new District mentioned in Clause 16 (b) of this Scheme, and pending the taking effect of the. union referred to in Clause 3 of this Scheme, (A) the endowments of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major and Saint Petrock (if such United Benefice shall come into being pursuant to the provisions of Clause 6 of this Scheme) shall consist of the whole of the present endowments of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, together with the capital sum of £1,800 referred to in part (b) of this Clause, or (B) the endowments of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, Saint George and Saint John, (if such United Benefice shall come into being pursuant to the provisions of Clause 6 of this Scheme) shall consist of the whole of the present endowments of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, and a part of the present endowments of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, that is to say, all the endowments of the last named Benefice excepting a capital sum of £540, being part of the capital sum of £1,600 held by the said Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, as aforesaid, and excepting also the said Parsonage House Fund at present held by the said Governors for the benefit of the same Benefice as aforesaid and the said capital sum of £540 and the said Parsonage House Fund shall be excluded from the union and shall be held and the income in respect thereof accumulated by the said Governors for and towards the endowment of the proposed new District mentioned in Clause 16 (b) of this Scheme:

"Provided always that if and so long as any compensation is payable to the said Harry Ward in accordance with the provisions of Clause 9 of this Scheme no part of the endowments (including the said Parsonage House Fund) of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George shall be excepted or excluded from the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, Saint George, Saint John, and Saint Petrock, or from the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, Saint George and Saint John.

"15. (a) That the patronage of any United Benefice constituted pursuant to this Scheme which shall include the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Arches, (b) that the patronage of the United Benefice referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin; (c) that the patronage of any United Benefice constituted pursuant to this Scheme which shall include the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major; and (d) the patronage of the proposed new District mentioned in Clause 16 (b) of this Scheme shall also belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major.

"16. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme has taken effect as aforesaid the Church of Saint Paul shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical

Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, (b) that the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Exeter under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as follows, that is to say, (1) in payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations and (2) for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection of a Church for a proposed new District to be constituted in or near the City of Exeter and any ultimate residue after the provision of a site for and the erection of such Church shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Exeter; (c) that the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Paul shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Lawrence being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Exeter and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Paul or such of them as the Bishop of Exeter shall select, shall be removed to the said Church of Saint Lawrence and any articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Exeter for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be transferred to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Exeter which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Paul aforesaid; (d) that in the event of the services of the organist or any of the Church Servants of the said Church of Saint Paul being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect, such organist or Church Servants shall, out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this Clause, receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of office, and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Exeter equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us, if we shall see fit so to do, in all or any of these cases, to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

"17. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after any union including the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, has taken effect the Church of Saint John shall be taken down in whole or in part and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such

manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923; (b) that the net proceeds (if any) to arise from such sale or sales shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Exeter; (c) that the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint John shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Mary Major being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Exeter and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint John or such of them as the Bishop of Exeter shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Exeter for use in any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Exeter which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint John as aforesaid.

"18. That upon the taking effect as hereinbefore recommended and proposed of any union including the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, the Church of Saint Mary Magdalene shall be appropriated as a Parish Hall to be used for such educational, charitable or other purposes in connection with the Church of England having in view the intellectual, moral or social welfare of the parishioners of the United Benefice and others and subject to such conditions, regulations and provisions as the Bishop of Exeter shall by Deed made pursuant to the 24th Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, declare and appoint.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale the said and disposal of Churches of Paul and Saint John to said appropriation of the Church of Saint Mary Magdalene, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale or appropriation under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site and materials of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Churches of Saint Paul and Saint John and of the sites thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto and to the appropriation hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council;

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Lord Bishop of London, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"There is in the County of Middlesex and my Diocese of London the Vicarage or Benefice of St. James Alperton the Parish whereof contains a population of seven thousand nine hundred and twelve or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for five hundred and sixty persons.

- "The net annual value of the said Benefice of St. James Alperton is four hundred and twenty pounds or thereabouts.
- "There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Perivale the Parish whereof contains a population of two hundred and eighty six or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for one hundred and ten persons.
- "The net annual value of the said Benefice of Perivale is two hundred and eighty pounds or thereabouts.
- "There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of St. Barnabas Ealing the Parish whereof contains a population of four thousand six hundred and forty-three or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for four hundred and fifty persons.
- "The net annual value of the said Benefice of St. Barnabas Ealing is five hundred and ninety nine pounds or thereabouts.
- "There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of St. Peter Ealing the Parish whereof contains a population of four thousand one hundred and ninety nine or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for nine hundred and forty persons.
- "The net annual value of the said Benefice of St. Peter Ealing is six hundred and sixteen pounds or thereabouts.
- "There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of West Twyford the Parish whereof contains a population of one hundred and eighty eight or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for fifty persons.
- "The net annual value of the said Benefice of West Twyford is two hundred and twenty nine pounds or thereabouts.
- "There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of St. Michael & All Angels Stonebridge the Parish whereof contains a population of sixteen thousand five hundred and forty six or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for five hundred and thirty persons.
- "The net annual value of the said Benefice of St. Michael & All Angels Stonebridge is four hundred and twenty two pounds or thereabouts.
- "There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Christ Church Ealing the Parish whereof contains a population of three thousand six hundred and fifty eight or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for five hundred persons.
- "The net annual value of the said Benefice of Christ Church Ealing is five hundred and seventy nine pounds or thereabouts.
- "There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Hanwell the Parish whereof contains a population of thirteen thousand one hundred and eighty eight or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for five hundred persons.

