UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY, 20 NOVEMBER, 1934.

Whereas it is expedient to determine the source from which repayments to Colleges under Statt. Tit. XIX. § 18 cl. 7, 2nd proviso, should be met:

Now the University of Oxford, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

- 1. In Statt. Tit. XIX. § 19, cl. 3 (Statuta, ed. 1934, p. 343, line 37), before the present sub-clause (1) insert "(1) Any payments due to Colleges under Statt. Tit. XIX. § 18, cl. 7, 2nd proviso".
- 2. Renumber the present sub-clauses (1) and (2) as (2) and (3) respectively.
