PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of *Catshill*, in the County of *Worcester*, 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has under the provisions of the *Burial Act, 1853*, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that for the protection of the public health burials should be discontinued as follows, viz. :—

*Catshill*.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of *Catshill*, in the Civil Parish of *Bromsgrove*, and in the Old Churchyard attached thereto.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 20th day of December next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 20th day of December.

#### THE COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

#### THE MIDLAND (AMALGAMATED) DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, it is provided that any Scheme may be amended with the approval of the Board of Trade in manner provided by the Scheme;

And whereas in pursuance of powers conferred upon them by subsection (4) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Board of Trade

have made the Midland (Amalgamated) District (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1934, which provides that the Midland (Amalgamated) District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may be amended so as to provide for certain matters specified in the Schedule to the said Order in substitution for certain matters mentioned in the said Section 3;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 26 of the said Scheme (inter alia) that any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme shall be operative from such date as may be prescribed by the Board of Trade;

And whereas in pursuance of the said Clause 26 the amendments of the said Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act hereby approve the amendments of the Midland (Amalgamated) District (Coal Mines) Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto and prescribe the 1st day of January, 1935, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force:

Provided that where under the said Scheme as amended the Executive Board are empowered to make any determination or to obtain any information which is necessary or expedient for bringing the said Scheme as amended into operation on the said 1st day of January, and any owner is required to furnish such information to the Executive Board, the provisions of the said Scheme as amended in relation to the matters aforesaid shall come into force on the 7th day of November, 1934.

#### SCHEDULE.

THE MIDLAND (AMALGAMATED) DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930, (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended as follows:—

FIRST:—The Scheme and the Schedule thereto shall have effect as if—

(i) the words "annual output standard tonnage" were substituted for the words "annual standard tonnage" wherever those words occur; and

(ii) the words "Sectional Tonnage" were substituted for the words "aggregate annual sectional standard tonnage" wherever those words occur.

SECONDLY:—Clause 2 of the Scheme shall have effect as if—

(i) Paragraph (f) thereof were deleted; and

(ii) there were added at the end of the Clause the following paragraphs, that is to say:—

(m) The expression "Sectional Tonnage" means the aggregate Annual Sectional Output Standard Tonnage fixed for each Section as provided in Clause 15 of the Scheme.

(n) "Export Supply" means loading at the customary shipping places of the District as cargo into ships for conveyance therein to destinations outside the United Kingdom, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands; or as fuel for use on ships proceeding to such destinations; or as fuel for use on fishing vessels; or supply to works situated at ports to be used for the preparation of patent fuel for export.

(o) "Inland Supply" means supply otherwise than as specified in paragraph (n) hereof, including supply to other parts of an undertaking of which the coal mine forms part; but excluding supply for use in working the coal mines and supply free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are, or have been, employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed.

(p) "The Customary Shipping Places of the District" means the Ports of Hull; Goole; Grimsby; Immingham; Boston; Keadby; King's Lynn; Middlesbrough; Liverpool (including Garston); Birkenhead (including Bromborough Dock); all shipping places on the Manchester Ship Canal; Preston; Ellesmere Port; Runcorn; Widnes; Fleetwood; and any other Port declared from time to time by the Executive Board to be a customary shipping place.

(q) "Coking Supply" means inland supply to coking plants (other than low temperature coking plants) to be used thereat in the manufacture of metallurgical coke whether such coke is supplied and used for metallurgical purposes or otherwise.

THIRDLY:—The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 15 and 16 of the Scheme that is to say:—

"Standard Tonnage Committee.

#### Interpretation.

15.—(1) In this Clause:—

"Coal Mine" includes undertaking;

"Section" in relation to Coalowners or Coal Mines means any of the Sections of the District enumerated in Clause 3 of the Scheme;

"Special Mine" means any coal mine whose circumstances are such as to make it unfair, in the opinion of the Standard Tonnage Committee or of the Executive Board, either to the owner thereof or to other Coalowners in the same Section, that an annual output standard tonnage should be determined therefor;

"Non-Special Mine" means any coal mine which is not a Special Mine;

"Special Circumstances" in relation to any coal mine means any special circumstances thereof including the efficiency and

economy of the working of the coal mine, the extent to which it has been developed or is being developed for economic working, the extent to which its output has been increasing or decreasing, and, in the case of a first determination of an annual output standard tonnage therefor, the proportion which the output of the coal mine bore to the output of the District during the period of twelve calendar months ended on the 31st day of March, 1928;

"Relevant Matters" in relation to determination of standard tonnages of any coal mine of coal or any class of coal for export supply or inland supply means all matters relevant to such determination including the proportions in which coal supplied from the coal mine has been disposed of for export supply and inland supply respectively either during some recent period as determined by the Executive Board or as laid down in the Scheme.

#### *Appointment of Standard Tonnage Committee.*

(2) (a) The Standard Tonnage Committee (in this Clause referred to as "the Committee") shall consist of representatives appointed by the Coalowners of the District in the following manner, that is to say:—

The Coalowners in each Section shall appoint one representative of the Section, and one additional representative, in respect of each ten million tons of Sectional Tonnage. Where there shall be a balance of Sectional Tonnage in excess of such ten million tons or any multiple thereof, one further additional representative shall be appointed in respect of such excess if the excess amounts to more than two-and-a-half million tons of Sectional Tonnage:

Provided that each Section shall in any event be entitled to not less than two representatives.

(b) The Coalowners of each Section shall, when appointing representatives upon the Committee, also appoint for each representative a substitute representative to attend meetings of the Committee in the absence of any such representative, and the appointment of such substitute representatives shall be made in the manner and upon the basis in this sub-clause prescribed for the appointment of representatives.

#### *Quorum.*

(3) A quorum at meetings of the Committee shall be eight representatives or substitute representatives representing not less than three of the Sections.

#### *Chairman of Committee.*

(4) The Executive Board shall appoint an independent person as Chairman of the Committee, and such Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Committee but shall have no right to vote.

#### *Voting.*

(5) Voting at meetings of the Committee shall be by show of hands.

#### *Functions of Standard Tonnage Committee.*

(6)—(a) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (c) and (d) of Clause 14 of the Scheme the functions of the Committee shall be those

laid down in this Clause and any other functions in relation to the determination of standard tonnages from time to time delegated to them by resolution of the Executive Board.

