The following Address was presented to The KING on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the new building of the Royal Institute of British Architects on the 8th November, 1934.

**PRESIDENT OF THE ROYAL INSTITUTE OF BRITISH ARCHITECTS.**

To The KING's Most Excellent Majesty:

May it please Your Majesty:

The Members of the Royal Institute of British Architects gratefully acknowledge the signal honour which has been conferred upon them by Your Majesty in graciously consenting to open this building, and by Her Majesty the Queen, in being present with Your Majesty.

The objects of the Royal Institute are defined in the first Royal Charter granted to it by King William IV in which it is stated that it is formed "for the general advancement of Civil Architecture and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various Arts and Sciences connected therewith". The record of a hundred years makes it clear that those objects have been faithfully and successfully pursued.

The Royal Institute has been the principal agency in creating the complete system of architectural education which now exists in this country and in fostering the development of similar systems in the Dominions overseas.

Its prizes and scholarships play an important part in stimulating the energy of the ablest students and in assisting those of inadequate means.

Its Code of Professional Practice sets a standard which is observed by all the best elements in the profession.

Beginning as a small Society in London it has developed into a great Imperial Organization which has 100 architectural Societies and Branches working in alliance with it in every part of the British Empire. More than 18,000 persons are now included in the field of its influence.

Its library is the finest and most comprehensive of its kind in the world.

It has always taken a prominent part in all useful movements for the benefit of the community in which its special knowledge and qualifications can be of value.

For 86 years it has been privileged to be the adviser of the Crown in the award of the Royal Gold Medal for Architecture.

Compelled by the growth of its membership and activities to abandon the old premises in which it worked for seventy years, it has, in a time of profound economic depression, carried through the task of erecting a new Headquarter building. It is this building which we have the honour to request Your Majesty to open.

*To which address His Majesty was pleased to return the following Gracious Answer:—*

The Queen and I are glad to be with you on this occasion, when the Royal Institute of British Architects enters its new home. In thanking you for your loyal Address I heartily congratulate the Institute on this year celebrating its Centenary.

To-day, as the importance of co-ordination in the whole field of building becomes ever more clearly recognised, it is the great task

of the Royal Institute to make the profession of Architecture increasingly useful to the community. In an age when millions of men and women spend their lives in a world of streets, the shaping of these calls for thought, skill and imagination. Every building, whether it be a cathedral or a factory, a shop or a city hall, forms part of a prospect on which many eyes will rest; and the designer of the humblest dwelling has a duty, not only to those who live in it but to those who pass by.

The provision of better homes for very many of my People is an urgent social need, in which the Institute has taken a deep interest. The subject is one for experts with wide knowledge and a broad outlook.

Your Members have also given consideration to the problems raised by the rapid spread of building along new roads and in country places of special beauty. To focus the collective thought of the profession on questions such as these is one of the many services rendered by the Institute.

The Royal Institute has now completed a century of useful work. The enterprise of its Members in providing this new centre for its activities shows that they are preparing for still greater responsibilities and greater successes in the future.

I warmly congratulate the Architect who designed this beautiful building, which I now have much pleasure in declaring open.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the

Bank of England, on Friday, the 23rd November, 1934, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 26th November, 1934, to Saturday, the 1st December, 1934, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

### THE COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

#### THE DURHAM DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, it is provided that any Scheme may be amended with the approval of the Board of Trade in manner provided by the Scheme;

And whereas in pursuance of powers conferred upon them by subsection (4) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Board of Trade have made the Durham District (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1934, which provides that the Durham District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may be amended so as to provide for certain matters specified in the Schedule to the said Order in substitution for certain matters mentioned in the said Section 3;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 33 of the said Scheme (*inter alia*) that any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme shall be operative from such date as may be prescribed by the Board of Trade;

And whereas in pursuance of the said Clause 33 the amendments of the said Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act hereby approve the amendments of the Durham District (Coal Mines) Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto and prescribe the 1st day of January, 1935, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force:

Provided that where under the said Scheme as amended the Executive Board are empowered to make any determination or to obtain any information which is necessary or expedient for bringing the said Scheme as amended into operation on the said 1st day of January, and any owner is required to furnish such information to the Executive Board, the provisions of the said Scheme as amended in relation to the matters aforesaid shall come into force on the 10th day of November, 1934.