- "The net annual value of the said Benefice of Hanwell is six hundred and ninety six pounds or thereabouts.
- "That it appears to me and I do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838:—
 - (1) Three portions of the Parish of St. James Alperton (the boundaries of which portions are delineated on the map attached to the annexed Scheme and thereon respectively verged red, dark blue and light brown may advantageously be separated from the Parish of St. James Alperton and the portion verged red annexed to the Parish of Perivale to which it is contiguous the portion verged dark blue annexed to the Parish of St. Barnabas Ealing to which it is contiguous and the portion verged light brown annexed to the Parish of West Twyford.
 - (2) A portion of the Parish of St. Barnabas Ealing (the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the said map and thereon verged green) may advantageously be separated from the Parish of St. Barnabas Ealing and annexed to the Parish of Perivale.
 - (3) Three portions of the Parish of St. Peter Ealing (the boundaries of which portions are delineated on the said map and thereon respectively verged purple, orange and violet) may advantageously be separated from the Parish of St. Peter Ealing and the portion verged purple annexed to the Parish of Perivale the portion verged orange annexed to the Parish of St. Barnabas Ealing to which it is contiguous and the portion verged violet annexed to the Parish of West Twyford.
 - (4) A portion of the Parish of St. Michael & All Angels Stonebridge (the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the said map and thereon verged dark brown) may advantageously be separated from the Parish of St. Michael & All Angels Stonebridge and annexed to the Parish of West Twyford to which it is contiguous.
 - (5) A portion of the Parish of West Twyford (the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the said map and thereon verged light blue) may advantageously be separated from the Parish of West Twyford and annexed to the Parish of Christ Church Ealing to which it is contiguous.
 - (6) A portion of the Parish of Christ Church Ealing (the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the said map and thereon coloured black) may advantageously be separated from the Parish of Christ Church Ealing and annexed to the Parish of West Twyford.
 - (7) A detached portion of the Parish of Hanwell (the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the said map and thereon partly verged yellow and partly hatched yellow) may advantageously be separated from the Parish of Hanwell and the portion verged yellow annexed to the Parish of West Twyford to which it is

contiguous and the portion hatched yellow annexed to the Parish of Christ Church Ealing to which it is contiguous.

"The Church Pastoral-Aid Society Board of Patronage Trust are the Patrons of the Benefice of St. James Alperton and the Reverend Thomas William Castle is the present Incumbent thereof.

"The Society for the Maintenance of the Faith are the Patrons of the Benefice of Perivale and the Reverend Arthur Henry Monger Hope is the present Incumbent thereof.

"I Arthur Foley Bishop of London am the Patron of the Benefices of St. Barnabas Ealing, St. Peter Ealing, St. Michael & All Angels Stonebridge, Christ Church Ealing, and Hanwell and the Reverend Harold Salter Barrett, The Reverend Joseph Bertram Kite, the Reverend Harold de Grant Rayner, The Reverend Hugh Lankester Haynes, and the Reverend William Muir Farquhar are the respective Incumbents thereof.

"The University of Oxford are the Patrons of the Benefice of West Twyford and the Reverend John Ellis Cardigan Williams is the present Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act 1838 I the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may best be affected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the Patrons of the said Benefices of St. James Alperton, Perivale, St. Barnabas Ealing, St. Peter Ealing, St. Michael & All Angels Stonebridge, Christ Church Ealing, Hanwell, and West Twyford and also the like Consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council.

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the Parish of St. James Alperton those three portions of the Parish of St. James Alperton which are delineated on the map hereto annexed and thereon respectively verged red, dark blue and light brown and annex that portion verged red to the Parish of Perivale to which it is contiguous that portion verged dark blue to the Parish of St. Barnabas Ealing to which it is contiguous and that portion verged light brown to the Parish of West Twyford.

"It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of St. Barnabas Ealing and annex to the Parish of Perivale all that portion of the Parish of St. Barnabas Ealing which is delineated on the map hereto annexed and thereon verged green.

"It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of St. Peter Ealing those three portions of the Parish of St. Peter Ealing which are delineated on the map hereto annexed and thereon respectively verged purple, orange and violet and annex that portion verged purple to the Parish of Perivale, that portion verged orange to the Parish of St. Barnabas Ealing to which it is contiguous and that portion verged violet to the Parish of West Twyford.