(b) If so authorised by the Executive Board the Committee may call for such Returns, information, and particulars from any one or more of the Coalowners in the District as may be necessary to enable the Committee properly to perform their functions.

#### *Method of fixing Sectional Tonnages.*

(7) The Sectional Tonnage of each Section severally shall be arrived at and fixed as follows, that is to say:—

(a) There shall be ascertained from every Coalowner in each Section the average annual output of each Non-Special Mine of the Coalowner situate in the Section during the following four years, that is to say:—

The year ended 31st December, 1923;  
The year ended 31st December, 1924;  
The year ended 31st December, 1925;  
The year ended 31st December, 1927.

(b)—(i) In each Section the aggregate of the average annual outputs ascertained as aforesaid shall, subject to any adjustment which may be agreed upon by the Coalowners of all Sections (such agreement to be expressed by Resolution of a Sectional Meeting in each Section as provided by Clause 8 of the Scheme) and to any variations under the subsequent provisions of this Clause, constitute the Sectional Tonnage of the Section.

#### *Right of arbitration in regard to Sectional Tonnages.*

(ii) Whether there shall have been a failure to agree upon any adjustment or not the Coalowners of any Section shall have the right to appeal annually to arbitration for a revision and adjustment of all the Sectional Tonnages. Notice in writing of any such appeal shall be given to the Secretary in the month of March in any year by the Secretary of the Section concerned, and the Executive Board shall thereupon cause the Secretary of each other Section to be informed of such notice of appeal and shall also arrange for the said revision and adjustment being referred to and determined by a single arbitrator sitting with a qualified Mining Engineer as assessor, such arbitrator and assessor to be appointed by unanimous vote of the Executive Board, and failing such unanimous vote then by the Lord Chief Justice of England.

(iii) The arbitrator shall give directions as to the procedure to be followed at the arbitration and after considering all evidence and particulars relating to the special circumstances of each Section submitted to him by the parties to the arbitration he shall award a Sectional Tonnage in respect of each of the five Sections.

(iv) The Sectional Tonnages as determined by award of an arbitrator as aforesaid shall come into operation as from the first day of May following the date of the notice of appeal and shall (except where

hereinafter otherwise specifically provided) be final and binding upon the Coalowners of every Section until further adjusted by agreement as aforesaid or by the award of an arbitrator hereunder.

(v) The Aggregate Annual Sectional Standard Tonnages in force immediately prior to the date when these amendments come into operation shall be deemed to be the Sectional Tonnages determined under the provisions of the Scheme until such time in the year 1935, as the procedure in this sub-clause (7) set forth relative to the determination and adjustment of Sectional Tonnages shall have operated.

*Annual Standard Tonnages.*

(c) There shall be determined for each Non-Special Mine in the several Sections:—

- (i) an annual output standard tonnage;
- (ii) an annual inland supply standard tonnage; and
- (iii) an annual export supply standard tonnage.

(d) The Executive Board may further distribute the standard tonnages so determined in respect of any class of coal determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry, or other category of consumer supplied:

Provided that—

- (i) any such distribution shall be made for all coal mines producing the class of coal concerned;
- (ii) in any distribution of output standard tonnages regard shall be had to the special circumstances of the coal mines; and
- (iii) in any distribution of supply standard tonnages regard shall be had to the relevant matters.

(e) As from the 1st day of January, 1935, the Committee shall determine a Monthly Coking Supply Standard Tonnage for every coal mine entitled thereto under the provisions of sub-clause (17) of this Clause.

*Annual Output Standard Tonnages. (Division of Sectional Tonnages.)*

(f) In order to determine the annual output standard tonnage of each Non-Special Mine in the several Sections the Sectional Tonnage of each Section respectively shall be divided by the Committee among the Non-Special Mines in the Section having regard to the special circumstances of each such Non-Special Mine, and the standard tonnages so determined shall come into force on the first day of January, 1935.

*Provisions for Appeal.*

(8) The annual output standard tonnages or any of them determined in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (f) of sub-clause (7) of this Clause shall, subject to the provisions of sub-clause (18) of this Clause, be reviewed, revised and varied only according to one or other of the two methods of Appeal Procedure set forth in sub-clauses (10) and (11) of this Clause.

*Selection of Appeal Procedure.*

(9) Prior to the 15th day of January, 1935, the Secretary of each Section shall convene a Meeting of the Coalowners of the section, and at such Meeting the Coalowners shall consider and vote upon the question whether the Section shall adopt the method of Appeal Procedure set forth in sub-clause (10) of this Clause (hereinafter referred to as "Appeal Procedure A") or that set forth in sub-clause (11) of this Clause (hereinafter referred to as "Appeal Procedure B"):

Provided that the method of voting shall be as laid down in Clause 8 of the Scheme and that unless votes representing at least 51 per cent. of the Sectional Tonnage of the Section are cast in favour of adopting Appeal Procedure A, the Coalowners of the Section shall be deemed to have adopted Appeal Procedure B on and from the date of the said meeting.

*Appeal Procedure A.*

(10) (a) If any Coalowner in a Section by which Appeal Procedure A has been adopted (in this sub-clause referred to as "the Section") is dissatisfied with the annual output standard tonnage of his coal mine he may request the Committee to make a revised division of the Sectional Tonnage of the Section and the Committee shall thereupon make such revised division unless they are of opinion that the request is unjustified. If any Coalowner in the Section is aggrieved by, or if the Committee shall refuse or fail to make, such revised division, the dissatisfied Coalowner or Coalowners may refer the matter to arbitration in the manner following, that is to say:—

The annual output standard tonnages of all the Non-Special Mines in the Section as then determined under the provisions of the Scheme shall be referred for revision to an independent arbitrator appointed either—

(i) by unanimous resolution of the Coalowners of the Section passed at a meeting to be called by the Secretary of the Section within ten days of notice of appeal being lodged with him by any dissatisfied Coalowner; or

(ii) failing such unanimous resolution by the President of the Incorporated Law Society.

