The following Address was presented to The KING on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the new Cambridge University Library on the 22nd October, 1934.

CHANCELLOR OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

To The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty:
May it please Your Majesty:

We, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, humbly offer to Your Majesty and to Her Majesty The Queen our dutiful and heartfelt welcome.

We recognise in Your Presence to-day a high mark of Your favour towards this University and a proof of Your gracious interest in the furtherance of education and learning.

The inauguration of the new Library is an event of immeasurable importance in our academic history and it will be rendered ever memorable by Your Majesties' Presence in our midst as evidence of Your gracious participation in our hopes and endeavours.

For nearly fifteen years we have been working for the attainment of this project which sees its fulfilment to-day. In the early years after the war, when the limit of congestion in the old buildings had been reached, we took the decision to abandon the site which had been the home of the Library since its beginnings and to build a new Library elsewhere; but for several years more there seemed little hope that this ambitious scheme could be realized. However, a site was acquired, for

which the University is indebted to the generosity of King's and Clare Colleges in sacrificing land which had formerly been their playing fields, and sketch-plans were prepared by the architect, Sir Giles Scott, for a new Library to be built and equipped at a cost of half a million pounds. In 1928 the University was able to see its way to provide half of this large sum and, placing its faith in the future, decided that the work should be begun. Then came the munificent benefaction which bettered our utmost hopes and made the completion of the entire work possible. The International Education Board, founded by Mr. John D. Rockefeller, Junior, offered to defray the remaining £250,000 as part of an even larger offer for the provision of various University buildings and endowments, provided the University itself raised by the end of 1931 the further sum of £229,000 which was required to make the whole scheme effective. An appeal for funds was launched and met with immediate and most generous response both from members of the University and from other quarters, and by June, 1930, the whole sum required had been raised and the condition of the offer fulfilled. The first stone of the new Library was laid on October 1st, 1932; by the spring of this year the building was complete; and eight weeks later the entire contents of the Library had been transported and rehoused in the new building which Your Majesty has graciously consented to open.

We would pray that the blessings of Almighty God may rest upon Your Majesties and that in the words of cur ancient Bidding Prayer all Members of this University in their several stations may serve truly and faithfully to the honour of God and the welfare of His people.

To which address His Majesty was pleased to return the following Gracious Answer:—

The Queen and I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address.

I am glad to be with you on this memorable occasion, and to express my appreciation of all that has been done to provide this wonderful home for the library of Cambridge University. The vision, faith and enterprise of those who conceived this great idea have been abundantly justified. In the long history of your University there have been many notable gifts, but the traditions of the past have been equalled or excelled by the generosity and public spirit manifested in our own day. The magnificent gift from the International Education Board reminds us not only that there are special ties of friendship and kinship between this country and the United States, but also that education knows no national frontiers. The pursuit of knowledge draws together the peoples of the world in a fellowship of co-operative effort.

To make provision for the growth, preservation and use of your famous collection of books was an object worthy of the generosity of the benefactors who have contributed the necessary means. A library such as this is both a powerhouse and a testing station of educational activities. It inspires and helps the work of specialists in every field of research, and it provides from generation to generation the standards of truth and sound learning by which the fresh products of science and scholarship are tried. It is a workshop of new knowledge and a storehouse of seasoned wisdom.

I congratulate the Architect and all who have shared in constructing and equipping this fine building on their achievement; and I declare this Library open, in the confident hope that it will be a centre of light and guidance for the civilisation of mankind.

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TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

THE COAL MINES ACT, 1930,

THE SCOTTISH DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, it is provided that any Scheme may be amended with the approval of the Board of Trade in manner provided by the Scheme;

And whereas in pursuance of powers conferred upon them by subsection (4) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Board of Trade have made the Scottish District (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1934, which provides that the Scottish District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may be amended so as to provide for certain matters specified in the Schedule to the said Order in substitution for certain matters mentioned in the said Section 3;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 25 of the said Scheme (inter alia) that any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme shall be operative from such date as may be prescribed by the Board of Trade;

And whereas in pursuance of the said Clause 25 the amendments of the said Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board nominated under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act hereby approve the amendments of the Scottish District (Coal Mines) Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto and prescribe the 1st day of January, 1935, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force:

Provided that where under the said Scheme as amended the Executive Board are empowered to make any determination or to obtain any information which is necessary or expedient for bringing the said Scheme as amended into operation on the said 1st day of January, and any owner is required to furnish such information to the Executive Board, the provisions of the said Scheme as amended in relation to the matters aforesaid shall come into force on the 31st day of October, 1934.

SCHEDULE.

THE SCOTTISH DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended as follows:—

- 1. Clause 2 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—
- (i) the words "District Allocation" were deleted;

(ii) at the end of the Clause there were added the following paragraphs, that is to say:—

"Allocation" means any allocation made to the District for any period under the provisions of the Central Scheme;

"Export Supply" means loading at the customary shipping places of the District as cargo into ships for conveyance therein to destinations outside the United Kingdom, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands, or as fuel for use on ships proceeding to such destinations or as fuel for use on fishing vessels or supply to works situated at ports to be used for the preparation of patent fuel for export:

"Inland Supply" means supply otherwise than as export supply including supply to other parts of an undertaking of which the coal mine forms part, but excluding supply for use in working the coal mines and supply free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependents of persons who have been so employed;

"The Customary Shipping Places of the District" means:—

Aberdeen, Aberdour, Alloa, Annan, Anstruther, Arbroath, Ardrossan, Avoch, Ayr, Banff, Beauly, Boddam, Bo'ness, Bowling, Bridgeness, Brora, Broughty Ferry, Buckhaven, Buckie, Burghead, Burntisland, Cambus, Campbeltown, Carradale, Castlehill, Charlestown, Cockenzie, Crail, Cromarty, Cunc, Dalbeattie, Dingwall, Drummore, Dumbarton, Dumfries, Dunbar, Dundee, Dunston, Dysart, Elie, Eyemouth, Fortrose, Dunston, Dysart, Elie, Eyemouth, Fallin, Findhorn, Findochty, Fortrose, Fort William, Fraserburgh, Gardenstown, Garlieston, Gatehouse, Glasgow, Golspie, Gourdon, Girvan, Gourock, Grangemouth, Granton, Greenock, Hartlepool, Helmsdale, Hopeman, Im-Inveraray, Invergordon, mingham, Inverkeithing, Inverness, Irvine, Isle of Whithorn, Johnshaven, Katerline, Kentallen, Kincardine, Kinghorn, Kinlochleven, Kirkcaldy, Kirkcudbright, Kirkwall, Kyleakin, Largo, Largs, Leith, Littleferry, Lerwick, Lossiemouth, Mallaig, Methil, Lybster, Macduff, Monifeith, Montrose, Morrison's Haven, Musselburgh, Nairn, Newburgh (Aberdeenshire), Newburgh (Fifeshire), New-castle Staiths, North Berwick, Oban, Paisley, Partington, Pennan, Perth, Peterhead, Pittenween, Port Erroll, Portessie, Port Glasgow, Port Gordon, Portknockie, Port Logan, Port-mahomack, Portobello, Portpatrick, Port Seton, Portsoy, Port William, Purfleet, Queensferry South, Raasay, Renfrew, Rosehearty, Rosyth, St. Abb's, St. Andrews, St. Davids, St. Monans, Saltcoats, Sandhaven, Scalloway, Scapa, Scrabster, Silloth, Stirling, Stonehaven, Stornoway, Stranraer, Thurso, Troon, Ullapool, Wemyss, Whitehaven, Whitehills, Wick;

and any other shipping places declared from time to time by the Board to be customary shipping places of the District.

- 2. Clause 24 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—
 - (i) the words "in respect of output of coal" were inserted after the words "standard tonnage" wherever those words occur; and
 - (ii) at the end of the Clause there were added the words "but so that in calculating the last 100,000 tons any remainder of tonnage less than 100,000 tons shall be reckoned as 100,000 tons".
- 3. Clause 28 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—
 - (i) the words "and undertakings" and the words "or undertaking" were deleted wherever those words occur;
 - (ii) the words "in respect of output (hereinafter referred to as "Output Standard Tonnages")" were inserted after the words "standard tonnages" where those words first occur;
 - (iii) The word "output" were inserted before the words "standard tonnage" wherever those words occur and before the words "standard tonnages" wherever those words occur after the first time; and
 - words occur after the first time; and
 (iv) the words "determined according to
 the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied" were inserted after the words "class
 of coal" where those words occur the first
 time
 - 4. Clause 29 of the Scheme shall be deleted.
- 5. Clause 30 of the Scheme shall be renumbered 29 and shall have effect as if:—
 - (i) the word "output" were inserted before the words "standard tonnages" wherever those words occur;
 - (ii) the words "or undertaking" were deleted where those words first occur; and
 - (iii) the words "The Board shall also be entitled to modify as it may deem equitable the standard tonnages of the coal mine or undertaking concerned" were deleted.
- 6. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clause 31 of the Scheme, that is to say:—
 - "30. The Board shall from time to time and for such periods as it thinks fit fix the standard tonnages of every coal mine in the District in respect of:—
 - (a) coal for export supply, and
 - (b) coal for inland supply:

Provided that the Board may if it thinks fit fix standard tonnages for export supply or for inland supply in respect of any class of coal determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied.

30a. In the determination of standard tonnages in respect of coal or any class of coal
for export supply and for inland supply the
Board shall have regard to the special circumstances of every coal mine (including the
efficiency and economy of working of the coal
mine, the extent to which it has been developed or is being developed for economic
working, the extent to which its output has
been increasing or decreasing, and in the
case of the first determination of such standard tonnages shall have regard to the proportion which the tonnage of coal or that

class of coal supplied from the coal mine concerned for export supply or for inland supply, as the case may be, hore to the total tonnage of coal or that class of coal, supplied from all the coal mines in the District for export supply or for inland supply during the period in the 12 months ended the 30th June, 1934, corresponding to the period in respect of which the standard tonnages are fixed).

30B. For the purpose of assisting the Board in the determination of Standard Tonnages for export supply and for inland supply every owner shall furnish to the Board upon notice given to him by the Board a statement in writing giving any information which the Board may require for that purpose and every owner may submit to the Board, together with such statement if required, a claim in writing accompanied by such additional explanations or information as the owner may consider it necessary or expedient to submit in support of the claim.

30c. In any case in which it may not be practicable for the Board to determine any standard tonnage for any coal mine in accordance with the foregoing provisions the Board may upon consideration of such circumstances as it may deem relevant determine such standard tonnages for such coal mine as the Board may think fair and proper but having regard in so fixing standard tonnages to any special circumstances of which the Board may have information affecting the coal mine in question.

31. The Board may at any time review, whether or not at the request of an owner, any standard tonnage of any coal mine or undertaking and upon consideration of such circumstances as the Board may think relevant, determine revised standard tonnages therefor:

Provided that in reviewing any standard tonnage the Board shall have regard to any special circumstance affecting the coal mine or undertaking concerned which may be within the knowledge of the Board or which may be brought to its notice."

- 7. Clause 32 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted wherever those words occur.
- 8. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 33, 34 and 35 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

Quotas.

"33.—(1) The Board shall from time to time determine the proportions (hereafter in the Scheme referred to generally as "the quotas" or particularly as "the quotas of output" or "the quotas of export supply" or "the quotas of inland supply" as the case may be) of the standard tonnages of each coal mine that may during any period fixed by the Board as after-mentioned be produced from such coal mine or supplied by the owner thereof as the case may be.

(2) If standard tonnages have been determined in respect of any class of coal the Board may if it thinks fit determine a

separate quota for such class.

(3) All quotas shall be so calculated that during no period in respect of which allocations have been fixed by the Central Council shall any of such allocations be exceeded.

- (4) Quotas shall be determined for such period as the Board may decide (hereinafter referred to as "the prescribed period") within the period of the allocation to which such quotas relate and shall be notified by the Board to all the owners concerned not later than seven days before the commencement of the period to which they relate.
- (5) The quotas and the prescribed periods shall be determined by the Board having regard among other matters to the prospective demand for the coal to which those quotas relate.
- (6) Any quota determined shall be the same proportion of the corresponding standard tonnage for all the coal mines in the District in respect of which such standard tonnage has been determined.
- (7) The Board may at any time after the determination of quotas increase or reduce any quota or grant any additional or supplementary quota so, however, that the tonnage of coal permitted to be raised or supplied as the case may be under any allocation made to the District shall not be exceeded. Any such increase or reduction of quota or any additional or supplementary quota shall be notified to all the owners affected thereby in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.
- (8) Subject to the provisions of Clause 34 hereof any owner who in any prescribed period exceeds any quota for his coal mine or undertaking by more than the permissible percentage margin specified in Clause 46 hereof shall be liable in penalties as prescribed by that Clause.
- (9) Every owner shall forward to the Board within seven days after the end of each prescribed period a statement in writing in such form and subject to such certification by Accountants, Mining Engineers or otherwise as the Board may prescribe giving in respect of such period full particulars of the output of his coal mine or undertaking, the tonnage of coal disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively, and the output or supply as the case may be of any class of coal for which a separate quota has been determined. The Board may require such other particulars as in its opinion may be necessary for ascertaining whether or not any quota for the coal mine or undertaking has been exceeded.

Standard Tonnages and Quotas of Colliery Undertakings.

33A. The Board shall determine the standard tonnages of and quotas for any two or more coal mines in the District which are worked by the same colliery undertaking as if they were one coal mine.

Deficiencies.

34. Should the output of coal produced by any owner or the tonnage of coal supplied by him in any prescribed period fall short of the quota fixed by the Board for the period to which that output or supply relates the amount of the deficiency shall be notified to the Board in writing within seven days from the last day of the period to which such quota relates and 50 per cent.

of the amount of the deficiency may be produced or supplied as the case may be in addition to the corresponding quota in the immediately succeeding prescribed period.

Sale or Transfer of Quotas.

35. Any owner may sell or transfer to the Board or to any other owner, the whole, or any part of any quota, fixed for his coal mine or undertaking for a prescribed period, and such quota of the owner who sells or transfers shall thereby be reduced by the amount so sold or transferred, and the corresponding quota of the owner to whom such quota has been sold or transferred shall be increased by that amount.

Such sale or transfer shall, within three days after being effected, be intimated to the Board by the owner who sells or transfers."

- 9. Clause 40 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the word "output" were inserted before the words "standard tonnage."
- 10. The following paragraphs shall be substituted for the first paragraph of Clause 46 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"46. Any owner who, during any prescribed period, produces or supplies coal or any class of coal in excess by more than two per cent. of the quota to which such production or supply relates for his coal mine or undertaking for that period shall pay to the Board a penalty in respect of each ton or part of a ton of each such excess (after allowing for such two per cent. margin and for any deficiency which may be carried forward under Clause 34 of the Scheme and for any arrangement under Clause 35 of the Scheme) of 2s. 6d. per ton or of the same amount per ton as is prescribed for the time being under rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme for exceeding the corresponding allocation whichever is the greater:

Provided that where in any prescribed period a quota for output of coal or any class of coal has been exceeded and any quota for export supply or inland supply of coal or that class of coal has also been exceeded the Board shall in any case in which it thinks it fair and proper to do so be entitled in the exercise of its discretion so to remit penalty in whole or in part as to ensure that one penalty only shall be payable in respect of such excesses calculated upon the amount of the excess over the quota for output or the excess over a quota or the sum of any excesses over quotas for supply whichever shall be the greater.

The Board shall before the coming into

The Board shall before the coming into force of any rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme notify each owner of the amount per ton which will be payable in consequence thereof for exceeding any quota.

Any owner who sells or supplies or agrees to sell or supply coal of any class below the minimum price therefor or in breach of the conditions of sale prescribed by the Board or otherwise in contravention of the provisions of Clause 36 hereof, shall, for each ton of coal so sold or supplied, or agreed to be sold or supplied, pay to the Board a penalty of 2s. 6d. per ton:

penalty of 2s. 6d. per ton:
Provided that if the Board at any time incurs a penalty to the Central Council in respect of failure to enforce or comply with

directions of the Central Council or failure to enforce or comply with provisions relating to minimum prices for coal produced in the District, every owner who sells or supplies or agrees to sell or supply coal of any class below the minimum price therefor or in breach of the conditions of sale prescribed by the Board or otherwise in contravention of the provisions of the Scheme, and without prejudice to that generality, of Clause 36 hereof whereby in the opinion of the Board the penalty so incurred by the Board to the Central Council as aforesaid has in whole or; in part been incurred, shall if the Board so decide pay to the Board in addition to any penalty herein provided a further penalty of 5s. 0d. per ton or such less amount per ton as may be determined by the Board of the tonnage of coal which in the opinion of the Board has been so sold or supplied."

11. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 47 of the Scheme, that is to say:-

Excesses of Quotas.

"47. Subject to Clauses 34 and 35 hereof where an owner has during any prescribed period produced or supplied coal or any class of coal in excess of the quota to which such production or supply relates for his coal mine or undertaking for that period the amount of such excess, less one per cent. of the corresponding quota may, if the Board so decide, be deducted from the corresponding quota for that coal mine or undertaking in a succeeding prescribed period to be determined by the Board, but without prejudice to any penalty that may have been incurred by reason of the excess.'

THE COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE KENT DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, it is provided that any Scheme may be amended with the approval of the Board of Trade in manner provided by the Scheme;

And whereas in pursuance of powers conferred upon them by subsection (4) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Board of Trade have made the Kent District (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1934, which provides that the Kent District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may be amended so as to provide for certain matters specified in the Schedule to the said Order in substitution for certain matters mentioned in the said Section 3;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 58 of the said Scheme (inter alia) that any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme shall be operative from such date as may be prescribed

by the Board of Trade;

And whereas in pursuance of the said Clause 58 the amendments of the said Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act hereby approve the amendments of the Kent District (Coal Mines) Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto and prescribe the 1st day of January, 1935, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force:

Provided that where under the said Scheme as amended the Executive Board are empowered to make any determination or to obtain any information which is necessary or expedient for bringing the said Scheme as amended into operation on the said 1st day of January, and any owner is required to furnish such information to the Executive Board, the provisions of the said Scheme as amended in relation to the matters aforesaid shall come into force on the 31st day of October, 1934.

SCHEDULE.

THE KENT DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme "), shall be amended as follows:-

- 1. Clause 3 of the Scheme shall have effect
 - (i) in the definition of "Coal Mine" the words "or any undertaking as hereinafter defined" were inserted after the word working "

(ii) the definition of "District Allocation" were deleted; and

(iii) at the end of the Clause there were added the following paragraphs, that is to say:-

"Allocation" means any allocation made to the District for any period under

the provisions of the Central Scheme; "Export supply" means loading at the customary shipping places of the District as cargo into ships for conveyance therein to destinations outside the United Kingdom, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands, or as fuel for use on ships proceeding to such destinations or as fuel for use on fishing vessels or supply to works situated at ports to be used for the preparation of patent fuel for export; "Inland supply" means supply other-

wise than as export supply including supply to other parts of an undertaking of which the coal mine forms part but excluding supply for use in working the coal mines and supply free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so

employed;
"The customary shipping places of the District" means the Ports of Dover, Richborough, Queenborough, Ramsgate, Erith and Newhaven and any other port declared from time to time by the Executive Board

to be a customary shipping place.

- 2. Clause 26 of the Scheme shall have effect as if in the second paragraph thereof-
 - (i) there were inserted after the word "Tonnage" where that word first occurs the words "in respect of output of coal";
 (ii) before the word "mine" there were

inserted the word "coal"; and

- (iii) the words "or undertaking" were deleted.
- 3. Clause 28 of the Scheme shall have effect as if in the first paragraph thereof the words "except for the purposes of Clauses 29 to 31 (inclusive) of the Scheme" were inserted after the word "classification".
- . 4. Clause 29 of the Scheme shall have effect as if—
 - (i) in paragraph (i) thereof the words "determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied" were inserted after the word "coal" where that word first occurs, the words "in respect of output" were inserted after the word "basis", and the words "or undertaking" were deleted;

(ii) in paragraph (ii) the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs, and the words "or undertaking" were deleted;

(iii) the following paragraphs were substituted for paragraph (iii) thereof, that is to say:

- "(iii) (a) Before the first day of January, 1935, the Board shall determine for every coal mine standard tonnages for that coal mine for such periods as the Board may decide in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme in respect of-
 - (I) coal for export supply, and (II) coal for inland supply.
- (b) The Board may if they think fit further distribute the standard tonnages so determined for any such coal mine among the various classes of coal, determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade industry or other category.
- of consumer supplied, produced therefrom. (c) The first standard tonnages thus determined shall come into force on the first day of January, 1935.
- (d) In the first determination of standard tonnages in respect of coal or any class of coal for export supply and for inland supply the Board shall have regard to all matters relevant to such determination and to the proportions in which coal supplied from the coal mine has been disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively during such recent period as the Board may decide.
- (iv) For the purpose of assisting the Board in the determination of standard tonnages, every owner shall furnish to the Board upon notice given to him by the Board a statement in writing giving any information which the Board may require for that purpose and every owner may submit to the Board together with a statement so required, a claim in writing, accompanied by any evidence required to substantiate the same relating, in the case of any determination of the standard tonnage of the coal mine in respect of output of coal, to the special circumstances of |

- his coal mine, and in the case of any determination of standard tonnages for his coal mine for export supply or for inland supply to any matters relevant to such determination.";
- (iv) paragraph (iv) thereof were numbered paragraph (v) and the words "or undertakings" in that paragraph were deleted; and
- (v) the following paragraph were substituted for paragraph (v) thereof, that is to say:
 - "(vi) The Board may at any time review, whether or not at the request of an owner, any standard tonnage and determine such revised standard tonnage as may seem to the Board fair and proper having regard in the determination of any standard tonnage in respect of output to the rate of development and other special circumstances of the coal mine, and in determining any standard tonnage respect of coal for export supply or for inland supply to any matters relevant to such determination and to the proportions in which coal supplied from the coal mine has been disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively during some recent period."
- 5. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35 and 36 of the Scheme, that is to say:-
 - "30. Where after the commencement of the Scheme an owner purchases or otherwise acquires any coal mine, the standard tonnages of the coal mine so acquired, added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner, shall constitute the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking and on any subsequent determination of standard tonnages such combined undertaking shall be treated in the same way as if the standard tonnages so constituted were the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking under the last previous determination of standard tonnages for the District:

Provided that where an owner purchases or otherwise acquires part only of an undertaking in respect of which standard tonnages have been determined under the Scheme, the proportion of those standard tonnages to be added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner shall be determined by the Board, and that amount shall be deducted from the standard tonnages of the undertaking of which the part has been so acquired.