#### SCHEDULE.

THE DURHAM DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme"), shall be amended as follows:—

1. Clause 2 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) at the end of the definition of "Coal mine" there were added the words "and in relation to any two or more mines comprised



in the same undertaking as hereinafter defined means such undertaking”;

(ii) the definition of “District Allocation” were deleted;

(iii) at the end of the Clause there were inserted the following paragraphs, that is to say:—

“Allocation” means any allocation made to the District for any period under the provisions of the Central Scheme;

“Export Supply” means loading at the customary shipping places of the District as cargo into ships for conveyance therein to destinations outside the United Kingdom, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands, or as fuel for use on ships proceeding to such destinations, or as fuel for use on fishing vessels or supply to works situated at ports to be used for the preparation of patent fuel for export;

“Inland Supply” means supply otherwise than as export supply, including supply to other parts of an undertaking of which the coal mine forms part, but excluding supply for use in working the coal mines and supply free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed;

“Output Standard Tonnage” means the standard tonnage of a coal mine in respect of output of coal;

“Export Supply Standard Tonnage” means the standard tonnage of a coal mine in respect of coal for export supply;

“Inland Supply Standard Tonnage” means the standard tonnage of a coal mine in respect of coal for inland supply;

“The customary shipping places of the District” means and includes all ports on the North East Coast from Blyth to the Tees inclusive, and any other port declared from time to time by the Board to be a customary shipping place of the District.

“Waste” means the residue after commercially disposable coal (including colliery consumption and workmen’s coal) has been deducted from the “output” as defined in the Scheme.

2. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 5 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

“5.—(i) Subject to paragraph (iii) of this Clause the Board shall consist of 20 owners or their representatives.

(ii) At every election of members of the Board there shall be elected with each member a person to act in case of need as a substitute for such member, and in the event of any member being absent from any meeting of the Board his substitute so elected may attend and take part in the meeting in the place of such member.

(iii) The owners may if they shall think fit at any General Meeting elect as an additional member of the Board an independent Chairman of the Board to preside over their meetings. The same period of notice of nomination for election and provisions as to retirement and re-election shall apply to such independent Chairman as to the other members of the Board.

(iv) The method of voting at the election of members of the Board including the election of such substitutes and independent Chairman as aforesaid shall be that prescribed by Clauses 28 and 29 of the Scheme.

(v) Not less than three days before any Annual General Meeting any owner desiring to nominate candidates for membership of the Board shall send to the Secretary a written notice of the candidates whom he desires to nominate together with candidates for election as substitutes, and no persons shall be eligible for election who shall not have been so nominated. In the notice convening any Annual General Meeting the Secretary shall call the attention of the owners to the terms of this Clause.”

3. Clause 9 of the Scheme shall have effect as if for the first sentence thereof there were substituted the following words, that is to say:—

“If there shall be no independent Chairman elected by the owners the Board shall appoint a Chairman from amongst themselves to preside at their meetings and they shall in any event appoint a Deputy Chairman from amongst themselves to preside in the Chairman’s absence.”

4. Clause 11 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words “or in the office of independent Chairman” were inserted after the word “Board” where that word occurs the first time.

5. Clause 23 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words “Except in the case of the first general meeting under Clause 5 (iv),” were deleted.

6. Clause 29 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the words “or undertaking as the case may be” were deleted wherever those words occur, and the words “or undertaking” in the proviso to such Clause were deleted;

(ii) the word “output” were inserted before the word “standard” wherever that word occurs.