Such arbitrator shall, if the Coalowners of the Section shall so decide by resolution passed in the manner in Clause 8 of the Scheme provided, sit with any Mining Engineer, Accountant, or other assessor or assessors as provided in the Resolution, such assessor or assessors to be appointed by unanimous resolution of the Coalowners of the Section, and failing such unanimous resolution the appointment shall be made on request of the Secretary of the Section in the following manner, that is to say:—

in the case of an assessor being a Mining Engineer, by the President of the Institution of Mining Engineers; in the case of an assessor being an Accountant, by the President of the Institute of Chartered Accountants; and in the case of any other assessor, by the President of the Incorporated Law Society.

*Notice of Reference.*

(b) Notice of the said reference and of the appointment of the arbitrator (and assessor or assessors if any) shall be given in writing by the Secretary of the Section to all the owners of Non-Special Mines in the Section and also to the Secretary and thereupon every such Coalowner shall be deemed to have objected to and to have referred the annual output standard tonnage of his coal mine to arbitration and shall have all the rights of a Complainant within the meaning of Clause 28 of the Scheme except as to the selection of an arbitrator or arbitrators.

*Arbitration and Award.*

(c) The arbitrator immediately upon appointment shall give directions as to the procedure to be followed and as to the method of conducting the arbitration and the provisions of paragraphs (a) (b) (c) and (d) of Clause 28 of the Scheme shall not apply to the arbitration. The arbitrator shall sit (with the assessor or assessors if any) and revise all the annual output standard tonnages of the Non-Special Mines in the Section so however that the aggregate of such revised annual output standard tonnages shall equal the Sectional Tonnage for the time being of the Section. After hearing any Coalowner who desires to appear before him, and considering any evidence which any Coalowner or the Committee or the Executive Board may submit, the arbitrator shall award the revised annual output standard tonnage of each Non-Special Mine in the Section and in so doing the arbitrator shall have regard to the special circumstances of every such Mine:

Provided that before making his award the arbitrator shall notify every Coalowner the annual output standard tonnage of whose coal mine he intends to reduce under his award of such intended reduction whereupon every such Coalowner shall have the right to submit to the arbitrator, within such period as the arbitrator shall prescribe, any further evidence in support of his claim to a larger annual output standard tonnage for his coal mine than that which the arbitrator has notified to the Coalowner.

*Duration of Award.*

(d) Such revised annual output standard tonnages when awarded shall be final and binding upon the Coalowners of the Section for a period of twelve calendar months calculated from the first day of the month following the date of the award of the arbitrator and during such period no Coalowner of the Section shall have any right of objection or appeal in respect of the annual output standard tonnage of his coal mine as so revised.

*Continued use of Appeal Procedure.*

(e) After the expiration of a period of twelve calendar months calculated from the first day of the month next following the date of any award of an arbitrator under Appeal Procedure A any Coalowner of the Section who is dissatisfied with the annual output standard tonnage of his Non-Special Mine shall have the right to request the Committee to make forthwith a revised division of the Sectional Tonnage of the

Section, whereupon the provisions of paragraphs (a) to (d) of this sub-clause shall again become applicable, and in the event of an appeal to arbitration thereunder the provisions of the last preceding paragraph of this sub-clause shall apply to the revised annual output standard tonnages as awarded by the arbitrator.

*Costs of Arbitration.*

(f) The costs of and incidental to any arbitration under Appeal Procedure A shall be in the discretion of the arbitrator who shall have power to award that the costs of all or any parties (including the fees and expenses of the arbitrator and assessor or assessors if any) shall be defrayed out of the District Fund; but any costs or expenses awarded to be paid by the Committee or the Executive Board shall in any event be payable out of the District Fund.

(g) In the event of an adjustment of the Sectional Tonnage of the Section under the provisions of sub-clause (7) of this Clause during any period of twelve calendar months referred to in paragraph (d) of this sub-clause the Committee shall immediately thereafter increase or reduce (as the case may be) all the annual output standard tonnages of the coal mines in the Section in the proportion which the annual output standard tonnage of each such coal mine bore to the Sectional Tonnage prior to the adjustment.

*Right to change Appeal Procedure.*

(h) The Coalowners of the Section shall have the right at the termination of any period of twelve calendar months calculated as hereinbefore in this sub-clause mentioned to decide by resolution passed in manner in Clause 8 of the Scheme provided to terminate their adoption of Appeal Procedure A and to adopt Appeal Procedure B in lieu thereof.

*Appeal Procedure B.**Objections to Annual Output Standard Tonnages.*

(11) (a) Any owner of a Non-Special Mine situate in a Section by which Appeal Procedure B has been adopted (in this sub-clause referred to as "the Section") shall have the right to submit an objection at any time to the Committee against the annual output standard tonnage determined by the Committee for such Mine and if he shall be aggrieved by any decision of the Committee either upon his objection or otherwise he shall have the right to appeal therefrom as hereinafter in this sub-clause provided.

*Appointment of Arbitrator.*

(b) The Coalowners of the Section may by unanimous resolution appoint an independent arbitrator to hear and determine all appeals against the annual output standard tonnages of the Non-Special Mines in the Section, and failing such unanimous resolution the appointment of the arbitrator shall be made by the President for the time being of the Incorporated Law Society.

*Appointment of Assessors.*

(c) The arbitrator shall if the Coalowners of the Section shall so decide by resolution passed in the manner in Clause 8 of the



Scheme provided, sit with any Mining Engineer, Accountant or other assessor or assessors as provided in the resolution, such assessor or assessors to be appointed by unanimous resolution of the Coalowners of the Section, and failing such unanimous resolution the appointment shall be made on request of the Secretary of the Section in the following manner, that is to say:—

In the case of an assessor being a Mining Engineer, by the President of the Institution of Mining Engineers; in the case of an assessor being an Accountant, by the President of the Institute of Chartered Accountants; and in the case of any other assessor, by the President of the Incorporated Law Society.

*Procedure at Arbitrations.*

(d) The provisions of Clause 28 of the Scheme except as to the selection of an arbitrator or arbitrators shall apply to all references to arbitration under this sub-clause.

(e) When revising or varying under this sub-clause the annual output standard tonnage of any Non-Special Mine the arbitrator shall have regard to the special circumstances thereof.