31. All standard tonnages determined by the Board shall immediately be communicated to all owners, and any owner dissatisfied with any standard tonnage determined in respect of his coal mine shall be entitled to appeal in accordance with Clauses 72 or 73 hereof.

Quotas.

32.—(i) The Board shall from time to time determine the proportions (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as "the Quotas") of the standard tonnages of each coal mine that may be produced therefrom or which may be supplied by the owner thereof as the case may be.

(ii) If standard tonnages have been determined in respect of any class of coal the Board may, if they think fit, determine a separate quota for such class.

(iii) All quotas shall be so calculated that, during no period in respect of which allocations have been fixed by the Central Council shall any of such allocations be exceeded.

(iv) Quotas shall be determined for such period as the Board may decide within the period of the allocation to which such quotas relate and shall be notified by the Board to all the owners not later than 7 days before the commencement of the period to which they relate.

(v) The quotas and the periods for which they are fixed shall be determined by the Board having regard, among other matters, to the prospective demand for the coal to

which those quotas relate.

(vi) Any quota determined shall be the same proportion of the corresponding stan-

dard tonnage for all coal mines.

(vii) The Board may at any time after the determination of quotas increase any quota so however that the tonnage of coal permitted to be raised or supplied, as the case may be, under any allocation made to the District shall not be exceeded. Any such increase shall be notified to all the owners affected thereby in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.

(viii) Every owner shall forward to the Board within seven days after the end of each period for which quotas are determined a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe, giving in respect of such period full particulars of the output of his coal mine, the tonnage of coal disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively, and the output or supply, as the case may be, of any class of coal for which a separate quota has been determined. The Board may require such other particulars as, in their opinion, may be necessary for ascertaining whether any quota for the coal

mine has been exceeded.

(ix) No owner shall be entitled in the event of the output of or the supply of coal or any class of coal from his coal mine falling short of the tonnage permitted under the relevant quota in the period for which such quota has been determined, to carry forward the amount of such shortage or any portion thereof as any addition to the tonnage permitted under any quota during

any succeeding period.

33. Should an appeal be pending involving the question of any standard tonnage of any coal mine, the Board may retain a proportion of the corresponding allocation until such time as the decision of the Arbitrator is given and should any standard tonnage of any coal mine be varied by such a decision, the quantity so retained shall be used for the purpose of adjusting the corresponding quota of each coal mine so that each coal mine shall have received the same proportion of its corresponding standard tonnage then in force as the corresponding allocation bears to the total of the corresponding standard tonnages of all the coal mines in the District.

34. Any owner may distribute all or any of his quotas amongst all or any of his coal mines in such proportions and in such manner as he may decide:

Provided that where quotas are fixed for classes of coal there shall not be interchange of quotas between different classes.

35. Arrangements may be made by any two owners whereby, the output or export supply or inland supply of coal or any class of coal from the coal mine of one owner may exceed the quota in respect thereof in any period where the other owner has agreed whether for valuable consideration or not to limit the corresponding output of or supply from his coal mine to a tonnage which is less than the quota in respect thereof by a tonnage not less than the tonnage by which such first-mentioned quota is exceeded. If the output of or supply from any coal mine exceeds any limit so agreed, for the purposes of Clauses 63 and 64 of the Scheme, the corresponding quota shall be deemed to be exceeded by the amount of the excess over such limit.

36. Notice in writing of any arrangement to exceed and reduce quotas under the provisions of Clause 35 of the Scheme must be given to the Secretary by the parties within 24 hours of the making of the arrangement."

6. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 59 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"59. Every owner shall within ten days after the expiration of each calendar month forward to such Chartered Accountant or Accountants as may for the time being be employed by the Board, a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe duly certified by the owner or his Agent, Manager or Accounting Officer giving particulars of the quantity and class of coal produced and of coal sold or supplied by him during such month together with such further information as the Board may from time to time require for the purposes of the Scheme and a signed declaration that the prices actually charged by him were nett prices and that he has not allowed or given or agreed to allow or give and will not allow or give any discount, allowance, rebate, commission, or extended credit nor has done nor will do anything in any other way directly or indirectly evading the Scheme and the Board may thereupon cause such statement to be verified by the Accountants who for such purpose shall have full access to the books and records of the owners."

7. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 63, 64 and 65 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"63.—(1) Any owner who, during any period for which a quota is determined, raises or allows to be raised an output of coal or any class of coal or supplies or allows to be supplied a tonnage of coal or any class of coal for export supply or for inland supply in excess of the corresponding quota (after allowing for any arrangement under Clause 35 of the Scheme whereby a quota may be exceeded) shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty, in respect of each ton of such excess, of the same amount per ton as is prescribed for the time being under rules

made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme for exceeding the corresponding allocation:

Provided that-

(i) until the coming into force of such rules the penalty shall be 2s. 6d. per ton;

- (ii) where in any period for which quotas have been determined a quota for output of coal or any class of coal has been exceeded and any quota for export supply or inland supply of coal or that class of coal has also been exceeded, one penalty only shall be payable in respect of such excesses calculated upon the amount of the excess over the quota for output or the excess over the quota or the sum of any excesses over quotas for supply, whichever shall be the greater.
- (2) The Board shall before the coming into force of any rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme notify each owner of the amount per ton which will be payable in consequence thereof for exceeding any quota.
- 64. Where output of coal or any class of coal or inland supply or export supply of coal or any class of coal is in excess of the corresponding quota for any period, the corresponding quota for the coal mine of the owner concerned may during such succeeding period as the Board may determine be reduced at the discretion of the Board by the amount of the excess but without prejudice to any penalty that may have been incurred by reason of the excess.

65. Any owner who sells or disposes of any coal or class of coal at a price below the minimum price fixed for the time being under the Scheme for such coal or sells or disposes of any coal or class of coal in such a manner that the actual consideration obtained by him is less in value than the minimum price so fixed or ships or causes to be shipped any coal in contravention of Clause 43 of the Scheme, or allows any such sale, disposal or shipment of any part of the output of his coal mine to take place, or sells or disposes of any coal or class of coal otherwise than in accordance with any conditions of sale prescribed by the Board under Clause 39 hereof, or who having a cause of action against any person firm or Company in respect of any breach of such conditions of sale by the sale or disposal of any coal or class of coal by such person firm or Company contrary to such conditions of sale fails or omits without the consent of the Board to proceed against such person firm or Company at law in respect of such breach, shall pay on demand to the Board a penalty at the rate of 2s. 6d. per ton of the tonnage of coal which, in the opinion of the Board has been so sold or disposed of."

THE COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE SOUTH WALES DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, it is provided that any Scheme may be amended with the approval of the Board of Trade in manner provided by the Scheme;

And whereas in pursuance of powers conferred upon them by subsection (4) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Board of Trade have South Wales District made the Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1934, which provides that the South Wales District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may amended so as to provide for certain matters specified in the Schedule to the said Order in addition to or in substitution for certain matters mentioned in the Section 3;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 60 of the said Scheme (inter alia) that any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme shall be operative from such date as may be prescribed by the Board of Trade;

And whereas in pursuance of Clause 58 of the said Scheme the amendments of the said Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme;

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act hereby approve the amendments of the South Wales District (Coal Mines) Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto and prescribe the 1st day of January, 1935, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force:

Provided that where under the said Scheme as amended the Executive Board are empowered to make any determination or to obtain any information which is necessary or expedient for bringing the said Scheme as amended into operation on the said 1st day of January, and any owner is required to furnish such information to the Executive Board, the provisions of the said Scheme as amended in relation to the matters aforesaid shall come into force on the 1st day of November, 1934.

SCHEDULE.

THE SOUTH WALES DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930, (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended as follows:—

- 1. By substituting the following new definitions for definitions contained in sub-paragraph (j) of Clause 3 thereof.
 - "(j) (i) "Coal" includes bituminous coal, cannel coal, and anthracite.
 - (ii) "Export supply" means loading at the customary shipping places of the District as cargo into ships for conveyance therein to destinations outside the United Kingdom, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands or as fuel for use on ships proceeding to such destinations or as fuel for use on fishing vessels or supply to works situated at ports to be used for the preparation of patent fuel for export.

- (iii) "Inland supply" means supply otherwise than as specified in sub-paragraph (ii) hereof and includes supply to other parts of an undertaking of which the coal mine forms part but excludes supply for use in working the coal mines and supply free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mines and the dependants of persons who have been so employed.
- (iv) "The customary shipping places of the District " means:

Port of Bristol (including Avonmouth),

Briton Ferry,

Burry Port,

Port of Cardiff (including the docks and harbour at Cardiff, Penarth and at Barry),

Chepstow.

Dartmouth,

Dover,

Falmouth.

Fishguard,

Folkestone,

Gloucester,

Port of Liverpool (including Birkenhead),

Llanelly, Port of London,

Lydney,

Milford Haven,

Neath,

Newhaven,

Port of Newport (including any of the staiths or shipping places thereat),

Pembroke Dock,

Poole,

Port Talbot,

Southampton,

Swansea,

Weymouth.

and any other port declared from time to time by the Executive Board to be a customary shipping place."

- 2. By inserting the following new definitions at the end of Clause 3 thereof:
 - "(u) the "Amendment Order" means the South Wales District (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1934.
 - (v) the "approval date" in any provision of the Scheme forming part of the amendments thereto effected pursuant to the Amendment Order or contemporaneously with the amendments so effected means the date the Board of Trade approved the said amendments.
 - (w) the "new provisions" of the Scheme means the provisions thereof as so amended as aforesaid and the "former provisions" of the Scheme means the provisions thereof in the form in force immediately before the date on which the Board of Trade approved the said amendments.
 - (x) "output standard tonnage" means standard tonnage in respect of output of coal; "export standard tonnage" means standard tonnage in respect of coal for export supply; and "inland standard tonnage" means standard tonnage in respect of coal for inland supply, and where standard tonnages have been fixed in respect of any separate class of coal then output (

- standard tonnage, export standard tonnage and inland standard tonnage shall be construed as including the several respective standard tonnages in respect of such class.'
- 3. By deleting clause 4 and inserting in lieu thereof a new clause numbered 4 as shown in the appendix hereto.
- 4. By deleting clauses 6 to 14 inclusive including the headings and inserting in lieu thereof new clauses numbered 6 to 23 inclusive and headings as shown in the appendix hereto.
 - 5. By renumbering clause 15 as clause 24.
- 6. By deleting clauses 16 to 19 inclusive (including the heading) and inserting in lieu thereof a new heading and clauses numbered 25 to 30 inclusive as shown in the appendix hereto.
 - 7. By renumbering clause 20 as clause 31.
- 8. By deleting clauses 21 to 25 inclusive (including the headings) and inserting in lieu thereof new clauses numbered 32 to 35 inclusive and headings as shown in the appendix hereto.
 - 9. By renumbering clause 26 as clause 36.
- 10. By deleting clauses 27 to 30 inclusive and inserting in lieu thereof a new clause numbered 37 as shown in the appendix hereto.
- 11. By renumbering clause 31 as 38, clause 32 as 39 and clause 33 as clause 40.
- 12. By deleting clauses 34 and 35 and inserting in lieu thereof new clauses numbered 41 and 42 as shown in the appendix hereto.
- 13. By renumbering clause 36 as clause 43 and substituting a reference to clause 50 for the reference therein to clause 43.
- 14. By deleting clause 37 and inserting in lieu thereof new clauses numbered 44 and 45 as shown in the appendix hereto.
- 15. By deleting clause 38 and inserting in lieu thereof a new clause numbered 46 as shown in the appendix hereto and by renumbering clause 39 as clause 47, clause 40 as clause 48 and clause 45 as clause 52 and by substituting in the last mentioned clause a reference to clause 51 for the reference therein to clause 44.

APPENDIX.

REPRESENTATIVES AND ASSOCIATES.

4.—(i) Each owner shall appoint one "representative" and one "associate" for the purposes of the Scheme.

(ii) Any owner may from time to time or at any time remove his representative or associate and appoint a new representative or associate in his place or in the place of a deceased representative or associate.

(iii) Every such appointment or removal shall be in writing under the hand of the owner concerned or in the case of an owner being a corporation under the hand of one or more of its officers duly authorised in that behalf. Written notice of every such appointment or removal shall be given to the Executive Board.

(iv) A sole owner not being a corporation may (subject to giving notice in writing to the Executive Board that he intends to do so) act as his own representative or associate and references herein or in the Schedules hereto to representatives or associates shall be deemed to include a sole owner so acting.

- (v) The representatives and associates appointed under this clause are in the Scheme referred to as "representatives" and "associates".
- (vi) No appointment or removal shall be operative until written notice thereof is given to the Executive Board.
- (vii) In the event of an undertaking being transferred from one owner to another, then the Board shall be entitled to treat the representative and associate, if any, of the transferring owner as the representative and associate respectively of the acquiring owner until notice of the removal of such representative or associate is given to the Board and such satisfactory evidence of the transfer or acquisition of the undertaking is given to the Board as they shall require.

THE EXECUTIVE BOARD.

- 6.—(i) The Scheme shall be administered by the Executive Board constituted as provided in the First Schedule to the Scheme.
- (ii) The Executive Board shall be responsible for the general administration of the Scheme and it shall be the duty of the Executive Board, subject to the provisions of the Scheme and within the limits thereof, from time to time to take such steps as may appear to them desirable for the purposes of regulation to the best advantage of the production of coal, and the supply and sale of coal produced in the district.
- (iii) The Board shall have all powers necessary or expedient for carrying out the aforesaid matters or any matter incidental thereto or consequential thereon and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing shall have powers for:
 - (a) The appointment of officers, servants and staff for the purpose of carrying out any functions under the Scheme.
 - (b) The appointment of committees of the Executive Board, so however that these shall be constituted of representatives or associates (as defined in the Scheme) of owners of coal mines within the district.
 - (c) The making of rules and regulations for carrying out any matters under the Scheme or incidental to any purpose of the Scheme.
 - (d) Any other purpose for carrying out the provisions of the Scheme.
- (iv) Notwithstanding any provision of the Scheme requiring or enabling any acts to be performed witnesses or objections to be heard or any other matter or thing to be done by the Executive Board the same may be performed heard or done by a Committee appointed by the Board.

Provided that

- (a) in case of any delegation of powers to a committee that committee shall as to at least half its membership consist of members of the Executive Board; and
- (b) the decision of any committee shall be subject to approval or ratification by the Executive Board.

(v) The provisions contained in the First Schedule hereto with respect to the constitution, election, meetings and proceedings of and otherwise in relation to the Executive Board shall have effect.

TONNAGE AND SUPPLY STATEMENTS.

- 7.—(1) Within 14 days after the approval date every owner shall forward to the Board a statement in writing (hereinafter called a "tonnage and supply statement") framed in accordance with the following provisions of this Clause and shall otherwise comply with such provisions, that is to say:—
 - (i) If the owner has already complied with Clause 7 of the former provisions of the Scheme and has forwarded a tonnage statement thereunder in respect of the undertaking then the owner shall send to the Board in writing a tonnage and supply statement in form prescribed by the Board and containing the following particulars:—
 - (a) a declaration to the effect that the tonnage statement furnished by such owner to the Board under the former provisions of the Scheme contains as at the date of such declaration full true and complete particulars with respect to all the matters required by Clause 7 of the former provisions; subject only to such (if any) additions or alterations as are next hereinafter mentioned;
 - (b) All such (if any) additions to and alterations of the particulars comprised in the last mentioned tonnage statement as shall be necessary to make the same full true and complete in every respect at the date of such declaration.
 - (c) The output of coal from the undertaking during and the tonnage of coal and of each class thereof supplied for export supply and inland supply respectively from the undertaking for each of the quarters in the year 1933 and for the quarter commencing on the 1st January 1934 respectively and also if any undertaking had no tonnage of coal supplied for export supply or for inland supply respectively in any of the said quarters then the tonnage of coal and of each class thereof for export supply and for inland supply respectively in the last four quarters in which there was a tonnage so supplied.
 - (ii) If the owner has not complied with Clause 7 of the former provisions of the Scheme in respect of such tonnage statement as aforesaid, then a tonnage and supply statement giving the following particulars shall be furnished in writing to the Board:
 - (a) The full name and address (and if a company the registered office) of such owner, or in the case of an undertaking owned by several persons jointly or by a partnership firm the name and address of each person or of each of the partners in the firm and also in the case of a firm the name and address of the firm.
 - (b) The name and situation of each coal mine owned by him in the district.
 - (c) A notification containing information:

As to what standard tonnage of output and of coal for export supply and

for inland supply (and of any class thereof) is desired and how such estimate is calculated.

(d) The output of each of such owner's coal mines with the tonnage of coal and of each class thereof supplied from the said mines for export supply and for inland supply respectively for:

each quarter within the six years ending 30th day of September, 1934.

- (2) (i) Within 30 days after the approval date, or within such extended time as the Board may allow, every owner shall further forward to the Board in writing a statement certified by a qualified accountant as to the accuracy of the information supplied by the owner and contained in the said tonnage and supply statement, or if the said qualified accountant is unable to certify the same then a statement certifying the accuracy of such amended tonnage and supply statement as may comply with the provisions of this clause.
- (ii) The expression "qualified accountant" means a person being a member of one or more of the following bodies, that is to say:

The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales,

The Society of Incorporated Accountants and Auditors.

- 8. Each tonnage and supply statement shall be accompanied by particulars in writing (together with the evidence necessary to substantiate the same) of any claim:—
 - (a) in the case of the determination of the output standard tonnage in respect of coal or any class of coal, relating to the special circumstances of the undertaking, including the efficiency and the economy of the working thereof, the extent to which it has been developed or is being developed for economic working and the extent to which its output has been increasing or decreasing; and
 - (b) in the case of the determination of the export and inland standard tonnages of the undertaking in respect of coal or any class of coal in regard to any matters relevant to the determination of such standard tonnages.
- 9.—(i) Any person, who after the approval date becomes the owner of any undertaking shall immediately on demand, or failing demand within 21 days of acquiring the undertaking, furnish to the Board tonnage and supply statements and claims (if any) as aforesaid.
 - (ii) Any owner, who after the approval date acquires any undertaking or mine or part thereof shall within seven days notify the Board of the same, and shall also give such further particulars to the Board as may be required.
- 10. All owners shall on demand from time to time furnish such other information, statements, and particulars as may be required by the Board.

DETERMINATION OF CLASSES.

11. For the purpose of determining the various classes to which any coal produced in the district belongs, the Board shall from time to time as they think fit allocate the coal produced at each mine into classes, such classification being:

(i) In the case of a classification for the purposes of output standard tonnage, export standard tonnage and inland standard tonnage respectively, or for the quotas applicable thereto, at the discretion of the Board according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied.

(ii) In the case of a classification for the purpose of minimum prices, at the discretion of the Board according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied, or according to whether it be supplied for use in Great Britain or for export to any other country.

DETERMINATION OF STANDARD TONNAGES.

- 12. As soon as possible after the time has elapsed within which the tonnage and supply statements and such claims (if any) as aforesaid ought to have been received the Executive Board shall proceed to determine output standard tonnages and export and inland standard tonnages respectively for each undertaking in the district in accordance with the following provisions:
 - (1) The output standard tonnage shall be first determined upon an annual basis as follows:—
 - (i) Where a standard tonnage was already determined and is in existence for the undertaking under the former provisions of the Scheme,
 - (a) in the absence of special circumstances justifying in the opinion of the Board a greater or less tonnage, the annual output standard tonnage shall be fixed at an amount equal to four times the standard tonnage of the undertaking howsoever determined.
 - (b) if in the opinion of the Board there exist special circumstances affecting such undertaking to which weight has not been given in determining the existing standard tonnage but to which weight ought to be given on the occasion of the determination of the output standard tonnage, then the Board shall have regard to the special circumstances in determining the output standard tonnage, but subject thereto shall determine the same as nearly as possible upon the basis set out in sub-paragraph (a) of this sub-clause.
 - (ii) Where no standard tonnage has been determined for an undertaking under the former provisions of the Scheme, the Executive Board shall determine an output standard tonnage for that undertaking having regard to the special circumstances of which it may have information affecting such undertaking, including the matters applicable to such determination set out in paragraph cc (i) of the Schedule to the Amendment Order.
 - (iii) Where the owner of any undertaking fails to furnish any tonnage and supply statement, or any information required by the Board, or in any case not herein otherwise provided for, the Executive Board shall determine such output standard tonnage for such undertaking as having regard to the provisions of paragraph cc (i) of the Schedule to the Amendment Order they shall think proper.

- (iv) In the first determination of the output standard tonnage for every undertaking the Board shall have regard to the proportion which the output of the undertaking bore to the output of the district during the quarter ended 31st March, 1927.
- (2) The export standard tonnages and the inland standard tonnages shall be first determined upon an annual basis as follows:
 - (i) If an output not less than one half of the quarterly allocation of or one half of the tonnage allocated to the undertaking in respect of the quarter under the former provisions of the Scheme as the case may be was produced from the undertaking during one or more of the following periods; namely each of the quarters in the year 1933, and the quarter ended 31st March, 1934, then the proportion which in the whole of the said quarters the total tonnage of coal supplied from the undertaking for export supply and for inland supply (as the case may be), bore to the total disposals of the undertaking (together with coal for use in working the mines of the undertaking and coal supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mines and the dependants of persons who have been so employed) during the whole of the said quarters shall be ascertained and the like proportion of the annual output standard tonnage shall (subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph (iii) hereof) be taken as the export standard tonnage and inland standard tonnage (as the case may be) of the undertaking.
 - (ii) In the case of an undertaking which did not produce the minimum output aforesaid during any of the last mentioned periods or in any other case not herein otherwise provided for the Board shall, subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph (iii) of this clause, determine the export standard tonnage and inland standard tonnage respectively at such respective amounts as (having regard to any relevant matters of which they may have information) they may think proper, but so that (subject to regard being had to any such relevant matters) the combined amount of the export standard tonnage and the inland standard tonnage of any undertaking shall be less than the output standard tonnage of that undertaking.
 - (iii) In the first determination of the export and inland standard tonnages the Board shall have regard to any information they may have of any matters relevant to such determination, and shall also have regard to the proportion which the total tonnage of coal supplied from the undertaking for export supply or inland supply respectively during the whole of the last mentioned periods bore to the total tonnage of coal supplied from all the undertakings in the district for export supply or for inland supply during those periods.
- 13. The standard tonnages so determined by the Executive Board and the results of any such revision as is hereinafter provided shall forthwith be notified to the respective owners concerned. If any owner is dissatisfied with any standard tonnage or any revision thereof he may within two days after such notification

- give notice of objection to the Executive Board, and the Board shall hear the objection and shall give their decision thereon with all convenient speed.
- 14. The Executive Board may if they think fit so to do determine separate standard tonnages for any class of coal determined according to the nature of the coal, or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied, and for that purpose may distribute the output standard tonnage, the export standard tonnage and the inland standard tonnage for any undertaking producing different classes of coal among the various classes of coal produced thereby but so that such distribution of standard tonnages amongst any class of coal shall be effected for all undertakings producing that class of coal. Separate standard tonnages may until the Board otherwise determine continue to be fixed in respect of the several classes of coals produced at the Steam and Bituminous, Swansea Industrial and the Anthracite mines in the district.

