A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING, SO FAR AS IT RELATES TO OUR DOMINION OF NEW ZEALAND, THE PROCLAMATION OF THE 1ST AUGUST, 1896, APPLYING PARTS OF THE COINAGE ACT, 1870, TO THE COLONIES NOW FORMING THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA AND TO NEW ZEALAND.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas by virtue of a Proclamation of Her Majesty Queen Victoria dated the 1st day of August, 1896, (hereinafter called "the Proclamation") certain parts of the Coinage Act, 1870, (in this Proclamation referred to as "the Act") as amended by section two and the schedule of the Coinage Act, 1891, were applied, with the modifications specified in the

Proclamation, to the Colonies of New South Wales, South Australia, Tasmania, Victoria, Queensland and Western Australia, and to New Zealand:

And whereas by virtue of the Act, it is lawful for Us, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to revoke any Proclamation previously made under the Act:

And whereas provision respecting the currency of Our Dominion of New Zealand is made by an Act of the Parliament of New Zealand entitled the Coinage Act 1933 and Our Ministers in Our Dominion of New Zealand have requested that the said Proclamation be revoked:

Now, therefore, We, with the advice of Our Privy Council in pursuance of the Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain, as follows:—

1. The Proclamation so far as relates to Our Dominion of New Zealand is hereby revoked and accordingly the Act shall cease to apply to and to be in force in New Zealand.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the New Zealand (Coinage) Proclamation 1934.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this ninth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and in the twenty-fifth year of Our Reign.

tion as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Saviour, Stockport, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint George, Stockport, in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester:

“Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint George, Stockport, and of the New Parish (sometime District) of Hall Street, Stockport, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint George, Stockport, and of the said New Parish of Hall Street, Stockport, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Saviour, Stockport, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of Chester, as such Bishop and also as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Hall Street, Stockport, and as one of the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint George, Stockport, and with the consents of Geoffry Christie-Miller, of Stapeley House, Nantwich, in the said County of Chester, Esquire, of Henry Green, of Langdale, Davenport Park, Stockport aforesaid, Solicitor, of William Astle, of Langley, Carr Wood Avenue, Bramhall, in the said County of Chester, Esquire, and of John William Shaw, of Barrington, Broadway, Bramhall, aforesaid, Esquire, as the remaining Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint George, Stockport (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint George, Stockport, and of the said New Parish of Hall Street, Stockport, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Saviour, Stockport, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Saviour, Stockport'.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Saviour, Stockport, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint George, Stockport, in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester, which is bounded upon the south and upon the south east by the New Parish of Saint Thomas, Norbury, upon the east by the New Parish (sometime District) of Hall Street, Stockport, both in the said County and Diocese and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north west and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Hall Street, Stockport, from the said New Parish of Saint George, Stockport, at a point in the middle of Dialstone Lane opposite to the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Christy's Playing Fields, and extending thence south westward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the north eastern side of Castle Farm Lane, and extending thence first south westward to and then south eastward along the middle of Castle Farm Lane for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north eastern end of the wall or fence forming the south eastern boundary of the premises attached to the house known as Castle Farm and extending thence south westward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the north eastern end of Lake Street, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Lake Street for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with

Buxton Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Buxton Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Woods Moor Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Woods Moor Lane for a distance of 33 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Moorland Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Moorland Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Cromley Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Cromley Road and the roadway in continuation thereof for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such roadway across the New Mills and Heaton Mersey Branch Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the footpath leading into Bridge Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of Bridge Lane, and extending thence southward in a straight line for a distance of 7 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Bridge Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Stockport, from the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Norbury.

"II. And also all the contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Hall Street, Stockport, which is bounded upon part of the east and upon part of the south west by the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Norbury, upon the remaining part of the south west and upon the west by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint George, Stockport, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the remaining part of the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Stockport, from the said New Parish of Hall Street, Stockport, at the junction of Dialstone Lane with Lisburne Lane, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Lisburne Lane for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the place where the boundary of the Parliamentary Borough of Stockport diverges southward from following the south eastern side of Lisburne Lane, and extending thence southward to and along such Parliamentary Borough boundary for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Hall Street, Stockport, from the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Norbury."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chester.

“Whereas District Chapelries have been assigned to each of the Churches of Saint Laurence, Catford; Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee; and Saint Andrew, Catford; and separate Districts for spiritual purposes have been constituted by the names of Saint Swithun, Hither Green, Lewisham, and Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, by the Orders in Council, the dates of which are stated in the third column of the following Table:—

“And whereas the District Chapelries and the Districts named in the foregoing Table have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parishes should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, of the said New Parish of Saint Swithun, Hither Green, Lewisham, of the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee, of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, and of the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, and of the said New Parish of Saint John,

Southend, Lewisham, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford; (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Swithun, Hither Green, Lewisham; and (thirdly) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, and of the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee, which are described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham.

“And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

" The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark, comprising:—

" I. All that portion of the New Parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon part of the west and upon the south by the New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, in the said County and Diocese, upon the east and upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, and upon the remaining part of the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, from the said New Parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, at the junction of Sandhurst Road and Inchmery Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Inchmery Road for a distance of $12\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thornsbeach Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Thornsbeach Road for a distance of $10\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Newquay Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham.

" II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, which is bounded upon the north partly by the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, and partly by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, diverges eastward from following the middle of Thornsbeach Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Thornsbeach Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bellingham Road, and extending thence southward to and along the footpath leading to the Forster Memorial Park for a distance of $2\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the footbridge which carries such footpath across the stream which flows past the southern side of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Bellingham Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of such stream for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford.

Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mildred, Burnt Ash Hill, Lee, from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, at the centre of the bridge which carries the Tonbridge Line of the Southern Railway across Saint Mildred's Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Saint Mildred's Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, from the said New Parish of Saint Swithun, Hither Green, Lewisham.

" THE THIRD SCHEDULE.

" The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, and of the New Parish of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee, in the said County and Diocese, which taken together are bounded upon the south by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Bromley, in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, at the north-western corner of the close numbered 561 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Lee published in the year 1916 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Scheme or Representation and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the fence forming the northern boundary of the said close for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the western boundary of the said Tonbridge Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence first north-eastward to and then south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, from the said New Parish of Saint Mildred, Burnt Ash Hill, Lee, and crossing the boundary which divides the last named New Parish from the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee) for a distance of 62 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Baring Road across the said line of railway and extending thence southward along the middle of Baring Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Downham Way, and extending thence westward along the middle of Downham Way for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Galahad Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Galahad Road for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Launcelot Road, and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Launcelot Road for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Baring Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Baring Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Wear, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter, comprising:—

(ii.) For the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near the said roads or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land, or

(iii.) In connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads or the laying, alteration or repair in or near the said roads of any sewer or any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, or electricity, or any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports.