*Sectional Tonnage not to be Exceeded.*

(f) Any variation made either by the Committee or an arbitrator in the annual output standard tonnage of a Non-Special Mine situate in the Section shall take place within the limits of the Sectional Tonnage for the time being of the Section.

*Power to vary Output Standard Tonnages in certain cases.*

(g) The Committee shall have power at any time to review (whether upon objection by a Coalowner or not) and, if necessary, revise and vary the annual output standard tonnage of any Non-Special Mine situate in the Section and to fix a revised annual output standard tonnage therefor having regard to the special circumstances of such Mine.

(h) The Coalowners of the Section shall have the right at any time to decide by resolution passed in manner provided by sub-clause (9) of this Clause to terminate their adoption of Appeal Procedure B and to adopt Appeal Procedure A in lieu thereof.

*Fixation of Annual Supply Standard Tonnages.*

(12) The Executive Board shall determine an Annual Supply Standard Tonnage for every Non-Special Coal Mine in respect of—

- (i) Coal for Inland Supply; and
- (ii) Coal for Export Supply;

and such standard tonnages shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1935.

*Method of Fixing Annual Supply Standard Tonnages.*

(13) The method of determining annual supply standard tonnages for inland supply and export supply respectively shall be as follows:—

*Inland and Export Percentages.*

(a) The Executive Board shall first ascertain from each Owner of a Non-Special Mine—

- (i) the tonnage of the inland supply from the Mine, and

- (ii) the tonnage of the export supply from the Mine during the three years ended on 31st December, 1933.

The Executive Board shall then ascertain—

- (i) the percentage (herein called "Inland Percentage") which the inland supply formed of the inland supply and export supply combined from the Mine during such period; and

- (ii) the percentage (herein called "Export Percentage") which the export supply formed of the inland and export supply combined from the Mine during the same period.

The figures produced by applying these percentages to the annual output standard tonnage of the mine shall for the purpose of the first determination of inland and export supply standard tonnages constitute the "annual inland basic figure" and the "annual export basic figure" of the coal mine respectively.

*Output and Supply Percentage.*

(b) The Executive Board shall further ascertain from each Owner of a Non-Special Mine the percentage (herein called "Output and Supply Percentage") which the inland supply and export supply combined from the Mine during the twelve months ended on 31st December, 1933, formed of the total output of the Mine during the same period. The Executive Board shall apply the percentage so ascertained to the annual inland basic figure and the annual export basic figure of the Mine. The tonnage resulting from the application of the percentage to the annual inland basic figure of the Mine shall (subject to variation on application or appeal as hereinafter provided) be the annual inland supply standard tonnage of the Mine, and the tonnage resulting from the application of the percentage to the annual export basic figure of the Mine shall (subject to variation on application or appeal as hereinafter provided) be the annual export supply standard tonnage of the Mine.

(c) The inland percentage, the export percentage, and the output and supply percentage or any of them shall after determination under paragraphs (a) and (b) of this sub-clause be adjusted by the Executive Board as may be necessary in order to have regard to relevant matters in the determination of inland supply and export supply standard tonnages.

*Application for variation.*

(d) Each Coalowner shall be notified in writing by the Secretary as soon as practicable of the inland and export percentages, the output and supply percentage, and the annual inland and export supply standard tonnages respectively determined under paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this sub-clause for his Non-Special Mine, and within twenty-one days of the receipt of such notification any Coalowner may apply to the Executive Board for a variation of any or all of such percentages, and of the annual inland and export supply standard tonnages of his Mine by forwarding an Application in writing to the Secretary specifying the

grounds for variation, the relevant matters in support thereof, and the nature of the relief sought:

Provided that the Executive Board shall, for good cause shown, have the right to grant a reasonable extension of the said period of twenty-one days.

(e) The Executive Board shall consider such Application and the relevant matters (not excluding consideration of any other period in substitution for the period of three years specified in paragraph (a) of this sub-clause and also matters affecting other Non-Special Mines) and shall determine the variation (if any) to be made upon each respective Application in any or all of the said percentages and in the annual inland and export supply standard tonnages of the Mine in question:

Provided that in no case shall the Executive Board increase the annual output standard tonnage of any such Mine.

*Appeal to Arbitration.*

(f) If any Coalowner so applying shall be dissatisfied with the decision of the Executive Board upon his Application he shall have the right within twenty-one days from notification to him in writing by the Secretary of such decision to appeal therefrom to one or three (as he may elect) of the five arbitrators appointed for the five respective Sections under the provisions of sub-clauses (10) and (11) of this Clause:

Provided that the arbitrator or arbitrators shall, for good cause shown, have the right to grant a reasonable extension of the said period of twenty-one days.

Such arbitrator or arbitrators shall be appointed by unanimous resolution of the Executive Board, and failing unanimity the arbitrator or arbitrators shall be the one or three (as the case may be) whose name or names shall first be drawn in the presence of the Coalowner from a box containing slips of paper bearing the respective names of the five arbitrators, the drawing to be performed by a person authorised for the purpose by the Secretary. In arriving at a decision the arbitrator or arbitrators shall have regard to the relevant matters but shall make no increase in the annual output standard tonnage of the coal mine concerned, and the decision of the arbitrator or arbitrators shall be final and binding upon all parties.

*Annual variation of Output and Supply Percentage.*

(g) In the month of January in each year after 1935 the Executive Board shall ascertain from every Coalowner the percentage which the inland supply and export supply combined from his Non-Special Mine formed of the output of the Mine during the previous calendar year. Such percentage after any adjustment thereof by the Board necessary to have regard to the relevant matters shall be applied to the then existing annual inland and export basic figures of the Mine and the resulting figures shall be the annual inland supply standard tonnage and the annual export supply standard tonnage respectively for the Mine in respect of the ensuing twelve calendar months commencing on the first day of May.