7. Clause 30 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words “in the latter event” were deleted.

8. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 32 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

“32. The Board shall, through the Secretary, give notice in writing to all owners of any decisions required by the Scheme to be notified to all owners immediately after the decisions have been reached. Such notices and any notices to be given by the Board to any owners individually under the provisions of the Scheme shall be addressed either to the registered office of the owner, to his principal place of business, or to such address as he may furnish to the Secretary as appropriate for the service of such notices, and they may be served either personally or by pre-paid post, and if posted shall be deemed to have been received by the owner within 24 hours of the posting thereof.”

9. Clause 33 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the following sub-paragraph were substituted for sub-paragraph (b) of the proviso thereof, that is to say:—

“The Resolution in order to have effect must be supported by at least two thirds of

the total number of votes recorded for and against the Resolution."

10. Clause 35 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the words "or undertaking" and the words "at the discretion of the Board" were deleted;

(ii) the words "from time to time" were inserted after the word "allocate"; and

(iii) the words "except for the purposes of Clauses 38 to 45 (inclusive) of the Scheme" were inserted after the word "classification".

11. Clauses 38 and 39 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs.

12. Clause 40 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs;

(ii) the words "or undertaking" and the words "or undertakings" were deleted wherever those words occur; and

(iii) the words "determined according to the nature of the coal, or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied" were inserted after the word "therefrom".

13. Clause 41 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the words "or undertaking" were deleted, wherever those words occur; and

(ii) the word "output" were inserted before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs.

14. There shall be inserted after Clause 41 of the Scheme the following new Clauses, that is to say:—

"41A.—(i) The Board shall before the 15th December, 1934, determine the Export Supply Standard Tonnage and Inland Supply Standard Tonnage of every coal mine for the period of three months commencing on the 1st January, 1935 (which determination is hereinafter called the first supply determination) and shall on or before the 28th February, 1935, and before each subsequent 28th February determine the Export Supply Standard Tonnage and Inland Supply Standard Tonnage of every coal mine for the period of six months commencing on the next following 1st April and shall on or before the 31st August, 1935, and before each subsequent 31st August determine the Export Supply Standard Tonnage and Inland Supply Standard Tonnage of every coal mine for the period of six months commencing on the next following 1st October.

(ii) The Board may if they think fit further distribute the Export Supply Standard Tonnage and the Inland Supply Standard Tonnage or either of them determined for any coal mine for each or any such period as aforesaid amongst the various classes of coal produced therefrom, such classes to be determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied:

Provided that any such distribution of the Export Supply and Inland Supply Standard Tonnages or either of them among classes of coal shall have effect for all coal mines producing those classes of coal or any of them.

41B. The Export Supply and Inland Supply Standard Tonnage of each coal mine for the period of the first supply determination and for each subsequent period of six months as aforesaid shall be determined by the Board in accordance with the following provisions, that is to say:—

(i) The Board shall ascertain the amounts of coal supplied for Export Supply and Inland Supply respectively from each coal mine during such previous period as is hereinafter mentioned (hereinafter called "the relevant period") that is to say (a) in the case of the first supply determination the period of three months ended on 31st March, 1934, (b) when the determination of Export Supply Standard Tonnage and Inland Supply Standard Tonnage is to be made for the period of six months commencing on any 1st April, the period of six months ended on the last preceding 30th September and (c) when such determination is to be made for the period of six months commencing on any 1st October the period of six months ended on the last preceding 31st March.

(ii) The Board shall deduct from the Output Standard Tonnage of each coal mine such amount as shall be determined by the Board as representing the annual proportion in the case of such coal mine of (a) waste and (b) coal to be used for the purpose of working the mine and (c) coal supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed.

(iii) Having ascertained the amounts specified in sub-paragraph (i) and made the deduction provided for in sub-paragraph (ii) of this Clause in the case of each coal mine, the Board shall proceed to determine the Export Supply and Inland Supply Standard Tonnages thereof at amounts in the case of the first supply determination together equal to one quarter and in all subsequent determinations together equal to one moiety of the balance remaining after such deduction as aforesaid from the Output Standard Tonnage of such coal mine and respectively bearing such proportion in the case of the first supply determination to one quarter and in all subsequent determinations to one moiety of the said balance as the Board shall think fit having regard to the following matters, that is to say:—

(a) the proportions in which coal supplied by the coal mine during the relevant period was disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively but such proportions shall not be so applied as by their application alone to fix the Inland Supply Standard Tonnage of the coal mine at an amount bearing a different ratio to the sum of the Inland Supply Standard Tonnages of all the other coal mines in the District from the ratio borne by the amount of coal actually supplied for Inland Supply by such coal mine in the relevant period to the total amount of coal supplied for Inland Supply by all the other

coal mines in the District during such relevant period;

(b) the extent to which the coal disposed of by the coal mine for inland supply and for export supply respectively has been increasing or decreasing and to the reasons for such increase or decrease;

(c) any seasonal fluctuations affecting the proportions in which coal is supplied by the coal mine for inland supply and for export supply or for either of such supplies;

(d) any evidence submitted to the Board to have effect that the demand from the markets supplied by the coal mine is likely to increase or decrease during the period for which the determination is being made;

(e) any other matters relevant to such determination.

(iv) On a distribution of the Export Supply and Inland Supply Standard Tonnages (or either of them) of a coal mine among the various classes of coal or any of them as hereinbefore provided the Board shall apply the provisions of this and the last preceding Clause hereof so far as the same are applicable and shall also have regard to any other matters relevant to such distribution which shall be made for the like periods as the determination of Export Supply and Inland Supply Standard Tonnages.

(v) On an addition to or deduction from the Output Standard Tonnage of a coal mine or if the same shall be changed on a general redetermination of standard tonnages the Board shall thereupon make such adjustments of the Export Supply and Inland Supply Standard Tonnages of such coal mine as shall be necessary having regard to the provisions of this and the last preceding Clause hereof.

(vi) For the purpose of assisting the Board in the determination of Export Supply and Inland Supply Standard Tonnages every owner shall furnish to the Board upon notice given to him by the Board a statement in writing giving any information which the Board may require for that purpose and every owner may submit to the Board together with any statement so required particulars in writing (accompanied by any evidence necessary to substantiate the same) of any matters claimed by him to be relevant for consideration by the Board in determining the Export Supply or Inland Supply Standard Tonnage of his coal mine."

15. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 42 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"42. Notice in writing of the standard tonnages so determined by the Board (including any special conditions attaching thereto) and of any such redetermination or alteration of output standard tonnages as is hereinafter mentioned and any adjustments in Export Supply and Inland Supply Standard Tonnages consequent upon any such redetermination or alteration, shall immediately be given by the Board to all the owners."

16. Clause 43 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) the word "shall" were substituted for the word "may"; and

(ii) the word "twenty-eight" were substituted for the word "fourteen".

17. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 44 and 45 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

"44.—(1) The Board shall annually re-determine the output standard tonnage of all coal mines in the District having regard in the case of each coal mine to:—

(i) the efficiency and economy of working of the coal mine;

(ii) the extent to which it has been developed for economic working;

(iii) the extent to which it is being developed for economic working and with due regard to good mining practice;

(iv) the extent to which its output has been increasing or decreasing and the reasons for such increase or decrease and so that greater regard shall be had to any increase of output which is attributable to the development of existing or additional resources or to re-opening of mines or seams than to an increase which is only attributable to more intensive working of existing resources;

(v) any other special circumstances of the coal mine.

(2) The first of such redeterminations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1936 and thereafter they shall come into force on the 1st day of April in each succeeding year.

(3) Pending the first of such redeterminations at intervals of not less than six months and thereafter at any time not being less than six months after any such annual redetermination the Board may and shall on the application of any owner consider whether any alteration by way of addition or deduction ought to be made in the output standard tonnage of any coal mine by reason of any change in the special circumstances of such coal mine and upon such redetermination may make such addition to or deduction from the output standard tonnage of the coal mine concerned as in the opinion of the Board is justified by such change in the special circumstances thereof.

45. Where after the commencement of the Scheme an owner purchases or otherwise acquires any coal mine the standard tonnages of the coal mine so acquired shall respectively be added to the corresponding standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner and constitute the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking and in such case on any subsequent determination of standard tonnages, such combined undertaking shall be treated in the same way as if the standard tonnages so constituted were the standard tonnages of the combined undertaking under the last previous determination of standard tonnages for the District:

Provided that where an owner purchases or otherwise acquires part only of an undertaking in respect of which standard tonnages have been determined under the Scheme, the proportion of those standard tonnages to be added to the standard tonnages of any other coal mine belonging to such owner shall be determined by the Board, and such amounts shall be deducted from the standard tonnages of the undertaking of which part has been so acquired."

18. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clauses 46, 47, 48 and 49 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

“46.—(i) The Board shall from time to time determine the proportions (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as ‘the quotas’) of the standard tonnages of each coal mine which may be produced therefrom or which may be supplied by the owner thereof for export supply and inland supply respectively as the case may be.

(ii) If standard tonnages have been determined in respect of any class of coal the Board may, if they think fit, determine separate quotas for such class.

(iii) All quotas shall be so calculated that during no period in respect of which allocations have been fixed by the Central Council shall any of such allocations be exceeded.

(iv) Quotas shall be determined for such period as the Board may decide not exceeding the period of the allocation to which such quotas relate, and shall be notified by the Board to all the owners not later than seven days before the commencement of the period to which they relate.

(v) The quotas and the periods for which they are fixed shall be determined by the Board having regard, among other matters, to the prospective demand for the coal to which those quotas relate.

(vi) Any quota determined shall be the same proportion of the relevant standard tonnage for all coal mines.

(vii) The Board may at any time after the determination of quotas increase any quota, so, however, that the tonnage of coal permitted to be raised or supplied, as the case may be, under any allocation made to the District shall not be exceeded. Any such increase shall be notified to all the owners affected thereby in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay, and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.

47. Every owner shall forward to the Board within seven days after the end of each period for which quotas are determined a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe, giving in respect of such period full particulars of the output of his coal mine, the tonnage of coal supplied for export supply and for inland supply, respectively, and the output or supply, as the case may be, of any class of coal for which a separate quota has been determined. The Board may require such other particulars as, in their opinion, may be necessary for ascertaining whether any quota for the coal mine has been exceeded.

48. No owner shall be entitled in the event of the output of or the supply of coal or any class of coal from his coal mine falling short of the tonnage permitted under the relevant quota in the period for which such quota has been determined, to carry forward the amount of such shortage or any portion thereof as any addition to the tonnage permitted under any quota during any succeeding period.

49.—(i) Arrangements may be made by any two owners whereby the output or export supply or inland supply of coal or any class

of coal from the coal mine of one owner may exceed the quota in respect thereof in any period where the other owner has agreed, whether for valuable consideration or not, to limit the corresponding output of or supply from his coal mine to a tonnage which is less than the quota in respect thereof by a tonnage not less than the tonnage by which such first-mentioned quota is exceeded. If the output of or supply from any coal mine exceeds any limit so agreed, for the purposes of Clauses 75, 75A and 76 of the Scheme the corresponding quota shall be deemed to be exceeded by the amount of the excess over such limit.

(ii) Notice in writing of any arrangement made under this Clause must be given to the Secretary by the parties concerned within two days of the making of such arrangement.”

19. Clause 55 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words “or undertaking” in paragraph (2) thereof were deleted.

20. Clause 55A of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words “and the rate of remuneration of such Agent or Subsidiary Company” were added at the end of paragraph (a) thereof.

