RURAL DISTRICT OF SAINT FAITH'S.

BY an Order dated the 5th day of November, 1934, the Minister of Health has declared that on and after the 26th day of November, 1934, certain provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, and the Public Health Act, 1925, shall be in force in the whole or certain portions of the Rural District of Saint Faith's as follows:—

- (a) In the contributory places of Catton, Drayton, Helledon, Horsham Saint Faith and Newton Saint Faith, Sprows-ton, Taverham and Wroxham:—

The Public Health Act, 1875—

So much of the provisions of Section 160 as incorporate the provisions of the Towns Improvement Clauses Act, 1847, with respect to numbering the houses.

The Public Health Act, 1925—

Sections 17, 18 and 19 (naming of Streets).

- (b) In the whole of the district:—

The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890—

Section 36 (means of ingress to and egress from places of public resort).

The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907—

Section 23 (new buildings).

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject, as regards Section 23 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, to the conditions specified in the Order.