Provided that in determining any separate standard tonnage for a class of coal:—

- (a) in respect of output, the Board shall have regard to the special circumstances of the undertaking, including the matters applicable to such determination set out in paragraph cc (i) of the Schedule to the Amendment Order and (as one of such matters) the proportion which the output of the undertaking bore to the output of the district in the quarter ended 31st March, 1927.
- (b) in respect of export supply and inland supply the Board shall have regard to any matters of which they may have information relevant to such determination, and in the case of the first determination shall have regard to the proportion which the tonnage of the class of coal supplied from the undertaking for export supply or for inland supply as the case may be bore to the total tonnage of that class of coal supplied from all the undertakings in the district for export supply or for inland supply during the period commencing on the 1st January, 1933, and ending on the 31st March, 1934.
- 15. The standard tonnages determined under the foregoing provisions are hereinafter referred to as "annual" standard tonnages and as first so determined shall come into operation
 - (1) Where the same have been fixed by the Board prior to the 1st January, 1935, on the 1st day of January, 1935.
 - (2) Where any standard tonnages have not been fixed prior to the 1st January, 1935, on such dates as the Board may determine.
- 16. The annual standard tonnages as first determined as aforesaid shall, subject to the provisions as to the revision thereof hereinafter contained, remain in force for the duration of the Scheme.
- 17. The annual standard tonnages shall be operated by means of quarterly proportions thereof to be determined as hereinafter provided, and such proportions are hereinafter called the quarterly output standard tonnage, or the quarterly export standard tonnage or the quarterly inland standard tonnage as the

case may be, and are collectively referred to as "quarterly standard tonnages

- 18.--(i) Either before, at, or as soon as possible after the determination of the annual standard tonnages or any revision thereof the Board shall give to the respective owners an opportunity of applying to the Board for the distribution of the annual standard tonnages into quarterly standard tonnages, and with such applications the respective owners may lay before the Board information as to any special circumstances to which regard should be had in the distribution of their respective annual output standard tonnages and as to any relevant matters to which regard should be had in distributing their respective annual export standard tonnages and inland standard tonnages.
- (ii) Either upon or failing such application by the owner the Board shall fix quarterly standard tonnages for each undertaking at such several amounts as having regard to the special circumstances or the relevant matters (as the case may be) of which they may have information they may consider proper.
- (iii) If any owner is dissatisfied with the decision of the Board he may within two days of the decision give notice of objection to the Board who shall hear the objection and give their decision thereon with all convenient

(iv) The quarterly standard tonnages of any undertaking for any quarter subsequent to the first in any year may be revised on such grounds, at such times, and in such manner

as is hereinafter provided.

- (v) The combined amount of the quarterly export and inland standard tonnages of each undertaking shall so far as practicable bear the same proportion to its quarterly output standard tonnage as the combined amount of its annual export and inland standard tonnages bears to its annual output standard tonnage.
- 19.—(i) The Board may from time to time make a general revision of the annual standard tonnages of all undertakings whenever it thinks fit and proper to do so.
- (ii) A revision of any standard tonnage of any undertaking may only be made at the times and subject to the conditions specified
- (iii) Upon any general revision of annual standard tonnages the Board in determining the alteration (if any) to be made in the annual output standard tonnage of each undertaking shall have regard to the special circumstances of that undertaking and in determining the alterations (if any) to be made in the annual export and inland standard tonnages of each undertaking shall have regard to any matters relevant to such determination of which they may have information.
- 20.—(1) Except on a general revision of standard tonnages, the annual output standard tonnage of any undertaking may be revised only at the times, in the manner and on the grounds following, that is to say:
 - (a) At the instance of the Board, or upon application made for that purpose by the owner within the time and in the manner prescribed by or under the Scheme, a revision to take effect at the commencement of any

- year of operation of the annual standard tonnages may be made upon the ground of the special circumstances relating to the undertaking since the annual output standard tonnage was last determined or varied (as the case may be); or
- (b) At the instance of the Board only, during the currency of any year a revision to take effect either at the commencement of any year of operation of the annual standard tonnages or during the currency of any such year may be made upon any of the grounds following, that is to say:
 - (i) that since the annual standard tonnage was last determined or varied by the Board or by an Arbitrator further knowledge of material facts relating to the coal mine or undertaking has been disclosed which renders a new determination neces-
 - (ii) that some material unforeseen circumstance has arisen since the commencement of the year of operation of the annual tonnage which has altered standard materially the circumstances relating to such undertaking;
 - (iii) for the purpose of correcting any clerical or typing error or an error which is one of calculation;
 - (iv) for enabling effect to be given to the acquisition or disposal or abandonment of any mine or undertaking or part of such mine or undertaking.
- (2) The quarterly output standard tonnage of any undertaking may only be revised at the times in the manner and on the grounds follow-
 - (a) At the instance of the Board, or upon application made for the purpose by the owner within the time and in the manner prescribed by or pursuant to the Scheme, the quarterly output standard tonnage of the undertaking for any quarter subsequent to the first in any year may be revised but not so as to make the total of the quarterly output standard tonnages of the undertaking exceed the total of its annual output standard tonnage for the year; or
 - (b) Where any increase or variation of the annual output standard tonnage of the undertaking has been or is being made for any reason during the year whether by virtue of sub-clause (1) of this clause or on a general revision, or by a decision of the Courts or the Arbitrator (as the case may be) a revision of the quarterly output standard tonnage may be made so as to allow for such increase or variation.

In carrying out any revision or in making or refusing to make any variation of the annual or quarterly output standard tonnage of any owner under this clause, the Board shall have regard to the special circumstances of such undertaking including the matters set out in paragraph cc (i) of the Schedule to the Amendment Order.

21.—(1) Except on a general revision of standard tonnages the annual export and inland standard tonnages of any undertaking may be revised only at the times in the manner and on the grounds following, that is to say:

- (a) at the instance of the Board, or upon application made for that purpose by the owner within the time and in the manner prescribed by or pursuant to the Scheme, a revision to take effect at the commencement of each year of operation of the annual standard tonnages may be made upon any ground relevant in the opinion of the Board to such revision: or
- (b) at the instance of the Board only, during the currency of any year a revision to take effect either at the commencement of the year of operation of the annual standard tonnages or during the currency of the year may be made upon any of the grounds or for any of the purposes following, that is to say:
 - (i) On the ground that since such standard tonnage was last determined or varied, further knowledge of relevant matters relating to the undertaking or to the supply of coal therefrom has been disclosed which renders a new determination necessary;
 - (ii) On the ground that some unforeseen relevant matter has arisen since the commencement of the year of the operation of the annual standard tonnages which has altered the circumstances relating to the export or inland supply of coal from the undertaking or circumstances relating to such undertaking;
 - (iii) For the purpose of correcting any clerical or typing error or an error which is one of calculation;
 - (iv) Generally for the purpose of adjusting (subject to consideration of any relevant matter) the annual export and inland standard tonnages so as to accord with any variation made in the annual output standard tonnage of the undertaking.
- (2) The quarterly export or inland standard tonnage (as the case may be) of any undertaking may only be revised at the times, in the manner and on the grounds following:
 - (a) At the instance of the Board, or upon application made for the purpose by the owner within the time and in the manner prescribed by or pursuant to the Scheme the quarterly export or inland standard tonnage of the undertaking for any quarter subsequent to the first in any year may be revised but not so as to make the total of the quarterly export or inland standard tonnages (as the case may be) exceed the total of its annual export or inland standard tonnage (as the case may be) for the year; or
 - (b) Whenever any increase or variation of the annual export or inland standard tonnage of any undertaking has been or is being made for any reason during the year whether by virtue of sub-clause (1) of this clause or on a general revision or by a decision of the Courts or the arbitrator (as the case may be) or whenever any increase or variation has been or is being made in the quarterly output standard tonnage of the undertaking a revision of its quarterly export or inland standard tonnage for the same quarter may be made so as to allow for such increase or variation.

In carrying out any revision under this clause the Board shall have regard to any relevant matters of which they may have information.

- 22. The following further provisions shall apply to the revision of standard tonnages:—
 - (1) No variation of any standard tonnage shall be made upon any revision (whether general or individual) which in the opinion of the Board or the arbitrator as the case may be would result in an unfair or undue advantage to the owner in respect of whose undertaking the variation is contemplated.
 - (2) Subject to regard being had to any matters relevant to the determination—
 - (i) Any variation of export or inland standard tonnages (as the case may be) made upon any revision (whether general or individual) shall be so limited that the combined amount of the export standard tonnage and the inland standard tonnage shall always be less than the output standard tonnage in respect of the undertaking concerned.
 - (ii) Any variation of the export or inland standard tonnage (as the case may be) made otherwise than contemporaneously with, or in accordance with a variation of the output standard tonnage shall be accompanied by an equivalent variation in the opposite direction of the export standard tonnage or the inland standard tonnage respectively as the case may be.
 - (iii) In default of or save in so far as the Board may think fit to accede to any application for revision of the annual or quarterly export standard tonnage or annual or quarterly inland standard tonage of any undertaking made contemporaneously with an application for revision of the annual or quarterly output standard tonnage thereof, any revision of the annual or quarterly output standard tonnage of such undertaking shall, unless other relevant matters appear, be accompanied by such a revision of the annual or quarterly (as the case may be) export and inland standard tonnages of such undertaking that the same shall respectively bear the same proportion to the annual or quarterly (as the case may be) output standard tonnage of such undertaking as so revised as they respectively bore thereto before such revisions.
 - (3).—(i) An application for a revision of standard tonnage shall only be entertained if made within such time and in such manner as shall from time to time be prescribed by the Board or (unless and until otherwise prescribed by the Board) if made in writing and in the case of an annual standard tonnage at least two calendar months before the commencement of the year for which it is desired that the revised annual standard tonnage shall be operative, and in the case of a quarterly standard tonnage at least 28 days before the commencement of the quarter for which it is desired that the revised quarterly standard tonnage should be operative.
 - (ii) In revising any standard tonnage of an undertaking the Board may consider all the other standard tonnages of that undertaking at the same time.
- 23.—(1) Subject as herein provided where an owner ceases to own a coal mine, or where he disposes of any coal mine or part thereof, then the whole or such portion of the standard

tonnages of his undertaking as may be determined by the Board shall cease and shall be deducted from the existing standard tonnages of his undertaking which comprised the coal mine or of which the coal mine was part.

(2) Subject as herein otherwise provided, where an owner abandons or permanently closes down all the coal mines in his undertaking then the standard tonnages of the undertaking which comprised those coal mines shall cease.

(3) Where an owner who has abandoned or permanently closed down all his coal mines has prior to the commencement of the Scheme entered into an agreement with another owner for the control of his undertaking or the control of his output therein for a period which was limited to continue for not less than two years from the commencement of the Scheme, or where the undertaking of any owner who abandons or permanently closes down all his coal mines is, as to not less than two thirds thereof, controlled by another owner, then the standard tonnages of the said undertaking may remain for such time as the Board may from time to time determine.

(4).—(a) In the case of the acquisition of a coal mine or undertaking the standard tonnages thereof shall be added to the existing standard tonnages (if any) of the acquiring owner and deducted from the standard tonnages (if any) of the transferring owner.

(b) In the case of the acquisition of part only of a coal mine or undertaking such proportions of the standard tonnages thereof shall be added to the acquiring owner's existing standard tonnages (if any) as shall be determined by the Board, and those amounts shall be deducted from the standard tonnages of the coal mine or undertaking part of which has been so acquired.

(c) Before any such addition to standard tonnages of an acquiring owner as aforesaid the Board may require the transferring owner, or the acquiring owner, or both of them to produce evidence satisfactory to the Board of the acquisition of such mine or undertaking or of part thereof.

REGULATION OF OUTPUT AND SUPPLY: QUOTAS.

25. The Board may from time to time estimate the respective amount of:—

(a) output of coal,

(b) coal for export supply,

(c) coal for inland supply,

and if thought desirable or necessary for each class of coal in the district in respect of any period.

The said estimates may be made for any purpose under the Scheme, or for the purpose of complying with the requirements of the Central Council under the Central Scheme.

26. Before the beginning of each quarter or other period determined by the Central Council the Board may submit to the Central Council an application for allocations in respect of the said period and the Board may at any time and from time to time apply to the Central Council for an increase in any allocation for the remainder of the period of the allocation on the ground that such increase is necessary by reason of the demand for coal or coal for export supply or coal for inland supply or any class thereof as the case may be being in excess of that for which the provision is made in the allocation made to the district

for the period in question or for any other reason which may appear to the Board to be sufficient.

27. In making any estimates for the purpose of an application to the Central Council for an allocation the Board shall have regard in the case of coal for export supply and coal for inland supply respectively to the prospective demand for the coal or of the class of coal as the case may be and in the case of the output of coal have regard to the output necessary or likely to be required in order to allow the production of such a quantity of coal as will satisfy such demand for coal for export supply or for inland supply and will also make allowance for coal needed for working the mines or undertakings and coal supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mines and the dependants of persons who have been so employed; and the Board may in addition have regard to the extent to which stocks of coal on the ground from coal mines in the district may require to be disposed of.

28.—(i) The Board shall proceed to determine the quotas of the quarterly standard tonnages which each of the undertakings in the district is to be allowed to produce or supply as the case may be during the period for which the allocations are operative or for such part of such period as the Board may think fit (hereinafter called "the allocation period") and where a standard tonnage has been determined for any separate class of coal the Board may fix a separate quota as respects that class.

(ii) The quotas and the period for which they are fixed shall be determined by the Board with regard to the prospective demand for the coal to which those quotas relate.

(iii) In determining any quota and the period thereof the Board may withhold from distribution as quota a part of the corresponding allocation, and may at their discretion subsequently distribute any part of such allocation so withheld in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.

29. The Board may from time to time during the allocation period increase any quota as and when they think fit; provided that all quotas determined by the Board shall be so calculated that during the period covered by the allocations those several allocations respectively shall not be exceeded.

30. The quota fixed as respects coal or any separate class of coal shall be the same proportion of the corresponding standard tonnage for all undertakings or (as the case may be) for all undertakings producing that same class of coal in the district, and the tonnages of coal or of any separate class of coal allowed to be produced or supplied from such undertakings by the owners thereof respectively during any allocation period are referred to in the Scheme as the "quotas" of the respective owners

32. No owner shall produce or supply as the case may be more coal or more coal of any separate class in any allocation period than his quota for that period of coal or of that separate class, except

(a) under any arrangement made under the provisions of clause 33 of the Scheme; (b) in the case of the output quota to the extent allowed by Section 4 of the Act in respect of any production of coal in any contract satisfying (in the judgment of the Board or in the event of arbitration the arbitrator) the requirements imposed by that Section,

and any owner acting in contravention hereof shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in clause 50 of the Scheme.

TRANSFERS OF QUOTAS.

- 33.—(1) Arrangements may be made by any two owners in the same class whereby the output or export supply or inland supply of coal or any class of coal from the undertaking of one owner may exceed the quota in respect thereof in any period where the other owner has agreed, whether for valuable consideration or not, to limit the corresponding output of or tonnage supplied from his undertaking to a tonnage lower than the quota in respect thereof by an amount not less than the tonnage by which such first mentioned quota is exceeded.
- (2) If the output of or tonnage supplied from any undertaking exceeds any limit so agreed then for the purposes of Clause 50 of the Scheme, the corresponding quota shall be deemed to be exceeded by the amount of the excess over such limit.
- (3) Owners making any such arrangement as aforesaid shall give notice in writing to the Board within three days of the arrangement being made and in any case before the end of the allocation period.

DEDUCTION OF EXCESSES FROM SUBSEQUENT QUOTAS.

34. Where any owner produces an output of coal or any class of coal or supplies coal or any class of coal for export supply or inland supply in excess of his corresponding quota for any period the Board may at their discretion during such succeeding period as they may decide reduce the corresponding quota of that undertaking by the amount of the excess, but without prejudice to any penalty that may have been incurred by reason of the excess.

CALCULATION OF OUTPUT AND SUPPLY.

- 35.—(i) Where a separate standard tonnage or quota has been provided for or fixed in respect of any class of coal then the references herein to output standard tonnage, export standard tonnage or inland standard tonnage, quota, output, tonnage supplied, disposals, excess or deficiency shall be deemed to mean the standard tonnage, quota, output, tonnage supplied, disposals, excess or deficiency as respects that class of coal.
- (ii) For the purpose of calculating any excess or deficiency of output or supply, or any quota applicable thereto, adjustments shall be made as provided in the Scheme, whether in respect of quota transferred from one owner to another, or in respect of excesses produced or supplied in one allocation period falling to be deducted from the following allocation period, or as the case may be.
- 37. The Board may amend the classification adopted or the minimum prices fixed in respect of any class of coal in the event of being so

- directed by the Central Council in pursuance of their powers under the Central Scheme and the Board may also vary such classification and minimum prices adopted from time to time and at such times and for such reasons as appear to them to be relevant whether or not in pursuance of any direction of the Central Council.
- 41. With a view to ascertaining whether any coal has been sold below the minimum price for the time being in force, any owner who claims to have sold or delivered any coal at a price other than an f.o.b. price for shipment coal or a pithead price for coal other than coal for shipment shall furnish to the Board through any officer or servant of the Board full details of the costs and charges actually incurred, and also in the case of sales made in pursuance of a contract details of the costs and charges which at the time the contract was made might reasonably have been expected to be incurred which fall to be deducted from the price in order to arrive at the f.o.b. or the pithead price, as the case may be, for the purpose of comparison with the appropriate minimum price, and where coal is sold at a price including wagon hire, the amount of the wagon hire shall be calculated by taking the amount which would have been charged therefor had the coal been carried in wagons owned by the Railway Company.
- 42. With a view to ascertaining whether in the case of any shipment of coal sold otherwise than f.o.b. the coal has been sold below the minimum price for the time being in force, the additional costs and charges (including the freight, insurance and other charges) to be deducted from the price charged to the buyer shall not be less than those which, at the time the contract was made, might reasonably have been expected to be incurred.
- 44. No owner shall ship or cause to be shipped any cargo of coal otherwise than in pursuance of a bona fide contract for the sale thereof at a price fixed before the time of shipment, not heing a price lower than the minimum price for the time being in force for the class or classes of coal contained in such cargo for shipment, and any owner committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to the penalties provided in Clause 50 of the Scheme.
- 45. Any owner who proposes to sell or supply any coal in respect of which no minimum price has been determined shall immediately and in any case before selling or supplying or entering into any contract to sell or supply that class of coal, deliver to the Board a notice giving particulars of that class of coal to enable the Board to determine a minimum price in respect thereof.

RETURNS.

- 46.—(1) The Executive Board may require the owners to send to the Board or to any person nominated by them such returns, accounts and information as the Board may consider necessary for the operation of the Scheme.
- (2) Without prejudice to the generality hereof and unless otherwise required by the Board each owner shall within 10 days after the end of each allocation period forward to the Board a statement in writing in such form

as the Board may prescribe duly certified by the owner or his agent or manager, and if the Board so desires, by the accountant of the owner giving full particulars of his output of coal and of the tonnage of coal supplied for export supply and for inland supply respectively in the allocation period together with any further particulars necessary for ascertaining any excess or deficiency as compared with the corresponding quota.

49. In case any owner fails to supply information required under the Scheme in respect of his undertaking or any output or supply of coal therefrom the Board may itself estimate as near as possible the information which should have been supplied by the owner, and in particular the Board may exercise such powers for making estimates for the purpose of determining any standard tonnage for the undertaking or any quota, or for the purpose of estimating the output of coal or the tonnage of coal supplied for export supply or for inland supply in any period, or for the purpose of levying contributions upon the owner or for any other matter for which such powers ought reasonably to be exercised. Such powers may be exercised without prejudice to the penalties incurred by the owner for any breach or breaches of any of the provisions of the

PENALTIES.

- 50. The following penalties shall be payable by any owner contravening or failing to comply with the Scheme, that is to say:
 - (i) For exceeding any quota of output or quota of coal for export supply or inland supply respectively such penalties as may from time to time be specified in rules made by the Board and published or notified to the owners before the commencement of the allocation period in respect of which they are to be enforced. Provided that different amounts of penalty per ton or part of a ton may be imposed in respect of exceeding different quotas. Until the Board specify the penalties by rules the following provisions shall apply:
 - (a) There shall be ascertained in respect of each owner the number of tons whereby the tonnage of coal (or of any class thereof as the case may be) supplied for export supply and for inland supply from his undertaking exceeds the respective quotas thereof and any excess tonnages so ascertained shall be added together and shall be compared with the amount whereby the output of coal (or of that class thereof) produced from the undertaking is in excess of the output quota of coal or of that class, and the penalites shall be calculated on the greater of the said two amounts in respect of coal or of each class of coal.
 - (b) If there is no excess output but an excess only over a quota for inland supply or for export supply or over both the penalty shall be calculated on the aggregate number of tons whereby the said several quotas are exceeded.
 - (c) The said penalty shall be at the rate of 2s. 6d. per ton or part of a ton of the excess so ascertained.
 - (ii) Any owner who shall commit a breach of Clauses 43 or 44 hereof or who allows any

- such sale disposal or shipment as is specified in the said Clauses shall pay to the Board a penalty at the rate of 2s. 6d. per ton in respect of every ton so sold supplied disposed of or shipped.
- 51.—(1) (i) Any owner who omits to render to the Executive Board any return or information required by or prescribed by the Board under the provisions of the Scheme, or who omits to render or supply information relative to any contract under Section 4 of the Act which may be required by the Executive Board and after notice in writing from the Secretary fails to furnish such return or information within the three days next following the date of such notice shall pay to the Executive Board on demand the following penalties:
 - a penalty of £10 a day for the first seven days during which the offence continues and a further penalty of £20 a day for any day after the first seven days for which the offence continues
- (ii) For the purpose of calculating the amount of any penalty payable under the provisions of this sub-clause the default shall be regarded as commencing on the first day after the expiration of the said three days next following the date of such notice as aforesaid.
 - (2) (i) Any owner who either:
 - (a) knowingly or wilfully makes a return incorrect or insufficient in any particular; or
 - (b) makes a return incorrect in any material particular shall pay to the Executive Board on demand a penalty of £10 a day for the first seven days during which the offence continues and a further penalty of £20 a day for any day after the first seven days during which the offence continues.
- (ii) For the purpose of this sub-clause the offence shall be deemed to take place upon the day upon which the said return is received by the Executive Board and shall be deemed to continue thereafter until such time as the said return is corrected by the owner.
- (3) The Board may for good reason shown remit the whole or any part of any penalty so incurred.
- 53. If any owner contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of the Scheme for which a penalty is not otherwise expressly provided herein he shall be liable to a penalty of £50 and to a further penalty of £20 for each day the contravention or failure occurs or continues.

Provided that the Board may for good cause shown remit the whole or any part of any penalty so incurred.

54. Penalties shall be paid immediately after notification by the Board to the owner of the amount thereof.

Provided that no proceedings in default of payment of any such penalty shall be commenced until a period of seven days shall have elapsed from the date of notice of the penalty being given, and in the event of an application being made within that period by the owner upon whom the penalty is imposed, that the matter be referred to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme, no such proceedings as aforesaid shall be commenced unless and until the arbitrator shall

have made his award, or until the owner shall have withdrawn his claim or reference, or within the time prescribed by the Scheme or the Executive Board hereunder have failed to prosecute his claim or proceed with the reference.

THE DISTRICT FUND.

- 57.—(i) All the property of the Board shall be vested in the Trustees. All contributions levies penalties and other monies received by the Board or by any person on behalf of the Board in connection with the administration of the Scheme shall form a fund to be called the District Fund and shall be paid into a bank in the names of the Trustees. Provided that such reasonable sums as the Board may decide may be left outstanding in the hands of any officer of the Board for such purposes as may be authorised.
- (ii) The administration and control of the District Fund shall be directed by the Board and the Trustees may and shall if so directed by the Board authorise any committee or person nominated by the Board to operate any banking account. Provided that all cheques drawn on any account so operated shall be signed by such person and in such manner as the Board or committee may direct.
- 58. There shall also be included in the District Fund on and after the 1st January 1935:—
 - (a) All monies or property standing to its credit at that date under the former provisions of the Scheme.
 - (b) Any balance of monies received and not distributed by payment of compensation to owners under clauses 50 and 54 of the former provisions of the Scheme.
 - (c) All monies whether from levies or by collection of penalties from the owners received after the 1st January 1935 even if so received under or by virtue of the former provisions of the Scheme.
- 59. There shall be paid out of the District Fund such expenses as the Board or any other persons on behalf of the Board may properly incur in the exercise or performance of their functions under the Scheme, and there shall also be paid out of the District Fund such amounts necessary to defray any penalties imposed on the District under the provisions of the Central Scheme.
- 60. For the purpose of meeting any expenses duly approved by the Executive Board the Trustees or such committee or persons duly authorised by them may draw cheques on the District Fund.

SAVINGS.

85. Notwithstanding the amendments of the Scheme effected pursuant to the Amendment Order or contemporaneously with the amendments so effected the former provisions of the Scheme shall remain in full force and effect so far as shall be necessary for the purpose of regulating the output and minimum prices of coal or any class of coal from undertakings in the District for any period prior to the 1st January 1935 and for the purpose of ascertaining the amount of and recovering penalties in accordance with such provisions in respect of any breaches thereof occurring prior to the 1st January 1935.

THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

11.—(ii) On a poll every owner shall have one vote for the first one thousand tons of his annual output standard tonnage in operation in the year in which the meeting is held and one further vote for each thousand tons over and above the first one thousand tons.

Provided than any owner whose standard tonnage aforesaid is less than one thousand tons shall have one vote.

Provided also that in case of any owner entitled to attend and vote at any meeting but in respect of whom the annual output standard tonnage has not been determined then his output for the year 1st October 1933 to the 30th September 1934 shall be taken.

THE COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE SHROPSHIRE DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, it is provided that any Scheme may be amended with the approval of the Board of Trade in manner provided by the Scheme;

And whereas in pursuance of powers conferred upon them by subsection (4) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Board of Trade have made the Shropshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1934, which provides that the Shropshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may be amended so as to provide for certain matters specified in the Schedule to the said Order in substitution for certain matters mentioned in the said Section 3;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 33 of the said Scheme (inter alia) that any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme shall be operative from such date as may be prescribed by the Board of Trade;

And whereas in pursuance of the said Clause 33 the amendments of the said Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act hereby approve the amendments of the Shropshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto and prescribe the 1st day of January, 1935, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force:

Provided that where under the said Scheme as amended the Executive Board are empowered to make any determination or to obtain any information which is necessary or expedient for bringing the said Scheme as amended into operation on the said 1st day of January, and any owner is required to furnish such information to the Executive Board, the provisions of the said Scheme as amended in

relation to the matters aforesaid shall come into force on the 31st day of October, 1934.

SCHEDULE.

THE SHROPSHIRE DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930, (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended as follows:-

- 1. Clause 2 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:-
 - (i) At the end of the definition of "Coal Mine" there were added the words "and includes undertaking ";
 - (ii) the definition of "District Allocation" were deleted;
 - (iii) at the end of the Clause there were added the following paragraphs, that is to say:-
 - "Allocation" means any allocation made to the District for any period under the provisions of the Central Scheme;
 - "Export Supply" means loading at the customary shipping places of the District as cargo into ships for conveyance therein to destinations outside the United Kingdom, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Manand the Channel Islands, or as fuel for use on ships proceeding to such destinations or as fuel for use on fishing vessels or supply to works situated at ports to be used for the preparation of patent fuel for export;
 - "Inland Supply" means supply otherwise than as export supply including supply to other parts of an undertaking of which the coal mine forms part, but excluding supply for use in working the coal mines and supply free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed.
 - "The customary shipping places of the District" means any port declared from time to time by the Board to be a customary shipping place.
- 2. Clause 5 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertakings" in paragraph (1) thereof were deleted wherever those words occur.
- 3. Clause 39 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:-
 - (i) the word "output" were inserted after the word "annual";
 (ii) the words "or mines" were deleted
 - wherever those words occur.
- 4. Clause 35 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "except for the purposes of Clauses 38 to 45 (inclusive) of the Scheme" were inserted after the word "classification".

- 5. Clause 37 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or mines" were deleted.
- 6. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 38 and 39 of the Scheme, that is to say:-
 - "38.-(1) Before the first day of December, 1934, and subsequently in the month of December in each year, the Board shall determine for every coal mine the annual standard tonnage for that coal mine in respect of-
 - (a) output of coal,
 - (b) coal for export supply, and
 - (c) coal for inland supply.
 - (2) The Board may, if they think fit, further distribute the standard tonnages so determined for any such mine among the various classes of coal (determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied) produced therefrom:

Provided that such distribution of the standard tonnages among classes of coal shall have effect for all coal mines producing those classes of coal or any of them.

- (3) The first standard tonnages thus determined shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1935, and subsequently such standard tonnages shall come into force on the 1st day of January in each year.
- 39. In every determination of standard tonnages, the Board shall have regard to the special circumstances of every coal mine (including the efficiency and economy of the working of the coal mine, the extent to which it has been developed or is being developed for economic working, and the extent to which its output has been increasing or decreasing) and in the case of the first determination of standard tonnage in respect of output of coal or any class of coal the proportion which the output of the coal mine bore to the output of the District during the year ended the 30th day of September, 1934, and, in the case of the first determination of standard tonnage in respect of coal or any class of coal for export supply, or for inland supply, the proportion which the tonnage of coal or that class of coal supplied from the coal mine for export supply or for inland supply, as the case may be, bore to the total tonnage of coal or that class of coal, supplied from all the coal mines in the District for export supply or for inland supply during the year ended the 30th day of September, 1934.**
- 7. Clause 40 of the Scheme shall have effect
 - (i) The following paragraph were substituted for paragraph (1) of that Clause, that is to say:-
 - "(1) For the purpose of assisting the Board in the determination of such standard tonnages, every owner shall furnish to the Board upon notice given to him by the Board a statement in writing giving any information which the Board may require for that purpose and every owner may submit to the Board, together with a statement so required, a claim in writing (together with the evidence necessary to substantiate the same) for consideration

- to be given to the special circumstances of his coal mine in the determination of such standard tonnages."; and
- (ii) the words "coal mine" were substituted for the words "mine or undertaking" where those words appear in paragraph (2) of that Clause.
- 8. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 41 of the Scheme, that is to say:—
 - "41. When annual standard tonnages have been determined by the Board for any coal mine and the owner thereof desires that any such annual standard tonnage shall be distributed in unequal monthly quantities, such owner shall notify the Board of the manner in which he desires such annual standard tonnage to be distributed and if the Board shall be satisfied that the suggested distribution is not prejudicial to the interests of other owners they shall accordingly divide such annual standard tonnage into monthly standard tonnages which shall not be alterable during the then current year unless such annual standard tonnage has been varied. For the purposes of this Clause a year shall be deemed to end on the 31st December."
- 9. Clause 42 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—
 - (i) the words "any standard tonnage" were substituted for the words "the standard tonnage";
 - (ii) the words "the standard tonnages" were substituted for the words "the tonnage";
 - (iii) the word "thereof" were deleted.
- 10. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 44, 45, 46, 47, 48 and 49 of the Scheme, that is to say:—
 - "44. The Board may at any time review whether or not at the request of an owner any standard tonnage and determine such revised standard tonnage as may seem to the Board fair and proper having regard to the special circumstances of the coal mine.
 - 45. Where after the commencement of the Scheme an owner purchases or otherwise acquires any coal mine the standard tonnages of the coal mine so acquired added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner, shall constitute the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking and on any subsequent determination of standard tonnages, such combined undertaking shall be treated in the same way as if the standard tonnages so constituted were the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking under the last previous determination of standard tonnages for the District:

Provided that where an owner purchases or otherwise acquires part only of an undertaking in respect of which standard tonnages have been determined under the Scheme, the proportion of each of the standard tonnages to be added to the corresponding standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner shall be determined by the Board, and the amounts so determined shall be deducted from the standard tonnages of the undertaking of which part has been so acquired.

Determination of Quotas.

- 46.—(1) The Board shall, from time to time, determine the proportions (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as "the quotas") of the standard tonnages of each coal mine that may be produced therefrom or which may be supplied by the owner thereof as the case may be.
- (2) If separate standard tonnages have been determined by the Board for any class or classes of coal, the Board may, if they think fit, determine a separate quota for any or all of such classes of coal.
- (3) Quotas shall be determined for such period as the Board may decide within the period of the allocation to which such quotas relate and shall be notified by the Board to all the owners not less than seven days before the commencement of the period to which they relate.
- (4) The quotas and the periods for which they are fixed shall be determined by the Board having regard among other matters to the prospective demand for the coal to which those quotas relate.
- (5) Any quota determined shall be the same proportion of the corresponding standard tonnage for all coal mines.
- (6) All quotas shall be so calculated that during no period for which allocations have been fixed by the Central Council shall any of such allocations be exceeded.
- (7) The Board may at any time after the determination of quotas increase any quota so however that the tonnage of coal permitted to be raised or supplied as the case may be under any allocation made to the District shall not be exceeded. Any such increase shall be notified to all the owners affected thereby in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.
- 47. Every owner shall forward to the Secretary within seven days after the end of each period for which quotas are determined a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe giving in respect of such period full particulars of the output of his coal mine, the tonnage of coal disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively and the output or supply as the case may be of any class of coal for which a separate quota has been determined. The Board may require such other particulars, as, in their opinion, may be necessary for ascertaining whether any quota for the coal mine has been exceeded.
- 48. No owner shall be entitled, in the event of the output of or the supply of coal or any class of coal from his coal mine falling short of the tonnage permitted by the relevant quota in the period for which such quota has been determined, to carry forward the amount of such shortage or any portion thereof as an addition to the tonnage permitted under any quota during any succeeding period:

Provided that if the quotas are fixed for a period of one month only, an owner shall be entitled, in the event of the output of or supply of coal from his coal mine in any month falling short of the tonnage permitted by the relevant quota for that month, to carry forward the amount of the shortage (being the difference between the tonnage permitted by such quota allowing for any arrangement under Clause 49 of the Scheme whereby a quota may be exceeded, and the actual output of or tonnage of coal supplied from the coal mine during the month) as an addition to the tonnage permissible under the corresponding quota during the next succeeding month. No shortage shall be carried forward at the end of the period of the allocation to which such quota relates.

- 49. Arrangements may be made by any two owners whereby the output or export supply or inland supply of coal or any class of coal from the coal mine of one owner may exceed the quota in respect thereof in any period where the other owner has agreed, whether for valuable consideration or not, to limit the corresponding output of or supply from his coal mine to a tonnage which is less than the quota in respect thereof by a tonnage not less than the tonnage by which such first mentioned quota is exceeded. If the output of or supply from any coal mine exceeds any limit so agreed, for the purposes of Clauses 76 and 77 of the Scheme the corresponding quota shall be deemed to be exceeded by the amount of the excess over such limit.'
- 11. Clause 72 of the Scheme shall have effect as 1f the words "or undertaking" were deleted.
- 12. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 76 and 77 of the Scheme, that is to say:—
 - "76.—(1) Any owner who, during any period for which a quota is determined, raises or allows to be raised an output of coal or any class of coal or supplies or allows to be supplied a tonnage of coal or any class of coal for export supply or for inland supply in excess of the corresponding quota (after allowing for any shortage carried forward under Clause 48 of the Scheme and any arrangement under Clause 49 of the Scheme whereby a quota may be exceeded) shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty in respect of each ton or part of a ton of such excess of the same amount per ton as is prescribed for the time being under rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme for exceeding the corresponding allocation:

Provided that

(i) until the coming into force of such rules the penalty shall be 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) per ton;

- (ii) where in any period for which quotas have been determined a quota for output of coal or any class of coal has been exceeded and any quota for export supply or inland supply of coal or that class of coal has also been exceeded one penalty only shall be payable in respect of such excesses calculated upon the amount of the excess over the quota for output or the excess over the quota or the sum of any excesses over quotas for supply, whichever shall be the greater.
- (2) The Board shall before the coming into force of any rules made under Clause XI

of the Central Scheme notify each owner of the amount per ton which will be payable in consequence thereof for exceeding any queta.

- 77. In addition to any monetary penalty payable under the last preceding Clause, where output of coal or any class of coal or inland supply or export supply of coal or any class of coal is in excess of the corresponding quota for any period, the corresponding quota for the coal mine of the owner concerned may be reduced at the discretion of the Board by the amount of the excess during such succeeding period as the Board may determine."
- 13. Clause 78 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.
- 14. Clause 79 of the Scheme shall have effect as if in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (1) the word "output" was inserted before the word "standard".

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT BY COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF BOTANISTS (INCLUDING ASSISTANT KEEPER, JODRELL LABORATORY) IN THE ROYAL BOTANIC GARDENS, KEW.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Application for appointment shall be made in the first instance to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Ministry. When a vacancy occurs, the Ministry will cause notice to be given by an advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

2. A candidate for the post of Botanist must have attained the age of 25 and must not have attained the age of 35 on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications; provided that in reckoning age for this purpose a candidate who served in the Army, Navy or Air Force between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918, may deduct from his actual age any period of service between the 4th August, 1914, and the 31st December, 1919.

3. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—

- (a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.
- (b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.
- (c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

4. Until further notice preference will be given to candidates who served in His Majesty's Forces during the War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

5. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 6. Candidates should be Honours graduates of British Universities and have had, since graduating, at least two years' experience either of work in Systematic Botany or of research work in one or more of the following botanical subjects:—Morphology, Physiology, Ecology, Genetics, Economic Botany, Cryptogamic Botany. Candidates must also produce evidence of ability to translate from French and German.
- 7. The completed application forms will be scrutinised by the Ministry and selected candidates will be interviewed by a Board consisting of representatives of the Ministry and of the Civil Service Commissioners. The Board will recommend to the Ministry for appointment to the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, provided they find so many suitable.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's previous work.

8. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed on probation, subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible for appointment in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and to the payment of a fee of £4.

Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

9. The retention of Botanists will be conditional on the Ministry being satisfied as to their conduct and capacity.

10. Service as Botanist will be probationary for a period of two years on the completion of which the Botanist will be eligible for consideration for appointment to the established staff. Appointment to the established staff is conditional on the issue by the Civil Service Commissioners of a Certificate of Qualification. A fee of £4, being the balance of the prescribed fee of £8, is payable before the Certificate of Qualification can be issued.

MILK ACT, 1934.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, have certified the Cheese-Milk price for the month of November, 1934, as required by Subsection 2 of Section 4 of the Milk Act, 1934, in the following terms:—

Certification of Cheese-Milk Price.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 4 cf the Milk Act, 1934 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is provided that for the purposes of the Act the cheese-milk price for any month shall be the excess over one penny three farthings of the average of the prices per pound at which cheese such as is commonly known at the commencement of the Act as "New Zealand Finest White" and "Canadian Finest White" was sold wholesale in Great Britain during the immediately preceding month;

And whereas by Sub-section (2) of the said Section the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, are required to certify as soon as may be after the beginning of September, 1934, and of each subsequent month falling before April, 1938, the cheese-milk price for that month;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, hereby certify that the cheese-milk price for the month of November, 1934, is 4.04 pence per pound.

The method by which the cheese-milk price for the month as certified above has been computed is as follows:—

(i) The range of price quotations in respect of sales by wholesale of "New Zealand Finest White" cheese and of "Canadian Finest White" cheese, as published by the London Provision Exchange, Ltd., for each of the periods ended at 11.30 a.m. on each of the Fridays in the preceding month, has been examined.

(ii) The average of the mean prices for the two kinds of cheese has been ascertained for each of the said periods, exceptional quotations being disregarded. The average of the periodic averages so ascertained has then been calculated to two places of decimals and expressed in pence per pound.

(iii) From the figure thus obtained one penny three farthings has been subtracted and the balance gives the figure certified

above.

And whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department, and the Secretary of State for

Scotland, acting jointly, being the Appropriate Department in this case, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter, are satisfied that the application of the aforesaid provisions of Article 1 of the said Order to whole carcases of frozen mutton and frozen lamb imported before the 7th January, 1935 (the date on which the said Order will come into force) is likely to cause hardship to the said persons.

Now therefore the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department, and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3, hereby direct as follows:—

1. Without affecting the operation of the provisions of the said Article 1 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 7 Order, 1934, requiring an indication of origin on importation, the provisions of the said Article 1 requiring an indication of origin on sale or exposure for sale shall not apply to whole carcases of frozen mutton and frozen lamb before the 28th February, 1935.

2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 3), 1934.

have a substantial interest in the matter that the application of the provisions of the Order or of some of those provisions to any particular class or description of those goods has caused or is likely to cause injury or hardship to the said persons or any of them, the Department may direct that the Order or any particular provisions of the Order shall cease to apply to goods of that class or description or shall apply to such goods subject only to such modifications and conditions as the Department think fit, and the Order shall, while the Direction is in force, have effect subject thereto.

And whereas it is provided by Article 1 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 7 Order, 1934,* that it shall not be lawful to import (among other things) any frozen pork or to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom (among other things) any imported frozen pork unless such meat bears an indication of origin; and by Article 2 of the said Order that the indication of origin shall be branded, or stamped, stencilled or printed in ink or stain, durably and conspicuously, in letters which shall except as therein provided be not less than one-half of an inch in height; and by Paragraphs III and IV of Article 3 of the said Order that the indication of origin required on importation shall be applied as follows, that is to say-

III. In the case of frozen pork, each carcase shall bear the indication of origin on each side of the carcase on the outer side of the leg, loin, fore-end (spare-rib and blade-bone) and hand-and-spring, composing four marks on each side in the position shown in the diagram, Figure III, in the Schedule to the Order.

IV. Except where any portion of a carcase of frozen pork is one of the forms of meat specified in the next following paragraph of the Order, each portion of any such carcase shall bear such markings indicative of origin as it would have borne if it had formed part of a complete carcase of such meat which had been marked in the manner hereinbefore in the Article prescribed.

and by Paragraph I of Article 4 of the said Order, that the indication of origin required on sale and exposure for sale, whether wholesale or by retail, shall be applied as follows, that is to say—

I. In the case of frozen pork, in like manner as on importation.

And whereas it is provided by Article 7 thereof that the said Order shall come into force at the expiration of six months from the date thereof and the said Order will accordingly come into force on the 7th January, 1935.

And whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, being the Appropriate Department in this case, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter, are satisfied that the application of the aforesaid provisions of Articles 3 and 4 of the said Order to certain portions of carcases of frozen pork, namely, frozen loins of pork from which the skin has been removed prior to importation, is likely to cause hardship to the said persons.

Now therefore the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3 hereby direct as follows:-

aforesaid provisions of Paragraph IV of Article 3 and Paragraph I of Article 4 of the Order shall not apply to loins of frozen pork from which the skin has been removed prior to importation; and

2. The provisions of Paragraph V of Article 3 and Paragraph II of Article 4 shall apply to such meat as though the description "loins of frozen pork from which the skin has been removed prior to importation " had been added to the forms of meat specified in these paragraphs.

3. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 4), 1934.