*Applications for subsequent alterations of Percentages.*

(h) After the 30th June 1935 every Coalowner shall have the right to apply in writing to the Executive Board for an alteration of the inland and export percentages of his Non-Special Mine not more than once in each calendar quarter; and for an alteration of the output and supply percentage of such Mine not more than once in each calendar half-year. Any application for variation of the inland and export percentages shall be made in writing to the Secretary within fourteen days from the commencement of a calendar quarter, and any application for variation of the output and supply percentage shall be made in writing to the Secretary within twenty-one days from the commencement of a calendar half-year. The Board after considering any such application and the relevant matters shall determine the alteration (if any) to be made in the percentage or percentages in respect of which the application is made. In the event of an alteration in the percentage or percentages of any Non-Special Mine the altered percentage or percentages shall be applied to the then existing annual output standard tonnage or to the annual inland and export basic figures (as the case may be) of such Non-Special Mine and the Board shall thereby determine the annual inland supply standard tonnage and the annual export supply standard tonnage for the Mine in lieu of those then in existence.

*Appeals in respect of Percentage alterations.*

(i) If any Coalowner shall be dissatisfied with the decision of the Executive Board upon any application made under the provisions of paragraph (h) of this sub-clause he shall have the same rights of appeal to arbitration as are provided in paragraph (f) of this sub-clause and the decision of the arbitrator or arbitrators shall be final and binding upon all parties:

Provided that in arriving at any decision the arbitrator or arbitrators shall make no increase in the annual output standard tonnage of the coal mine concerned.

*Alteration of Output and Supply Standard Tonnages.*

(j) In the event of an alteration at any time in the annual output standard tonnage of any Non-Special Mine the Executive Board in order to determine the annual inland and annual export basic figures respectively of such Mine shall apply to such altered annual output standard tonnage the inland and export percentages as last previously determined for the Mine; and in order to determine the annual inland and annual export supply standard tonnages of such Non-Special Mine shall apply to the annual inland and annual export basic figures of the Mine as so determined the output and supply percentage as last previously determined for the Mine.

*Revision of Supply Standard Tonnages.*

(k) The Executive Board shall have power at any time to review, revise or vary any or all of the annual supply standard tonnages and to determine such revised annual supply

standard tonnages as they shall deem fair and proper having regard to the relevant matters:

Provided that in arriving at any such determination no increase shall be made in the annual output standard tonnage of any coal mine.

*Monthly allocations of Annual Standard Tonnages.*

(14) (a) (i) Every Owner of a Non-Special Mine shall, not later than the 15th day of December, 1934, declare by notice in writing to the Secretary the monthly proportions in which he requires the Committee to allocate the respective annual standard tonnages of his Non-Special Mine over the twelve months ending on 30th April, 1935, and if the Committee shall be satisfied that such declared allocations are not prejudicial to the interests of other Coalowners they shall fix the monthly allocations so declared as the respective monthly standard tonnages of such Mine.

(ii) Every Owner of a Non-Special Mine shall during the month of April, 1935, and thereafter in the month of April in each year declare by notice in writing to the Secretary the monthly proportions in which he requires the Committee to allocate the respective annual standard tonnages of his Non-Special Mine over the twelve months of the ensuing year commencing on the first day of May, and if the Committee shall be satisfied that such declared allocations are not prejudicial to the interests of other Coalowners they shall fix the monthly allocations so declared as the respective monthly standard tonnages of such Mine.

(iii) If any Coalowner shall fail to declare allocations or shall declare allocations which the Committee shall report to the Executive Board as being prejudicial to the interests of other Coalowners, the Executive Board shall have power to determine the allocations or any of them for such Coalowner or to amend the declared allocations or any of them and fix the same as so determined or amended as the monthly standard tonnages of the Non-Special Mine concerned:

Provided that the Executive Board shall, before so determining or amending the allocations of any such Coalowner cause not less than ten days' previous notice in writing of their intended action to be given to him by the Secretary within which time such Coalowner may make representations in the matter to the Executive Board.

(iv) After the Committee or the Executive Board (as the case may be) shall have fixed the monthly standard tonnages of any Non-Special Mine, the same shall not be altered by the Coalowner concerned except with the sanction of the Committee or the Board and in such manner as may be so sanctioned or in pursuance of the provisions of paragraph (b) of this sub-clause.

(b) If any annual standard tonnage of a Non-Special Mine shall be varied under the provisions of the Scheme during any period of twelve calendar months commencing on 1st May the Coalowner concerned shall within one calendar month of such variation declare the monthly proportions in which

he requires the Committee to allocate such varied annual standard tonnage and all the provisions of sub-paragraphs (ii), (iii) and (iv) of paragraph (a) of this sub-clause shall then apply.

*Standard Tonnages of acquired Mines.*

(15) If a Coalowner of any Section shall purchase or otherwise acquire a Non-Special Mine situate in any other Section such Coalowner shall, with the approval of the Executive Board, be entitled to the standard tonnages of the Non-Special Mines so acquired.

*Standard Tonnages of Special Mines.*

(16) (a) (i) Prior to the commencement of each calendar month the Committee shall determine a monthly output standard tonnage and also a monthly inland supply standard tonnage and a monthly export supply standard tonnage for every Special Mine in respect of such month.

(ii) The Committee shall also determine for each Special Mine concerned a standard tonnage in respect of any distribution of output or supply standard tonnages which may be determined by the Executive Board under the provisions of sub-clause (7) of this Clause in respect of any class of coal.

(iii) In determining output standard tonnages under this Clause the Committee shall have regard to the special circumstances of the Special Mine concerned; and in determining supply standard tonnages the Committee shall have regard to the relevant matters.

*Appeals in respect of Monthly Standard Tonnages of Special Mines.*

(b) Any Coalowner owning a Special Mine who shall be aggrieved by any decision of the Committee under the foregoing provisions of this sub-clause shall have the right to appeal therefrom to the arbitrator appointed under sub-clause (10) or (11) (as the case may be) of this Clause for the Section in which his Special Mine is situate and the decision of such arbitrator shall be final and binding.

*Annual Standard Tonnages fixed for Special Mines.*

(c) The Committee may at any time determine that a Special Mine shall be re-classified as a Non-Special Mine and shall thereupon determine for such re-classified Mine—

(i) an annual output standard tonnage having regard to the special circumstances of such mine;

(ii) inland and export percentages, an output and supply percentage, and annual inland and export supply standard tonnages having regard to the relevant matters.

(d) Within one month of notice of such determinations being given by the Secretary to the Coalowner concerned the Coalowner may refer the determination to re-classify the Mine or the determination of standard tonnages therefor under paragraph (c) of this sub-clause to the arbitrator appointed under sub-clause (10) or (11) (as the case

may be) of this Clause in respect of the Section in which the Special Mine is situate, and the decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on all parties.

(e) After any such re-classification such Mine shall for all the purposes of the Scheme be regarded as a Non-Special Mine, and the relevant provisions of this Clause shall thereafter apply to any revision of the respective standard tonnages determined in respect of such Mine.

(f) Any monthly output standard tonnage determined in respect of a Special Mine under this sub-clause shall not form part of the Sectional Tonnage of the Section in which such Special Mine is situate.

#### *Additions to Sectional Tonnages.*

(g) Upon the re-classification of a Special Mine any annual output standard tonnage determined or awarded under this sub-clause shall be added to the then existing Sectional Tonnage of the Section in which such Special Mine is situate.

(h) The Committee may at any time determine that a Non-Special Mine shall be re-classified as a Special Mine whereupon the respective annual standard tonnages determined therefor shall be cancelled and the amount of the annual output standard tonnage of the Mine shall be deducted from the Sectional Tonnage of the Section in which such Mine is situate.

(i) Within one month of notice of any determination under paragraph (h) of this sub-clause being given by the Secretary to the Coalowner concerned the Coalowner may refer the determination to the arbitrator appointed under sub-clause (10) or (11) (as the case may be) of this Clause in respect of the Section in which the Non-Special Mine is situate and the decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on all parties.

(j) The Committee shall also determine a monthly coking supply standard tonnage for every Special Mine entitled thereto under the provisions of sub-clause (17) of this Clause.

#### *Monthly Coking Supply Standard Tonnage.*

(17) (a) The Committee shall be furnished not later than seven days prior to the expiration of each calendar month by every Coalowner concerned with an estimate of the tonnage of coal which having regard to the relevant matters he requires for coking supply from his coal mine during the immediately succeeding calendar month (hereinafter called "month of fixation"). Such estimated tonnage shall be deemed to be the coking supply standard tonnage of the coal mine for the month of fixation.

(b) The Committee shall have power to revise and vary in respect of any month the estimates or any of them furnished by the Coalowners concerned regard being had on such revision or variation to the relevant matters; and in every such case the estimate as so revised or varied shall be deemed to be an estimate furnished by the Coalowner concerned for the purposes of this sub-clause.

(c) In the case of any coal mine which has a coking supply standard tonnage the balance of monthly inland supply standard

tonnage of the mine remaining after deduction of the coking supply standard tonnage of the Mine shall be deemed to constitute the inland supply standard tonnage of that coal mine for the month of fixation for all the purposes of the Scheme.

#### *Representations by District Committee of Investigation.*

(18) Nothing in this Clause shall be so construed as to prevent the Executive Board, the Committee, or an arbitrator from giving effect to any representations made by the Committee of Investigation for the District, and if the annual output standard tonnage of any Non-Special Mine shall be increased in consequence of any such representations the amount of such increase shall be added to the Sectional Tonnage of the Section in which such Mine is situate.

#### *Consideration of Special Circumstances.*

(19) Whenever under the provisions of the Scheme it is required that regard shall be had to the special circumstances of any coal mine, such special circumstances shall be considered in relation to the coal mine itself and also the other coal mines in the Section in which the coal mine is situate.

#### *Assistants to the Committee.*

(20) The Executive Board, or the Committee with the authority of the Executive Board, shall have power to engage any person or persons to assist them in carrying out any of their functions under this Clause.

#### *Arbitrators and Assessors to be Independent Persons.*

(21) (a) Any arbitrator or assessor appointed under this Clause shall be an independent person not financially interested in the ownership or working of any coal mine or any concern comprising coal mines situate in the District; and no person shall be so appointed who is acting in a secretarial or advisory capacity to any association or other body for regulating the production supply or sale of coal.

(b) The appointment of any arbitrator or assessor appointed under sub-clauses (10) or (11) (as the case may be) of this Clause may be terminated at any time by three months' notice in writing given by the Secretary of the Section concerned pursuant to a resolution of the Coalowners of the Section to that effect passed in manner in Clause 8 of the Scheme provided.

(c) After any such resolution has been passed another arbitrator or assessor (as the case may be) shall be appointed in the manner provided in sub-clauses (10) or (11) (as the case may be) of this Clause and the appointment of such arbitrator or assessor shall take effect as from the date on which the notice given to his predecessor shall expire.

(22) Wherever in this Clause a Coalowner in any Section is entitled to refer any determination of the Executive Board or the Committee to arbitration by the arbitrator appointed for his Section under the provisions of sub-clauses (10) or (11) (as the case may be) of this Clause and no procedure is specified for the conduct of the arbitration

then the provisions of paragraphs (c) and (d) of Clause 28 of the Scheme shall apply.

(23) The Executive Board shall at any time if so authorised by a Resolution of the Coalowners of each Section duly passed as provided in Clause 8 of the Scheme take over and perform all the functions of the Standard Tonnage Committee prescribed for that Committee under this Clause and in such event as from a date to be fixed by Resolution of the Executive Board the Standard Tonnage Committee shall cease to function and their appointment and constitution as a Committee hereunder shall be entirely terminated.

#### *Quota Committee.*

16. (a) In this Clause the expression "Coal Mine" includes undertaking.

(b) The Quota Committee shall be constituted and appointed in the manner and upon the basis set forth in Clause 15 of the Scheme with regard to the constitution and appointment of the Standard Tonnage Committee:

Provided that the Executive Board shall appoint not more than five of their own number as additional Members of the Quota Committee.

#### *Independent Chairman of Committee.*

(c) Voting at meetings of the Quota Committee shall be by show of hands and a Chairman shall be appointed from the Members at each Meeting but when so required by any Member there shall preside as Independent Chairman one of the Members (sitting in rotation as far as may be) of the Panel of Arbitrators constituted under Clause 28 of the Scheme, and such Independent Chairman shall have power to decide any question relative to the determination of quotas on which the Members of the Quota Committee present at any meeting shall not arrive at a unanimous decision:

Provided that such Independent Chairman may not act as arbitrator in any reference to arbitration arising out of his decision.

#### *Quorum.*

(d) A Quorum at meetings of the Committee shall be eight members representing not less than three of the Sections hereinbefore referred to.

#### *Functions of Quota Committee.*

(e) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (c) and (d) of Clause 14 of the Scheme the functions of the Quota Committee shall be—

(i) To determine in respect of each month the proportions (herein called "Quotas") of the various monthly standard tonnages which may be produced at or supplied from each coal mine in that month. The tonnages produced by applying the quotas to the respective monthly standard tonnages are hereinafter referred to as "quota tonnages";

(ii) To determine at their discretion any monthly quota in advance for more than one month but not for more than each of three succeeding months;

(iii) During any period for which any quota shall have been determined to increase such quota as may be necessary for

such period or part of the period as the Committee shall prescribe;

(iv) If so authorised by the Executive Board, to call for such returns, statements, or other information as, in the opinion of the Committee, will assist them in arriving at their determinations.

#### *Determination of Quotas.*

(f) Each quota shall in every month be expressed as a uniform percentage of the corresponding monthly standard tonnage fixed in respect of the particular month for each coal mine:

Provided that—

(i) All quotas shall be so calculated that during any period in respect of which allocations shall have been fixed for the District by the Central Council such allocations or any of them shall not be exceeded;

(ii) The quotas fixed and the periods for which they are fixed shall be determined having regard to the prospective demand for the coal to which each quota relates and to any other circumstances which in the opinion of the Committee are material or relevant.

(g) The Coalowners shall be notified of all quotas not later than the day preceding the first day of the month to which such quotas apply, and in the case of any increase thereof shall be notified of such increase forthwith.

(h) The expressions "Monthly Permitted Output" and "Monthly Permitted Supply" as applied to coal or any class of coal or coal for inland supply or coal for export supply or any class thereof (as the case may be) respectively mean—

(i) Quota tonnage derived from the corresponding standard tonnage; and

(ii) Quota tonnage derived from the corresponding standard tonnage carried forward month by month under the provisions of sub-clause (j) of this Clause:

Provided that in calculating Monthly Permitted Outputs and Monthly Permitted Supplies account shall be taken—

(i) Of Quota tonnage pooled under the provisions of sub-clause (h) of this Clause; and

(ii) Of any excess tonnages debited against a coal mine under the provisions of Clause 18 of the Scheme.

#### *Shortages to be carried forward.*

(j) (i) In the event of the output of coal or any class of coal or the supply of coal or any class of coal for inland supply or export supply from the coal mine of any Coalowner in any month falling short of the monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply (as the case may be) of the coal mine in such month the Coalowner concerned shall be entitled to carry forward the amount of the shortage (being the difference between the monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply, and the corresponding actual output or tonnage of coal supplied from the coal mine during the month) for raising or supply (as the case may be) in subsequent months. No shortages shall be carried forward beyond the 30th day of April in any year:

Provided that the Executive Board shall have power to authorise any Coalowner to carry forward his shortage or any part thereof as existing at 30th April in any year whether of output or supply if the Executive Board shall be satisfied that such shortage has arisen from a strike or stoppage at the coal mine of the Coalowner concerned caused by a trade dispute or from an accident or breakdown at such coal mine but in any event no shortage carried forward under this proviso shall be carried forward beyond a period of twelve months and shall be spread over the period in such proportions as the Executive Board shall determine.

(ii) In the event of the monthly quota tonnages of any Special Mine not being raised at or supplied from such mine in any month the shortage shall be wholly cancelled and not otherwise dealt with.

(iii) Accumulated shortage in the hands of any Coalowner at 31st December, 1934, shall be carried forward by the Coalowner as being shortage derived from output quota tonnage and in order to arrive at the corresponding shortage of inland and export supply quota tonnage the tonnage of the shortage of output quota shall have applied to it the inland and export percentages and the output and supply percentage of the Coalowner concerned; but no shortage shall be carried forward beyond 30th April, 1935.

#### *Pooling of Quota Tonnage.*

(k) (i) Arrangements may be made by any two Coalowners whereby any monthly permitted output or any monthly permitted supply from the coal mine of one Coalowner may be exceeded in any case where the other Coalowner has agreed, whether for valuable consideration or not, to limit the corresponding monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply from his coal mine to a tonnage which is less than such monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply (as the case may be) of that coal mine by a tonnage not less than the tonnage by which such first-mentioned monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply is exceeded. If the monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply affected exceeds any limit as so agreed then for the purposes of Clause 18 of the Scheme the corresponding monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply shall be deemed to be exceeded by the amount of the excess over such limit.

(ii) Notice in writing of any Arrangement to exceed and reduce monthly permitted outputs and monthly permitted supplies under this Clause must be given to the Secretary by the parties thereto within twenty-four hours of the making of the arrangement."

FOURTHLY.—The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 18 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

#### *"Penalties for Exceeding Quotas.*

18.—(1) (i) Any Coalowner who, during any period for which a quota is determined, raises or allows to be raised an output of coal or any class of coal or supplies or allows to be supplied a tonnage of coal or any class of coal for export supply or for inland

supply in excess of the corresponding monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply for his coal mine or undertaking shall (subject to the provisions of Section 4 of the Act) pay to the Trustees on demand by way of penalty a sum in respect of each ton of such excess of the same amount per ton as is prescribed for the time being under rules made under Clause XI. of the Central Scheme for exceeding the corresponding allocation:

Provided that—

(a) until the coming into force of such rules the rate of penalty shall be three shillings per ton;

(b) if any such excess is not more than one per centum above the corresponding monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply (as the case may be) no penalty shall be payable.

(ii) The Executive Board shall before the coming into force of any rules made under Clause XI. of the Central Scheme notify each Coalowner of the amount per ton which will be payable in consequence thereof for exceeding any monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply.

(2) The Executive Board shall have power to reduce or cancel (as the case may be) any penalty incurred by a Coalowner under this Clause in respect of an excess over monthly permitted output where such excess shall in the opinion of the Board have been solely and entirely caused by necessity on the part of the Coalowner concerned to raise the excess output in order to be in a position to provide his supply of any category of supply quota tonnage (other than inland supply) in any month in which the quota for such category of supply quota tonnage (other than inland supply) shall be higher than the quota fixed for inland supply in that month.

