And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 18th day of October, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the Archdeaconries of Hampstead, London and Middlesex, all in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries of Hampstead, London and Middlesex, are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recom-

mend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first, a new Rural Deanery shall be formed within the said Archdeaconry of Hampstead and such new Rural Deanery shall be called 'The Rural Deanery of Hendon,' and shall comprise and consist of the Parishes or Cures of Hendon; Saint Peter, Cricklewood; Saint Jude, Hampstead Garden Suburb; Christ Church, Hendon; Saint Alphage, Hendon; Saint Michael and All Angels, Mill Hill; Saint Paul, Mill Hill; Saint Barnabas, Temple Fortune, and Saint John, West Hendon, all at present in the Rural Deanery of Hampstead, and the Parishes of Edgware, Kingsbury, and Little Stanmore (or Whitchurch) all at present in the Rural Deanery of Harrow; which said Rural Deaneries of Hampstead and Harrow are at present in the said Archdeaconry of Hampstead; secondly, the Rural Deanery of Finsbury and the Rural Deanery of Holborn shall be united and form one Rural Deanery within the said Archdeaconry of London and such new Rural Deanery shall be called 'The Rural Deanery of Finsbury and Holborn'; thirdly, the following Parishes at present in the Rural Deanery of Ealing, in the said Archdeaconry of Middlesex, shall be transferred to other Rural Deaneries in the same Archdeaconry, that is to say, the Parishes of (Saint Mary) Acton; (Saint Alban the Martyr, Acton Green; Saint Peter, Acton Green; Saint Thomas, Acton Vale; Saint Dunstan, East Acton; Saint Gabriel, North Acton; All Saints, South Acton; and Saint Martin, West Acton, to the Rural Deanery of Hammersmith and the Parishes of Heston; Hounslow; Saint Stephen, Hounslow; Saint Paul, Hounslow Heath; (All Saints) Isleworth; Saint John, Isleworth; All Souls, Saint Margarets-on-Thames, and Saint Mary, Spring Grove, to the Rural Deanery of Hampton; and fourthly, the Parish of Cranford shall be transferred from the said Rural Deanery of Hampton to the Rural Deanery of Uxbridge in the said Archdeaconry of Middlesex; and each of the Parishes or Cures hereinbefore referred to shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery to which it is hereby transferred, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notices of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act been transmitted to the Archdeacons affected by the Scheme, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of Hampstead, to the Archdeacon of London and to the Archdeacon of Middlesex, and they have severally expressed their approval of the same:
