At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 6th day of December, 1934.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS on 30th May, 1932, the Secretary-General of the League of Nations communicated to His Majesty's Government a certified copy of a draft Convention concerning the Protection against Accidents of Workers employed in loading or unloading Ships which had been adopted at the International Labour Conference at Geneva on 27th April, 1932:

And whereas it is provided in Article 405 of the Treaty of Versailles that in the case of a draft Convention so communicated each Member of the International Labour Organisation shall, if such draft Convention obtains the consent of the Authority or Authorities within whose competence the matter lies, communicate the formal ratification thereof to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations:

And whereas the said draft Convention has in respect of Great Britain and Northern Ireland obtained the consent of the Authority or Authorities within whose competence the matter lies, and such action as is necessary to make the provisions of the said draft Convention effective therein has been taken:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said draft Convention be confirmed and approved.

And it is further ordered that formal communication thereof be made to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Clare College, Cambridge, on the 12th day of November, 1934, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

Proposed Amendments of the Statutes of Clare College, Cambridge, approved by the Unanimous Vote of all those present at a Meeting of the Governing Body specially summoned for the purpose, and held on November 12th, 1934.

Statute 3, page 6, paragraph 2: first line, delete "of the Senate."

Statute 4, page 8:

add a seventh paragraph, thus:

(7) When it is known that the Mastership is about to be vacated whether by the Master giving notice to the Governing Body of his resignation of the Mastership on a specified date or by reason of his impending superannuation, an election may be made not more than six calendar months before the date of the vacancy by the same procedure as if the Mastership had already become vacant. Such election shall take effect from the date on which the Mastership becomes vacant.

Statute 7, page 9, paragraph 1, line 11:

for "stipend and share of the Divisible Fund" read "emoluments."

Statutes 8 to 14 inclusive to read as follows:

8. Of the Fellows

(1) There shall be in the College five Classes of Fellowships:

Class A. Research Fellowships.

Class B. Official Fellowships.

Class C. Professorial Fellowships.

Class D. Life Fellowships.

Class E. Supernumerary Fellowships.

- (2) Fellowships in Classes A and B shall be stipendiary-that is, Fellows in these Classes shall receive a dividend as hereafter set forth in these Statutes.
- (3) Fellowships in Classes C, D and E shall be non-stipendiary—that is, Fellows in these Classes shall not receive a dividend but only such allowances as are enjoyed by Fellows in Classes A and B.
- (4) The number of Stipendiary Fellowships shall be ten at the least, and two such Fellowships shall be called the Fellowships on the foundation of Dr. Coles. A Fellowship held under former Statutes shall count as a Stipendiary Fellowship.

(5) The Master shall inform the Vice-Chancellor whenever the number of Fellows holding Reserved Fellowships as defined by the Statutes of the University falls below the number required by those Statutes and whenever the deficiency in the said number is increased, diminished or extinguished.

(6) If at any time it shall appear to the Council that the revenues of the College permit, they may, subject to the approval of the Governing Body, increase the number of Stipendiary Fellowships. The Council may, as vacancies occur, suppress Stipendiary Fellowships, but not so as to reduce the number of such Fellowships below the minimum number prescribed in these Statutes.

When the number of Stipendiary Fellows is ten or more, no election to a Stipendiary Fellowship shall be made unless in the opinion of the Finance Committee a modulus of at least £33 6s, 8d. can be maintained.

- (7) A Fellowship shall not be tenable with the Headship, or a Scholarship, or a Studentship at this College; and no Fellow (other than an Honorary Fellow) shall hold a Fellowship with a Headship, or a Fellowship (other than an Honorary Fellowship) at any other College in this or other University. Fellow shall hold a Fellowship in more than one Class at the same time.
- 9. Of the Election and Admission of Fellows.

(1) The election of Fellows shall be vested

in the Governing Body.

- (2) In the election of Fellows preference shall be given to those whom the Electors believe to be of good moral character and best fitted to be Fellows of the College as a place of education, religion, learning and research.
- (3) The election to Fellowships shall be held on such day or days as shall in each case be determined by the Council. The Master shall send notice in writing to each member of the Governing Body at least fourteen days before the day fixed for any election.

(4) If a majority of the Governing Body be not present at a meeting so summoned, the election shall not be proceeded with.

(5) No person shall be deemed to have been elected to a Fellowship who shall not have not exceed six years in all.

- It shall be declared at the time of the election whether the Fellow has been elected into a Fellowship in Class A, Class B, Class C or
- (6) Each Fellow shall on his admission make and subscribe the following declaration: "I will, as far as in me lies, promote the honour and usefulness of the College, observe its Statutes and Orders and its reasonable and approved customs, be obedient to the Master in the exercise of his statutable powers, and to the best of my judgment and ability discharge the business of the College which may be entrusted to me."
- 7) A Fellow elect shall not be entitled to any of the privileges of a Fellow until his admission; but upon admission he shall become entitled, if a Stipendiary Fellow, to receive the dividend of his Fellowship as from the day of his election. Seniority among the Fellows who have been admitted shall normally be determined by the order in which they were elected; the Governing Body may, however, grant to a Fellow, after his election, a definite number of years of seniority.
 (8) If a Fellow elect be not admitted to his

Fellowship within six calendar months from the date of his election, the Council shall, unless a sufficient reason be assigned for the postponement of his admission, declare the

Fellowship vacant.

- (9) There shall be no admission of Fellows on re-election or transference to another Class, but an ex-Fellow, on election to a Fellowship, shall be admitted as at a first election.
- (10) Fellows who are Graduates of the University of Oxford or of the University of Dublin (Trinity College) shall take all necessary steps for incorporation into the University of Cambridge with all convenient speed, and Fellows who are Graduates of the University of Cambridge and are not Members of the Senate shall proceed to such degrees as shall entitle them to become Members of the Senate as soon as they are qualified to take such degrees. Fellows not proceeding to their degrees in due course shall, unless prevented from so doing by some cause to be approved by the Council, forfeit all the emoluments of their Fellowships until they shall have complied with this regulation.

10. Of Fellows in Class A.

A Fellow in this Class shall hold his Fellowship in the first instance for three years from the time of his election. He shall pursue a course of study or research in Cambridge or in such other place or places as may be approved by the Council, and shall at the end of the second year of his tenure at latest make a report of his work to the Governing Body. He shall also fulfil any reasonable conditions which may be imposed by the Governing Body at his election. Such a Fellow may, by a vote in which not less than two-thirds of those present and voting concur, be re-elected for a further period or periods at a meeting of the Governing Body held not more than six months before the expiration of his tenure. The total tenure of a Fellowship in this Class shall

If at any time it should appear that a Fellow in this Class is not complying with the conditions of his tenure, the Governing Body may, by a vote in which two-thirds of those present and voting concur, remove him from his Fellowship, or transfer him to a Fellow-ship in Class E for the remainder of the tenure of his Fellowship.

11. Of Fellows in Class B.

- (1) Fellows holding one or more of the qualifying offices of Dean, Bursar, Tutor, Assistant Tutor, and Lecturer of the College shall be Official Fellows and shall retain their Fellowships so long as they hold any of the above offices.
- (2) Any person whether a Fellow in Class A, or not, eligible to hold a Reserved Fellowship, or who has been appointed to a post making him so eligible although his tenure may not have commenced, may be elected to hold an Official Fellowship, in the first instance until the end of the academical year in which he is elected, and for the ensuing year. The Governing Body shall have the power to re-elect such Fellow annually at the meeting for the election of College Officers. The tenure of such a Fellowship shall however terminate if the holder ceases to be eligible to hold a Reserved Fellowship. The Council may require of any such Fellow as a condition of the tenure of his Fellowship that he shall perform such duties as they may from time to time prescribe, provided that they do not conflict with the duties of his University post.

A Fellow holding a Fellowship under paragraph (1) of this Statute and whose tenure of a qualifying office will expire within a period of six months, may have the tenure of his Fellowship prolonged by election in accordance with this paragraph subject to the prescribed conditions.

(3) Any person of exceptional distinction may be elected in accordance with Statute 9 to hold an Official Fellowship for periods of not more than six years at a time whether he be at the time a Fellow in Class A, Class B or Class E, or not, except that such election shall not be made save with the concurrence of the votes of not less than two-thirds of those present. The tenure of a Fellow elected under this paragraph shall not be prolonged beyond the end of the academical year in which he He shall fulfil any attains the age of 65. reasonable conditions which may be imposed by the Governing Body at each election.

12. Of Fellows in Class C.

(1) Persons holding University appointments such as certain Professorships, Readerships or other posts prescribed by the Statutes or Ordinances of the University shall be qualified for election into Fellowships in this Class. Such a Fellow shall hold a Fellowship in this Class so long as he holds the University appointment with which it is associated.

(2) A Fellow holding a Fellowship in another Class who becomes qualified to hold a Fellowship in this Class shall automatically have his Fellowship transferred to this Class for a period of three calendar months from the date of the commencement of his University appointment. If during this period he shall not be elected to a Fellowship in this Class, his Fellowship shall lapse at the end of the period of three months aforesaid.

(3) The Master shall inform the Vice-Chancellor whenever the number of Fellows holding Fellowships in this Class falls below the number prescribed by the University Statutes.

13. Of Fellows in Class D

(1) The Master on retirement shall become a Fellow in Class D.

(2) A Fellow who has held a Fellowship in Class B, Class C or in Class E under paragraph (3) of Statute 14, for twenty years in the aggregate shall, on ceasing to hold a Fellowship in any of these Classes, become a Fellow in Class D.

14. Of Fellows in Class E

(1) A Fellow in Class A, Class B or Class C, whose tenure of a Fellowship will expire within a period of six months, may be elected to a Fellowship in Class E to be held from the date of expiry of the Fellowship already held. Any ex-Fellow may be elected to a Fellowship in Fellows so elected may be rethis Class. elected from time to time.

The period and conditions of tenure shall be determined in each case by the Governing Body at the time of election or re-election.

- (2) A Fellow in Class A may signify to the Master in writing his wish to become a Fellow in Class E. If the Governing Body consent he shall remain a Fellow to all intents and purposes, and hold his Fellowship for the time and in the manner applicable to his former Fellowship, and enjoy all the benefits and advantages of the same, except that he shall not thenceforth be entitled to any Fellowship dividend. If such a Fellow is entitled to be re-elected to a Fellowship in Class A, he may be re-elected to a Fellowship in Class E under the same conditions and for the same period.
- (3) A Fellow in Class B may similarly have his Fellowship transferred to Class E at his own request with the consent of the Governing He shall similarly be entitled to all the privileges of his former Fellowship, except that he shall not thenceforth be entitled to any Fellowship dividend. He shall continue to hold his Fellowship so long as he holds a qualifying office, or, if he held a Fellowship in Class B under paragraph (2) of Statute 11, he may be re-elected annually under the same conditions to a Fellowship in Class E. If he held a Fellowship in Class B under paragraph (3) of Statute 11, he may be re-elected from time to time in accordance with the provisions of that paragraph.

(4) A Fellow in this Class shall be counted as one of the Stipendiary Fellows for the purpose of computing the number of Stipendiary

Fellowships required to be reserved.

(5) If a Fellow in this Class is qualified to hold a Reserved Fellowship, his Fellowship shall be counted in the number of Reserved Fellowships.

Statute 16, page 16, paragraph 2:

In the first line, delete "and Entrance Exhibitions."

After "elected without limit of age." insert: Entrance Exhibitions shall be awarded only to candidates whose attainments have been decided by open examination held by the College acting either singly or as a member of a group of Colleges, except that Exhibitions may be awarded to candidates who are or who have been students of any educational institution in the British Empire outside Great Britain and Ireland upon satisfactory evidence as to their attainments.

Statute 18, page 19, section (a):

for "emoluments" read "emolument."

Statute 19, page 20, paragraph 4:

To read:

(4) The payment of the emoluments shall be subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of Statute 17. Exhibitioners in need of additional assistance may receive grants from Scholarship Fund B.

Statute 23, page 22, paragraph 1:

To read:

(1) There shall be a Council consisting of the Master, the Official Fellows, the Supernumerary Fellows holding Fellowships under Statute 14, paragraph (3), and two other Fellows . . . etc.

Statute 24, page 23:

for puragraphs 1 to 5 inclusive, substitute the following:

- (1) There shall be a Finance Committee consisting of the Master and eight Fellows. The Bursar, Senior Tutor and Steward, if Fellows, shall be ex officio members. Other members shall be elected by the Council from among the Fellows of the College for periods not exceeding two years.
- (2) Any member of this Committee who shall cease to be a Fellow of the College shall ipso facto vacate his place on the Committee.

and renumber the succeeding paragraphs accordingly.

Statute 25, page 24:

delete paragraph 3 and renumber the succeeding paragraphs accordingly.

for present paragraph 4, substitute:

(3) Subject to the conditions of paragraph (4) below, no business shall be transacted at a meeting of the Governing Body or of the Council unless at least one half of the members be present, and no business shall be transacted at a meeting of the Finance Committee unless at least five members be present.

present paragraph 8:

line 3, to read:

... the senior of the Official Fellows present shall take the place of the Master.

for present paragraph 9, substitute:

(8) If the Mastership be vacant, or if the Master be incapacitated or absent without having appointed a locum tenens, the senior of the Official Fellows in residence may summon meetings, and in the absence of the Master from meetings so summoned, the senior of the Official Fellows present shall take his place.

Statute 26, page 25, paragraph 2:

Add

The affixing of the Seal to any document shall be attested by two members of the Governing Body when attestation is required by the nature of the document.

paragraph 3:

To read:

The gold and silver plate which is not in daily use shall be under the charge of the Master, and shall be kept in one or more safes or strong rooms provided for the purpose. Every addition to or removal from such deposit shall be entered in a register kept for the purpose, and the person taking custody of such plate shall sign his name against the entry. All plate must be produced for the annual inspection of plate.

Statute 35, page 28, paragraph 2:

for "appointed" substitute "elected."

Statute 37, page 29, paragraph 1:

The second sentence of the paragraph to read:

If however one whom the College proposes to elect to the Mastership has on or before the date of the election attained the age of 63, but not the age of 68 years, he may be elected for a period terminating at any date after the end of the academical year in which he attains the age of 70 not later than the 30th of September following the expiration of seven years from the date of his assuming office.

Statute 38, page 30, paragraph 2:

after "consider necessary," to read:

... shall sleep each night in College, or in a suitable house communicating with the College and approved by the Council, during that portion of each term which is appointed for the residence of the Undergraduates.

The Council shall make such provision as may from time to time seem to them expedient for residence in College during vacations.

After the first sentence, the Statute to read:
