

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon part of the west and upon the south by the New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, in the said County and Diocese, upon the east and upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, and upon the remaining part of the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, from the said New Parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, at the junction of Sandhurst Road and Inchmery Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Inchmery Road for a distance of  $12\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thornsbeach Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Thornsbeach Road for a distance of  $10\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Newquay Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, which is bounded upon the north partly by the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, and partly by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, diverges eastward from following the middle of Thornsbeach Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Thornsbeach Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bellingham Road, and extending thence southward to and along the footpath leading to the Forster Memorial Park for a distance of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the centre of the footbridge which carries such footpath across the stream which flows past the southern side of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Bellingham Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of such stream for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford.

"THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Swithun, Hither Green, Lewisham, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, which is bounded upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint Swithun, Hither Green, Lewisham, upon the north-east by the New Parish of Saint Mildred, Burnt Ash Hill, Lee, in the said County and

Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mildred, Burnt Ash Hill, Lee, from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, at the centre of the bridge which carries the Tonbridge Line of the Southern Railway across Saint Mildred's Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Saint Mildred's Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, from the said New Parish of Saint Swithun, Hither Green, Lewisham.

"THE THIRD SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, and of the New Parish of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee, in the said County and Diocese, which taken together are bounded upon the south by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Bromley, in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Southend, Lewisham, from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, at the north-western corner of the close numbered 561 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Lee published in the year 1916 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Scheme or Representation and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the fence forming the northern boundary of the said close for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the western boundary of the said Tonbridge Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence first north-eastward to and then south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Catford, from the said New Parish of Saint Mildred, Burnt Ash Hill, Lee, and crossing the boundary which divides the last named New Parish from the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee) for a distance of 62 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Baring Road across the said line of railway and extending thence southward along the middle of Baring Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Downham Way, and extending thence westward along the middle of Downham Way for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Galahad Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Galahad Road for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Launcelot Road, and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Launcelot Road for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Baring Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Baring Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which
