WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 18th day of October, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Wear, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 23rd day of May, 1844, and published in the London Gazette on the 14th day of September, 1844, a Chapelry District was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Luke, situate at Wear in the Parish of Topsham, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Chapelry District was named 'The Chapelry District of Wear':

"And whereas the said Chapelry District of Wear has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Wear should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette

of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Wear shall be altered so that all those contiguous portions of the Parish of Heavitree and of the Parish of Saint Leonard, Exeter, both in the said County and Diocese, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dis-severed from such Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Wear.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Wear, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Heavitree and of the Parish of Saint Leonard, Exeter, both in the said County and Diocese, which taken together are bounded upon the south by the said New Parish of Wear, upon the south-west by the Parish of Alphington, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west, upon the north-east, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the River Exe where the boundaries of the said Parish of Saint Leonard, Exeter, of the said Parish of Alphington, and of the said Parish of Heavitree all meet, and extending thence north-eastward along the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Leonard, Exeter, from the said Parish of Heavitree for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary reaches the middle of Topsham Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Topsham Road for a distance of 8½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Barrack Lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Barrack Lane for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wonford Road, and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of Wonford Road for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Burnthouse Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Burnthouse Lane for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to the point where it turns south-westward, and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of Mincinglake Stream where such stream diverges westward from following the western side of Ludwell Lane, and extending thence first south-westward and then in various directions along the middle of such stream for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Heavitree from the said New Parish of Wear."