21. Clause 65 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words “or undertaking” were deleted wherever those words occur.

22. Clause 71 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words “or undertaking” were deleted wherever those words appear in paragraph (a) thereof.

23. The following Clauses shall be substituted for Clause 75 of the Scheme, that is to say:—

“75.—(1) Any owner who, during any period for which a quota is determined, raises or allows to be raised an output of coal or any class of coal or supplies or allows to be supplied a tonnage of coal or any class of coal for export supply or for inland supply in excess of the corresponding quota (after allowing for any arrangement under Clause 49 of the Scheme whereby a quota may be exceeded) shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty in respect of each ton or part of a ton of such excess of the same amount per ton as is prescribed for the time being under rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme for exceeding the corresponding allocation:

Provided that until the coming into force of such rules the penalty shall be 2s. 6d. per ton;

(2) The Board shall before the coming into force of any rules made under Clause XI of the Central Scheme notify each owner of the amount per ton which will be payable in consequence thereof for exceeding any quota.

75A. Where in any period the output of coal or any class of coal or the quantity of coal or any class of coal supplied for inland supply or export supply from any coal mine is in excess of the relevant quota in force during such period, the relevant quota applicable during such succeeding period as the Board may determine may be reduced by the amount of such excess, but without prejudice to any penalty that may be incurred by reason of such excess. In calculating such excess effect shall be given to any relevant adjustments under Clause 49.”

24. Clause 76 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the words "or undertaking" were deleted.

25. Clause 83 of the Scheme shall have effect as if the following paragraphs were added at the end thereof, that is to say:—

"And provided further that no owner shall be entitled to refer any matter to arbitration unless he shall have given notice in writing to the Board of his intention to do so within 28 days after notice of the matter complained of shall have been given to him by the Board or (in the absence of any such notice as last aforesaid) within 28 days after he first became aware of such matter. For the purposes of this proviso in any case in which an owner being entitled so to do under any of the provisions of the Scheme applies to the Board for reconsideration of any decision the aforesaid period of 28 days shall be computed from the date on which notice is given to him of the decision of the Board on such reconsideration:

Provided further that an arbitrator may extend the time for giving notice under this Clause if the delay in giving notice has been due to accident or mistake and the Board have not in the meantime relied on the absence of notice and altered their position so as to be prejudicially affected by an arbitration."

## ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

The Minister of Transport in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (3) of Section 19 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930 (hereinafter called "the Act"), as amended by Section 31 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933, has made an Order as follows:—

1. In the case of heavy locomotives, light locomotives, motor tractors and motor vehicles constructed to carry goods other than the effects of passengers and authorised to be used under A or B licences issued in England or Wales:—

(a) paragraph (i) of sub-section (1) of Section 19 of the Act shall be varied so as to provide that where in any period of 24 hours one period of duty only is worked not exceeding 8 hours in length then the limit of 8 hours may be substituted for the limit of 5½ hours imposed by the said paragraph in respect of a continuous period of driving if the driver of the vehicle is allowed intervals of rest and time for refreshment of not less than 40 minutes in the aggregate, and if one such interval is of not less than 20 minutes to be taken not earlier than 2 hours after the beginning nor later than 5 hours after the beginning of the 8 hours' period of duty; and

(b) paragraph (ii) of sub-section (1) of Section 19 of the Act shall be varied so as to provide that where a driver is employed by the week and receives at least one complete day's rest of 24 hours in each week on not more than 2 days in any week the limit of 12 hours may be substituted for the limit of 11 hours imposed by the said paragraph in respect of the aggregate of continuous periods of driving, provided that some part



of the said 12 hours is occupied by the driver in waiting or on work in connection with the loading or unloading of the vehicle.

2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1935.

4. This Order may be cited as "The Road Traffic Act, 1930 (Variation of Provisions of Section 19), Order, 1934."