(3) All penalties payable under this Clause shall forthwith be collected by the Trustees from the Coalowner or Coalowners so indebted and the amounts so collected shall be paid into and become part of the District Fund.

(4) Whether or not any monetary penalty shall be payable under this Clause any tonnage in excess of any monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply shall be carried forward and debited against the corresponding monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply of the coal mine or undertaking of the Coalowner concerned in such subsequent month or months as the Quota Committee shall decide:

Provided that if any penalty payable by a Coalowner in respect of an excess of monthly permitted output shall have been cancelled or reduced under the provisions of sub-clause (2) of this Clause the tonnage in respect of which the amount of the reduction or cancellation of penalty was payable shall not be carried forward or debited under this sub-clause.

(5) If there shall be any tonnage in excess of any monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply at any Special Mine as defined in Clause 15 of the Scheme in any month such excess may at the discretion of the Coalowner concerned be pooled with the

corresponding monthly permitted output or monthly permitted supply of other coal mines (not being Special Mines) belonging to the same Coalowner."

FIFTHLY.—Clause 28 of the Scheme shall have effect as if

(i) in paragraph (a) thereof the words "and for which no other method of arbitration is hereinbefore specifically provided" were inserted after the word "Scheme", and

(ii) the following paragraph were substituted for paragraph (b) thereof, that is to say:—

"(b) (i) Any Coalowner who is aggrieved (hereinafter referred to as "the Complainant") by any act or omission of the Executive Board or of any Committee or other persons in respect of their functions under the Scheme shall (subject to the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Clause) be entitled to refer the matter for decision to one or more (but not exceeding three) of the arbitrators constituting the Panel of Arbitrators for the District. The arbitrator or arbitrators shall be appointed by agreement between the Complainant and the Executive Board, and failing agreement slips bearing the respective names of all the arbitrators on the Panel shall be placed in a box and the arbitrator or arbitrators whose name or names shall be first drawn in the presence of the Complainant from the box shall be deemed to be appointed the arbitrator or arbitrators (as the case may be) in the cause the draw to be made by some person authorised by the Secretary for the purpose.

(ii) By agreement between the Executive Board and the Complainant any matter in dispute falling to be dealt with by arbitration under this Clause instead of being referred to arbitrators selected or drawn from the Panel in manner hereinbefore provided may be referred to a sole arbitrator or to three arbitrators whether selected from the Panel or not as may be agreed."

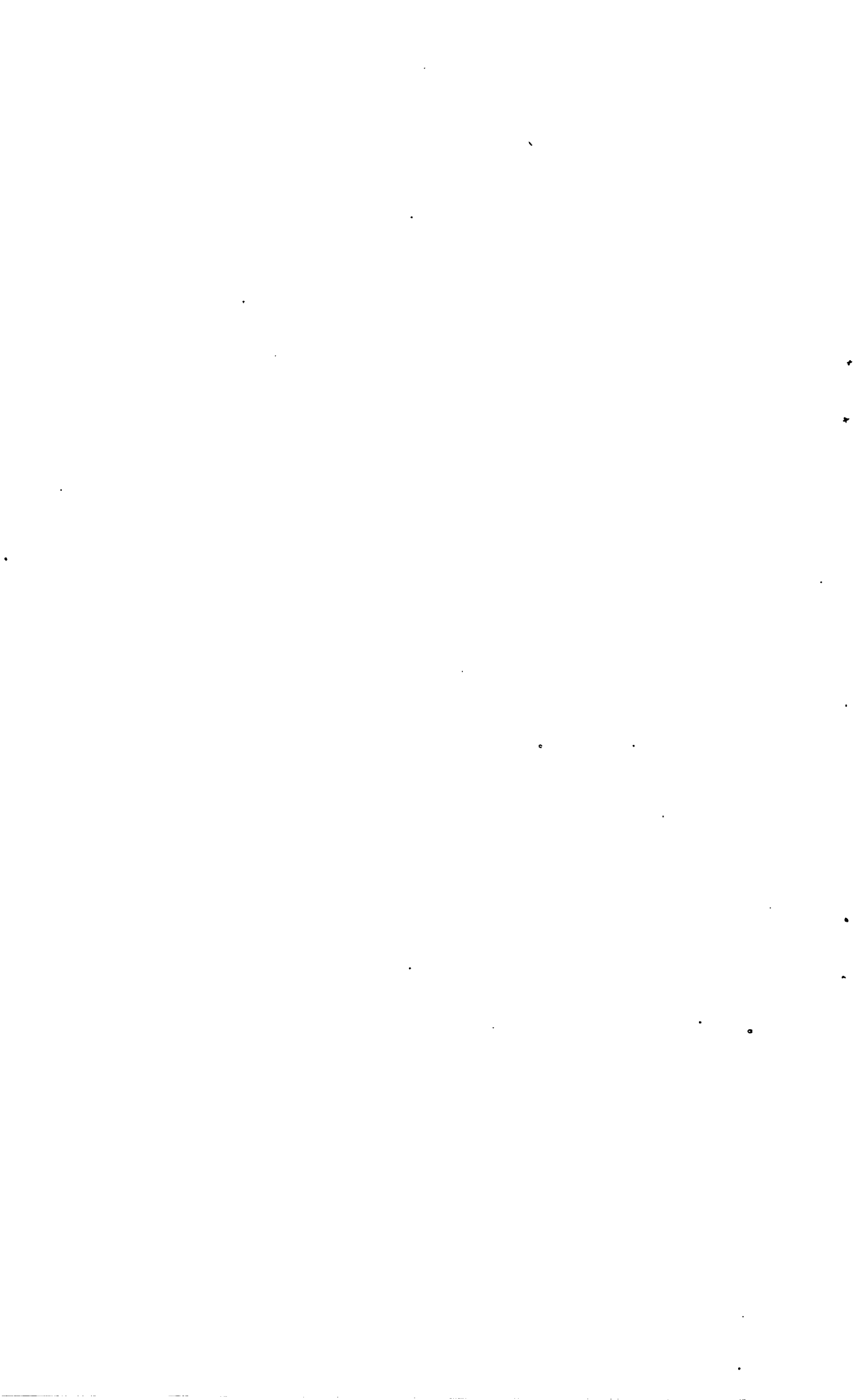