"It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of St. Michael and All Angels Stone-bridge and annex to the Parish of West Twyford all that portion of the Parish of St. Michael and All Angels Stonebridge which is delineated on the map hereto annexed and thereon verged dark brown.

"It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of West Twyford and annex to the Parish of Christ Church Ealing all that portion of the Parish of West Twyford which is delineated on the map hereto annexed and thereon coloured light blue.

"It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of Christ Church Ealing and annex to the Parish of West Twyford all that portion of the Parish of Christ Church Ealing which is delineated on the map hereto annexed and thereon coloured black.

"It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of Hanwell all that detached portion of the Parish of Hanwell which is delineated on the map hereto annexed and partly verged yellow and partly hatched yellow and annex that portion verged yellow to the Parish of West Twyford to which it is contiguous and that portion hatched yellow to the Parish of Christ Church Ealing to which it is contiguous.

"That the Incumbents of Perivale, St. Barnabas Ealing, West Twyford, and Christ Church Ealing shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within those portions of the Parishes so to be separated from the Parishes of St. James Alperton, St. Barnabas Ealing, St. Peter Ealing, St. Michael and All Angels Stonebridge, West Twyford, Hanwell, and Christ Church Ealing respectively and annexed to their respective Parishes.

"That the inhabitants of such portions so to be separated shall be entitled to accomodation in the respective Parish Churches of the Parishes to which the portions are to be so annexed but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Churches of the Parishes from which the several portions are respectively separated except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in any or either of the said Parish Churches and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portions so to be separated shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the respective Parish Churches of the Parishes to which the portions are to be so annexed as they might have had in the Parish Churches of the Parishes from which such por-

tions were separated.

"That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments (but excluding tithes if any) arising from the said portions so to be separated shall henceforth belong to the respective Incumbents of the Benefices to which such portions are respectively annexed.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or any of

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or any of

" Consents.

In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of Otford the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Shoreham and contains according to the census of 1931 a population of one thousand two hundred and ninety-three and the net annual value thereof is four hundred and thirty-six pounds.
- "8. The western portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Kingsdown lies at a distance from the Parish Church of Kingsdown and adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Mary Woodlands.
- "9. The southernmost portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Farningham lies at a distance from the Parish Church of Farningham and adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Kingsdown.
- "10. The southernmost portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Ash lies at a distance from the Parish Church of Ash and adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Kingsdown.
- "11. The detached portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Kemsing lies at a distance from the Parish Church of Kemsing and adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Ash being bounded on three sides thereof by the last named Parish.

- "12. The southernmost portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Shoreham known as Twitton also lies at a distance from the Parish Church of Shoreham and adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Otford.
- "13. It appears to me that the following alterations in the boundaries of the said respective Ecclesiastical Parishes may be made with advantage to the interests of religion viz.:—

- "15. The Reverend Robert Reginald Milner is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of St. Mary Woodlands and I, the said Bishop of Rochester, in right of my said Bishopric am the Patron thereof.
- "16. The Reverend Frederick Wiltshire is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Farningham and the Dean and Chapter of our Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary of Rochester are the Patrons thereof.
- "17. The Reverend Harold Barclay Hennell is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ash and William Gore Lambarde of Bradbourne Hall Sevenoaks in the said County of Kent a Major in His Majesty's Army is the Patron thereof.
- "18. The Reverend Harold James Graham is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kemsing and the Rochester Diocesan Board of Patronage are the Patrons thereof.
- "19. The Reverend Augustus Payne is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shoreham and the Very Reverend William Foxley Norris Doctor in Divinity Dean of the Collegiate Church of St. Peter Westminster and the Chapter of the same Church are the Patrons thereof.
- "20. The Reverend Albert Ewart Elder is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Otford and the Very Reverend William Foxley Norris Doctor in Divinity Dean of the Collegiate Church of St. Peter Westminster and the Chapter of the same Church are the Patrons thereof.
- "21. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Act I, the said Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation

describing the said Districts of the said Ecclesiastical Parishes of Kingsdown, Farningham, Ash, Kemsing and Shoreham so proposed to be annexed to the said respective Ecclesiastical Parishes of St. Mary Woodlands Kingsdown Ash and Otford and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction Glebe lands tithes dues rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested."

"Such district shall consist of the detached portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Kemsing known as Godsheath which is bounded on the east or south-east by the Ecclesiastical Parish of Stansted and on all other sides by the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Ash.

"Such district is coloured blue on the plan No. 1 hereto annexed and thereon indicated by the letter 'D'.

"5. It is also proposed to separate the following district from the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Shoreham in the same County and Diocese and unite the same for Ecclesiastical purposes

to the adjoining Parish of Otford.

"There is in the County of Devon and Diocese of Exeter the Benefice or Vicarage of Ivybridge the Parish whereof contains a population of 1,649 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 500 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Ivybridge is three hundred and fifty-six pounds or thereabouts.
